The Gustavus Adolphus football team will travel to Arden Hills, Minn., for a battle with fifth-ranked Bethel on Saturday, Oct. 26th. After a 42-21 win last weekend against non-conference opponent Valley City State, the Gusties will look for a second straight win as they enter back into conference play. The Royals escaped last weekend with a 28-21 victory over No. 15 St. Thomas after trailing 21-14 midway through the fourth quarter. Gustavus enters this weekend's action with a 4-2 (2-2 MIAC) record, while Bethel comes in with a perfect 6-0 (4-0 MIAC) record.

### **GAME NOTES**

#### **Gusties Take To Gridiron For 97th**

**Season...** The Gustavus football team is now in its 97th season in 2013. Over the previous 96-plus years, the Gusties have compiled a record of 471-337-21, including a record of 372-242-13 in conference play. With 22 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) championships, Gustavus has claimed the second-most league titles in the 93-year history of the conference. Only Saint John's (31) has claimed more MIAC championships.

Follow The Gusties On KNUJ... KNUJ AM 860 out of New Ulm, Minnesota will once again broadcast all ten Gustavus regular season football games. The voice of the Golden Gusties Tom Wheeler will handle the play-by-play duties for the eighth consecutive season. Wheeler will once again be joined by 1984 Gustavus graduate and former Gustie football player Ken Ericson on the live call of this year's games. Fans can listen to the KNUJ broadcasts on the Internet through the Gustavus Athletics website. In addition, Gustavus will once again video stream all home games for viewing on your computer and portable internet device through GameCentral by Stretch Internet. Calling All Captains... Of over 5,000 student-athletes who have played football for Gustavus in the 97-year history of the program, only 188 have earned the privilege to serve as team captain. Peter Haugen's captains this season include seniors Torey Asao, Beau Bachman, Jeffrey Dubose, David Gschneidner, and Lyle Opdahl.

Senior Leadership... With 22 seniors on this year's squad, the Gustavus roster features the fourth-most seniors on any Gustie football team in the last 20 years. The 2003 (28), 2002 (26), and 2011 (23) teams are the only three squads during that span to have more seniors wearing Black and Gold. This year's senior class features four offensive linemen, three wide receivers, two running backs, and two tight ends from the offensive side of the ball, while the defense features five defensive backs, four defensive linemen, and two linebackers

Gustie Football Around The Globe... The 2013 Gustavus football team features a total of 107 players from nine different states and, for the second time in the last four years, a country outside the United States. Of those 107 players, 93 claim Minnesota as their native state. A combined four players call Kansas home, while one player each hails from California, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Iowa, South Dakota, and Wisconsin. Mexico also makes its presence felt on this year's roster as it is the homeland of three Gusties, all of whom hail from Cancun.

The Series... Saturday's match up will be the 36th meeting between Gustavus and Bethel on the gridiron. The Royals hold the slight advantage in the all-time series with a record of 18-17. However, the series has been all Bethel lately, as the Royals have won six of the last seven meetings, including last season's contest in St. Peter. In that game, Bethel opened up a 21-0 lead midway through the first quarter and never looked back on the way to a 41-21 victory. The Royals were dominant through the air, as quarterback Erik Peterson completed 27 of 29 passes (93.1%) for 315 yards and three touchdowns compared to no interceptions. Bethel gained 452 yards of total offense (137 rushing, 315 passing) on the afternoon compared to just 248 (184 rushing, 64 passing) for Gustavus.

Meet The Head Coaches... Gustavus Head Coach Peter Haugen is in his fifth season at the helm of the Gustavus football program. Haugen has a combined record of 17-29 in his first four-plus seasons. A graduate of Bethel University, Haugen was the head coach at Washburn High School in Minneapolis prior to coming to Gustavus. Bethel Head Coach Steve Johnson is in his 25th year at the head of the Bethel football program. A native of Chicago, Johnson graduated from Bethel in 1978 before beginning his coaching career. Johnson made stops at St. Cloud State, St. Cloud Cathedral High School, the University of Minnesota, and Montana State before landing the Bethel job in 1989.

About The Royals... Bethel remained perfect on the season last Saturday when it defeated St. Thomas 28-21 in Arden Hills. The Royals took a 14-0 lead into halftime, but the Tommies came back to score 21 unanswered points in the third quarter to take a 21-14 lead. With their backs against the wall, the Royals scored two touchdowns in the final seven minutes, the last of which came with :40 seconds remaining, to capture the seven-point victory.

Through six games, Bethel has proven itself to be the top offense in the MIAC. The Royals are averaging 39.8 points and 465.2 yards of total offense per game this season. Both marks lead the league in their respective categories. Bethel is averaging 280.3 yards passing (2nd/MIAC) behind the arm of Erik Peterson, who has completed 119 of 169 passes (70.4%, 1st/MIAC) for 1,564 yards (260.7 ypg, 2nd/MIAC) and 10 touchdowns (3rd/MIAC). His favorite target so far has been Mitch Hallstrom. Hallstrom

has hauled in 42 receptions (2nd/MIAC) for 526 yards (3rd/MIAC) and an average of 87.7 yards per game (2nd/MIAC). On the ground, the Royals are averaging 204 yards per game, which ranks fourth in the MIAC. The Royal rushing attack is led by Brandon Marquardt, who has rushed 77 times for 605 yards (100.8 ypg, 3rd/MIAC) and seven touchdowns (2nd/MIAC). His 7.9 yards per carry are first among all MIAC rushers

Defensively, the Royals are allowing 19.3 points (4th/MIAC) and 327.7 total yards (3rd/MIAC) per game. Of those 327.7 yards of total offense, 190.8 are given up through the air (3rd/MIAC) and 136.8 on the ground (4th/MIAC). The defense is led by Seth Mathis, who has racked up 67 tackles (27 solo) on the season. His 67 tackles rank third in the MIAC, while Josh Treimer ranks third in the league in interceptions with three. The true strength of the Royal defense has been its ability to create turnovers. Through six games, Bethel has posted a turnover margin of +11, which ranks tied for sixth in all of NCAA Division III.

Last Minute Scoring... In Saturday's 42-21 win over Valley City State, the Gustavus offense scored six touchdowns. Ironically, three of those six touchdowns came in the final minute of a quarter, two of which came in the final :05 seconds. The Gusties scored with :01 second left in the first quarter before scoring with :04 seconds remaining in the second. Gustavus scored again in the final minute of the third quarter, scoring a touchdown:43 seconds before the final frame. The Gusties have made a habit of scoring this way so far this season, as they have now scored six times in the final seconds of a quarter. That mark equals last year's total and is the most in the last five years.

**Dubose Among Nation's Leaders...** With a stellar first half of his senior season, Jeffrey Dubose has emerged as one of the most prolific running backs in all of NCAA Division III college football. Dubose currently ranks tied for fourth in the nation in total touchdowns (15), rushing touchdowns (14), and total points scored (90). He also leads the MIAC in all three categories after scoring multiple touchdowns in five of six games this season.

