GOLDEN GUSTIE FOOTBALL IS ON THE AIR...Golden Gustie football will once again be broadcast live on the air by KNUJ Radio AM 860 out of New Ulm, Minn. KNUJ will provide radio coverage for all 10 Gustavus games this season. Gustavus play-by-play broadcaster Tom Wheeler, now in his seventh year as the voice of the Golden Gusties, will be joined on the call by former Gustavus football player and 1984 Gustavus graduate Ken Ericson `84 on the live call.

RETURNERS...The Gustavus Adolphus football team returned a total of 27 letterwinners to the field for the 2012 season. The Gusties also bring back a total of 12 starters, seven on offense and five on defense. Starters returning on offense include left tackle Brian Grundmeyer (Sr., Inver Grove Heights, Minn.), right guard Lance Erickson (Jr., Pelican Rapids, Minn.), quarterback Muresuk Mena (Sr., Inver Grove Heights, Minn.), running back Jeffrey Dubose (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.), running back Phillip Butler (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.), wide receiver Andre Creighton (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.), and right tackle Wyatt Adams (Jr., Chaska, Minn.). On defense, returning starters include defensive tackle Donte Green (Jr., Minneapolis, Minn.), outside lineback Anthony Boyce (So., Excelsior, Minn.), middle linebacker Matt Keller (So., Eagan, Minn.), outside linebacker Joe Haas (Jr., Mission, Kan.), and safety Beau Bachman (Jr., St. Peter, Minn.).

CALLING ALL CAPTAINS...Of over 5,000 student-athletes who have played football for Gustavus in the 96-year history of the program, only 185 have earned the privilege to serve as team captain. Peter Haugen's captains this season include seniors Brian Grundmeyer, Muresuk Mena, and Lyle Opdahl, and junior Torey Asao.

SOTA' BORN AND RAISED...The 2012 Gustavus football roster features a total of 108 players from nine states across America. Ninety-four are Minnesota natives, while Kansas (4), California (3), Florida (2), Colorado (1), Iowa (1), South Dakota (1), Texas (1), and Wisconsin (1) are also represented.

MEET THE HEAD COACHES... Gustavus Head Coach Peter Haugen is in his fourth season at the helm of the Gustavus football program. Haugen has a combined record of 13-26 in his three-plus seasons in St. Peter. A graduate of Bethel University, Haugen was the head coach at Washburn High School prior to coming to Gustavus. Head coach Terry Horan is currently in his 12th season at the helm of the Cobber football program. In his 11-plus seasons at Concordia, Horan has compiled an overall record of 80-43 and an MIAC mark of 61-35. Before coming to Concordia, Horan served as the head football coach at Breckenridge High School for six years.

Father Greg; Uncle Tim), **Bill Rodning** (Father Mark), **Derek Wilking** (Brothers Carl and Blake), and **Ryan Williams** (Father Gary; Mother Jayne; Aunt Sue). Of those 19 extended family members who have attended Gustavus, 14 of which have donned the winged helmet for the football team. There are five father-son duos and one three generation family in freshman Max Roberts, his father Greg, and his grandfather Don.

THE SERIES... Saturday afternoon's game marks the 81st meeting between Gustavus and Concordia on the gridiron. The Gusties hold the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 44-34-2. Gustavus had won its previous two meetings with the Cobbers before suffering a 37-20 loss on Homecoming last season. The Gusties are 23-15-1 against the Cobbers in St. Peter, yet their challenger from the Red River Valley has come out victorious in its most recent five trips to Hollingsworth Field. In fact, the home team in the series has unsuccessfully defended its own turf over the last six meetings.

THE LONG AND WINDING... The 2012 Gustavus football schedule has proven to be one of the most grueling in the country this season. According to the most recent "Toughest Schedule" poll released by the NCAA on Oct. 28, Gustavus has the sixth hardest in the country schedule based on cumulative opposition. Saint John's ranks one spot ahead of the Gusties in fifth, while Frostburg State (1), Buffalo State (2), Whitworth (3), and St. John Fisher (4) round out the top five.

SEASON FINALES AND THE COBBERS... The Gustavus football team is 28-21-1 in season finales over the past 50 years. The Gusties and Cobbers have met in the final game of the regular season a total of seven times. The first season-ending meeting was also the first ever game between the two schools, taking place in Moorhead on Oct. 27, 1923. The Gusties came out victorious in that contest by the score of 12-0 thanks to a pair of dropkicks by Abner Haugdahl and a fourth quarter touchdown run by Hilding Hanson. The Gusties hold a slight advantage over Concordia in season-finales with a record of 4-3. Fans will not likely forget Peter Haugen's first season-capping contest with Concordia, where Greg Lane `11 brought back an 86-yard kickoff return for a touchdown with less than a minute on the clock to allow Gustavus a 20-19 victory at Jake Christiansen Stadium.

NINETY-EIGHT YEARS OF GUSTAVUS FOOTBALL... The Gustavus football team is at the end of its 98th season of existence. The football team was first recognized as a collegiate program in 1902. That team, which was coached by Reverend Chouinard, posted a record of 1-0. Football was later banned at Gustavus from 1904 to 1916, but was reinstated in 1917 and the College has supported a team every year since. Gustavus has compiled an overall mark of 467-334-21 and a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference mark of 370-239-13. Gustavus was a charter member of the MIAC. The other charter members included Carleton, Hamline, Saint John's, Macalester, St. Olaf, and St. Thomas.

STEPKA IGNITES OFFENSE... Gustavus senior quarterback Tim Stepka ignited what had been a struggling Gustavus offense in Saturday's victory over Carleton. In his first collegiate start at quarterback, Stepka led an offense that scored a season-high 41 points – over 20 points more than the team's scoring average coming into the game. The New Prague product ran for a touchdown and also threw for another two, connecting with Michael

Hintze on a 15-yard strike and Jeffrey Dubose on a 31-yard catch-and-run. He completed 23 of his 28 passes for an 82.1-percent completion rate. His season/team-best 297 yards passing was the most by a Gustavus quarterback since Oct. 10, 2009 when Jordan Becker `10 threw for 301 yards against Pacific Lutheran. Stepka's completion percentage was also the highest since Sean Smith `04 went 16-for-19 for four touchdowns and 238 yards in a 41-14 win over Augsburg on Sept. 28, 2002.

