## GAME NOTES

**Gusties Take To Gridiron For 97th Season:** The Gustavus football team is now in its 97th season in 2013. Over the previous 96-plus years, the Gusties have compiled a record of 471-338-21, including a record of 372-243-13 in conference play. With 22 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) championships, Gustavus has claimed the second-most league titles in the 93-year history of the conference. Only Saint John's (31) has claimed more MIAC championships.

**Follow The Gusties On KNUJ:** KNUJ AM 860 out of New Ulm, Minnesota will once again broadcast all ten Gustavus regular season football games. The voice of the Golden Gusties Tom Wheeler will handle the play-by-play duties for the eighth consecutive season. Wheeler will once again be joined by 1984 Gustavus graduate and former Gustie football player Ken Ericson on the live call of this year's games. Fans can listen to the KNUJ broadcasts on the Internet through the Gustavus Athletics website. In addition, Gustavus will once again video stream all home games for viewing on your computer and portable internet device through GameCentral by Stretch Internet. **Calling All Captains:** Of over 5,000 student-athletes who have played football for Gustavus in the 97-year history of the program, only 188 have earned the privilege to serve as team captain. Peter Haugen's captains this season include seniors Torey Asao, Beau Bachman, Jeffrey Dubose, David Gschneider, and Lyle Opdahl.

**Senior Leadership:** With 22 seniors on this year's squad, the Gustavus roster features the fourth-most seniors on any Gustie football team in the last 20 years. The 2003 (28), 2002 (26), and 2011 (23) teams are the only three squads during that span to have more seniors wearing Black and Gold. This year's senior class features four offensive linemen, three wide receivers, two running backs, and two tight ends from the offensive side of the ball, while the defense features five defensive backs, four defensive linemen, and two linebackers.

**Gustie Football Around The Globe:** The 2013 Gustavus football team features a total of 107 players from nine different states and, for the second time in the last four years, a country

outside the United States. Of those 107 players, 93 claim Minnesota as their native state. A combined four players call Kansas home, while one player each hails from California, Colorado, Florida, Illinois, Iowa, South Dakota, and Wisconsin. Mexico also makes its presence felt on this year's roster as it is the homeland of three Gusties, all of whom hail from Cancun.

**The Series:** Saturday's game marks the 80th meeting between Gustavus and Saint John's on the gridiron. The Johnnies hold the upper hand in the all-time series with a record of 45-31-3 after escaping with a 31-17 victory last season in Collegeville, Minn. With the score tied at 17-17, Saint John's scored touchdowns late in the third quarter and midway through the fourth to pull away with the 14-point victory. The last time Gustavus defeated the Johnnies was in 1997 when the Gusties came away with a 24-16 win on Oct. 11 in Collegeville. Since then, Gustavus is winless against the Johnnies in the last 15 years.

**Meet The Head Coaches:** Gustavus Head Coach Peter Haugen is in his fifth season at the helm of the Gustavus football program. Haugen has a combined record of 17-30 in his first four-plus seasons. A graduate of Bethel University, Haugen was the head coach at Washburn High School in Minneapolis prior to coming to Gustavus. Saint John's Head Coach Gary Fasching is in his first season at the head of the Johnnie football program. A 1981 graduate of Saint John's, Fasching began his coaching career at St. Cloud Cathedral High School as the head coach from 1986-95. Fasching joined the Johnnie staff in 1996, beginning a 17-year tenure as an assistant before being named the head coach in December of 2012.





**Scouting the Gusties:** The Gustavus football team is coming off a 41-17 loss to fifth-ranked Bethel last Saturday in Arden Hills, Minn. Despite gaining 383 yards of total offense (119 rushing, 264 passing), the most by any team against the Royal defense so far this season, three turnovers proved to be too much for the Gusties to overcome in the loss. Those three turnovers led to 21 Bethel points, seven of which came on a 100-yard interception return for a touchdown by Matt Mehlhorn at the end of the first quarter. The interception return helped the Royals build a 13-10 halftime lead. Bethel went on to score on four of its five possessions in the second half to push on for the 24-point win.

The Gustavus offense was once again paced by the production of running back Jeffrey Dubose. The senior rushed for 83 yards on 23 carries (3.6 ypc) and a touchdown. Quarterback Mitch Hendricks completed 23 of a season-high 43 attempts for 264 yards with a touchdown and three interceptions. His favorite target was wide receiver Matt Boyce, who caught nine passes for 121 yards (13.4 ypc). Fellow receiver George Buchner also caught seven passes for 72 yards (10.3 ypc), including his first career touchdown.

Defensively, the Gusties allowed a season-high 418 total yards (164 rushing, 254 passing). The Royals also converted 9 of 12 third downs and scored on 3 of 4 trips in the red zone. Defensive end Cameron Cropsey led the way with seven tackles (4 solo), one of which went for a loss. Free safety Kellan Euerle followed with six tackles (6 solo) and also recorded an interception, which he returned for 35 yards deep into Bethel territory.

For the season, Gustavus is averaging 30.3 points (5th/MIAC) and 363.7 yards of total offense (5th/MIAC) per contest. Dubose has rushed for 928 yards (2nd/MIAC) and is closing in on a 1,000-yard season for the first time in his career and just the eighth in Gustavus history. His 928 yards have come on 176 carries for an average of 5.3 yards per carry (3rd/MIAC) to go along with 15 touchdowns (1st/MIAC). Through the air, Mitch Hendricks has completed 136 of 221 passes for a completion percentage of 61.5 percent (4th/MIAC). Hendricks has thrown for 1,323 yards (5th/MIAC) and eight touchdowns (6th/MIAC) compared to seven interceptions. In the absence of Phillip Butler, Matt Boyce has emerged as Hendricks's go-to receiver. Boyce has now hauled in 40 receptions (t-6th/MIAC) for 445 yards (11.1 ypc) and a pair of touchdowns.

On defense, the Gusties are allowing an average of 21.1 points (5th/MIAC) and 306.3 total yards (2nd/MIAC) per game. Linebacker Joe Haas is once again leading the team in tackles. The senior has amassed 40 tackles (20 solo) through seven games, five of which have gone for losses. Haas has also forced a league-leading three fumbles and recovered another. Cameron Cropsey comes next with 36 tackles (18 solo) and eight tackles for losses. He has also registered 1.5 sacks and has an interception.

Cornerback Zach Dilger leads the defensive backfield with three interceptions (t-4th/MIAC) and nine pass break-ups (2nd/MIAC).

**Scouting The Johnnies:** After being idle last weekend, the Saint John's football team is most recently coming off a 23-13 victory over Carleton on Oct. 19th in Northfield, Minn. The Johnnies got out to an early 10-0 lead in the first quarter before Carleton came back to take a 13-0 lead early in the third. However, Saint John's had the answer with a pair of touchdowns to close out the third quarter, which proved to be enough in the 10-point victory.

Saint John's outgained Carleton in yards of total offense by a tally of 396 (229 rushing, 167 passing) to 259 (38 rushing, 221 passing). The two teams combined for seven turnovers on the afternoon with each throwing three interceptions and Saint John's committing the only fumble. Johnnie fullback Jakob Certeza led the way on the ground with 118 yards rushing on 28 carries (4.1 ypc), while quarterback Nick Martin rushed for two touchdowns. Martin completed 17 of 28 passes for 167 yards and a touchdown compared to three interceptions in the absence of starter Connor Bruns. Josh Bungum was the top receiver for the Johnnies with seven catches for 52 yards.

