#### **THE SERIES**

#### **LAST WEEKEND**

Lawrence swept a weekend Midwest Collegiate Hockey Association series from Finlandia at the Appleton Family Ice Center.

Lawrence turned the tables on Finlandia late in the second period on Friday and went on to a 6-3 victory.

Lawrence trailed 3-2 and was skating two men down due to penalties, but the Vikings killed off the two-man advantage and then scored a pair of goals just moments later to seize the momentum. Lawrence then scored twice in the third period to seal the

second period thanks to goals from Brad Scurfield and Phil Bushbacher, but Finlandia scored two goals in a 56-second span midway through the period to grab a 3-2 edge.

Lawrence then took a pair of penalties that left the Lions with a twoman advantage for 1:39. The Vikings killed off the two-man advantage and were still down a skater when Finland-

ia's Kevin Smith was whistled for a fiveminute major and a game misconduct.

With the teams now both skating a man down, Scurfield scored off a face-off Logan Lemirande at the 13:15 mark to



tie the game at 3-3. Just 24 seconds later with Lawrence on the power play, Brandon Boelter's slapshot found the back of the net and the Vikings led 4-3.

Buschbacher then scored 4:08 into the third to put Lawrence up 5-3, and Logan Lemirande added a goal with just 1:41 left to seal the win.

Bushbacher and Scurfield both had a pair of goals, and Lemirande had four assists to go with his goal.

Michael Baldino made 19 saves to pick up the win. Troy Chandler stopped 42 shots for Finlandia and took the loss.

Lawrence scored three times in the first 9:39 of the third period and went on to a 5-2 win on Saturday.

Five different players scored for Lawrence, and Erik Soderlund and Paul Zuke had two assists apiece for

the Vikings. Lawrence also scored two short-handed goals, and the Vikings now have five short-handers on the season.

Lawrence led 2-1 entering the third period, and the Vikings quickly pulled away. Bushbacher scored off passes from Lemirande and Zuke just 2:22 into the period for a 3-1 lead. Rudi Pino then scored at the 5:54 mark off passes from Boelter and Soderlund for a 4-1 edge.

After Soderlund got whistled for roughing at 8:12, the Lions (3-6-0, 3-5-0) went on the power play but it was Lawrence that cashed in. Scurfield scored an unassisted short-handed goal at 9:39 for a 5-1 Lawrence lead.

Mike Montrose scored on the power play for Finlandia at the 14:20 mark to cut the lead to 5-2, but that's as close as the Lions would get.

Lawrence jumped on Finlandia early with Huck Saunders scoring for the Vikings just 6:31 into the first period. Lemirande got the first shorthanded goal of his career when scored at the 8:07 mark of the first to put the Vikings up 2-0. Justin Scott scored for Finlandia with just 1:32 left in the second period to trim the margin to 2-1.

Peter Emery made 28 saves to pick up the victory for Lawrence. Troy Chandler stopped 36 shots and took the loss.

in last Friday's win. The four assists ties the second-highest game total in Lawrence history. The record of seven was set by Tom Conti vs. Illinois Benedictine back on Nov. 21, 1998. Lemirande scored his first career shorthanded goal and added an assist in Saturday's victory.

Lemirande ranks second in the Midwest Collegiate Hockey Association at 1.67 points per game. He has three goals and 12 assists for 15 points. Lemirande is tied for the conference lead at 1.33 assists per contest.

Senior forward Brad Scurfield (Midland, Mich.) is now in the top 10 in career points. Scurfield picked up four points on the weekend and has 74 for Brad Scurfield his career, which is



good for ninth place on the Lawrence list. He trails Josh Peterson by three points for eighth place. Scurfield also moved up a spot on the career goals list with three goals this past weekend. He is tied with Andy Rozanski for eighth place with 36 goals. One of the goals this past weekend came on the power play, and Scurfield now ranks fourth on that list with 15 goals.

▶Freshman defenseman Brandon Boelter (Saginaw, Mich.) is tops in the conference in power-play points at 0.70 per game. He has two goals, and five assists for seven points on the man-advantage. Boelter also leads the league in defenseman scoring with four goals and eight assists for 12 points.

▶The short-handed goals continue in droves for the Vikings. Lawrence had two more short-handers over the weekend and now has five on the season. The Lawrence record of seven short-handers was set during the 2007-08 season.

#### **SCOUTING GUSTAVUS**

Gustavus Adolphus is coming off a weekend sweep of Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference rival Augsburg this past weekend.



The Gusties beat Augsburg 5-0 in the series opener and 3-2 in overtime the following evening.

Senior forward Ryan Johnson leads the Gusties' balanced scoring attack. He paces the team with five goals and five assists for a team-best 10 points. Gustavus has eight players with at least four points, 16 players with at least two points and 21 players who have a point this season.

▶The Gusties have split time in net between three players. Senior Tyler Venne has seen the most action and has a 2-2-1 record with a 2.30 goals against average and .913 save percentage. Sophomore Patrick Sullivan is 3-1-0 and with a 1.72 GAA and .949 save percentage, and sophomore John McLean is 1-2-0 with a 1.84 GAA and .936 save percentage.

#### November 2 Concordia (Wis.) 3, Lawrence 2

MEQUON, Wis. — The Lawrence University hockey team opened its season with a 3-2 Midwest Collegiate Hockey Association loss to Concordia (Wis.) University at the Ozaukee Ice Center.



Lawrence fell behind in the first 30 seconds of the contest and were never able to overtake the Falcons (1-3-0, 1-2-0 MCHA).

Concordia scored just 24 seconds into the game on Devin Stuermer's unassisted goal. Huck Saunders scored on the power play for the Vikings to tie the game at 1-1 just 7:35 into the first period.

Kevin Michaelcavage countered with a power-play goal for Concordia early in the second period, and the score stayed that way until Travis Payne scored at the 15:12 mark of the third for a 3-1 lead.

Brandon Boelter got his first collegiate goal for Lawrence just 46 seconds later off a pass from Brad Scurfield to trim the lead to 3-2, but that's as close as the Vikings would get.

Goaltender Jake Hebda made 31 saves to earn the win, and Peter Emery stopped 30 shots for the Vikings and took the loss.

Lawrence (1-2-0, 1-2-0 MCHA) got a pair of goals from both senior Brad Scurfield and freshman Rudi Pino. Peter Emery made 15 saves to pick up the win.

The game was tied 1-1 early in the second period when Phil Bushbacher scored on the power play to give Lawrence a 2-1 edge at the 5:38 mark.

Pino then got his first collegiate goal at the 10:04 mark, and the Vikings racked up three more goals in the next 5:34. Scurfield and Gustav Lindgren scored, and freshman Matt Moore capped the outburst with his first collegiate goal, a short-hander, at the 15:39 mark for a 6-1 lead.

Lawrence (2-2-0, 2-2-0 MCHA) trailed 3-0 early, rallied for a 6-3 lead and then needed a penalty shot and empty-net goal to seal the victory over the Lumberjacks (0-4-0, 0-4-0).

Erik Soderlund scored a pair of goals for the Vikings, and Logan Lemirande and Rudi Pino both had three points. Senior goaltender Michael Baldino came on in relief and made 16 saves to pick up the victory for Lawrence.
