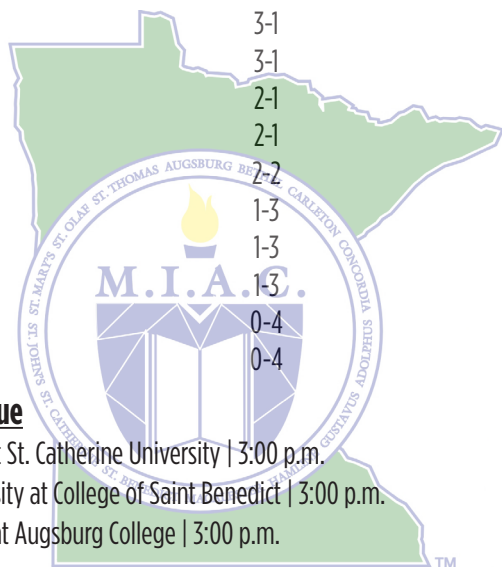

### Game Notes

**WOMEN'S BASKETBALL EMBARKS ON NEW SEASON...** On what is the 40th anniversary of Title IX, women's basketball at Gustavus has been seen on the campus of Gustavus Adolphus College since the turn of the 20th century. On February 14, 1903, it was women who played the first intercollegiate basketball game at Gustavus. On that date, the Gusties took on Mankato Normal at the local Opera House, falling by the score of 16-2. Since that time, the Gustavus women's basketball team has compiled a record of 608-413 overall and 434-234 in the MIAC. The Gusties have won two MIAC Championships, while Laurie Kelly is the 10th head coach in the history of the program.

**GEOGRAPHY LESSON...** The 2012-13 Gustavus Adolphus women's basketball roster features 18 student-athletes from a total of three states across the upper midwest. Home-grown natives of the Land of the 10, 000 Lakes make up the blunt of the roster with 15 players hailing from Minnesota. Illinois is represented by senior Jessica Richert and first-year Kelle Nett, while Kaitlin Kwasniewski is a product of Minnesota's western neighbor South Dakota.

**LAST TIME OUT...** The Gustavus women's basketball team broke its recent trend and got off to fast start on Wednesday night in its 66-54 victory Bethel University. With a ten point lead at halftime, the Gusties used stellar free throw shooting to keep Bethel from closing the gap in the second half. Gustavus shot 40-percent (22-55) from the field, 33.3-percent (2-6) from three, and a season-high 83.3-percent (20-24) at the free throw line.

Gustavus finished with three players in double-figures. Julia Dysthe paced the Black and Gold with a season/game-high 17 points after going 5-for-7 from the field, 1-for-1 from three-point range, and 6-for-6 at the free throw line. Abby Rothenbuehler earned a double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds after going 4-for-10 from

the floor. Karina Schroeder (Lake Crystal, Minn.) rounded out the group with another well-balanced night, scoring 11 points (4-11) and adding eight rebounds.

**THE SERIES...** Saturday's game marks the 66th meeting between Gustavus and Carleton in women's basketball. Gustavus holds the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 43-22. Since suffering a 51-46 loss to the Knights on Jan. 21, 2009, Gustavus has rattled off six consecutive victories in the matchup. The Gusties swept Carleton in the regular season last year with 73-31 and 70-44 wins.

**ABOUT THE KNIGHTS...** The Carleton women's basketball team suffered its first MIAC loss of the season on the road at Saint Benedict on Monday night. Saint Ben's built on a 27-20 halftime lead in the second half with a 43.3-percent shooting performance within the frame. Carleton's Emma Purfeerst and Skylar Tsutsui both finished in double-figures. Purfeerst recorded a double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds, while Tsutsui scored 13 points.

Forward Emma Purfeerst has proven to be one of the most well-rounded players in the MIAC through the opening stages of the season. She currently ranks third in the MIAC in scoring (13.2 ppg) and is second in rebounding (8.8 rpg). Her .629 field goal percentage is currently tops in the league while she also boasts the fifth-best free throw percentage at 91.3-percent. Megan Chavez is also averaging double-digits at 10.6 ppg, doing her damage at the charity stripe (.929) and from beyond the arc (.324).

Carleton is the league's third highest scoring team with a 63.4 ppg average entering the weekend. The Knights are shooting 39-percent from the field (5th/MIAC) and 31.6-percent from three-point range (3rd/MIAC). Turnovers have been an issue early as Carleton averages 22.4 per game (11th/MIAC).

**ROAD WARRIORS...** The Gustavus cagers have had to take on the role of road warrior because of their early-season road schedule this season. Seven of Gustavus' first eight games take place on the road. Gustavus is

currently 4-1 in road games not at a neutral site. Within those five games, the Gusties are shooting 46.6-percent from the field and are averaging 63.4 points per game.

**HOT FROM THE STRIPE...** The Gustie women have made the most of their trips to the free throw line over the past two games, shooting over 80-percent as a team from the charity stripe in both contests. Over that period, Gustavus is a combined 37-for-45 (82.2%). The Gusties are currently leading the MIAC in free throw shooting with a 74.8-percent shooting mark. Junior guard Julia Dysthe paces Gustavus at the line, going 17-for-18 (94.4%) to rank her second in the league behind Saint Ben's Emily Lueck who is shooting 94.7-percent.

**LEAGUE BEGINNINGS...** Gustavus is currently in the midst of its best start in conference play since the 2009-10 season. That year, the Gusties went 4-0 in the MIAC before the holiday break. The 2009-10 team went on to win its first five conference games before suffering a loss in early January. In the previous five seasons, Gustavus is a combined 26-11 before the Jan. 1st. The Gusties went 6-2 before the turn of the calendar last year.

**LOOKING AHEAD...** After Saturday's game with Carleton, Gustavus will be off because the holiday season for 24 days from Dec. 9 to Jan. 1. The lull is a well-deserved rest for the Gustie women who began practice on Oct. 15. The calm period leads into what is Gustavus' busiest month of the season. The Black and Gold will play 11 conference games over the month of January, seven of which will be at home on Gus Young Court.

**DOUBLE-DOUBLE...** Although Abby Rothenbuehler has consistently turned in a team-high marks in points and rebounds through the early portion of the season, she has narrowly missed that elusive double-double on numerous occasions. That changed on Wednesday against Bethel when Rothenbuehler scored 11 points and brought down 10 boards. The North Mankato product currently averages near a double-double at 13.4 points per game and 9.0 rebounds per game.

Laurie Kelly is currently in her first season as the head coach of the Gustavus women's basketball team. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a major in speech communications, replaces Mickey Haller, who resigned in March of 2012 after serving as the head coach for 12 years. Kelly comes to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she has directed the Division I Lumberjacks for the past nine seasons.

A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after a record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early '90s. In the past nine years at Northern Arizona, she has compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while also directing the team to its first-ever Big Sky Conference tournament title and NCAA tournament bid in the 2005-06 season. During Kelly's tenure, the Lumberjacks advanced to the Big Sky tournament six times with two appearances in the championship game (2006, 2007), and her teams have registered two of the three 20-win seasons in the program's history.

In addition to quality on the floor, her squads have also been strong in the classroom, with four players earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors including one Academic All-American. The Lumberjacks were recognized in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Academic Honor Roll six times, with two Top Ten national rankings.

Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In that first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the team to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly started her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-1 Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January of 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Laurie Kelly is the ninth head coach in the 44-year history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. The Gusties have compiled an all-time record of 603-411 (.594), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly will serve as the coordinator of the Gustavus Health Promotion program (GHP). The Gustavus Health Promotion program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan (9) and Madison (7).