PLAYING POLITICS... The Gustavus football team last met Concordia College the Saturday following the United States presidential election after Ronald Reagan won in a landslide against incumbent Democratic President Jimmy Carter in 1980. Unlike that contest, the battle between the Gusties and Cobbers came down to the wire. With an MIAC title on the line and trailing 23-22, Gustavus Head Coach Denny Raarup elected to go for two following a late fourth quarter touchdown. Quarterback Neal Hagberg dropped back to pass only to have the attempt deflected by a Cobber defender and slip through the fingers of Mark Tipps. Following that loss, Gustavus rattled off six straight wins following the presidential election. After the last presidential race in 2008 where Barack Obama defeated John McCain, the Gusties suffered a similar narrow loss to St. Olaf 27-20 in double overtime.

DUBOSE GOES OVER 500.. Despite missing the previous two games due to injury, junior running back Jeffrey Dubose bounced back with his fourth 100-yard rushing performance of the season against Carleton. Dubose carried the ball a season-high 26 times for a season-best 143 yards against the Knights, surpassing the 500-yard rushing mark in the process. He has gone over 500 yards rushing in each of his first three seasons and now totals 1,890 yards on 385 carries (4.91 ypc). With 1,890 yards, Dubose moves ahead of Mitch Anderson (1,872) for 11th on the all-time rushing leaders list at Gustavus. Scott Anderson sits in front of the junior tailback in 10th with 2,079 yards.

HUEPENBECKER EARNS IRON MAN STATUS... Gustavus kicker Tom Huepenbecker will play in his 40th college football game wearing a winged helmet Saturday, earning the program's prestigious "Iron Man" award for playing in every game of his collegiate career. Over his four-year career serving as the team's primary kicker, Huepenbecker is 17-of-38 on field goal tries and 87-for-100 on extra points. The Middleton, Wis. native has recorded six field goals over 40 yards with a career long 44 yarder coming against St. Thomas his rookie season. His 44-yard make is also the longest since Christian White made his own 44-yard field goal against Concordia in 2000. Huepenbecker has also scored 133 points during his tenure, which ranks third amongst Gustavus kickers since 1980.

BY THE NUMBERS...

Peter Haugen, a native of Minneapolis and a 1991 graduate of Bethel University, is entering his fourth year as head football coach at Gustavus Adolphus College.

In his third year as head coach, Haugen led the Gusties to a 2-8 record overall and a 2-6 mark within the MIAC, finishing seventh in the league standings. In three seasons at the head of the Gustavus Adolphus football program, Haugen has compiled an overall record of 13-26 and an MIAC record of 10-25. Last season, Gustavus received three All-MIAC Second Team selections in junior offensive lineman Brian Grundmeyer (Inver Grove



Heights, Minn.), senior defensive lineman Tom Einberger, Jr. (West St. Paul, Minn.), and senior defensive back Brad Kruckeberg (Ellendale, Minn.). Kruckeberg would later go on to earn CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team honors, while also being named the National Football Foundation's winner of the Bob Stein College Scholar Athlete Award.

Haugen, who was the head football coach at Washburn High School for 15 years prior to coming to Gustavus, compiled an overall record of 111-44 during that span, while winning 11 league championships and posting a league record of 76-8. He directed the Millers to the Class AAAA quarterfinals in 2007 finishing with a mark of 9-3. In his last season as the Millers head coach, Haugen's squad posted a mark of 8-2. While building the program at Washburn, Haugen increased player participation from 35 players in 1994 to 110 players. He also implemented academic monitoring and meal programs for student athletes as well as creating and directing the highly successful Washburn Athletic Leadership Academy. He served as the chair of the Minneapolis Football Conference this past year and he is an active clinician working at many local and regional clinics including the NIKE Coach of the Year clinic. Haugen was also a member of the Metro coaching staff for the Minnesota All-Star game in 1998. He started his coaching career at his alma mater serving as the offensive line coach during the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

A three-sport standout at Bethel, Haugen was a starting tight end on the football team, a starting goaltender on the hockey team, and a starting catcher on the baseball team in the late '80s and early 90s. In his senior year, he earned All-Conference honors in football, and was selected Most Valuable Player of the hockey team.

Haugen became the 17th head coach in the 95-year history of Gustavus football. The Golden Gusties have a long and storied football tradition that includes 22 MIAC titles. The program ranks in the top-50 all-time in Division III (out of 235 institutions) with a 58.3 winning percentage (464-328-21). The Gusties will soon join a very elite group of 40 NCAA Division III institutions whose football teams have won 500 games. Along with great teams, Gustavus has also been blessed with many outstanding individual players, which includes 29 players who have received All-America honors, 12 who have received CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, and five who have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Most recently, senior safety Brad Kruckeberg was awarded an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

GUSTAVUS 35 SIMPSON 26

Indianola, Iowa (2,739) Bill Buxton Stadium 77 degrees, Sunny

Indianola, lowa – The Gustavus Adolphus football team kicked off its 2012 season with a 35-26 win over Simpson College on Saturday afternoon at Bill Buxton Stadium. Gustavus was able to capitalize on Simpson's mistakes throughout the day, scoring two defensive touchdowns and forcing a total of five turnovers. Gustavus wins its first season-opener since 2008 and is now 1-0 for the first time in Head Coach Peter Haugen's tenure. Simpson suffers its first loss of the year and is now 1-1.

With Simpson leading 17-14 at the start of the second half, the momentum began to swing towards the Gustavus sideline following a booming 62-yard punt by Jordan Rudenick (Jr., Nicollet, Minn.) that was downed on the seven-yard-line. Three plays later on third-and-15 from the three-yard-line, defensive lineman Nolan Wester (Jr., Kettle River, Minn.) sacked quarterback Taylor Nelson in the endzone, forcing a fumble that was covered up by fellow defensive lineman Donte Green (Jr., Minneapolis, Minn.) for a touchdown. Following the extra point, Gustavus led 21-17 just five minutes into the quarter.

The Gustie defense came up big again on Simpson's following drive when cornerback Torey Asao (Jr., Chaska, Minn.) picked off a tipped pass and returned it 55 yards for a touchdown, extending Gustavus' lead to 28-17.

After the two teams traded possessions, Gustavus came up with its third turnover of the third quarter when defensive end Andrew Lonneman (So., Adrian, Minn.) sacked Nelson, forced him to fumble, and recovered the ball on the 15-yard line. The Gustavus offensive converted the turnover to points on the very next play when quarterback Muresuk Mena (Sr., Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) found tight end Rudenick on 15-yard catch-and-run touchdown.