Balancing Act... The Gustavus offense used a balanced scoring attack in Saturday's 21-point win. The Gusties scored six total touchdowns on the afternoon, three coming through the air and three more on the ground. The last time Gustavus accomplished such a feat in the same game was on Oct. 6th, 2001, when

#### **MIAC Offensive Player-of-the-Week**

### Erik Peterson, Bethel Orono, Minn./Orono

Bethel remained perfect on the season with a 28-21 win over St. Thomas last weekend thanks in large part to the play of quarterback Erik Peterson. Peterson completed 20 of 29 passes for 262 yards and two touchdowns. He also led his team down the field twice in the final seven minutes to come from behind in the win.

#### **MIAC Defensive Player-of-the-Week**


#### Seth Mathis, Bethel Anoka, Minn./Anoka

Linebacker Seth Mathis filled up the stat sheet in Saturday's big win over St. Thomas.

Mathis made 16 tackles (7 solo) on the day to go along with a forced fumble, a fumble recovery, a tackle-for-loss, and three pass breakups. The Royals held the Tommies to 21 points and 352 yards of total offense on the afternoon.

#### MIAC Special Teams Player-of-the-Week

Jack Gilliland, St. Thomas Simi Valley, Calif./Brethren



Gilliland scored his first career touchdown on Saturday in a seven-point loss to Bethel. Gilliland returned the opening kickoff of the second half to the house to cut the Bethel lead to 14-7. The return sparked a St. Thomas comeback that would see the Tommies take a 21-14 lead before eventually falling in the closing minutes.

the Gusties defeated Carleton by a final score of 47-7 in St. Peter. At the time, the win improved Gustavus's record to 4-1 (3-1 MIAC) on the way to a season record of 7-3 (6-3 MIAC), the best finish to a season for any Gustie team in the last 12 years.

D, D, De-fense... Through six games this season, the experience of the Gustavus defense has shown through as it is one of the top defenses in the MIAC. The Gusties are allowing an average of 17.8 points (3rd/MIAC) and 287.7 yards of total offense (2nd/MIAC) per game. Gustavus is also tied for the league lead in interceptions (10) and ranks second in passing yards (177.5 ypg), rushing yards (110.2 ypg), and turnover margin (+8). The Gustie "D" has allowed 300 or more yards just once all season, giving up 353 total yards to the conference's second-leading offense in Augsburg.

Red Zone Offenses... Saturday's contest features the MIAC's top two red zone offenses. Bethel sits atop the league, scoring on 22 of 25 chances inside its opponents 20-yard line for a conversion percentage of 88-percent. Gustavus follows closely at an 85-percent clip after capitalizing on 22 of its 26 chances. The Royals have scored 19 touchdowns in its 25 possessions in the red zone while the Gusties have crossed the goal line 20 times.

Grass Stains... With the evolution of field turf and other multi-purpose surfaces, it is becoming more and more difficult to find natural grass fields. Bethel is one of three teams remaining in the MIAC that host such fields, while the other six teams have all made the transition to turf. Saturday afternoon's contest at Royal Stadium will be the first and only game played on a natural grass surface for the Gusties this season. Last season, Gustavus won its only game on grass when it beat Carleton 41-27 in Northfield on November 3rd. Over the past five-plus seasons, the Gusties have racked up a record of 5-3 on grass, compared to a record of 23-25 on turf.

Seniors Stepping Up... For the second straight week, a senior stepped up with a career performance last weekend. In the wake of a banged up receiving core, wide receiver Cole Engen was called upon and delivered with two catches for 23 yards, a touchdown, and a two-point conversion on Saturday. Prior to last week, Engen had caught just three passes for 34 yards in his entire career. His performance came one week after linebacker Lucas Kleinschrodt exploded onto the scene with a career performance agaisnt St. Thomas. Kleinschrodt had his hand in three turnovers and recorded seven tackles (4 solo). The

senior recovered two fumbles and pulled down an interception in the game.

#### **Dubose Racing Into The Record Books...**

Senior running back Jeffrey Dubose etched his name in the Gustavus football record books with three touchdowns in Saturday's win over Valley City State. The senior now has 38 career total touchdowns, surpassing Ron Straka '81 and Jay Schoenebeck '80, and sits alone atop the career total touchdowns list.

All three of Jeffrey's touchdowns on Saturday came on the ground, giving him 31 rushing touchdowns in his career. He now sits tied for second with Jay Schoenebeck two TDs shy of the Gustavus record of 33, held by Ron Straka.

On top of the scoring accolades, Dubose is also climbing the list of rushing yards leaders. With 2,805 yards, Jeffrey has surpassed Andy Traetow '03 to move into fourth place on the list behind Ron Straka '81, who is third with 3,071 yards. Dubose has a chance to break the record, as he is now 510 yards behind Tom Dahlberg '73 (3,315 yards).

Gusties Against the Top 25... In Head Coach Peter Haugen's four-plus years at the helm of the Gustavus football program, the Gusties have not defeated a team ranked in the top 25 in the D3football.com national rankings, a trend they will look to break on Saturday afternoon against the No. 5-ranked Royals. During Haugen's tenure, Gustavus is 0-11 against top 25 teams. Its most recent loss came earlier this season to then-No. 6 St. Thomas 20-12 on Oct. 12th in St. Peter. Of the 11 losses, three have come to Bethel. In those three losses, the Gusties have averaged a deficit of 18 points per game. Their last loss to the Royals was a 41-21 defeat in St. Peter last season when Bethel was ranked No. 14 in the D3football.com poll.

### BETHEL 41 GUSTAVUS 21

St. Peter, Minn. (2,239) Hollingsworth Field 46 degrees, overcast

**St. Peter, Minn.** – The Gustavus Adolphus football team suffered a 41-21 loss to No. 15 Bethel University on Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. Led by an efficient offense, Bethel built on a 28-7 halftime lead before scoring two touchdowns in the third quarter to lead by as much as 41-7. Bethel quarterback Erik Peterson stole the show with a breakout performance in the passing game. Peterson was 27-for-29 for 315 yards with three touchdowns through the air.

Gustavus drops to 2-5 overall and 1-4 in the MIAC with the loss, while Bethel is now 6-1 overall and 4-1 in the MIAC.

Bethel's strong first half began with a seven-play, 68-yard scoring drive on the first possession of the game. On fourth-and-goal from the two-yard-line, Erik Peterson pitched the ball to Derek Waldbillig who found the end zone for the early touchdown, giving Bethel a 7-0 lead after the extra point.

After Bethel forced a three-and-out on the next possession, Gustavus' defense came up with a turnover when Xavier Fust (So., Columbia Heights, Minn.) forced a fumble that was recovered by Zach Dilger (South St. Paul, Minn.) at the Gustavus 24-yard line. The Gusties couldn't capitalize on the fumble and were forced to punt on the next drive.