So far this season, Saint John's averages 21.7 points (8th/MIAC) and 361.4 total yards (6th/MIAC) per game. Running back Sam Sura leads the way for a ground game that ranks seventh in the MIAC, averaging 155.9 yards per game. Sura has carried 93 times in six games for 392 yards and an average of 65.3 yards per game (5th/MIAC). He has also scored six touchdowns. After missing the Carleton game due to injury, quarterback Connor Bruns returns to the starting lineup this afternoon. Bruns has completed 97 of 170 attempts (57.1%) for 1,088 yards (181.3 ypg) and seven touchdowns (7th/MIAC). He has had one of the top receivers in the MIAC to throw to in Josh Bungum. Bungum has hauled in a league-best 59 receptions for 579 yards (5th/MIAC) and an average of 82.7 yards per game (4th/MIAC). He has also scored two touchdowns.

The Johnnie defense has been the strength of Saint John's so far this season. It is allowing just 15.9 points (2nd/MIAC) and 356.7 total yards (4th/MIAC) per game. However, the Johnnies have had their fair share of struggles against opposing ground games, as they are giving up an average of 152.4 yards per contest (6th/MIAC). Saint John's is led defensively by Andrew Rose, who has recorded 58 total tackles (5th/MIAC), 33 of which are solo (7th/MIAC). Matt Workman has recorded four sacks (4th/MIAC) to lead the Johnnie pass rush and also leads the MIAC in forced fumbles (3) and fumble recoveries (3). In the secondary, Darryl Williams ranks second in the conference with four interceptions.

**Hall Of Fame Weekend:** The Gustavus Adolphus College Athletics Department has selected eight individuals into its Athletics Hall of Fame. The 2013 class of inductees includes Todd Bowlby

#### MIAC Offensive Player-of-the-Week

**Griffin Neal, Concordia  
Fargo, N.D./South**

Concordia registered a big win on Saturday over Augsburg by the score of 47-20. Quarterback Griffin Neal was nearly perfect in the passing game, completing 19 of 21 passes (90.5%) for 281 yards and four touchdowns. Neal also ran for 43 yards on 19 carries. Griffin led the Cobbers to four straight scoring drives that produced 27 points in the win.



#### MIAC Defensive Player-of-the-Week

Bethel remained unbeaten on Saturday with a 41-17 win over Gustavus in Arden Hills. Defensive back Matt Mehlhorn gave the Royals a huge lift when he intercepted a pass in his own end zone and returned it a record 100 yards for a touchdown. The score gave Bethel a 13-3 lead late in the first quarter on the way to the 24-point victory.



#### MIAC Special Teams Player-of-the-Week

**Ben Wagner, Concordia  
St. Aubin de Medoc, France**

Kicker Ben Wagner contributed in a big way to the Cobber offense in Concordia's win last Saturday. Wagner knocked in a pair of field goals and all five of his extra points to score a total of 11 points for the Cobbers. He has now made 73 consecutive extra points, including a perfect 29 for 29 on PATs this season.

This group will be honored at the Athletics Hall of Fame Banquet, which will be held in Alumni Hall at 6:00 p.m., this evening.

**Mark Lynch Headed To The Hall:** Former Gustavus football player Mark Lynch, a standout offensive tackle for the Gusties from 1992 to 1994, will be inducted into the Gustavus Athletics Hall of Fame tonight. After spending a year and a half at the University of Wisconsin, Lynch left the bright lights of Division I and transferred to Gustavus where he could devote more time to his schoolwork while at the same time pursuing excellence on the football field. Standing 6' 7" and weighing in at 305 pounds, Lynch towered over defensive lineman and anchored the Gustavus offensive line for each of his three seasons in St. Peter. He started in 30 consecutive games for the Gusties and earned all-conference honors twice after opening up holes for back-to-back 1,000-yard rushers Kevin Grussing in 1993 and Brian Brekke in 1994. Both Grussing and Brekke surpassed 2,000 career yards and rank among the top 10 on Gustavus's all-time rushing leaders list. Over the course of Lynch's tenure at tackle, Gustavus averaged 186.5 rushing yards per game and 4.2 yards per carry. The 1993 team ran for 2,252 yards and averaged 220.1 yards per game, which ranks eighth in Gustavus history.

**Dubose Running Into The Record Books:** With three rushing touchdowns on Oct. 19th in a 42-21 win over Valley City State, senior running back Jeffrey Dubose ran his way into the Gustavus football record book as the all-time career touchdowns leader. At the time, Dubose had 38 career touchdowns, surpassing Ron Straka '81 and Jay Schoenebeck '80 to move to first on the list. After adding another rushing touchdown last weekend, Dubose now needs just one rushing touchdown to tie the record for career rushing touchdowns. Jeffrey currently ranks second with 32, one shy of the record holder Ron Straka. Dubose is also closing in on the Gustavus record for rushing yards in a career. Currently in fourth with 2,888 rushing yards, the senior needs 427 yards on the ground to surpass Tom Dahlberg to the top spot on the list. These pinnacle career numbers are thanks in large part to a stellar senior season for the St. Paul native. His 15 rushing touchdowns this season place him second on the all-time season rushing touchdowns list, two shy of Travis Prunty '00, who holds the season record with 17. Dubose also has a chance to set the single-season rushing yards mark. With 928 yards rushing and three games to go, Jeffrey needs 305 yards to break the single-season record set by Andy Traetow '03 in 2002 when he racked up 1,233 yards on 212 carries (123.3 ypg).

**The Turnover Battle:** Although the Gustie offense gained more yards of total offense against the Bethel defense than any other team so far this

season and won the time of possession battle by just over three minutes, three key turnovers proved costly in the loss as those three giveaways led to 21 points for the Royals. The Gustavus defense was able to force Bethel into just one turnover, leading to a turnover margin of -2. Prior to Saturday, the Gusties had ranked 16th in all of NCAA Division III in turnover margin with a rating of +8. However, after Saturday, that ranking has dropped to 44th with an adjusted margin of +6. This season has proved that winning the turnover battle plays a big factor in the outcome of a game. When accomplishing this task, the Gusties are 3-1, while posting a record of 1-2 when they commit more turnovers than their opponent. Taking care of the ball will be a point of emphasis for the Gustie offense this afternoon, as Saint John's ranks seventh in the country in turnovers gained with 23 and second in fumble recoveries with 13.

**Caught In The Middle:** The Gustavus football team has been the most successful during the middle two quarters of the game through seven games this season. However, it has been a different story in the first and fourth quarters. In the second and third quarters, the Gusties have outscored their opponents an impressive 151-39. However, in the first and fourth, Gustavus has been outscored 109-61. The Gusties will look for both a strong start and finish this afternoon to avoid being "caught in the middle."

**Weathering the Storm:** Gustavus is in the midst of a treacherous portion of the schedule that features four consecutive games against ranked opponents, three of which reside in the D3football.com top 25 poll. The stretch began on Oct. 12th against then-No. 6 St. Thomas that resulted in a 20-12 loss. The next weekend pit the Gusties against Valley City State, which was ranked No. 16 in the NAIA polls at the time, in a 42-21 win before falling last weekend at No. 5 Bethel by the final score of 41-17. This afternoon's match up brings No. 22 Saint John's to town in the fourth straight contest against a top 25 team. Next weekend, the Gusties take on a much-improved Carleton team in the "eye" of the storm before heading up to Moorhead for the season finale at Concordia, which is ranked No. 21 in this week's D3football.com poll.

