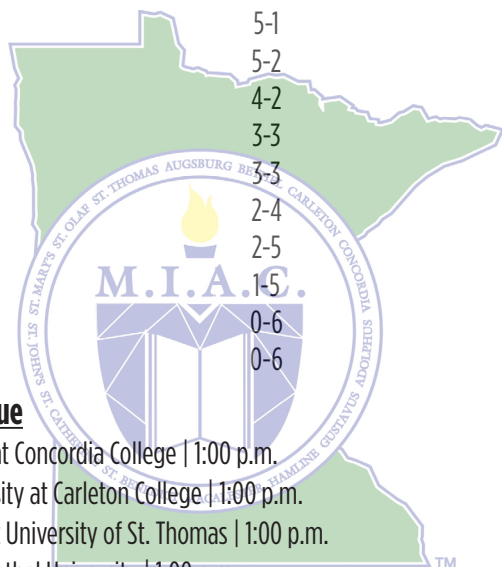

Game Notes

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL EMBARKS ON NEW SEASON... On what is the 40th anniversary of Title IX, women's basketball at Gustavus has been seen on the campus of Gustavus Adolphus College since the turn of the 20th century. On February 14, 1903, it was women who played the first intercollegiate basketball game at Gustavus. On that date, the Gusties took on Mankato Normal at the local Opera House, falling by the score of 16-2. Since that time, the Gustavus women's basketball team has compiled a record of 610-413 overall and 436-234 in the MIAC. The Gusties have won two MIAC Championships, while Laurie Kelly is the 10th head coach in the history of the program.

GEOGRAPHY LESSON... The 2012-13 Gustavus Adolphus women's basketball roster features 18 student-athletes from a total of three states across the upper midwest. Home-grown natives of the Land of the 10, 000 Lakes make up the blunt of the roster with 15 players hailing from Minnesota. Illinois is represented by senior Jessica Richert and first-year Kelle Nett, while Kaitlin Kwasniewski is a product of Minnesota's western neighbor South Dakota.

GUSTIE HOOPS IS ON THE AIR... The Gustavus vs. Hamline women's basketball game will be broadcast live on the airwaves of KNUJ AM 860 on Saturday afternoon. Gustavus play-by-play announcer Tom Wheeler, now in his seventh season as the voice of the Golden Gusties, will be at Gus Young Court for the live call of the game.

THE SERIES... Saturday's contest will be the 64th meeting between Gustavus and Hamline in women's basketball. The Gusties hold the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 55-8. Gustavus swept the Pipers in the regular season series last year with a 63-54 victory at home and an 83-82 overtime win on the road in St. Paul. Since losing to the Pipers 83-76 on Jan. 3, 2011, Gustavus has won the last three contests with Hamline. The Gusties are 6-4 against the Pipers in the last 10 meetings of the series.

HOT START IN LEAGUE PLAY... The Gustavus women's basketball team is off to its best start in conference play since the mid-2000s. The Gusties have won their past six games and are 6-0 in league play entering Saturday's contest. The last time Gustavus started 6-0 in MIAC play was during the 2003-04 season. The Black and Gold got off to an 8-0 start that year before falling to

LAST TIME OUT... Gustavus women's hoops earned an impressive 86-66 victory over Saint Mary's University in its last time out on Wednesday, Jan. 2 at Gus Young Court. Playing on their home court for just the second time this season, the Gusties jumped out to a 16-point halftime lead and never looked back - shooting a season-best 59.3-percent from the field in the game.

Gustavus finished with five players in the double-figures, the most this season. Stephanie Comer led the way with 19 points after going 5-for-9 from the field, 3-for-5 from three-point range, and 6-for-8 at the line. Julia Dysthe (7-10) and Karina Schroeder (6-8) finished next in line with 17 points each, while Abby Rothenbuehler scored 15 points (7-11) and Kelsey Florian added 12 (4-10).

Despite a late charge by the Cardinals in the second half, Gustavus would not let its lead diminish to less than 11 points at any occasion. Laurie Kelly's squad was once again stellar at the line in the second half, knocking down 13-of-14 free throws.

COMER BREAKS OUT... Senior guard Stephanie Comer broke out with a career-high 19 points in Wednesday night's outing against Saint Mary's. The senior guard got off to a fast start by going 4-for-7 from the field and 2-for-3 from three-point range to score 10 points to lead the Gusties in first half scoring. She went on to score nine points in the second half after knocking down one three and sinking all six of her free throws. Prior to Comer's 19 point performance, the Minnetonka product had scored in double digits just once. She scored 15 points after going 5-for-9 from three in a win over Hamline on Jan. 18, 2012. Heading into Saturday, Comer is averaging 5.8 points per game and is now shooting .313 from the field.