The Royals extended their lead to 14-0 with :57 seconds remaining in the first quarter when Peterson found Hans Duininck on a slant from 19 yards out. The score was the first of what was five consecutive touchdown-scoring possessions that extended into the third quarter for Bethel.

The Bethel lead was pushed to 21-0 after Jesse Phenow pushed his way across the goal line at the 11:16 mark of the second quarter.

Gustavus responded to the big lead with a long drive of its own, going 75 yards on 12 plays to cut the gap to 21-7 with five minutes remaining in the half. On third-and-11 from the Bethel 15-yard-line, Muresuk Mena (Sr., Inver Grove Heights, Minn.) connected with Michael Hintze (So., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) who made a diving catch in the corner of the end zone. The touchdown catch was Hintze's second of the season.

Bethel took back the momentum heading into halftime with a 12-play drive on it's next possession. For the second time in the half, Phenow pounded the ball into the end zone, this time from one yard out, to put the Royals on top 28-7 at the break.

The Royals totaled 265 yards compared to Gustavus' 100 in the opening 30 minutes. Erik Peterson led an efficient aerial attack, going 16-for-17 for 196 yards passing. Mena was 2-of-6 for 29 yards through the air while leading the team in rushing 39 yards on 11 carries.

Despite picking up a pair of first downs on their opening drive of the second half, the Gusties turned the ball over when David Morgan picked off Mena at the Bethel 13-yard-line on a pass intended for Phillip Butler (Jr., St. Paul, Minn.) deep down the middle.

Bethel went up 35-7 after an eight-play, 90-yard drive was capped off by a 12-yard touchdown pass from Peterson to Jay Hilbrands with 8:59 left in the third quarter.

The Royals' final score of the day come at the 1:36 mark of the third quarter when Peterson found Waldbillig from six yards out. Following a missed extra point, Bethel's lead was 41-7, its largest margin of the game.

The Gusties put together their best drive of the afternoon following the Waldbillig score, going 80 yards on 17 plays in 8:05 to cut the lead to 41-14. Facing fourth-and-goal from the Bethel two-yard-line, Mena plunged across the line on his second effort for the first of his

two rushing touchdowns.

Once Zach Stackhouse (Sr., Houston, Minn.) forced Peterson to fumble on Bethel's next drive, Gustavus took control at the Bethel 40 going in. On fourth-and-one from the 16, Mena opted to sneak for the first down. After getting lost in the mass of bodies that quickly filled any gap, the senior quarterback spun off the scrum and scampered 16 yards untouched for the touchdown.

Mena led the team in rushing with 89 yards on 26 carries (3.4 ypc) in the game. He was also 8-for-17 for 64 yards passing with one touchdown and two interceptions. Butler finished behind Mena with 83 yards rushing on eight carries (10.4 ypc).

Gustavus totaled 248 yards (184 rush, 64 pass) in the game compared to Bethel who gained a total of 452 yards (137 rush, 315 pass).

Both squads were efficient in the red zone, as Gustavus went 3-for-3 with three touchdowns and Bethel went 6-for-7 with six touchdowns. The Royals won the time of possession battle 34:31-to-25:29 and were 7-of-12 on third down.

The Gustavus defense was led by Joe Hass (Jr. Mission, Kan.) who recorded a game-high 10 tackles (3 solo). Torey Asao (Jr., Chaska, Minn.) had nine tackles (5 solo), while Lucas Kleinschrodt (Jr., Alden, Minn.) had seven.

Peter Haugen, a native of Minneapolis and a 1991 graduate of Bethel University, is entering his fifth year as head football coach at Gustavus Adolphus College.

In his fourth year as head coach, Haugen led the Gusties to a 3-7 record overall and a 2-6 mark within the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, finishing seventh in the league standings. In four-plus seasons at the head of the Gustavus Adolphus football program, Haugen has compiled an overall record of 17-29 and an MIAC record of 12-24. Last season, Gustavus received four all-conference selections in running back Jeffrey Dubose (St. Paul, Minn.), offensive lineman Brian Grundmeyer (Inver Grove Heights, Minn.), defensive lineman Donte Green (Minneapolis, Minn.), and linebacker Joe Haas (Mission, Kan.). Dubose earned first team distinction while Grundmeyer, Green, and Haas all earned a spot on the second team.

Haugen, who was the head football coach at Washburn High School for 15 years prior to coming to Gustavus, compiled an overall record of 111-44 during that span, while winning 11 league championships and posting a league record of 76-8. He directed the Millers to the Class AAAA quarterfinals in 2007 finishing with a mark of 9-3. In his last season as the Millers head coach, Haugen's squad posted a mark of 8-2. While building the program at Washburn, Haugen increased player participation from 35 players in 1994 to 110 players. He also implemented academic monitoring and meal programs for student athletes as well as creating and directing the highly successful Washburn Athletic Leadership Academy. He served as the chair of the Minneapolis Football Conference this past year and he is an active clinician working at many local and regional clinics including the NIKE Coach of the Year clinic. Haugen was also a member of the Metro coaching staff for the Minnesota All-Star game in 1998. He started his coaching career at his alma mater serving as the offensive line coach during the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

A three-sport standout at Bethel, Haugen was a starting tight end on the football team, a starting goaltender on the hockey team, and a starting catcher on the baseball team in the late '80s and early 90s. In his senior year, he earned All-Conference honors in football, and was selected Most Valuable Player of the hockey team.

Haugen became the 17th head coach in the 96-year history of Gustavus football. The Golden Gusties have a long and storied football tradition that includes 22 MIAC titles. The program ranks in the top-50 all-time in Division III (out of 235 institutions) with a .580 winning percentage (471-337-21). The Gusties will soon join a very elite group of 37 NCAA Division III institutions whose football teams have won 500 games. Along with great teams, Gustavus has also been blessed with many outstanding individual players, which includes 29 players who have received All-America honors, 12 who have received CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, and five who have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Most recently in 2012, senior safety Brad Kruckeberg was awarded an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

#### **GAME 1 - SEPT. 14**

### SIMPSON 21 GUSTAVUS 28

St. Peter, Minn. (2,739) Hollingsworth Field 77°, Sunny

**St. Peter, Minn.** – The Gustavus Adolphus football team kicked off its 2013 season with a 28-21 victory over Simpson College Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. Trailing 7-0 late in the first half, the Gusties rattled off 28 unanswered points heading into the fourth quarter to take a 28-7 lead. Simpson did not go quietly, however, as the Storm scored twice in the final six minutes of the game to pull within seven. In the end, the Gusties drained the remaining 2:29 on the final drive of the afternoon to hang on for the 28-21 win. Gustavus begins the season 1-0, while Simpson drops to 1-1.

"It's a great feeling to win a football game," remarked linebacker Joe Haas (Sr., Mission, Kan.). "We have been working towards this since last season, and to come out here and play like we did, it feels amazing."

After an empty outcome on its first possession, Simpson drove the ball 74 yards in seven plays and 2:44 to take an early 7-0 lead. A pair of big plays on the ground from Ethan Calvert and Tyler Kenny for gains of 17 yards and 23 yards, respectively, highlighted the drive, which was capped off by an eight-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Taylor Nelson to Ryan Olson.