In the third quarter alone, Gustavus scored 21 unanswered points and forced three turnovers, leading by the score of 35-17 entering the final quarter.

Rudenick's touchdown capped Gustavus' scoring for the afternoon. It would take Simpson until the 2:38 mark of the fourth quarter to get back on the scoreboard. Logan Klein hit a 30-yard field goal to make the score 35-20, and Nelson found wide receiver Taylor Rogers with a 15-yard touchdown to bring the score to a final at 35-26.

The Simpson offense had a hard time getting back into rhythm in the second half – a credit to a relentless pass rush, tight coverage in the secondary, and play of the Gustavus punt team. The Gustie defense registered six sacks and intercepted two passes, while Jordan Rudenick stole the show in his first game as the full-time punter. Rudenick punted six times for 290 yards for an average of 48.3 yards per punt. He downed five punts inside the 20-yard line, three of which were downed inside the five-yard-line. Even when called upon to fill in for Rudenick at punter, Tom Huepenbecker (Sr. Middleton, Wis.) pinned a 34-yard punt inside the 15-yard line. Huepenbecker also finished 5-for-5 on extra point tries.

The game began with Simpson taking a 3-0 lead after Klein knocked in a 29-yard field goal that capped a six-play, 30-yard drive

After a punt and a blocked field goal attempt, Gustavus scored its first points of the 2012 season with 1:02 remaining in the first quarter. Muresuk Mena, who seemed to be dead in the water on fourth-and-two when his key target was covered, made a play with his feet, seeing daylight downfield and taking the ball in for a 35-yard touchdown run that gave Gustavus a 7-3 advantage. Mena would tally two runs over thirty yards in the game, gaining a total of 73 yards on 13 carries for an average of 5.6 yards per rush.

Simpson's offense began to pick up some steam after the Mena score, answering

on the ensuing drive with a 63-yard touchdown pass from Nelson to Rogers, bringing the score to 17-7. Rogers was Nelson's top target in the game, making a game-high eight catches for 187 yards with two touchdowns.

Not to be outdone by Simpson's big play, the Gusties responded right back on their next drive with a touchdown, cutting the lead to 17-14. On third-and-11 from the Gustavus 36-yard line, Mena opted to throw a screen pass to running back Jeffrey Dubose (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.). After catching the screen and turning up field, an opening appeared down field following two key blocks by offensive lineman Lyle Opdahl (Sr., Norwood Young America, Minn.) and David Gschneidner (Jr., Edina, Minn.). Dubose hit the crease and scampered 64 yards down the sideline, stiff-arming a Simpson defender at the five-yard-line on his way into the endzone.

Dubose benefited from the solid play of Gustavus' offensive line throughout the afternoon, running for 119 yards on 26 carries for an average of 4.6 yards per run

The final count saw Gustavus gain a total of 366 yards (211 rush, 155 pass). The Gusties had no turnovers and were 1-of-2 in the red-zone. Simpson racked up a total of 466 yards, 427 of which were through the air.

Muresuk Mena played mistake free football in his first start under center, finishing 8-for-14 for 155 yards and two touchdowns through the air. His counterpart Taylor Nelson was 28-for-54 for 427 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions

Gustavus was led defensively by safety Jake Forcier (So., Watkins, Minn.), who had a team-high seven tackles (all solo) and one interception. Andrew Lonneman finished with a game-high three sacks and three tackles for loss.

AUGSBURG 26 GUSTAVUS 24

St. Peter, Minn. (5,699) Hollingsworth Field 75 degrees, Sunny

St. Peter, Minn. – The Gustavus football team suffered a heartbreaking 26-24 loss to Augsburg College on Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. With just :10 seconds remaining and Gustavus leading 24-20, Augsburg quarterback Ayrton Scott heaved a prayer towards the end zone. The ball came down into the hands of teammate Hakeem Bourne–McFarlane, who carried several Gusties across the goal line for the game–winning touchdown.

Augsburg improves to 2-0 overall and 1-0 in the MIAC with the victory, while Gustavus is now 1-1 overall and 0-1 in the MIAC.

If football fans attended today's "St. Peter Day" game expecting big offensive numbers, they were certainly not disappointed in what they wittnessed. Augsburg totaled 475 yards (192 rush, 283 pass) and Gustavus racked up 438 yards (199 rush, 239 pass) for a combined 913 yards of total offense.

The first quarter was nearly entirely consumed by two long drives by each team. Augsburg took the opening possession 67 yards on 12 plays, eating up 7:26 before missing a field goal from 30 yards out. Gustavus then capitalized on the next drive with a Tom Huepenbecker (Sr., Middleton, Wis.) 19-yard field goal (3-0) that capped a 15-play, 77-yard drive that took 7:14.

It would take until the :13-second mark of the second quarter before points were put on the scoreboard again. Gustavus capitalized on a forced fumble by safety Beau Bachman (Jr., St. Peter, Minn.) that was recovered by linebacker Joe Haas (Jr., Mission, Kan.) at the Augsburg 22-yard line. Quarterback Mursek Mena (Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) found Michael Hintze (So., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) on a three-yard slant to put Gustavus on top 10-0. It was Hintze's first career touchdown, as the sophomore would finish the game with 53 yards on five catches.

Augsburg would take back the momentum on the ensuing kickoff and head into the locker room trailing 10-7. After catching the kick on the 18-yard line, Bourne McFarland reversed his field several times and dodged multiple tacklers before seeing daylight on the far sideline. Picking up a convoy of blockers, he took the ball 82 yards for the score.

Gustavus' offense gained a total of 179 yards of total offense in the first half, while the defense came up with two fumble recoveries and allowed 162 total yards.

After Gustavus failed to score points inside the red-zone on the opening drive of the second half, Augsburg went 86 yards on six plays to score a touchdown and grab its first lead of the game at 14-10. Scott found tight end Adam Carl on a skinny post from 28 yards out for his first receiving touchdown of the afternoon.

The Gusties answered on the next drive with a touchdown of their own, taking the lead back at 17-14 with 5:24 left in the third quarter. Mena connected with Phillip Butler (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) on a bubble screen at the 12-yard line and the junior receiver leaped into the near corner of the end zone for his first touchdown of the year.

On what looked like to be sure points in store for the Auggies on their next drive, sophomore safety Jake Forcier (Watkins, Minn.) came up with a key defensive play that kept Gustavus in control of the lead and the ball at the start of the fourth quarter. After Augsburg's Carl was wrapped up following a short catch-and-run on the far sideline, Forcier ripped the ball from his hands at the ten-yard line and returned it to the Gustavus 21.