**In The Red Zone:** Entering last weekend, the Gusties had converted on 22 of their 26 chances in the red zone for a conversion percentage of 85 percent (2nd/MIAC). However, that mark took a step back after a turnover and a blocked field goal held Gustavus to three scores in five chances inside the Royal 20-yard line on Saturday. The outing dropped the Gusties to third in the MIAC with a current red zone conversion rate of 81 percent (25-31). The red zone will be a key again today as the Johnnie defense posts the third-best red zone defense in all of Division III, allowing teams to score just 45.5 percent of the time.

**Collegeville, Minn.** – The Gustavus football team suffered a 31-17 loss at the hands of Saint John's on Saturday afternoon at Clemens Stadium. Despite a 14-10 lead at halftime, Gustavus was outscored 21-to-3 in the second half on the way to its fourth straight loss. The Gusties drop to 2-6 overall and 1-5 in the MIAC, while Saint John's improves to 4-4 overall and 2-4 in the MIAC.

After winning the coin toss, Gustavus elected to receive for the first time this season. The Saint John's defense came up with a big turnover to start by picking off a Muresuk Mena pass on the third play of the game to take over possession at the Gustavus 23-yard line.

The Gustie defense responded to the short field by holding the Johnnies to a 32-yard field goal by Jimmie Mattson. The kick gave Saint John's a 3-0 lead with 10:44 on the clock.

Gustavus had trouble finding success on offense through its first three drives of the game, punting on three straight possessions after Mena's opening drive interception.

Saint John's capitalized on its early defensive effort at the start of the second quarter when quarterback Nick Martin connected with receiver Tyson Euerle on a fade in the corner of the end zone. Following the Mattson extra point, Saint John's was on top with 13:44 left in the second half.

Facing a 10-0 deficit, Gustavus turned the momentum to its sideline halfway through the second quarter. A 25-yard reverse by slot receiver Eddie Ramos (Jr., Lakeland, Fla.) provided the spark Gustavus needed. After picking up a first down on fourth-and-four on a Saint John's offside penalty later in the drive, Mena hooked up with Michael Hintze (So., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) two plays later for a 25-yard catch and run touchdown. Hintze took a swing pass and picked up a key downfield block to scamper into the end zone for his first touchdown of the day. Tom Huepenbecker (Sr., Middleton, Wis.) hit the extra point to cut the Johnnie lead to 10-7 with 7:45 on the clock in the second quarter.

After a sloppy stretch of possessions that saw both teams turn the ball over twice, the Black and Gold used one of its best drives of the season to take its first lead in three games.

Following a 20-yard run by Hintze and a 34-yard run by Eddie Ramos, Gustavus had first-and-ten at the Saint John's 31-yard-line with less than two minutes remaining in the half. The Gusties pounded the ball to the five-yard-line where Mena capped the drive with his second touchdown pass to Hintze with :23 seconds on the clock. Huepenbecker's extra point gave Gustavus a 14-10 lead heading in the locker rooms for halftime.

Mena was 9-for-13 for 72 yards passing in the first half. He connected with five different receivers. Michael Hintze was his top target with three grabs for 30 yards, while Ramos had two catches for 25 yards. Ramos would go on to lead the Gusties on the ground with two carries for 59 yards.

Gustavus totaled 180 yards of total offense compared to Saint John's 108 yards in the opening half.

Saint John's re-established itself offensively on the first drive of the third quarter, going 86 yards on six plays to re-take the lead 17-14. Nick Martin broke a 38-yard run for a touchdown with 12:17 on the clock.

The Gusties would not go away quietly, answering with a field goal on their next drive to knot the score at 17-17 with 8:36 left in the third. Huepenbecker capped off the 50-yard drive with his longest field goal of the season from 32 yards out.

From that point on it was all Saint John's. After forcing Gustavus to a three-and-out, the Johnnies re-gained the lead after Colin Moynihan plunged across the goal line from three yards, giving the Johnnies a 24-17 advantage with less than a minute remaining in the third quarter.

The Johnnies brought the afternoon's scoring to a close at the 6:36 mark of the fourth quarter when Jake Essler scored on a six-yard run, extending the lead to 31-17 after the extra point.

Saint John's saw its ground game hit its stride today, racking up 213 rushing yards with Martin and Stephen Johnson leading the way with 83 and 75 yards, respectively.

The Gusties couldn't find their first half rhythm following the Huepenbecker field goal in the third quarter and were shut out for the remaining minutes of the game. In what was a much-improved offensive performance than recent weeks, Gustavus totaled 296 yards (106 rush, 190 pass) on the day.

Breaking out with his finest performance of the season was Michael Hintze who caught two touchdown passes and totaled a season/team-best 91 yards receiving on six catches. Hintze was also the team's second-leading rusher with 47 yards on six carries.

Muresuk Mena finished the game 16-for-26 for 190 yards passing. He threw two touchdowns and one interception and was sacked seven times.

The Gusties were on the wrong end of the turnover battle this afternoon, losing three fumbles and throwing one pick. Gustavus' defense continued to force turnovers however, recovering a fumble and intercepting two passes. Leading the defense for the third straight week was linebacker Joe Haas (Mission, Kan.) who finished with a season/team-best 17 tackles (7 solo) and a fumble recovery. Safeties Beau Bachman (Jr., St. Peter, Minn.) and Kellan Euerle (Jr., St. Cloud, Minn.) came up with the interceptions, while Gustavus registered three sacks.

Peter Haugen, a native of Minneapolis and a 1991 graduate of Bethel University, is entering his fifth year as head football coach at Gustavus Adolphus College.

In his fourth year as head coach, Haugen led the Gusties to a 3-7 record overall and a 2-6 mark within the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, finishing seventh in the league standings. In four-plus seasons at the head of the Gustavus Adolphus football program, Haugen has compiled an overall record of 17-30 and an MIAC record of 12-25. Last season, Gustavus received four all-conference selections in running back Jeffrey Dubose (St. Paul, Minn.), offensive lineman Brian Grundmeyer (Inver Grove Heights, Minn.), defensive lineman Donte Green (Minneapolis, Minn.), and linebacker Joe Haas (Mission, Kan.). Dubose earned first team distinction while Grundmeyer, Green, and Haas all earned a spot on the second team.

Haugen, who was the head football coach at Washburn High School for 15 years prior to coming to Gustavus, compiled an overall record of 111-44 during that span, while winning 11 league championships and posting a league record of 76-8. He directed the Millers to the Class AAAA quarterfinals in 2007 finishing with a mark of 9-3. In his last season as the Millers head coach, Haugen's squad posted a mark of 8-2. While building the program at Washburn, Haugen increased player participation from 35 players in 1994 to 110 players. He also implemented academic monitoring and meal programs for student athletes as well as creating and directing the highly successful Washburn Athletic Leadership Academy. He served as the chair of the Minneapolis Football Conference this past year and he is an active clinician working at many local and regional clinics including the NIKE Coach of the Year clinic. Haugen was also a member of the Metro coaching staff for the Minnesota All-Star game in 1998. He started his coaching career at his alma mater serving as the offensive line coach during the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

A three-sport standout at Bethel, Haugen was a starting tight end on the football team, a starting goaltender on the hockey team, and a starting catcher on the baseball team in the late '80s and early 90s. In his senior year, he earned All-Conference honors in football, and was selected Most Valuable Player of the hockey team.