On Simpson's next possession, Joe Haas recovered a fumbled snap for the first of what would be four straight turnovers between the two teams. The Gusties returned the favor two plays later with a fumble inside the Simpson five-yard line only to get it right back on an athletic interception by Torey Asao (Sr., Chaska, Minn.). Three plays later it was Simpson's turn to force an interception and the flurry of turnovers was finished.

Gustavus threatened on each of its next two possessions, but could not find a way to put points on the scoreboard until the final :26 seconds of the half. Following a pair of 20-plus-yard completions, Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) carried off right tackle for a two-yard touchdown run to even the score at 7-7 heading into halftime.

"I think we did a nice job of keeping our composure in the first half when we weren't playing how we wanted to, especially on the offensive side of the ball," mentioned Dubose. "We stuck with it and took the momentum when we scored at the end of the half."

The 15-minute halftime break could do nothing to break the spirit of the newly rejuvenated Gusties. They proceeded to score on each of their first three possessions of the second half to open up a 28-7 lead midway through the third. On its opening drive following the break, Gustavus marched 69 yards down the field in 11 plays to score the half's opening touchdown on an 11-yard run by Jeffrey Dubose. On the play, Dubose surpassed the 2,000-yard rushing milestone, becoming just the 11th player to do so in the history of the Gustavus football program.

"It means a lot to me," admitted Dubose of his accomplishment. "A big reason why I have gotten this far is because of the coaches and my teammates. The coaches have kept their faith in me and my teammates have been willing to block for me. From the offensive line out to the receivers, it has really been a team thing. They put the yards in front of me and I just had to grab them."

The Gusties needed just two plays on the following drive, thanks to a 53-yard touchdown run by quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) that extended the Gustavus lead to 21-7. After Xavier Fust (Jr., Columbia Heights, Minn.) recovered a fumble inside the Simpson nine-yard line, Hendricks scored his second touchdown of the day with a four-yard touchdown run.

However, Simpson would not go quietly. In a 28-7 hole, Simpson came back to score two touchdowns in the final six minutes of the game to pull within seven points. The Storm scored on a 35-yard touchdown pass from Nelson to Mike Kuhn to narrow the lead to 28-14 before Taylor fired another touchdown pass to Nate Connealy.

"Simpson has a great offense, we learned that last year, and they showed it today when they scored two touchdowns in two minutes," said Haas. "We held together as a defense and got the turnover we needed to make a stand on the goal line."

In the end, however, the Gusties drained the final 2:29 with the final drive of the game to hold on for the 28-21 win.

"We came out and moved the ball the first few drives of the second half and rode the momentum," added Dubose. "They came back at the end, but we just had to turn the page and get back on track. Sometimes you have lows during a game, but you have to stay steady. I think we did a good job of doing that."

Gustavus was led offensively by Mitch Hendricks. In his first start as a Gustie, Hendricks completed 27-of-42 passes for 222 yards and also carried the ball nine times for 57 yards and two touchdowns. He was joined in the ground game by Jeffrey Dubose, who carried 22 times for 75 yards and two touchdowns. Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) led all receivers with 11 catches for 53 yards.

Defensively, Joe Haas recorded seven tackles, while also forcing a fumble and recovering a fumble. Jake Forcier (Jr., Watkins, Minn.) registered five tackles and an interception on the day.

The Gusties will be back in action next Saturday when they travel to Minneapolis to take on Augsburg at 1:00 p.m. Even with the win, Head Coach Peter Haugen knows there is room for improvement heading into next week.

"I think we need to play cleaner," stated Haugen. "Offensively in the first half, there were plays to be made and we were close to making them but just couldn't seem to figure it out. We ended up doing that in the second half, but we need to play cleaner from the start."

#### **GAME 2 - SEPT. 21**

#### **GUSTAVUS** 16 **AUGSUBRG** 19

Minneapolis (1,409) **Edor Nelson Field** 55°, Mostly Cloudy

Minneapolis – After leading on the scoreboard for nearly 44 consecutive minutes of game clock on Saturday, the Gustavus football team surrendered its lead to Augsburg late in the fourth quarter and would not get it back as it fell to the Auggies by a final score of 19-16 at Edor Nelson Field. Augsburg's game-winning drive required four plays to march 78 yards in :51 seconds to score the go-ahead touchdown with just 2:37 remaining. With the loss, Gustavus drops to 1-1 overall and begins Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) play 0-1. Augsburg improves to 2-0 and opens its MIAC schedule

After receiving the opening kickoff, the Gustavus offense proceeded to control the remainder of the first quarter. The Gusties dominated the time of possession battle, controlling the ball for 11:03 of the opening 15 minutes. Following an interception on its first drive, Gustavus took over at the 12:30 mark and would not give the ball up until there was just 3:47 remaining in the quarter, rattling off a 16-play, 58-yard drive that began at its own 10-yard line. However, the Gusties came up empty-handed when they failed to convert on fourth down in Augsburg territory. Because of the dominance in possession, the Gustie defense was able to hold the Augsburg offense to just 29 total yards in the opening quarter compared to 104 yards for Gustavus.

The Gustavus offense chewed up another 3:30 to begin the second quarter before Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) got the Gusties on the scoreboard with a two-yard touchdown run. The touchdown capped a nine-play, 91-yard drive that was highlighted by a 45-yard carry from Dubose on the first play of the second frame. The senior's two-yard score was his third touchdown of the season and gave the Gusties a 7-0 lead following a Tom Schleusener (Jr., Rapid City, S.D.) extra point.

Augsburg answered with a touchdown of its own on the ensuing possession. A 45-yard kickoff return to the Gustavus 49-yard line by Tyrell Martin set up what would be a 12-play, 49-yard drive that was capped by an 11-yard touchdown pass from Auggie quarterback Ayrton Scott, who accounted for all 49 yards on the drive (27 pass, 22 rush), to Joey Sonnenfeld. With the Gusties now leading 7-6, a rare turn of events ensued on the point-after attempt. The extra point try was blocked by Torey Asao (Sr., Chaska, Minn.) and returned all the way to the endzone by Beau Bachman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) to give Gustavus two points on what should have been the game-tying extra point. As it stood, the Gusties took a 9-6 lead to halftime, as neither team was able to put any more points on the board before the break.

After forcing a three-and-out on the Augsburg's first possession of the second half, Gustavus came out to score on its opening drive of the third quarter. Beginning on their own 32-yard line, the Gusties drove 68 yards in nine plays to take a 16-6 lead. Carrying the workload throughout the day, Jeffrey Dubose carried the ball seven times for 48 yards on the drive, 12 of them coming on his second touchdown run of the afternoon

Just as in the first half, Augsburg again had the answer in the third guarter. The Auggies marched 75 yards in nine plays, highlighted by a 45-yard completion from Ayrton Scott to Phil Putratz that would have spotted the ball inside the Gustavus five-yard line were it not for a personal foul penalty assessed to Augsburg. The Auggies were not to be denied, however, and put the ball in the endzone on the second scoring connection between Scott and Joey Sonnenfeld, this time from 10 yards out.