The Auggies came up with a turnover of their own on the next drive when Kaleb Williams picked off Mena with 7:02 left in the game. Augsburg turned the interception into points five minutes later when Carl redeemed himself with his second touchdown catch of the

game, putting the Auggies up 20-17 after the extra point attempt was missed. Carl led all receivers in the game, making nine grads for 101 yards and two touchdowns.

With 2:13 on the game clock, Muresuk Mena orchestrated a seven-play, 66-yard scoring drive that put Gustavus on top 24-20 with 1:04 left to play. For the second game in a row, Mena hooked up with Jeffrey Dubose (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) on the touchdown pass, hitting his running back on a wheel route from the 19-yard line.

The victory seemed all but sealed after Kellan Euerle (Jr., St. Cloud, Minn.) gave the Gustavus offense the ball back with :54 seconds on the clock after he picked off Scott on Gustavus' 42-yard line. This, however, was not the case, as Augsburg gained the possession back on its own 20-yard line following a Gustavus punt. Scott then marched the Auggies 38 yards in :24 seconds before his Hail Mary hookup with Bourne-McFarlane.

Both quarterbacks put their dual threat capabilities on full display at Hollingsworth Field this afternoon. Scott ran for 163 yards on 23 carries, and was 19-for-36 for 283 yards and three touchdowns through the air. His counterpart Mena ran for 80 yards on 21 carries, and was 19-for-27 for 239 yards with three touchdowns passing.

Gustavus' offensive line was once again superb, allowing just one sack and creating holes that led to 199 yards of rushing offense. Dubose finished with 70 yards on 14 carries, while Butler had 49 yards on six carries.

Andre Creighton (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) led the Gusties in receiving with 72 yards on six catches, three of which were key first down grabs.

The Gustavus defense recovered three fumbles and picked off one pass, helping the team to win the turnover battle for the second-straight week. The defense also held the Auggies scoreless on three of their four red-zone chances.

Forcier led the way with 10 tackles (4 solo, 6 asst.), while Zach Dilger (So., South St. Paul, Minn.), Matt Keller (So., Eagan, Minn.), and Anthony Boyce (So., Excelsior, Minn.) each had seven.

GUSTAVUS 14 ST. OLAF 17

Northfield, Minn. (6,219) **Manitou Field** 51 degrees, Mostly Cloudy

Northfield, Minn. – Despite a gritty fourth guarter comeback, the Gustavus football team fell by the score of 17-14 to St. Olaf on Saturday afternoon at Manitou Field. After Gustavus cut lead to three points late in the fourth quarter, St. Olaf was able to hold on maintain possession of the football until the final gun. Gustavus drops to 1-2 overall and 0-2 in the MIAC with the loss, while St. Olaf improves to 3-1 overall and 1-1 in the MIAC with the win.

After forcing a turnover and a punt on St. Olaf's first two possessions of the game, Gustavus failed to capitalize with the ball deep in St. Olaf territory. An interception by St. Olaf's Jimmy Gildea at the 19-yard line shut down one drive, and three straight sacks by the Oles led to a turnover on downs on the next drive.

St. Olaf capitalized on the ensuing possession when Dan Dobson went deep down the middle of the field to Stephen Asp for a 51-yard completion. Dobson took to the air on third-and-goal later in the drive, finding Jake Schmiesing on an out route from five yards out for the go-ahead touchdown (7-0).

The Gustavus offense began to click at the start of the second quarter. Quarterback Muresuk Mena (Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) broke free for a 21 and 27-yard run within the same drive to put Gustavus in the red-zone on the eight-yard-line. After running back Jeffrey Dubose (St. Paul, Minn.) took the ball down to the one-yard-line on a seven-yard carry, St. Olaf's defense responded with a goal-line-stand that proved to be a major momentum shift in the game. The Oles stopped Gustavus on three-straight dives, preserving their 7-0 lead halfway through the second quarter.

With a 7-0 edge following halftime, St. Olaf took advantage of another Gustavus miscue. After recovering a Mena fumble to Gustavus' 26-yard-line, Dobson found Schmiesing once again – this time on a five-yard slant – for a touchdown to extend the lead to 14-0 with 11:08 left in the third guarter.

Dobson finished the game 19-for-27 for 183 yards and two touchdowns passing. He found seven different receivers over the course of the day and rushed eight times for 50 yards. Stephen Asp was Dobson's top target, bringing down three catches for a game-high 75 yards.

After the Gustavus offense fumbled for the second-straight possession, the defense came up with big defensive stop on St. Olaf's next drive when safety Jake Forcier (Watkins, Minn.) picked off Dobson at the Gustavus 27-yard-line.

The Gusties used the momentum to cut the lead to 14-7 following an 11-play, 61-yard scoring drive. On third-and-goal from the four-yard-line, Mena was flushed out of the pocket after seeing that his key target was covered in the end zone. The senior eluded one tackle before scrambling free to the far sideline where he flanked the defense with speed and ran untouched across the goal line for the touchdown. Gustavus gashed the Oles with its running game on the drive, throwing only one incomplete pass and picking up all 71 yards on the ground.

Just when it looked as if Gustavus had turned a corner in the game, St. Olaf responded with its most important drive of the afternoon. Although the Oles settled for a 24-yard Lucas Walnman field goal (17-7), the 14-play drive lasted 8:32.

With 4:58 left to play in the game, Gustavus brought the score to a final at 17-14 after scoring a touchdown with less than three minutes on the clock. Once again, it was Muresuk Mena making a play with his feet. After seeing his hole collapse on a draw play on fourth-andone, Mena decided to reverse his field and look for a opening on the far side the field. With

eight St. Olaf players in the box selling out on the inside run, Mena found daylight on the outside, hitting a lane with speed and galloping 58 yards for touchdown.

The drive would be Gustavus' last of the game, as the Oles picked up a pair of first downs on the final possession of the game.

Although his squad threw for just 77 yards, Coach Haugen has confidence in his team's running ability early in the season. "We have committed ourselves to keeping it simple and doing a few things exceptional in our rushing game. The guys who have the ball in their hands are dynamic; there is no question about that. With Muresuk near 200 yards and Jeffrey over 100, our ground game is right where it needs to be right now."