Haugen became the 17th head coach in the 96-year history of Gustavus football. The Golden Gusties have a long and storied football tradition that includes 22 MIAC titles. The program ranks in the top-50 all-time in Division III (out of 235 institutions) with a .580 winning percentage (471-337-21). The Gusties will soon join a very elite group of 37 NCAA Division III institutions whose football teams have won 500 games. Along with great teams, Gustavus has also been blessed with many outstanding individual players, which includes 29 players who have received All-America honors, 12 who have received CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, and five who have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Most recently in 2012, senior safety Brad Kruckeberg was awarded an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.

**St. Peter, Minn.** — The Gustavus Adolphus football team kicked off its 2013 season with a 28-21 victory over Simpson College Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. Trailing 7-0 late in the first half, the Gusties rattled off 28 unanswered points heading into the fourth quarter to take a 28-7 lead. Simpson did not go quietly, however, as the Storm scored twice in the final six minutes of the game to pull within seven. In the end, the Gusties drained the remaining 2:29 on the final drive of the afternoon to hang on for the 28-21 win. Gustavus begins the season 1-0, while Simpson drops to 1-1.

"It's a great feeling to win a football game," remarked linebacker Joe Haas (Sr., Mission, Kan.). "We have been working towards this since last season, and to come out here and play like we did, it feels amazing."

After an empty outcome on its first possession, Simpson drove the ball 74 yards in seven plays and 2:44 to take an early 7-0 lead. A pair of big plays on the ground from Ethan Calvert and Tyler Kenny for gains of 17 yards and 23 yards, respectively, highlighted the drive, which was capped off by an eight-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Taylor Nelson to Ryan Olson.

On Simpson's next possession, Joe Haas recovered a fumbled snap for the first of what would be four straight turnovers between the two teams. The Gusties returned the favor two plays later with a fumble inside the Simpson five-yard line only to get it right back on an athletic interception by Torey Asao (Sr., Chaska, Minn.). Three plays later it was Simpson's turn to force an interception and the flurry of turnovers was finished.

Gustavus threatened on each of its next two possessions, but could not find a way to put points on the scoreboard until the final :26 seconds of the half. Following a pair of 20-plus-yard completions, Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) carried off right tackle for a two-yard touchdown run to even the score at 7-7 heading into halftime.

"I think we did a nice job of keeping our composure in the first half when we weren't playing how we wanted to, especially on the offensive side of the ball," mentioned Dubose. "We stuck with it and took the momentum when we scored at the end of the half."

The 15-minute halftime break could do nothing to break the spirit of the newly rejuvenated Gusties. They proceeded to score on each of their first three possessions of the second half to open up a 28-7 lead midway through the third. On its opening drive following the break, Gustavus marched 69 yards down the field in 11 plays to score the half's opening touchdown on an 11-yard run by Jeffrey Dubose. On the play, Dubose surpassed the 2,000-yard rushing milestone, becoming just the 11th player to do so in the history of the Gustavus football program.

"It means a lot to me," admitted Dubose of his accomplishment. "A big reason why I have gotten this far is because of the coaches and my teammates. The coaches have kept their faith in me and my teammates have been willing to block for me. From the offensive line out to the receivers, it has really been a team thing. They put the yards in front of me and I just had to grab them."

The Gusties needed just two plays on the following drive, thanks to a 53-yard touchdown run by quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) that extended the Gustavus lead to 21-7. After Xavier Fust (Jr., Columbia Heights, Minn.) recovered a fumble inside the Simpson nine-yard line, Hendricks scored his second touchdown of the day with a four-yard touchdown run.

However, Simpson would not go quietly. In a 28-7 hole, Simpson came back to score two touchdowns in the final six minutes of the game to pull within seven points. The Storm scored on a 35-yard touchdown pass from Nelson to Mike Kuhn to narrow the lead to 28-14 before Taylor fired another touchdown pass to Nate Connealy.

"Simpson has a great offense, we learned that last year, and they showed it today when they scored two touchdowns in two minutes," said Haas. "We held together as a defense and got the turnover we needed to make a stand on the goal line."

In the end, however, the Gusties drained the final 2:29 with the final drive of the game to hold on for the 28-21 win.

"We came out and moved the ball the first few drives of the second half and rode the momentum," added Dubose. "They came back at the end, but we just had to turn the page and get back on track. Sometimes you have lows during a game, but you have to stay steady. I think we did a good job of doing that."

Gustavus was led offensively by Mitch Hendricks. In his first start as a Gustie, Hendricks completed 27-of-42 passes for 222 yards and also carried the ball nine times for 57 yards and two touchdowns. He was joined in the ground game by Jeffrey Dubose, who carried 22 times for 75 yards and two touchdowns. Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) led all receivers with 11 catches for 53 yards.

Defensively, Joe Haas recorded seven tackles, while also forcing a fumble and recovering a fumble. Jake Forcier (Jr., Watkins, Minn.) registered five tackles and an interception on the day.

The Gusties will be back in action next Saturday when they travel to Minneapolis to take on Augsburg at 1:00 p.m. Even with the win, Head Coach Peter Haugen knows there is room for improvement heading into next week.

"I think we need to play cleaner," stated Haugen. "Offensively in the first half, there were plays to be made and we were close to making them but just couldn't seem to figure it out. We ended up doing that in the second half, but we need to play cleaner from the start."

## 2013 GAME RECAPS



### GAME 2 - SEPT. 21

**GUSTAVUS 16**  
**AUGSBURG 19**

**Minneapolis (1,409)**  
**Edor Nelson Field**  
**55°, Mostly Cloudy**

**Minneapolis** – After leading on the scoreboard for nearly 44 consecutive minutes of game clock on Saturday, the Gustavus football team surrendered its lead to Augsburg late in the fourth quarter and would not get it back as it fell to the Auggies by a final score of 19-16 at Edor Nelson Field. Augsburg's game-winning drive required four plays to march 78 yards in :51 seconds to score the go-ahead touchdown with just 2:37 remaining. With the loss, Gustavus drops to 1-1 overall and begins Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) play 0-1. Augsburg improves to 2-0 and opens its MIAC schedule 1-0.

After receiving the opening kickoff, the Gustavus offense proceeded to control the remainder of the first quarter. The Gusties dominated the time of possession battle, controlling the ball for 11:03 of the opening 15 minutes. Following an interception on its first drive, Gustavus took over at the 12:30 mark and would not give the ball up until there was just 3:47 remaining in the quarter, rattling off a 16-play, 58-yard drive that began at its own 10-yard line. However, the Gusties came up empty-handed when they failed to convert on fourth down in Augsburg territory. Because of the dominance in possession, the Gustie defense was able to hold the Augsburg offense to just 29 total yards in the opening quarter compared to 104 yards for Gustavus.

The Gustavus offense chewed up another 3:30 to begin the second quarter before Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) got the Gusties on the scoreboard with a two-yard touchdown run. The touchdown capped a nine-play, 91-yard drive that was highlighted by a 45-yard carry from Dubose on the first play of the second frame. The senior's two-yard score was his third touchdown of the season and gave the Gusties a 7-0 lead following a Tom Schleusener (Jr., Rapid City, S.D.) extra point.