Augsburg threatened again late in the third and into the fourth on a 15-play, 50-yard drive that stretched over 4:54 of game clock, but the drive stalled at the Gustavus 13-yard line when the Auggies failed to convert on fourth down.

Gustavus could not pass midfield on either of its next two drives, as the Augsburg punting unit pinned the Gusties deep in their own territory in both situations. After eating up 7:53 on its second drive of the guarter, Gustavus was forced to punt on fourth down and 16 yards to go.

Augsburg took over on its own 22-yard line and four plays later owned a 19-16 lead. A 21-yard completion to Sonnenfeld, a 12-yard run by Scott set the Auggies up for a 46-yard touchdown on a screen pass to Phil Putratz to give Augsburg its first lead of the game with 2:37 to play. The Gusties began what would be their final possession at their own 41-yard line, but a key fumble on the first play of the drive put the seal on the outcome as the Auggies were able to milk the remaining 2:24 and wrap up the 19-16 victory.

"We went into the game thinking we had to contain their quarterback and run the ball well. We did both of those today," commented Head Coach Peter Haugen. "I thought we did a great iob of limiting what their quarterback was able to do on the ground. We wanted to make him beat us with his arm, and Augsburg was able to make enough plays in the passing game to

For the game, Gustavus running back Jeffrey Dubose carried 37 times for a career-high 227 vards. His performance ties the Gustavus record for most carries in a game, while his 227 rushing yards rank seventh on the all-time single-game rushing yards list, 31 yards behind the record of 258 yards set by Ray Wilson `09 against Augsburg in 2008.

Through the air, Gustavus quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) completed 12 of 23 passes for 100 yards and was sacked twice on the day. Gustavus' leading receiver was Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) for the second week in a row. Butler hauled in four receptions for 34 yards.

"We have to score more points." Haugen put simply. "Jeffrey did a great job running the ball today and our guys up front were terrific, but we weren't as effective in our passing game as we needed to be. Augsburg did a good job punting the football, so we played on a long field for a good part of the day, but we just weren't as sharp as we needed to be."

Defensively, Cameron Cropsey (Jr., Eagan, Minn.) led the way for the Gusties, Cropsey registered eight total tackles (4 solo) and intercepted a pass on the day. Travis Pepper (Jr., Overland Park, Kan.) came next with 7 tackles (2 solo), while Beau Bachman recorded the lone sack on the day.

Quarterback Avrton Scott led the way for the Auggies offensively. Scott accounted for 258 vards through the air and 56 more on the ground. He also tallied three passing touchdowns on the day, two of which connected with Joey Sonnenfeld, who caught a total of four passes for 66 yards. Phil Putratz led all receivers in the game with five catches for 104 yards and a touchdown.

Michael Juberian led the Augsburg defense in the game. Juberian registered 18 tackles (5 solo) on the day. Felix Coleman joined him with double-digit tackles, notching 10 total (6 solo) on the afternoon

The two teams were nearly identical in most offensive categories. Gustavus claimed 21 first downs compared to Augsburg's 19, while the Auggies outgained the Gusties in total yardage by a single vard. Augsburg gained 353 yards on 68 offensive plays in comparison to 352 yards on 71 plays for Gustavus. However, the key difference proved to be Gustavus' two turnovers, one of which came on its final drive of the game, compared to just one for Augsburg

#### **GAME 3 - SEPT. 23**

### ST. OLAF 19 GUSTAVUS 45

St. Peter, Minn. (3,144) Hollingsworth Field 54°, Partly Cloudy

**St. Peter, Minn.** – After trailing 13-7 at the outset of the second quarter, the Gustavus football team rattled off 38 unanswered points to capture a 45-19 victory over St. Olaf on Homecoming Saturday at Hollingsworth Field. The Gusties racked up over 400 yards of total offense and came up with four interceptions of St. Olaf quarterback Nate Penz on their way to the 26-point win. Gustavus improves to 2-1 overall and 1-1 in the MIAC, while St. Olaf falls to 1-3 overall and 1-2 in the MIAC.

"It means a lot to play like we did today," said Head Coach Peter Haugen. "We talked about it being a 'hinge' moment for us all week, and I think the biggest thing was that you could see our guys had energy and they kept believing. It was just a great team effort. I felt like each guy did what they're being asked to do. We had a lot of energy and it was certainly a big win for us."

On the first possession of the game, with St. Olaf's punting unit in place, Gustavus cornerback Zach Dilger (Jr., South St. Paul, Minn.) committed a roughing-the-kicker penalty that gave the Oles a first down and kept the drive alive. On the very next play, Dilger made up for his wrongdoing by pulling down his first of two interceptions on the day near midfield. The Gustie offense proceeded to march 53 yards in eight plays on its first possession of the game, which was capped off by an Aaron O'Gorman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) 10-yard touchdown run. O'Gorman's first career touchdown gave the Gusties the early 7-0 lead at the 8:30 mark of the first quarter.

"St. Olaf is a big rivalry game for us, so the whole week the intensity was building up to today," said Dilger. "We were ready to go, so it was nice to come out here and get off to a fast start."

St. Olaf responded with two touchdowns in the next two minutes, the first of which was a 55-yard strike from Nate Penz to Joel Reinhardt. After the Gustavus kickoff landed out-of-bounds, the Oles needed just three plays to tie the game at 7-7. On the second play of the ensuing Gustavus drive, quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) made his only mistake of the day, throwing an interception at his own 30-yard line. After a two-yard return, the Oles took over at the Gustavus 28 and wasted little time in reaching the endzone. St. Olaf scored two plays later with a 9-yard pass from Penz to Jake Schmiesing. The extra point failed to keep the score at 13-7 in favor of the Oles. St. Olaf would threaten again late in the first quarter, but a Dilger interception in his own endzone would extinguish all hope of extending the lead any further before the quarter break.

As if it were a ticking time-bomb, the Gustavus offense exploded with production in the second quarter. The Gusties got the ball back with 11:08 remaining in the frame and would proceed to score on six of its next seven possessions to score 38 unanswered points. Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) kicked things off with his first of three touchdown runs on the day. Just over four minutes later, Hendricks found Jordan Rudenick (Sr., Nicollet, Minn.) down a seam in the middle of the field after a play-action fake. Rudenick bulled his way across the goal line to give Gustavus a 21-13 lead with 2:17 to play in the opening half. Two plays later, the Gusties had the ball back after Kellan Euerle (Sr., St. Cloud, Minn.) intercepted a pass on the first play of the next St. Olaf drive. Gustavus took over at its own 38-yard line and after methodically moving the ball down the field, a Thomas Schleusener (Jr., Rapid City, S.D.) field goal with :17 seconds left in the half put the Gusties on top 24-13 heading to the break.