The senior quarterback turned in what was a historic day running the football. With 193 yards on 24 carries (8.0 ypc), Mena ranks 15th all-time on Gustavus' single-game rushing list. He now holds the school record for most single-game rushing yards by a guarterback. With Dubose' 114 yards on 18 carries (6.3 ypc), Gustavus ran for a total of 350 yards.

Gustavus went 1-for-3 inside the red-zone, while St. Olaf capitalized on all three of its opportunities. The Black and Gold finished with 392 total yards compared to St. Olaf' 323 yards.

HAMLINE 0 GUSTAVUS 37

St. Peter, Minn. (2,329) Hollingsworth Field 78 degrees, Sunny

St. Peter, Minn. – The Gustavus Adolphus football team picked up its first MIAC victory of the season on Hall of Fame Day at Hollingsworth Field with a 37-0 victory over Hamline University on Saturday afternoon. With a 10-0 lead at halftime, Gustavus's ground game went work, scoring four rushing touchdowns in the second half and racking up a total of 283 yards in the game. Running back Jeffrey Dubose (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) stole the show with four touchdowns and a season/game-high 131 yards on the ground.

Gustavus improves to 2-2 overall and 1-2 in the MIAC with win, while Hamline drops to 1-3 overall and 0-3 in the MIAC.

After forcing Hamline to a three-and-out on the first drive of the game, Gustavus capped off a 22-yard drive with a 29-yard field goal by Tom Huepenbecker (Sr., Middleton, Wis.) to take a 3-0 lead with 10:53 left in the first quarter.

Huepenbecker's field goal would be the only points of the opening quarter, as the two teams combined for 77 yards of total offense.

At the start of the second quarter, Gustavus quarterback Muresuk Mena (Sr., Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) connected with fellow senior Andre Creighton (St. Paul, Minn.) on a 32-yard jump ball to give Gustavus first down and goal from the Hamline two-yard-line. Jeffrey Dobose plunged into the end zone on next play for his first touchdown of the day, extending Gustavus's lead to 10-0 following the extra point with 12:04 left in the half.

Hamline would move the ball into Gustavus territory twice over the remaining minutes of the quarter but could not put points on the board, as the two squads went into the break with Gustavus on top 10-0.

Despite losing a fumble on the opening drive of the third quarter, Gustavus responded with a forced fumble of its own on Hamline's next drive. Defensive end Zach Stackhouse (Sr., Houston, Minn.) forced the fumble at Gustavus's 40-yard-line and defensive tackle Donte Green (Jr., Minneapolis, Minn.) recovered it at the 39 to swing the momentum back to Gustavus's sideline.

The Gustie offense used that momentum to grab a 17-0 lead (8:05) after Dubose ran untouched into the end zone from ten yards out behind a convoy of blockers on a sweep.

Gustavus's defense forced Hamline to fumble on its next two possessions. A Matt Keller (So., Eagan, Minn.) strip was recovered by Stackhouse with less than five minutes left in the quarter, and an Anthony Boyce (So., Excelsior, Minn.) forced fumble was recovered by Keller with less than two minutes on the clock.

Dubose wasted no time putting the Gusties on top 23-0 with :45 seconds on the clock. Dobose ran the ball on all three plays of the drive before capping it off with a 13-yard touchdown run.

Mena's offense was in rhythm at the start of the fourth quarter, scoring on its next two drives to bring the score to a final at 37-0. Dubose crossed the goal line from the one-yard-line for the first score, and Mena scampered in from 17-yards out for the afternoon's final touchdown

Gustavus picked up a total of 283 yards on the ground and 119 yards through the air for a total of 402 yards in the game. It is the second time this season that Gustavus has eclipsed the 400-yard mark.

Mena and Dubose both went over 100 yards rushing for the second straight week. Mena ran for 116 yards on 15 attempts (7.7 ypc), while Dubose carried 25 times and averaged 5.2 yards per carry on the way to his third 100-yard rushing game of the season. Connecting with seven different receivers in the game, Mena went 7-for-16 for 82 yards with a touchdown and an interception through the air.

With four touchdowns today, Dubose also became the first Gustavus player to rush for four or more touchdowns in a game since Andy Traetow ran for five touchdowns against Hamline in 2002.

The Gustavus defense was responsible for a +4 rating in the turnover battle, forcing six fumbles and recovering five. Stackhouse recovered two fumbles, while Keller led the team with 12 tackles (three solo) and 1.5 tackles for loss.

Hamline finished with 138 yards rushing and 97 yards passing for a total of 235 yards. It was the first time since last season against Carleton that Gustavus held the opposition to under 100 yards passing.

Running back Austin Duncan led the Pipers with 85 yards on the ground, while guarterback Zach Brautigam went 8-for-19 for 97 yards through the air.

GUSTAVUS 14 ST. THOMAS 28

St. Paul, Minn. (3,750) O'Shaunessey Stadium 47 degrees, cloudy

St. Paul - The Gustavus Adolphus football team suffered a 28-14 loss to No. 3 St. Thomas on Saturday afternoon at O'Shaunessey Stadium. Despite cutting St. Thomas' lead to seven points (21-14) with nine minutes remaining in the game, a Gustavus interception followed by a Tommie touchdown turned out to be the difference in the game. Gustavus falls to 2-3 overall and 1-3 in the MIAC with the loss, while St. Thomas remains undefeated at 5-0 overall and 3-0 in the MIAC.

Gustavus' potent running game ran into its kryptonite in the form of the St. Thomas' 3-4 defensive front this afternoon. The Gustavus ground game, which was averaging over 250 yards per game coming into today, was held to a mere 32 total yards. Both quarterback Muresuk Mena (Sr., Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) and Phillip Butler (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) ran for 18 yards each to lead the Gusties.

The Tommies were the first to draw blood, taking advantage of a running in to the punter penalty on the opening drive and scoring four plays later to go up 8-0 after a successful two point conversion. St. Thomas quarterback Matt O'Connell completed a 35-yard post to Dan Noehring for the game's opening touchdown.

It would take until the final minute of the half before another point was added to the scoreboard. Following a Torey Asao (Jr., Chaska, Minn.) interception at the five-yard-line and a three and out by the Gustauvs offense, the Tommie offense took over at the Gustavus 43-yar-line. O'Connell completed a 23-yard pass to Dan Ferrazzo before finding Kyle Whitley in the end zone for a touchdown from nine yards out two plays later. After the extra point, St. Thomas would head to the locker room with a 15-0 lead.