Augsburg answered with a touchdown of its own on the ensuing possession. A 45-yard kickoff return to the Gustavus 49-yard line by Tyrell Martin set up what would be a 12-play, 49-yard drive that was capped by an 11-yard touchdown pass from Auggie quarterback Ayrton Scott, who accounted for all 49 yards on the drive (27 pass, 22 rush), to Joey Sonnenfeld. With the Gusties now leading 7-6, a rare turn of events ensued on the point-after attempt. The extra point try was blocked by Torey Asao (Sr., Chaska, Minn.) and returned all the way to the endzone by Beau Bachman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) to give Gustavus two points on what should have been the game-tying extra point. As it stood, the Gusties took a 9-6 lead to halftime, as neither team was able to put any more points on the board before the break.

After forcing a three-and-out on the Augsburg's first possession of the second half, Gustavus came out to score on its opening drive of the third quarter. Beginning on their own 32-yard line, the Gusties drove 68 yards in nine plays to take a 16-6 lead. Carrying the workload throughout the day, Jeffrey Dubose carried the ball seven times for 48 yards on the drive, 12 of them coming on his second touchdown run of the afternoon.

Just as in the first half, Augsburg again had the answer in the third quarter. The Auggies marched 75 yards in nine plays, highlighted by a 45-yard completion from Ayrton Scott to Phil Putratz that would have spotted the ball inside the Gustavus five-yard line were it not for a personal foul penalty assessed to Augsburg. The Auggies were not to be denied, however, and put the ball in the endzone on the second scoring connection between Scott and Joey Sonnenfeld, this time from 10 yards out.

Augsburg threatened again late in the third and into the fourth on a 15-play, 50-yard drive that stretched over 4:54 of game clock, but the drive stalled at the Gustavus 13-yard line when the Auggies failed to convert on fourth down.

Gustavus could not pass midfield on either of its next two drives, as the Augsburg punting unit pinned the Gusties deep in their own territory in both situations. After eating up 7:53 on its second drive of the quarter, Gustavus was forced to punt on fourth down and 16 yards to go.

Augsburg took over on its own 22-yard line and four plays later owned a 19-16 lead. A 21-yard completion to Sonnenfeld, a 12-yard run by Scott set the Auggies up for a 46-yard touchdown on a screen pass to Phil Putratz to give Augsburg its first lead of the game with 2:37 to play. The Gusties began what would be their final possession at their own 41-yard line, but a key fumble on the first play of the drive put the seal on the outcome as the Auggies were able to milk the remaining 2:24 and wrap up the 19-16 victory.

"We went into the game thinking we had to contain their quarterback and run the ball well. We did both of those today," commented Head Coach Peter Haugen. "I thought we did a great job of limiting what their quarterback was able to do on the ground. We wanted to make him beat us with his arm, and Augsburg was able to make enough plays in the passing game to do that."

For the game, Gustavus running back Jeffrey Dubose carried 37 times for a career-high 227 yards. His performance ties the Gustavus record for most carries in a game, while his 227 rushing yards rank seventh on the all-time single-game rushing yards list, 31 yards behind the record of 258 yards set by Ray Wilson '09 against Augsburg in 2008.

Through the air, Gustavus quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) completed 12 of 23 passes for 100 yards and was sacked twice on the day. Gustavus' leading receiver was Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) for the second week in a row. Butler hauled in four receptions for 34 yards.

"We have to score more points," Haugen put simply. "Jeffrey did a great job running the ball today and our guys up front were terrific, but we weren't as effective in our passing game as we needed to be. Augsburg did a good job punting the football, so we played on a long field for a good part of the day, but we just weren't as sharp as we needed to be."

Defensively, Cameron Cropsey (Jr., Eagan, Minn.) led the way for the Gusties. Cropsey registered eight total tackles (4 solo) and intercepted a pass on the day. Travis Pepper (Jr., Overland Park, Kan.) came next with 7 tackles (2 solo), while Beau Bachman recorded the lone sack on the day.

Quarterback Ayrton Scott led the way for the Auggies offensively. Scott accounted for 258 yards through the air and 56 more on the ground. He also tallied three passing touchdowns on the day, two of which connected with Joey Sonnenfeld, who caught a total of four passes for 66 yards. Phil Putratz led all receivers in the game with five catches for 104 yards and a touchdown.

Michael Juberian led the Augsburg defense in the game. Juberian registered 18 tackles (5 solo) on the day. Felix Coleman joined him with double-digit tackles, notching 10 total (6 solo) on the afternoon.

The two teams were nearly identical in most offensive categories. Gustavus claimed 21 first downs compared to Augsburg's 19, while the Auggies outgained the Gusties in total yardage by a single yard. Augsburg gained 353 yards on 68 offensive plays in comparison to 352 yards on 71 plays for Gustavus. However, the key difference proved to be Gustavus' two turnovers, one of which came on its final drive of the game, compared to just one for Augsburg.

## GAME 3 - SEPT. 28

**St. Peter, Minn.** – After trailing 13-7 at the outset of the second quarter, the Gustavus football team rattled off 38 unanswered points to capture a 45-19 victory over St. Olaf on Homecoming Saturday at Hollingsworth Field. The Gusties racked up over 400 yards of total offense and came up with four interceptions of St. Olaf quarterback Nate Penz on their way to the 26-point win. Gustavus improves to 2-1 overall and 1-1 in the MIAC, while St. Olaf falls to 1-3 overall and 1-2 in the MIAC.

"It means a lot to play like we did today," said Head Coach Peter Haugen. "We talked about it being a 'hinge' moment for us all week, and I think the biggest thing was that you could see our guys had energy and they kept believing. It was just a great team effort. I felt like each guy did what they're being asked to do. We had a lot of energy and it was certainly a big win for us."

On the first possession of the game, with St. Olaf's punting unit in place, Gustavus cornerback Zach Dilger (Jr., South St. Paul, Minn.) committed a roughing-the-kicker penalty that gave the Oles a first down and kept the drive alive. On the very next play, Dilger made up for his wrongdoing by pulling down his first of two interceptions on the day near midfield. The Gustie offense proceeded to march 53 yards in eight plays on its first possession of the game, which was capped off by an Aaron O'Gorman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) 10-yard touchdown run. O'Gorman's first career touchdown gave the Gusties the early 7-0 lead at the 8:30 mark of the first quarter.

"St. Olaf is a big rivalry game for us, so the whole week the intensity was building up to today," said Dilger. "We were ready to go, so it was nice to come out here and get off to a fast start."

St. Olaf responded with two touchdowns in the next two minutes, the first of which was a 55-yard strike from Nate Penz to Joel Reinhardt. After the Gustavus kickoff landed out-of-bounds, the Oles needed just three plays to tie the game at 7-7. On the second play of the ensuing Gustavus drive, quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) made his only mistake of the day, throwing an interception at his own 30-yard line. After a two-yard return, the Oles took over at the Gustavus 28 and wasted little time in reaching the endzone. St. Olaf scored two plays later with a 9-yard pass from Penz to Jake Schmiesing. The extra point failed to keep the score at 13-7 in favor of the Oles. St. Olaf would threaten again late in the first quarter, but a Dilger interception in his own endzone would extinguish all hope of extending the lead any further before the quarter break.