"In the first quarter we were getting settled in," said Matt Boyce (So., Excelsior, Minn.). "We needed to see what they were running defensively and adjust accordingly, so we threw some different formations at them. By the second, we had it figured out and our coaches did a great job with our play-calling."

Boyce provided a spark coming out of the break. The sophomore returned the opening second half kickoff 61 yards to the St. Olaf 28-yard line. Five plays later, Dubose scored his second touchdown of the afternoon to extend the lead to 31-13 with 12:49 to play in the third quarter. Boyce followed four minutes later with an incredible diving catch in the endzone on the ensuing possession. Matt made an adjustment on a deep ball thrown over the top of his head toward the sideline and still managed to keep a foot in-bounds to put the Gusties on top 38-13. Dubose would cap Gustavus' scoring output for the day on his third and final touchdown of the afternoon, a one-yard run with 9:42 left in regulation that brought the score to 45-13.

St. Olaf would score on the final play of the game to cut the lead to 45-19, but it was too little, too late for the Oles as the Gusties walked away with the 26-point victory.

On the day, the Gustavus offense amassed 433 yards of total offense (301 passing, 132 rushing). Mitch Hendricks led the way through the air, completing 29 of 39 passes for 301 yards and two touchdowns. His favorite target, Matt Boyce, hauled in 13 passes for 150 yards and a touchdown. Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) came next with nine catches for 71 yards. Jeffrey Dubose tallied three touchdowns and 99 yards in the ground game on 23 carries.

"We knew coming in that they play a lot of cover three and we could attack them with certain routes, so we worked on those all week," mentioned Boyce. "Our scout defense was phenomenal, especially our secondary. They are a huge part of our success today because of their work hammering it out during practice all week."

Defensively, the Gusties held St. Olaf to 282 total yards (207 passing, 75 rushing) and forced four turnovers, all of which were interceptions led by Zach Dilger with two. Kellan Euerle and Nick Frandsen also recorded a pick on the day. Gustavus also sacked St. Olaf quarterback Nate Penz three times for a total of 29 yards lost. Cameron Cropsey (Jr., Eagan, Minn.), Anthony Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.), and Xavier Fust (Jr., Columbia Heights, Minn.) all had one sack each.

"They have great receivers, and they were really hurting us in the first quarter with the intermediate passing game," stated Haugen of his defense's play. "We switched some things up, gave their quarterback a few different looks defensively, played a little man-to-man, and I think that really helped us."

Gustavus will now look to carry the win into next week's contest against Hamline. "We need to bring the same kind of focus we brought this week into next week's practices," finished Dilger. "We can't take a step back. We have to keep moving forward with more focus and determination and we will get it done next Saturday."

Haugen echoed his junior cornerback's mindset, "Moving forward, we need to demonstrate that we are a mature football team," finished Haugen. "If you have one solid week, a mature team follows it up with another solid week, so I think that needs to be the message this week. We need to continue to grow, be critical of mistakes that we have and fix those mistakes, and play cleaner."

The Gusties will be back in action next Saturday, Oct. 5th when they travel to St. Paul to take on Hamline for a 1:00 p.m. kick off at Klas Field.

#### **CAME 4 - OCT. 5**

#### **GUSTAVUS 52 HAMLINE**

St. Paul (1,533) Klas Field 60°, Mostly Cloudy

St. Paul - Following an interception by Zach Dilger (Jr., South St. Paul, Minn.) on Hamline's opening drive, the Gustavus football team put its foot on the gas and would not let off until late in the third quarter on its way to a 52-7 victory over Hamline on Saturday afternoon at Klas Field. The Gustavus offense scored on all six of its possessions of the first half and its opening two drives in the second half to open up a 52-0 lead before Hamline scored in the fourth quarter to bring the final score to 52-7. With the win, Gustavus improves to 3-1 overall and 2-1 in the MIAC, while the Pipers fall to 1-3 overall and 0-3 in the MIAC.

"We have been talking a lot about momentum and carrying things over to the next week," said junior safety Jake Forcier (Watkins, Minn.). "The big goal for us was to go 1-0 this week. That has been the motto throughout the year: go 1-0 every week. Last week was big win for us, but this week was a different opponent and I think we did a good job of focusing solely on Hamline this week."

After allowing the Hamline offense to pick up a pair of first downs on its opening drive, Zach Dilger came down with an interception off a tipped ball and returned it 30 yards to the Hamline 48-yard line to set up the Gustavus offense. The Gusties would not let the opportunity go to waste, as Thomas Schleusener (Jr., Rapid City, S.D.) connected on a 30-yard field goal to give the Gusties a 3-0 lead with 10:29 to play in the opening quarter.

"Coach Shea has preached fast and physical defense all year, and that starts up front" continued Forcier. "Our d-line has been doing a great job of getting it done and getting after the guarterback. That makes it easy on us in the secondary. When they force quarterbacks out of the pocket, they are uncomfortable and that allows us to get tips on some passes, which Dilger took advantage of today with his pick."

After holding Hamline to 16 yards on the next possession, the Gusties drove 85 yards in nine plays to cross the goal line and take a 10-0 lead. Gustavus converted a key third down on the drive when guarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) completed a 38-yard strike down the sideline to receiver George Buchner (Fr., Excelsior, Minn.) on third-and-11 that kept the possession alive. The drive was capped off by Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) when he took a handoff and went up-and-over the pile from one yard out.

The Gusties got the ball back three plays later and proceeded to score once more on a Dubose touchdown run, this time from four yards out. Gustavus again converted on a key third down on the drive with a completion from Hendricks to Buchner to push the offense on to take a 17-0 lead.

"Our offense played really well today and I think it was our ability to convert on third down that was the difference in the game," acknowledged Head Coach Peter Haugen. "Early on we were forced to convert a couple of third and long situations, which gave us some confidence right from the start."

From there, the Gusties controlled the remainder of the half, scoring on each of its next three drives to end the second guarter. Dubose scored from 28 yards out after breaking two tackles and cutting to the outside where he outraced everyone to the pylon to push the lead to 24-0. On the ensuing kickoff, Hamline kick returner Hoyfal Adam fumbled on his own five yard line where Beau Bachman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) snatched the ball off the bounce and took it home for the score. Dubose capped the half of scoring with an eight-vard touchdown reception off a screen pass out of the backfield to extend the lead to 38-0 with just :25 seconds remaining in the half. The scored capped an 11-play, 94-yard drive that took just 4:32.

It took just two plays out of halftime for Dubose to break off a 57-yard touchdown run to put the Gusties in front 45-0. The touchdown put an end to the afternoon for the offensive starters, as they would turn the reigns over the second team, which in turn scored on its first possession in the game. Aaron O'Gorman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) scored his second touchdown of the season on a five-vard run with 8:08 to play in the third before the Gusties were forced to punt for the first time all afternoon on the next possession with just over 2:00 remaining in the quarter.