ABOUT THE PIPERS... The Hamline University women's basketball team enters Saturday's game coming off a 70-52 win over Macalester on Wednesday night at Hutton Arena. Hamline improved its league winning-streak to three games with the win and is now back at .500 in conference play.

Three Pipers finished in double figures against the Scots including Jordan Sammons, Steph Pilgrim, and Cassidy Vogt. Sammons scored a game-high 25 points after going 10-for-18 from the field. Pilgrim added 17 points on 5-of-13 shooting, while Vogt scored 10 after going 3-for-9 from the field. Despite trailing 30-26 at halftime, Hamline outscored the Scots 44-22 in the second half to earn the victory. Hamline shot 43.3-percent from the field and went 13-for-16 from the free throw line, which included a 10-for-10 showing in the second half.

Hamline is averaging 58.9 points per game (8th/MIAC) and is shooting shooting 36.5-percent (9th/MIAC) from the field as a team this season. Jordan Sammons comes into the weekend as the MIAC's leading scorer with a 15.8 points per game average. She has scored in double-figures in every game but one and has posted three double-doubles. Sammons' 46.3-percent field goal percentage ranks 13th in the league while her rebounding average of eight per game ranks second. Along with Sammons, Steph Pilgrim is also averaging double-figures, scoring 13.4 points per game to rank fourth in the league.

SEASON HIGHS... The Gusties recorded season-high marks in several key categories in Wednesday night's win over Saint Mary's. Gustavus recorded season-highs in points (86), field goals made (32), field goal percentage (.593, 32-54), and three-point field goal percentage (.444, 4-9).

ROTHENBUEHLER, DECEMBER ATHLETE OF THE MONTH... Much of the team's success in the final four games before the holiday break was a credit to the play of senior post Abby Rothenbuehler who led the Gusties to a 4-0 record inside a time-span of just eight days in the early stage of the month. For her efforts, Rothenbuehler was named the Gustavus Female Student-Athlete of the Month for December. She averaged 15 points and 8.8 rebounds while shooting 54.7-percent from the field, 83.3-percent from three-point range, and 75-percent from the free throw line. She played an average of 33 minutes per game and recorded four blocked shots.

BY THE NUMBERS...

3 - The number of consecutive MIAC contests that Hamline has shot 40-percent or over in. The Pipers are shooting .413 from the floor as a team over their last three conference games.

74.9 - The league-best free throw percentage of the Gustavus women's basketball team. Within conference play, the Gusties are shooting an MIAC-high 75.4-percent from the charity stripe.

4 - The number of players playing in Saturday's Gustavus versus Hamline game who rank inside the top 10 in the MIAC in scoring. Sammons leads the league with a 15.8 ppg average, while Abby Rothenbuehler sits in second at 13.8 ppg. Steph Pilgrim is scoring 13.7 ppg (4th/MIAC), and Julia Dysthe is scoring 13.3 ppg (5th/MIAC).

Laurie Kelly is currently in her first season as the head coach of the Gustavus women's basketball team. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a major in speech communications, replaces Mickey Haller, who resigned in March of 2012 after serving as the head coach for 12 years. Kelly comes to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she has directed the Division I Lumberjacks for the past nine seasons.

A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after a record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early '90s. In the past nine years at Northern Arizona, she has compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while also directing the team to its first-ever Big Sky Conference tournament title and NCAA tournament bid in the 2005-06 season. During Kelly's tenure, the Lumberjacks advanced to the Big Sky tournament six times with two appearances in the championship game (2006, 2007), and her teams have registered two of the three 20-win seasons in the program's history.

In addition to quality on the floor, her squads have also been strong in the classroom, with four players earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors including one Academic All-American. The Lumberjacks were recognized in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Academic Honor Roll six times, with two Top Ten national rankings.

Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In that first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the team to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly started her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-1 Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January of 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Laurie Kelly is the ninth head coach in the 44-year history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. The Gusties have compiled an all-time record of 603-411 (.594), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly will serve as the coordinator of the Gustavus Health Promotion program (GHP). The Gustavus Health Promotion program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan (9) and Madison (7).