The Tommies opened up a 21-0 lead after forcing Gustavus to a three-and-out on its opening drive of the third quarter. O'Connell broke several tackles and before reversing his field and taking a keeper 74 yards for a touchdown.

After fumbling on their next possession, hope seemed to be all but lost for the Gusties. Thanks to an Anthony Boyce (So., Excelsior, Minn.) sack and forced fumble, Gustavus received the momentum swing it needed. Cory Colvard (Sr., Centerville, Minn.) picked up the Boyce forced fumble and ran it back 53 yards for a Gustavus touchdown.

Gustavus intercepted O'Connell on St. Thomas' following two possessions, yet couldn't find a way to capitalize as the score would remain 21-7 by the start of the fourth quarter.

With under 10 minutes remaining in the game, Gustavus cut the lead to 21-14 on a six-yard touchdown from Mena to Butler. Mena's intended pass was knocked out of the hands of Michael Hintze (So., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) before falling into the arms of Butler in the corner of the end zone.

The Gustavus defense would come up with another big stop on St. Thomas' next possession, gaining control of the ball at the GAC 33-yard-line with 6:49 on the clock. On second down and nine, Mena's pass was picked off Tremayn Williams and the Tommies took over at the 18-yard-line. Two plays later, Brenton Braddock added the insurance touchdown from four yards out to bring the score to a final at 28-14.

Gustavus totaled 187 yards compared to St. Thomas' 468 in the game. Mena was 17-for-25 with one touchdown and one interception through the air. His top target of the day was Hintze who brought in five catches for 62 yards.

A bright spot for the Gusties was the stellar turnover generation by the defense. Corey Shea's defensive unit recovered three fumbles and picked off three passes to finish +4 in turnover margin.

Anthony Boyce led the defensive effort with a game-high 14 tackles (11 solo) and a sack. Torey Asao intercepted two passes, while Dilger also had one pick.

St. Thomas quarterback Matt O'Connell was 20-for-34 for 220 yards and two touchdowns. He spread the ball around to eight different receivers over the course of the game. The sophomore was also the game's leading rusher, running for 149 yards on 13 carries.



VALLEY CITY ST. 16 GUSTAVUS 0

St. Peter, Minn. (3,750) Hollingsworth Field 56 degrees, overcast

St. Peter, Minn. – On what was a drizzly Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field, the Gustavus football team suffered a 16-0 loss to Valley City State University on Homecoming. With a 9-0 lead following three field goals by kicker Thomas Cortez, Valley City State added a late touchdown to hand Gustavus its second straight loss.

With the loss, Gustavus drops to 2-4 overall, while Valley City State is now 5-2. Relying on a fast and physical defense that bottled up Gustavus quarterback Muresuk Mena (Sr., Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) for much of the afternoon, Valley City Sate made few mistakes on offense and took advantage of its opportunities in the red zone. The Vikings held the time of possession advantage 41:01-to-18:59 and scored on all four of its trips to the red zone.

After a pair of long drives on their first two possessions of the game, the Vikings grabbed a 6-0 lead after Thomas Cortez nailed 31-yard field goal at 10:10 of the first quarter and a 32-yard field goal at 13:39 of the second quarter. Valley City State tallied 132 yards of offense on its first two drives while eating up over 14 minutes of clock.

Gustavus had possession of the ball just four times in the first half, punting three times before time expired on its last drive of the half. The Gusties gained 86 yards of offense in the first half, as Valley City State took a 6-0 lead into halftime.

Gustavus' offense began to pick up late in the third quarter. Mena led a drive to the Valley City State 24-yard-line, where Gustavus elected to try a field goal after an incomplete pass on third down. From 41 yards out, Tom Huepenbecker's (Sr., Middleton, Wis.) field goal try was blocked by Matt Craft and the Vikings took over possession.

Valley City State used the momentum from the blocked kick to drive 54 yards on 13 plays the very next possession. After a third down stop by the Gustavus defense at the Gustie 20-yard-line, Cortez knocked through his longest field goal of the day from 37 yards out to put the Vikings on top 9-0 with 14:50 left in the game.

The Gusties threatened on their next possession, but came up with no points once a 45-yard field goal attempt by Huepenbecker came up just short.

After Gustavus turned the ball over on downs halfway through the fourth quarter, Valley City State capitalized once again. Running back Taylor Cino scored the game's only touchdown when he broke free for a 17-yard touchdown run that brought the score to a final at 16-0 with 5:15 on the clock.

Cino was the leading rusher in the game with 118 yards (4.5 ypc) on 26 attempts. Fellow running back back Derek Elliot followed behind Cino with 85 yards (5.3 ypc) on 16 attempts. Valley City State totaled 199 yards on the ground in the game.

Gustavus gained a total of 224 yards (96 rush, 128 pass) on the afternoon. Phillip Butler (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) led the Gusties on the ground with 40 yards (6.7 ypc) on six attempts, while Mena gained 36 yards (2.2 ypc) on 16 attempts.

Mena went 11-for-27 for 128 yards with an interception through the air. He connected with six different receivers, yet was sacked three times. Mena's top target was Michael Hintze (So., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) who caught three passes for 54 yards.

Viking quarterback Tommy Zinke was 14-for-23 for 151 yards passing. His top receiver was Ken Ellacin who made five catches for 37 yards. Valley City State tallied 350 yards

of total offense, 151 of which were through the air.

Leading the Gusties defensively was Lucas Kleinschrodt (Sr., Alden, Minn.), Joe Haas (Jr., Mission, Kan.), and Xavier Fust (So., Columbia Heights, Minn.). Kleinschrodt recorded a game-high 13 tackles (5 solo), while Haas had 11 (3 solo), and Fust had 10 (2 solo).

BETHEL 41 GUSTAVUS 21

St. Peter, Minn. (2,239) Hollingsworth Field 46 degrees, overcast

St. Peter, Minn. – The Gustavus Adolphus football team suffered a 41-21 loss to No. 15 Bethel University on Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. Led by an efficient offense, Bethel built on a 28-7 halftime lead before scoring two touchdowns in the third quarter to lead by as much as 41-7. Bethel quarterback Erik Peterson stole the show with a breakout performance in the passing game. Peterson was 27-for-29 for 315 yards with three touchdowns through the air.

Gustavus drops to 2-5 overall and 1-4 in the MIAC with the loss, while Bethel is now 6-1 overall and 4-1 in the MIAC.

Bethel's strong first half began with a seven-play, 68-yard scoring drive on the first possession of the game. On fourth-and-goal from the two-yard-line, Erik Peterson pitched the ball to Derek Waldbillig who found the end zone for the early touchdown, giving Bethel a 7-0 lead after the extra point.