As if it were a ticking time-bomb, the Gustavus offense exploded with production in the second quarter. The Gusties got the ball back with 11:08 remaining in the frame and would proceed to score on six of its next seven possessions to score 38 unanswered points. Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) kicked things off with his first of three touchdown runs on the day. Just over four minutes later, Hendricks found Jordan Rudenick (Sr., Nicollet, Minn.) down a seam in the middle of the field after a play-action fake. Rudenick bulldozed his way across the goal line to give Gustavus a 21-13 lead with 2:17 to play in the opening half. Two plays later, the Gusties had the ball back after Kellan Euerle (Sr., St. Cloud, Minn.) intercepted a pass on the first play of the next St. Olaf drive. Gustavus took over at its own 38-yard line and after methodically moving the ball down the field, a Thomas Schleusener (Jr., Rapid City, S.D.) field goal with :17 seconds left in the half put the Gusties on top 24-13 heading to the break.

"In the first quarter we were getting settled in," said Matt Boyce (So., Excelsior, Minn.). "We needed to see what they were running defensively and adjust accordingly, so we threw some different formations at them. By the second, we had it figured out and our coaches did a great job with our play-calling."

Boyce provided a spark coming out of the break. The sophomore returned the opening second half kickoff 61 yards to the St. Olaf 28-yard line. Five plays later, Dubose scored his second touchdown of the afternoon to extend the lead to 31-13 with 12:49 to play in the third quarter. Boyce followed four minutes later with an incredible diving catch in the endzone on the ensuing possession. Matt made an adjustment on a deep ball thrown over the top of his head toward the sideline and still managed to keep a foot in-bounds to put the Gusties on top 38-13. Dubose would cap Gustavus' scoring output for the day on his third and final touchdown of the afternoon, a one-yard run with 9:42 left in regulation that brought the score to 45-13.

St. Olaf would score on the final play of the game to cut the lead to 45-19, but it was too little, too late for the Oles as the Gusties walked away with the 26-point victory. On the day, the Gustavus offense amassed 433 yards of total offense (301 passing, 132 rushing). Mitch Hendricks led the way through the air, completing 29 of 39 passes for 301 yards and two touchdowns. His favorite target, Matt Boyce, hauled in 13 passes for 150 yards and a touchdown. Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) came next with nine catches for 71 yards. Jeffrey Dubose tallied three touchdowns and 99 yards in the ground game on 23 carries.

"We knew coming in that they play a lot of cover three and we could attack them with certain routes, so we worked on those all week," mentioned Boyce. "Our scout defense was phenomenal, especially our secondary. They are a huge part of our success today because of their work hammering it out during practice all week."

Defensively, the Gusties held St. Olaf to 282 total yards (207 passing, 75 rushing) and forced four turnovers, all of which were interceptions led by Zach Dilger with two. Kellan Euerle and Nick Frandsen also recorded a pick on the day. Gustavus also sacked St. Olaf quarterback Nate Penz three times for a total of 29 yards lost. Cameron Cropsey (Jr., Eagan, Minn.), Anthony Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.), and Xavier Fust (Jr., Columbia Heights, Minn.) all had one sack each.

"They have great receivers, and they were really hurting us in the first quarter with the intermediate passing game," stated Haugen of his defense's play. "We switched some things up, gave their quarterback a few different looks defensively, played a little man-to-man, and I think that really helped us."

Gustavus will now look to carry the win into next week's contest against Hamline. "We need to bring the same kind of focus we brought this week into next week's practices," finished Dilger. "We can't take a step back. We have to keep moving forward with more focus and determination and we will get it done next Saturday."

Haugen echoed his junior cornerback's mindset, "Moving forward, we need to demonstrate that we are a mature football team," finished Haugen. "If you have one solid week, a mature team follows it up with another solid week, so I think that needs to be the message this week. We need to continue to grow, be critical of mistakes that we have and fix those mistakes, and play cleaner."

The Gusties will be back in action next Saturday, Oct. 5th when they travel to St. Paul to take on Hamline for a 1:00 p.m. kick off at Klas Field.

**St. Paul** - Following an interception by Zach Dilger (Jr., South St. Paul, Minn.) on Hamline's opening drive, the Gustavus football team put its foot on the gas and would not let off until late in the third quarter on its way to a 52-7 victory over Hamline on Saturday afternoon at Klas Field. The Gustavus offense scored on all six of its possessions of the first half and its opening two drives in the second half to open up a 52-0 lead before Hamline scored in the fourth quarter to bring the final score to 52-7. With the win, Gustavus improves to 3-1 overall and 2-1 in the MIAC, while the Pipers fall to 1-3 overall and 0-3 in the MIAC.

"We have been talking a lot about momentum and carrying things over to the next week," said junior safety Jake Forcier (Watkins, Minn.). "The big goal for us was to go 1-0 this week. That has been the motto throughout the year: go 1-0 every week. Last week was big win for us, but this week was a different opponent and I think we did a good job of focusing solely on Hamline this week."

After allowing the Hamline offense to pick up a pair of first downs on its opening drive, Zach Dilger came down with an interception off a tipped ball and returned it 30 yards to the Hamline 48-yard line to set up the Gustavus offense. The Gusties would not let the opportunity go to waste, as Thomas Schleusener (Jr., Rapid City, S.D.) connected on a 30-yard field goal to give the Gusties a 3-0 lead with 10:29 to play in the opening quarter.

"Coach Shea has preached fast and physical defense all year, and that starts up front" continued Forcier. "Our d-line has been doing a great job of getting it done and getting after the quarterback. That makes it easy on us in the secondary. When they force quarterbacks out of the pocket, they are uncomfortable and that allows us to get tips on some passes, which Dilger took advantage of today with his pick."

After holding Hamline to 16 yards on the next possession, the Gusties drove 85 yards in nine plays to cross the goal line and take a 10-0 lead. Gustavus converted a key third down on the drive when quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) completed a 38-yard strike down the sideline to receiver George Buchner (Fr., Excelsior, Minn.) on third-and-11 that kept the possession alive. The drive was capped off by Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) when he took a handoff and went up-and-over the pile from one yard out.

The Gusties got the ball back three plays later and proceeded to score once more on a Dubose touchdown run, this time from four yards out. Gustavus again converted on a key third down on the drive with a completion from Hendricks to Buchner to push the offense on to take a 17-0 lead.

"Our offense played really well today and I think it was our ability to convert on third down that was the difference in the game," acknowledged Head Coach Peter Haugen. "Early on we were forced to convert a couple of third and fourth situations, which gave us some confidence right from the start."

From there, the Gusties controlled the remainder of the half, scoring on each of its next three drives to end the second quarter. Dubose scored from 28 yards out after breaking two tackles and cutting to the outside where he outraced everyone to the pylon to push the lead to 24-0. On the ensuing kickoff, Hamline kick returner Hoyfal Adam fumbled on his own five yard line where Beau Bachman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) snatched the ball off the bounce and took it home for the score. Dubose capped the half of scoring with an eight-yard touchdown reception off a screen pass out of the backfield to extend the lead to 38-0 with just :25 seconds remaining in the half. The scored capped an 11-play, 94-yard drive that took just 4:32.

It took just two plays out of halftime for Dubose to break off a 57-yard touchdown run to put the Gusties in front 45-0. The touchdown put an end to the afternoon for the offensive starters, as they would turn the reigns over the second team, which in turn scored on its first possession in the game. Aaron O'Gorman (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) scored his second touchdown of the season on a five-yard run with 8:08 to play in the third before the Gusties were forced to punt for the first time all afternoon on the next possession with just over 2:00 remaining in the quarter.

