

Game Notes

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL EMBARKS ON NEW SEASON... On what is the 40th anniversary of Title IX, women's basketball at Gustavus has been seen on the campus of Gustavus Adolphus College since the turn of the 20th century. On February 14, 1903, it was women who played the first intercollegiate basketball game at Gustavus. On that date, the Gusties took on Mankato Normal at the local Opera House, falling by the score of 16-2. Since that time, the Gustavus women's basketball team has compiled a record of 614-414 overall and 446-235 in the MIAC. The Gusties have won two MIAC Championships, while Laurie Kelly is the 10th head coach in the history of the program.

GEOGRAPHY LESSON... The 2012-13 Gustavus Adolphus women's basketball roster features 18 student-athletes from a total of three states across the upper midwest. Home-grown natives of the Land of the 10, 000 Lakes make up the blunt of the roster with 15 players hailing from Minnesota. Illinois is represented by senior Jessica Richert and first-year Kelle Nett, while Kaitlin Kwasniewski is a product of Minnesota's western neighbor South Dakota.

ALUMNI DAY... Saturday is also Alumni Day for the Gustie women's basketball team, as head coach Laurie Kelly welcomes former players along with family and friends of the program back to campus. The day's festivities will begin with an alumni basketball game played at 11:00 a.m. on Gus Young Court. Following the alumni game, the team will host a luncheon at 12:30 p.m. inside the President's Dining Hall located in the Jackson Student Center. All in attendance are welcomed to join. The day will conclude with a gathering in the NCAA Championships room following Gustavus's game with Saint Ben's.

THE SERIES... Saturday's game will serve as the 64th meeting between Gustavus and Saint Benedict in women's basketball. The Blazers hold the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 43-20.

In the first meeting of the season between the two squads, Gustavus was able to

come away with a 64-61 win at Claire Lynch Hall to improve to 2-0 in MIAC play. Trailing by eight points at halftime, Gustavus came roaring back in the second, outscoring the Blazers 37-26 on the way to the three point win. The Gusties shot a red-hot 58-percent from the field in the second half and outscored the Blazers 12-to-4 in the final five minutes.

Abby Rothenbuehler, Julia Dysthe, and Kelsey Florian all finished in double-figures. Rothenbuehler led the way with 18 points on 8-of-10 shooting. Dysthe went 6-for-10 from the field and 3-for-6 from three-point range to score 17 points, Florian rounded out the group with 11 points after going 3-for-5 from the floor and 5-for-7 at the line.

LAST TIME OUT... The Gustavus women's basketball team was able to snap its two-game losing-skid with a 69-42 win in its last outing on Wednesday night at Gus Young Court.

It was déjà vu to Gustavus' first meeting of the season with Bethel for both Julia Dysthe and Abby Rothenbuehler. Dysthe, who led the way with 17 points against the Royals in the first meeting, scored a season-best 18 on 7-for-12 shooting tonight. Rothenbuehler, who notched her first doubledouble of the season in Arden Hills with 11 points and 10 rebounds, scored 26 points after going 12-for-19 from the field.

Gustavus shot 43.5-percent (27-62) from the field and finished with a 45-to-34 rebounding advantage. The Black and Gold scored 40 points in the paint compared to Royals' eight.

ABOUT THE BLAZERS... The Saint Benedict women's basketball team enters the weekend riding a five-game winning-streak that began with a 66-62 win over then No. 3 St. Thomas on Jan. 12. The Blazers are most recently coming off a 55-34 win in what was their worst shooting performance of the five-game stretch. Saint Ben's shot 30.5-percent from the field on Wednesday in St. Joseph, while the visiting Scots shot just 18.9-percent. With Macalester on top 22-20 at halftime, Saint Ben's played a much improved game in the second half, outscoring the Scots 35-to-12 in the frame.

Three Blazers finished in double-figures as Morgan Dale led the way with 15 points (4-6). Whitney Canton finished second in line with 12 points (4-14), and Brianna Barrett rounded out the group with 10 points (3-10).

Barrett is the only player on the Saint Ben's roster currently averaging double-figures, scoring 13.4 points per game for a fifth place ranking in the MIAC. Canton has had the hot hand as of late, leading the team in scoring three of the past five games for an average of 14.6 ppg. She is averaging 9.9 ppg on the year, while Dale averages 7.5 and Tish Alexander averages 7.1.

Within conference play, Saint Ben's is shooting 39.5-percent from the field (4th/MIAC). The Blazers are the best three-point shooting team in the league, hitting at a 37.2-percent clip from behind the arc. Inside their current five-game win-streak, the Blazers are averaging 66.4 points per game and are shooting 41.4-percent from the field.

DYSTHE AND ROTH GET THE BALL ROLLING... Junior guard Julia Dysthe and senior forward Abby Rothenbuehler got back on track with stellar performances on Wednesday night against Bethel. Dysthe, who was just 7-for-24 from the floor in her previous two games, went 7-for-12 from the field for a career-best 18 points. Rothenbuehler recorded her third double-double in four games after scoring a career-high 26 points (12-19) and matching her career-best with 15 rebounds. The senior's previous 15-rebound performance came her rookie season against Augsburg on Dec. 9, 2009.

BACK-TO-BACK... The Saint Benedict and Gustavus women's basketball teams currently sit in third and fourth place, respectively, in the MIAC in both scoring offense and points allowed. Within league play, Saint Ben's scores an average of 65.9 ppg and allows an average of 57.5 ppg. Gustavus is right behind the Blazers in both categories, averaging 64.4 ppg offensively and 55.3 ppg defensively.

BY THE NUMBERS...

- **.522 -** Gustavus' field goal shooting percentage the last time it took on Saint Benedict. Saint Ben's shot just .339 in the first meeting.
- **1.5 -** The team-leading assist-to-turnover ration of Gustavus' Kelsey Florian. Florian ranks seventh in the MIAC in the category.
- **.580 -** The conference-leading shooting percentage of Gustie post Karina Schroeder. Gustavus has two players shooting over .500, as Abby Rothenbuehler is currently shooting .506.





Laurie Kelly is currently in her first season as the head coach of the Gustavus women's basketball team. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a major in speech communications, replaces Mickey Haller, who resigned in March of 2012 after serving as the head coach for 12 years. Kelly comes to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she has directed the Division I Lumberjacks for the past nine seasons.

A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after a record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early `90s. In the past nine years at Northern Arizona, she has compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while





Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In that first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the team to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly started her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-1 Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January of 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Laurie Kelly is the ninth head coach in the 44-year history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. The Gusties have compiled an all-time record of 603-411 (.594), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly will serve as the coordinator of the Gustavus Health Promotion program (GHP). The Gustavus Health Promotion program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan (9) and Madison (7).