After Bethel forced a three-and-out on the next possession, Gustavus' defense came up with a turnover when Xavier Fust (So., Columbia Heights, Minn.) forced a fumble that was recovered by Zach Dilger (South St. Paul, Minn.) at the Gustavus 24-yard line. The Gusties couldn't capitalize on the fumble and were forced to punt on the next drive.

The Royals extended their lead to 14-0 with :57 seconds remaining in the first quarter when Peterson found Hans Duininck on a slant from 19 yards out. The score was the first of what was five consecutive touchdown-scoring possessions that extended into the third quarter for Bethel.

The Bethel lead was pushed to 21-0 after Jesse Phenow pushed his way across the goal line at the 11:16 mark of the second guarter.

Gustavus responded to the big lead with a long drive of its own, going 75 yards on 12 plays to cut the gap to 21-7 with five minutes remaining in the half. On third-and-11 from the Bethel 15-yard-line, Muresuk Mena (Sr., Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) connected with Michael Hintze (So., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) who made a diving catch in the corner of the end zone. The touchdown catch was Hintze's second of the season.

Bethel took back the momentum heading into halftime with a 12-play drive on it's next possession. For the second time in the half, Phenow pounded the ball into the end zone, this time from one yard out, to put the Royals on top 28-7 at the break.

The Royals totaled 265 yards compared to Gustavus' 100 in the opening 30 minutes. Erik Peterson led an efficient aerial attack, going 16-for-17 for 196 yards passing. Mena was 2-of-6 for 29 yards through the air while leading the team in rushing 39 yards on 11 carries.

Despite picking up a pair of first downs on their opening drive of the second half, the Gusties turned the ball over when David Morgan picked off Mena at the Bethel 13-yard-line on a pass intended for Phillip Butler (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) deep down the middle.

Bethel went up 35-7 after an eight-play, 90-yard drive was capped off by a 12-yard touchdown

Bethel went up 35-7 after an eight-play, 90-yard drive was capped off by a 12-yard touchdowr pass from Peterson to Jay Hilbrands with 8:59 left in the third quarter.

The Royals' final score of the day come at the 1:36 mark of the third quarter when Peterson found Waldbillig from six yards out. Following a missed extra point, Bethel's lead was 41-7, its largest margin of the game.

The Gusties put together their best drive of the afternoon following the Waldbillig score, going 80 yards on 17 plays in 8:05 to cut the lead to 41-14. Facing fourth-and-goal from the Bethel two-yard-line, Mena plunged across the line on his second effort for the first of his

two rushing touchdowns.

Once Zach Stackhouse (Sr., Houston, Minn.) forced Peterson to fumble on Bethel's next drive, Gustavus took control at the Bethel 40 going in. On fourth-and-one from the 16, Mena opted to sneak for the first down. After getting lost in the mass of bodies that quickly filled any gap, the senior quarterback spun off the scrum and scampered 16 yards untouched for the touchdown.

Mena led the team in rushing with 89 yards on 26 carries (3.4 ypc) in the game. He was also 8-for-17 for 64 yards passing with one touchdown and two interceptions. Butler finished behind Mena with 83 yards rushing on eight carries (10.4 ypc).

Gustavus totaled 248 yards (184 rush, 64 pass) in the game compared to Bethel who gained a total of 452 yards (137 rush, 315 pass).

Both squads were efficient in the red zone, as Gustavus went 3-for-3 with three touchdowns and Bethel went 6-for-7 with six touchdowns. The Royals won the time of possession battle 34:31-to-25:29 and were 7-of-12 on third down.

The Gustavus defense was led by Joe Hass (Jr. Mission, Kan.) who recorded a game-high 10 tackles (3 solo). Torey Asao (Jr., Chaska, Minn.) had nine tackles (5 solo), while Lucas Kleinschrodt (Jr., Alden, Minn.) had seven.

GUSTAVUS 17 **SAINT JOHN'S** 31

Collegeville, Minn. (5,821) **Clemens Stadium** 40 degrees, mostly sunny

Collegeville. Minn. – The Gustavus football team suffered a 31-17 loss at the hands of Saint John's on Saturday afternoon at Clemens Stadium. Despite a 14-10 lead at halftime, Gustavus was outscored 21-to-3 in the second half on the way to its fourth straight loss. The Gusties drop to 2-6 overall and 1-5 in the MIAC, while Saint John's improves to 4-4 overall and 2-4 in the MIAC.

After winning the coin toss. Gustavus elected to receive for the first time this season. The Saint John's defense came up with a big turnover to start by picking off a Muresuk Mena pass on the third play of the game to take over possession at the Gustavus 23-yard line.

The Gustie defense responded to the short field by holding the Johnnies to a 32-yard field goal by Jimmie Mattson. The kick gave Saint John's a 3-0 lead with 10:44 on the clock.

Gustavus had trouble finding success on offense through its first three drives of the game, punting on three straight possessions after Mena's opening drive interception.

Saint John's capitalized on its early defensive effort at the start of the second quarter when quarterback Nick Martin connected with receiver Tyson Euerle on a fade in the corner of the end zone. Following the Mattson extra point, Saint John's was on top with 13:44 left in the second half.

Facing a 10-0 deficit. Gustavus turned the momentum to its sideline halfway through the second quarter. A 25-vard reverse by slot receiver Eddie Ramos (Jr., Lakeland, Fla.) provided the spark Gustavus needed. After picking up a first down on fourth-and-four on a Saint John's offside penalty later in the drive, Mena hooked up with Michael Hintze (So., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) two plays later for a 25-yard catch and run touchdown. Hintze took a swing pass and picked up a key downfield block to scamper into the end zone for his first touchdown of the day. Tom Huepenbecker (Sr., Middleton, Wis.) hit the extra point to cut the Johnnie lead to 10-7 with 7:45 on the clock in the second quarter.

After a sloppy stretch of possessions that saw both teams turn the ball over twice, the Black and Gold used one of its best drives of the season to take its first lead in three games.

Following a 20-yard run by Hintze and a 34-yard run by Eddie Ramos, Gustavus had first-and-ten at the Saint John's 31-yard-line with less than two minutes remaining in the half. The Gusties pounded the ball to the five-vard-line where Mena capped the drive with his second touchdown pass to Hintze with :23 seconds on the clock. Huepenbecker's extra point gave Gustavus a 14-10 lead heading in the locker rooms for halftime.