Hamline's Austin Duncan scored on a three-yard touchdown run midway through the fourth quarter, but it was far too late for the Pipers in the 45-point loss.

For the game, Gustavus racked up 489 yards of total offense (230 passing, 259 rushing) in the 52-point performance. However, the key on the stat sheet was a 67-percent (8-for-12) conversion rate on third down, while not turning the ball over. Running back Jeffrey Dubose led the way for the Gusties with 200 yards on 16 attempts (12.5 avg) to go along with four touchdowns on the ground. Dubose also caught two passes for 15 yards and another touchdown through the air to bring his touchdown total to five on the day. Quarterback Mitch Hendricks was on point all afternoon, completing 15-of-18 passes (83.3%) for 184 yards and a touchdown. His favorite target was Phillip Butler (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) caught seven passes for 60 yards on the day.

Although dominant in the first half, the Gustavus defense allowed over 100 yards rushing for the first time this season, as Hamline ran for 154 yards. However, the Pipers were held to just 61 yards rushing in the first two quarters. Hamline also gained 109 yards passing for 263 total yards on the day. Individually, Lucas Kleinschrodt (Sr., Alden, Minn.) led the way with 10 tackles (5 solo), while Zach Dilger raked in an interception and Beau Bachman recovered a fumble for a touchdown.

Gustavus will next host the University of St. Thomas on Saturday, Oct. 12th for family weekend and Coach to Cure MD in St. Peter. That kick off is set for 1:00 p.m. on Saturday. More information on Coach to Cure MD will be available later in the week.

"I think it comes back to how we handle this success," finished Haugen. "Similar to this week, we need to be a mature team, stay focused, and be critical of ourselves so we can continue to get better and grow as a football team."

**St. Peter, Minn.** – Like two teams playing a game of tug-of-war, the Gustavus and St. Thomas football teams battled back-and-forth on Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. In the end, it was a 20-12 win for St. Thomas.

After the Tommies scored a touchdown late in the first quarter to take a 7-0 lead, the Gusties responded with a touchdown of their own early in the second to cut the lead to 7-6. St. Thomas found the end zone again midway through the third quarter, but Gustavus answered with more of the same in the fourth to bring the score to 13-12. After the Tommies scored midway through the final frame to go up 20-12, the Gusties drove the ball all the way down to the St. Thomas 20-yard line on the ensuing possession. The Tommie defense dug in its heels at that point and forced Gustavus to turn the ball over on downs after three straight incompletions, securing the eight point victory.

"St. Thomas is a great team," said senior linebacker Joe Haas (Mission, Kan.), "We knew that coming in, and we knew that it would be a battle all day. They capitalized on a few of their chances and we missed some of ours, which was the bottom line of the game."

Following a sloppy start to the game that featured three turnovers in the first four possessions, the Tommies took advantage of a 10-play, 45-yard drive that led to a touchdown and a 7-0 lead. The drive was capped off by a one-yard touchdown on a quarterback sneak by Matt O'Connell with :48 seconds remaining in the opening frame. The drive encompassed most of the offensive production in the quarter as St. Thomas gained 69 yards of total offense compared to a meager three yards for the Gustavus offense.

However, the Gusties responded on the ensuing possession with a 12-play, 61-yard drive that found the end zone at the 10:30 mark of the second quarter. Quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) kept the ball off left tackle and over the goal line to bring his team within one point with a score of 7-6, where it would remain following a missed point-after-attempt. The Gusties converted on three third downs on the drive.

"Early in the game, we struggled offensively," mentioned Hendricks. "After the first quarter, we started to find ways to attack their defense. We moved the ball and made some plays."

St. Thomas began the scoring again in the third quarter. The Tommies marched 50 yards in six plays to take a 13-6 lead on a touchdown pass from Alex Fenske, who replaced injured starting quarterback Matt O'Connell, to Nick Waldvogel. The pass was a 19-yard strike 5:57 into the second half.

Gustavus had the answer once again early in the fourth quarter. The Gusties took over at the St. Thomas 35-yard line following a Lucas Kleinschrodt (Sr., Alden, Minn.) interception at the 13:56 mark. From there, the Gustavus offense needed just three plays for Hendricks to connect with sophomore tight end Jake Douglas (Montevideo, Minn.) down the seam off a play action fake to cut the deficit to 13-12. Again the Gusties could not convert the extra point and the score remained a one-point Tommie lead.

Later in the fourth, St. Thomas tacked on what would give itself some breathing room when it caught a favorable break in the end zone. On third down and six yards to go on the Gustavus 11-yard line, quarterback Alex Fenske rolled out to the right and threw to the end zone where defensive back Zach Dilger (Jr., South St. Paul, Minn.) went up and deflected the ball away from its intended receiver. However, rather than flying out of play, the ball instead fell into the arms of Cole Kelly for the 11-yard touchdown. Following the extra point, the Tommies held an eight-point lead with 5:48 remaining.

Trailing 20-12, the Gusties would not go quietly. Facing a fourth-and-four at the his own 37-yard line and the pocket collapsing, quarterback Mitch Hendricks extended the play by rolling out to his right to find Matt Boyce (So., Excelsior, Minn.) on the sideline for a 10-yard gain on the key fourth-down conversion. The pair hooked up again on the next play, a 17-yard completion to the St. Thomas 36-yard line. With the momentum on their side, the Gusties went for the homerun with a halfback pass from Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) to Boyce, a play that resulted in a 15-yard pass interference penalty and placed the ball at the Tommie 21-yard line. After a one-yard pick up on first down, the St. Thomas defense dug in and got the stop it needed, forcing three consecutive incompletions, and hanging on for the eight-point win.

"It's just one of those gut-wrenching losses," said Head Coach Peter Haugen. "Our kids played really well. I can't say enough about our defense, they did some really good things today, and our offense made some really key drives when we needed to. On the last drive, we put ourselves in a position to tie the game, which is what you want to do, we just have to finish it. They are a good football team, it's what our league is built on, and it's a tough loss to take, but we will bounce back."

Defense and field position proved to be the differences in the game. With an average starting field position of their own 42-yard line, the Tommies did not score on any drive longer than 50 yards. Comparatively, the Gusties averaged starting on their own 25-yard line.

In the game, the St. Thomas defense showed its teeth, holding Gustavus to 170 yards of total offense (20 rushing, 150 passing), while the Gustavus defense put forth its best performance of the season. The Gusties held St. Thomas' MIAC second-ranked rushing offense to 142 yards and also held the Tommies to 113 yards passing for a season-low 255 yards. Gustavus also forced three turnovers on the afternoon. Joe Haas led the way with 13 tackles (7 solo), three of which went for losses, and forced a fumble. Lucas Kleinschrodt also had a big day on defense, racking up seven tackles (4 solo) to go along with two fumble recoveries and an interception. The last time a Gustie defender came away with three turnovers in a game was all the way back on Nov. 15th, 2008 when Mike Fabel '09 intercepted three passes against Concordia.

"They've been playing well for four weeks," said Haugen of his defense. "They have been building some confidence over that period of time, and we have defended the run really well, which was the case again today. We got a bad bounce there at the end of the game when we make a nice play on the ball and it ends up getting tipped into their guy's hands, but that's football. There's no question that our guys played their tails off."