Hamline's Austin Duncan scored on a three-yard touchdown run midway through the fourth quarter, but it was far too late for the Pipers in the 45-point loss.

For the game, Gustavus racked up 489 yards of total offense (230 passing, 259 rushing) in the 52-point performance. However, the key on the stat sheet was a 67-percent (8-for-12) conversion rate on third down, while not turning the ball over. Running back Jeffrey Dubose led the way for the Gusties with 200 yards on 16 attempts (12.5 avg) to go along with four touchdowns on the ground. Dubose also caught two passes for 15 yards and another touchdown through the air to bring his touchdown total to five on the day. Quarterback Mitch Hendricks was on point all afternoon, completing 15-of-18 passes (83.3%) for 184 yards and a touchdown. His favorite target was Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) caught seven passes for 60 yards on the day.

Although dominant in the first half, the Gustavus defense allowed over 100 yards rushing for the first time this season, as Hamline ran for 154 yards. However, the Pipers were held to iust 61 yards rushing in the first two quarters. Hamline also gained 109 yards passing for 263 total yards on the day. Individually, Lucas Kleinschrodt (Sr., Alden, Minn.) led the way with 10 tackles (5 solo), while Zach Dilger raked in an interception and Beau Bachman recovered a fumble for a touchdown.

Gustavus will next host the University of St. Thomas on Saturday, Oct. 12th for family weekend and Coach to Cure MD in St. Peter. That kick off is set for 1:00 p.m. on Saturday. More information on Coach to Cure MD will be available later in the week.

"I think it comes back to how we handle this success," finished Haugen. "Similar to this week, we need to be a mature team, stay focused, and be critical of ourselves so we can continue to get better and grow as a football team."

### ST. THOMAS 20 GUSTAVUS 12

St. Peter, Minn. (3,041) Hollingsworth Field 58°, Partly Cloudy

**St. Peter, Minn.** – Like two teams playing a game of tug-of-war, the Gustavus and St. Thomas football teams battled back-and-forth on Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. In the end, it was a 20-12 win for St. Thomas.

After the Tommies scored a touchdown late in the first quarter to take a 7-0 lead, the Gusties responded with a touchdown of their own early in the second to cut the lead to 7-6. St. Thomas found the end zone again midway through the third quarter, but Gustavus answered with more of the same in the fourth to bring the score to 13-12. After the Tommies scored midway through the final frame to go up 20-12, the Gusties drove the ball all the way down to the St. Thomas 20-yard line on the ensuing possession. The Tommie defense dug in its heels at that point and forced Gustavus to turn the ball over on downs after three straight incompletions, securing the eight point victory.

"St. Thomas is a great team," said senior linebacker Joe Haas (Mission, Kan.), "We knew that coming in, and we knew that it would be a battle all day. They capitalized on a few of their chances and we missed some of ours, which was the bottom line of the game."

Following a sloppy start to the game that featured three turnovers in the first four possessions, the Tommies took advantage of a 10-play, 45-yard drive that led to a touchdown and a 7-0 lead. The drive was capped off by a one-yard touchdown on a quarterback sneak by Matt O'Connell with :48 seconds remaining in the opening frame. The drive encompassed most of the offensive production in the quarter as St. Thomas gained 69 yards of total offense compared to a meager three yards for the Gustavus offense.

However, the Gusties responded on the ensuing possession with a 12-play, 61-yard drive that found the end zone at the 10:30 mark of the second quarter. Quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) kept the ball off left tackle and over the goal line to bring his team within one point with a score of 7-6, where it would remain following a missed point-after-attempt. The Gusties converted on three third downs on the drive.

"Early in the game, we struggled offensively," mentioned Hendricks. "After the first quarter, we started to find ways to attack their defense. We moved the ball and made some plays."

St. Thomas began the scoring again in the third quarter. The Tommies marched 50 yards in six plays to take a 13-6 lead on a touchdown pass from Alex Fenske, who replaced injured starting quarterback Matt O'Connell, to Nick Waldvogel. The pass was a 19-yard strike 5:57 into the second half.

Gustavus had the answer once again early in the fourth quarter. The Gusties took over at the St. Thomas 35-yard line following a Lucas Kleinschrodt (Sr., Alden, Minn.) interception at the 13:56 mark. From there, the Gustavus offense needed just three plays for Hendricks to connect with sophomore tight end Jake Douglas (Montevideo, Minn.) down the seam off a play action fake to cut the deficit to 13-12. Again the Gusties could not convert the extra point and the score remained a one-point Tommie lead.

Later in the fourth, St. Thomas tacked on what would give itself some breathing room when it caught a favorable break in the end zone. On third down and six yards to go on the Gustavus 11-yard line, quarterback Alex Fenske rolled out to the right and threw to the end zone where defensive back Zach Dilger (Jr., South St. Paul, Minn.) went up and deflected the ball away from its intended receiver. However, rather than flying out of play, the ball instead fell into the arms of Cole Kelly for the 11-yard touchdown. Following the extra point, the Tommies held an eight-point lead with 5:48 remaining.

Trailing 20-12, the Gusties would not go quietly. Facing a fourth-and-four at the his own 37-yard line and the pocket collapsing, quarterback Mitch Hendricks extended the play by rolling out to his right to find Matt Boyce (So., Excelsior, Minn.) on the sideline for a 10-yard gain on the key fourth-down conversion. The pair hooked up again on the next play, a 17-yard completion to the St. Thomas 36-yard line. With the momentum on their side, the Gusties went for the homerun with a halfback pass from Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) to Boyce, a play that resulted in a 15-yard pass interference penalty and placed the ball at the Tommie 21-yard line. After a one-yard pick up on first down, the St. Thomas defense dug in and got the stop it needed, forcing three consecutive incompletions, and hanging on for the eight-point win.

"It's just one of those gut-wrenching losses," said Head Coach Peter Haugen. "Our kids played really well. I can't say enough about our defense, they did some really good things today, and our offense made some really key drives when we needed to. On the last drive, we put ourselves in a position to tie the game, which is what you want to do, we just have to finish it. They are a good football team, it's what our league is built on, and it's a tough loss to take, but we will bounce back."

Defense and field position proved to be the differences in the game. With an average starting field position of their own 42-yard line, the Tommies did not score on any drive longer than 50 yards. Comparatively, the Gusties averaged starting on their own 25-yard line.

In the game, the St. Thomas defense showed its teeth, holding Gustavus to 170 yards of total offense (20 rushing, 150 passing), while the Gustavus defense put forth its best performance of the season. The Gusties held St. Thomas' MIAC second-ranked rushing offense to 142 yards and also held the Tommies to 113 yards passing for a season-low 255 yards. Gustavus also forced three turnovers on the afternoon. Joe Haas led the way with 13 tackles (7 solo), three of which went for losses, and forced a fumble. Lucas Kleinschrodt also had a big day on defense, racking up seven tackles (4 solo) to go along with two fumble recoveries and an interception. The last time a Gustie defender came away with three turnovers in a game was all the way back on Nov. 15th, 2008 when Mike Fabel '09 intercepted three passes against Concordia.

