## **GCAA Announces 2011 Academic National Champions**

**NORMAN, Okla.** – DePaul (Division I), Lynn (Division II), Grinnell (Division III), SCAD-Savannah (NAIA), USC-Lancaster (NJCAA DI) and South Mountain CC (NJCAA DII) have been named Academic National Champions for their respective divisions announced the GCAA. DePaul posted the highest recorded team GPA with 3.66. A total of 104 teams submitted GPAs of 3.00 or higher and earned All-Academic Team recognition.

"Once again I am very happy for the guys," said DePaul Head Coach Betty Kaufmann.