Mena was 9-for-13 for 72 yards passing in the first half. He connected with five different receivers. Michael Hintze was his top target with three grabs for 30 yards, while Ramos had two catches for 25 yards. Ramos would go on to lead the Gusties on the ground with two carries for 59 vards.

Gustavus totaled 180 vards of total offense compared to Saint John's 108 vards in the opening half.

Saint John's re-established itself offensively on the first drive of the third quarter, going 86 yards on six plays to re-take the lead 17-14. Nick Martin broke a 38-yard run for a touchdown with 12:17 on the clock.

The Gusties would not go away guietly, answering with a field goal on their next drive to knot the score at 17-17 with 8:36 left in the third. Huepenbacker capped off the 50-vard drive with his longest field goal of the season from 32 yards out.

From that point on it was all Saint John's. After forcing Gustavus to a three-andout, the Johnnies re-gained the lead after Colin Moynihan plunged across the goal line from three yards, giving the Johnnies a 24-17 advantage with less than a minute remaining in the third quarter.

The Johnnies brought the afternoon's scoring to a close at the 6:36 mark of the fourth guarter when Jake Essler scored on a six-yard run, extending the lead to 31-17 after the extra point.

Saint John's saw its ground game hit it's stride today, racking up 213 rushing yards with Martin and Stephen Johnson leading the way with 83 and 75 yards, respectively.

The Gusties couldn't find their first half rhythm following the Huepenbecker field goal in the third guarter and were shut out for the remaining minutes of the game. In what was a much-improved offensive performance than recent weeks, Gustavus totaled 296 yards (106 rush, 190 pass) on the day.

Breaking out with his finest performance of the season was Michael Hintze who caught two touchdown passes and totaled a season/team-best 91 yards receiving on six catches. Hintze was also the team's second-leading rusher with 47 yards on six carries.

Muresuk Mena finished the game 16-for-26 for 190 yards passing. He threw two touchdowns and one interception and was sacked seven times.

The Gusties were on the wrong end of the turnover battle this afternoon, losing three fumbles and throwing one pick. Gustavus' defense continued to force turnovers however, recovering a fumble and intercepting two passes. Leading the defense for the third straight week was linebacker Joe Haas (Mission, Kan.) who finished with a season/team-best 17 tackles (7 solo) and a fumble recovery. Safeties Beau Bachman (Jr., St. Peter, Minn.) and Kellan Euerle (Jr., St. Cloud, Minn.) came up with the interceptions, while Gustavus registered three sacks.

GUSTAVUS 41 CARLETON 27

Northfield, Minn. (1,821) Laird Stadium 42 degrees, cloudy

Northfield, Minn. – Thanks to it's best offensive performance of the season, the Gustavus Adolphus football team ran away with a 41-27 victory over Carleton College on Saturday afternoon at Laird Stadium. The Gusties picked up 28 first downs and totaled 493 yards of offense on the day. With the win, Gustavus snaps a four-game losing-streak to improve to 3-6 overall and 2-5 in the MIAC. Carleton drops to 3-6 overall and 1-6 in the MIAC with the loss.

Behind the arm of senior quarterback Tim Stepka (New Prague, Minn.), who was making his first collegiate start in a Gustavus uniform, the Gustie passing game came alive. Stepka's career day included two throwing touchdowns and a total of 297 yards passing after completing 23 of his 28 passes.

The Gusties and Knights went back-and-forth during the first 20 minutes of the game. Running back Jeffrey Dubose (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) kicked off the game's scoring with a 16-yard touchdown run that gave Gustavus a 6-0 lead at the 9:26 mark of the first quarter.

Following the Dubose touchdown, Carleton answered two minutes later with a 31-yard touchdown pass from Mike Hartwell to C.J. Dale to put Carleton on top 7-6.

The back-and-forth continued at the 3:21 mark of the quarter when Stepka scored his first career touchdown on a nine-yard run that put Gustavus in front 13-7 following Tom Huepenbecker's (Sr., Middleton, Wis.) extra point.

Carleton then tied the game at 13-13 with 10:26 remaining in the second quarter when Hartwell found Anthony Kemper on a five-yard touchdown pass. The touchdown would cap a series of four straight scoring possessions by both teams.

After punts by each team, Gustavus took back the lead at 20-13 with 4:18 left in the half when Dubose scampered into the end zone from 15 yards out for his second rushing score of the day. The junior was not done there as he later plunged across the goal line from the one-yard-line for his third touchdown of the day. Dubose's third touchdown gave the Gusties a 27-13 lead heading into halftime.

Dubose, who missed the last three games due to an injury, would lead all rushers in the game with 143 yards on 26 carries (5.5 ypc). Gustavus ran for a total of 211 yards in the

Despite not scoring in the third quarter, Gustavus held on to a 27-20 lead heading into the final 15 minutes of the game. Michael Hintze (So., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) scored his fourth touchdown in three weeks to put Gustavus up by two scores at 34-20 with 13:18 remaining in the game. Hintze filled the scoresheet up once again with another stellar performance, catching eight passes for a game-high 120 yards.

Carleton would not go away quietly, scoring a touchdown on a Hartwell to Derek Turner pass with 10:25 on the clock to cut the lead to 34-27. It would be their final points of the game, as the Gustie defense would shut down the Knights over the remaining minutes of the game. Gustavus responded to Carleton's score with a touchdown scoring drive on the next possession. Dubose made an impact through the air this time, catching a 31-yard pass from Stepka with the clocking reading 5:39 to bring the score to a final at 41-27

Gustavus finished the game a perfect 5-for-5 in red zone scoring. The Gusties also won the time of possession battle with 33:18 minutes and were 6-for-10 on third down conversions.

Gustavus' three linebackers Lucas Kleinschrodt (Jr., Alden, Minn.), Matt Keller (So., Eagan, Minn.) and Joe Haas (Jr., Mission, Kan.) led the Gustavus defense with a combined 29

tackles. Kleinschrodt and Keller led the team with 10, while Haas finished with nine. Haas and Travis Pepper (Overland Park, Kan.) also registered one sack each.

Carleton gained a total of 330 yards of offense, 261 yards of which came through the air. Gustavus shut down the Knight's ground game, holding them to 69 yards. Carleton quarterback Mike Hartwell went 26-for-39 for 261 yards with three touchdowns in the passing game. His top target was Chase Gottschk who caught nine passes for 111 yards.