"They've been playing well for four weeks," said Haugen of his defense. "They have been building some confidence over that period of time, and we have defended the run really well, which was the case again today. We got a bad bounce there at the end of the game when we make a nice play on the ball and it ends up getting tipped into their guy's hands, but that's football. There's no guestion that our guys played their tails off."

Offensively, quarterback Mitch Hendricks completed 17-of-37 passes for 150 yards with a touchdown as well as an interception. His favorite target was once again Matt Boyce, who caught six balls for 65 yards. The MIAC's second-leading rusher coming into the day, Jeffrey Dubose, was held in check on the ground. The senior was held to just 48 yards on 21 carries for an average of 2.3 yards per carry. His 48-yard total is the lowest since last season when he was held to 18 yards rushing on seven carries before being injured in a 28-14 loss at St. Thomas.

"It's been a mantra of our team this year to take one snap at a time and win every down," finished Haas. "This is a tough loss, but it doesn't change the way we are going to play the rest of the season. Every snap is a new play. We are going to keep working hard to get ready for Valley City next week."

#### GUSTAVUS 42 VALLEY CITY ST. 21

Valley City, N.D. (1,533) Lokken Stadium 37°, Brisk, Partly Sunny

**Valley City, N.D.** – The Gustavus Adolphus football team used a balanced offensive attack to push past Valley City State University at Lokken Stadium on Saturday afternoon. The Gusties passed for three touchdowns and rushed for three more in the 42-21 win.

Senior running back Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) scored all three touchdowns on the ground to break the Gustavus career total touchdowns record. The senior now has 38 career touchdowns (32 rushing, 6 receiving), surpassing Jay Schoenebeck '80 and Ron Straka '81, who had each scored 37 career touchdowns.

With the win, the Gusties improve to 4-2 overall, while the Vikings drop to 4-3 on the season.

After the Gustie defense stopped the Valley City State offense deep in its own territory, the Gustavus offense took over with good field position at the Viking 40-yard line. The Gusties proceeded to drive the remaining 40 yards in nine plays and 3:44 to score on their opening possession. They converted on two fourth downs on the drive before Jeffrey Dubose scampered into the end zone from 12 yards out to take a 6-0 lead. A Thomas Schleusener (Jr., Rapid City, S.D.) extra point was blocked and the Gustavus lead was stalled at six points.

"We did a nice job of getting the field position early today," mentioned Head Coach Peter Haugen. "They were forced to play on a long field their first possession then our defense played well and forced them into a punting situation. We got the ball in good field position and were able to convert a couple key third downs that led to a score."

Later in the first quarter after the Gusties held the Viking offense to a three-and-out, Valley City State punted out to the 50-yard line where Beau Bachman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) took the kick on a bounce and jutted across the field towards the Gustie sideline. Bachman cut up field and picked up some blocking on his way to a 36-yard return. Following the return, the Gustavus offense took over at the Valley City State 14-yard line.

Three plays later, the Gusties added to their lead when quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) found receiver Matt Boyce (So., Excelsior, Minn.) in between two Viking defenders in the end zone. Gustavus converted on the two-point conversion when Hendricks scrambled and tossed one up to Cole Engen (Sr., Crosslake, Minn.) in the back corner of the end zone to push the lead to 14-0.

After Valley City State scored midway through the second quarter to cut the lead to 14-7, Hendricks hooked up with Engen again with just :04 seconds remaining in the opening half. Engen gained a step on his defender and went up high in the end zone to haul in his first career touchdown. Following a Schleusener PAT, Gustavus took a 21-7 lead into halftime.

"We're just so excited for Cole," admitted Haugen. "A week ago, it kind of happened a senior, Lucas Kleinschrodt came out and had the game of his career, and the same thing happened with Cole today. We have a couple guys that have been out with injuries and whatnot, so Cole got an opportunity to play and came out to make a couple big catches and also threw a key block on one of Jeffrey's touchdown runs."

The Gustavus offense was comparable to a well-oiled machine in the second half, part of which Head Coach Peter Haugen attributes to the play of his offensive line.

"Our offensive line played phenomenal today, particularly in the second half," complimented Haugen.
"Those guys played well in the first half, but they really took over in the second half."

The Gusties scored on both of their third quarter drives and took a total of 11:31 off the clock in doing so. Their first scoring drive went 57 yards in 10 plays and 4:22 of game clock. The drive was highlighted by a 14-yard run on a fake punt by Levi Gibbs (So., LaPorte, Colo.). Three plays later, Hendricks connected with sophomore tight end Jake Douglas (So., Montevideo, Minn.) for a 22-yard touchdown to extend the lead to 28-7.

Just under three minutes later, Gustavus began an 11-play, 75-yard drive that took 7:09 and resulted in Dubose's second touchdown of the afternoon. Not only did the score extend the Gustie lead to 35-7, but it also launched Dubose into a tie for the most individual career total touchdowns in Gustavus football history. The touchdown gave Jeffrey 37 for his career to tie him with Jay Schoenebeck '80 and Ron Straka '81.

In the fourth quarter, the Vikings took advantage of a blocked punt deep in Gustavus territory. Two plays later, they were in the end zone on a Derek Elliott16-yard touchdown run up the middle. With the score 35-14, the Gusties came right back to respond with a touchdown on the ensuing possession. Dubose carried the ball all four times on the drive, including a 12-yard touchdown run that broke the record for career total touchdowns and extended the lead to 42-14.

"He didn't even know he broke the record, which is the cool thing about it," said Haugen of the record-breaking run. "That's a huge accomplishment for him personally, and it's also a great accomplishment for the offensive line and the receivers who have blocked for him. It was pretty cool to be apart of."

The Vikings went on to score on the next possession to bring the final score to 42-21.

For the game, the Gusties gained 366 yards of total offense (264 rushing, 102 passing), led by running back Jeffrey Dubose. The senior carried 34 times for 196 yards and three touchdowns. Quarterback Mitch Hendricks was mistake-free on the afternoon, completing 13-of-20 passes for 102 yards and three touchdowns compared to no interceptions. Hendricks spread out his completions with five receivers hauling in multiple catches.

The Gustavus defense kept its opponent under 300 yards for the fifth time in six games on Saturday. The Vikings were held to 290 yards of total offense (132 rushing, 143 passing). Jake Forcier (Jr., Watkins, Minn.) led the way with nine tackles (5 solo) on the day. Travis Pepper (Jr., Overland Park, Kan.) and Donte Green (Sr., Minneapolis, Minn.) both recorded a sack, while Torey Asao (Sr., Chaska, Minn.) pulled down an interception

"Our defense has just been very consistent," proclaimed Haugen. "Just can't say enough about them. They have put together six weeks of really strong play. If you can play defense, you have a shot to win games, and they are without question one of the reasons we have been so competitive. We have also been able to put some points on the board offensively. I think the combination of scoring points and playing solid defense has been really good for us so far this year."