Offensively, quarterback Mitch Hendricks completed 17-of-37 passes for 150 yards with a touchdown as well as an interception. His favorite target was once again Matt Boyce, who caught six balls for 65 yards. The MIAC's second-leading rusher coming into the day, Jeffrey Dubose, was held in check on the ground. The senior was held to just 48 yards on 21 carries for an average of 2.3 yards per carry. His 48-yard total is the lowest since last season when he was held to 18 yards rushing on seven carries before being injured in a 28-14 loss at St. Thomas.

"It's been a mantra of our team this year to take one snap at a time and win every down," finished Haas. "This is a tough loss, but it doesn't change the way we are going to play the rest of the season. Every snap is a new play. We are going to keep working hard to get ready for Valley City next week."

**Arden Hills, Minn.** – Three turnovers proved to be the difference in a 41-17 loss to fifth-ranked Bethel for the Gustavus football team on Saturday afternoon at Royal Stadium. Those three turnovers led to 21 points for the Royals, including a 100-yard interception return for a touchdown. With the loss, Gustavus drops to 4-3 overall (2-3 MIAC), while Bethel improves to 7-0 overall (5-0 MIAC).

It took all of 3:50 for the Royals to take the opening kick off and march 70 yards in eight plays to score a touchdown on their opening drive. Two plays into the drive, Bethel faced a third down with 13 yards needed to convert the first down at its own 27-yard line. Quarterback Erik Peterson dropped back and found Mitch Hallstrom for a 19-yard completion that gave the Royals a first down at their own 46-yard line. Peterson went on to hook up with Hallstrom twice more on the possession, the last of which was a 35-yard touchdown pass down the Bethel sideline. The point-after attempt was missed, but the Royals still were out to the early 6-0 lead.

The Gusties responded with a monster drive that went 13 plays and 60 yards in 6:54 of game clock. Gustavus diced up the Bethel defense, gaining small chunks of yardage play after play, converting three third downs on the drive. Faced with third-and-goal from the Bethel two-yard line, running back Jeffrey Dubose (Sr., St. Paul, Minn.) plunged into the end zone to presumably tie the score, but the touchdown was called back due to an illegal formation penalty on the Gusties, pushing them back to the Bethel seven-yard line.

On the ensuing third down try, quarterback Mitch Hendricks (So., Laporte, Minn.) had Matt Boyce (So., Excelsior, Minn.) open in the back of the end zone, but the two were unable to connect as the ball was slightly behind Boyce, who slipped on the play, and the Gusties were forced to settle for a field goal. Thomas Schleusener (Jr., Rapid City, S.D.) nailed the 24-yarder and cut the deficit to 6-3. However, the drive would be foreshadowing of what was to come for the Gustavus offense throughout the afternoon.

The kick off following the field goal gave the Royals possession at their own 35-yard line. Three plays later, on second-and-seven, an Eric Peterson pass fell into the waiting arms of Gustavus safety Kellan Euerle (Sr., St. Cloud, Minn.). Euerle returned the interception 35 yards to the Bethel 17-yard line and the Gusties were in business with great field position.

The Gustavus offense pounded the ball all the way down to the Bethel three-yard line and it was knocking on the door once again. After Dubose was denied the goal line twice, Hendricks dropped back on third down and fired to the right side, looking for his receiver on a slant in the end zone. But Hendricks never found him. Instead, Bethel defensive back Matt Mehlhorn stepped in front, intercepted the pass, and raced the entire length of the field for a 100-yard touchdown return to put the Royals out front 13-3.

The Gustavus offense battled back with yet another huge drive. The possession encompassed 13 plays, 75 yards, and 6:07 of game time. The result was a Gustavus touchdown. Much like their first drive, the Gusties picked apart the Bethel defense. This time it was two big pass plays that highlighted the drive, both with Matt Boyce on the receiving end. Hendricks found Boyce for a 19-yard gain midway through the drive, and later connected for a key 33-yard strike on fourth down with 11 yards to go. Boyce went high to grab the reception and hung on despite pass interference by the Bethel defensive back. The big play set up a one-yard Dubose touchdown run and the Gusties were back in business, trailing by just three points (13-10).

The only other scoring threat of the first half came when the Royals marched down the field deep into Gustavus territory. With a first and goal at the nine-yard line, the Gustie defense dug in its heels with two key pass break ups in the end zone by Euerle and Jake Forcier (Jr., Watkins, Minn.). The deflections came on second and third down, respectively, and kept the Royals off the scoreboard as Bethel kicker Andrew O'Reilly missed a 26-yard field goal.

However, the second half would prove to be a different story. On the second play of the frame, quarterback Mitch Hendricks was intercepted by linebacker Landon Mathis, who returned the pick to the Gustavus 46-yard line. The Royals did not let the short field go to waste, as they marched down the field to score on a five-yard touchdown pass from Erik Peterson to Mitch Hallstrom.

Gustavus responded with another long drive on the ensuing possession, driving 66 yards down to the Bethel five-yard line. But again the Gustie offense stalled and had to settle for a field goal attempt from 22-yards out, which was blocked.

Bethel again took advantage of the Gustavus miscue on its next possession. The Royals pulled a trick play out of the bag when receiver Mitch Hallstrom caught a lateral behind the line of scrimmage and proceeded to throw the ball downfield to a wide-open Jay Hillbrands. Hillbrands did the rest of the work, taking it 66 yards across the goal line to extend the Bethel lead to 27-10.

After an empty drive for Gustavus, the Gustie defense stopped the Royals on fourth down on the first play of the fourth quarter. The offense took over and proceeded to march 71 yards in nine plays to score a touchdown and cut the lead to 27-17. A pair of big plays in the passing game again highlighted the drive, the first of which was a 26-yard completion to Matt Boyce on fourth down and nine yards to go. With the defense bearing down all around him, quarterback Mitch Hendricks threw the ball up to Boyce. The sophomore again climbed the ladder and came down with the reception to keep the drive alive. Two plays later, Hendricks completed a swing pass out to the left side to wide receiver George Buchner (Fr., Excelsior, Minn.). After breaking a tackle, Buchner stretched for the pylon and snuck the ball past the goal line. The score was Buchner's first of his career and pulled the Gusties within 10 points (27-17) with 11:54 remaining in the game.

The score would not be enough, however, as the Royals marched down the field to score another touchdown on their next possession. An interception on Gustavus's following drive would lead to another Bethel score to increase the lead to 41-17, which is where it would remain until the final horn.

For the game, the Gusties gained the most yards allowed by the Bethel defense this season, collecting 383 yards of total offense (119 rushing, 264 passing). However, three key turnovers led to 21 points for the Royals. Quarterback Mitch Hendricks completed 23 of 43 attempts for 264 yards and a touchdown along with three interceptions. Running back Jeffrey Dubose paced the ground game with 83 yards rushing on 23 attempts and added a touchdown. He now sits just one rushing touchdown shy of the career touchdowns record and two shy of the record for rushing TDs in a season. Gustavus also got big games from receivers Matt Boyce and George Buchner in the receiving game. Boyce caught nine passes for 121 yards, while Buchner hauled in seven receptions for 72 yards and a touchdown.

The Gustavus defense had a difficult time containing the top offense in the MIAC, as the Royals collected 418 yards of total offense (164 rushing, 254 passing). Bethel also converted on nine of 12 third downs (75%) on the day. Cameron Cropsey (Jr., Eagan, Minn.) led the way for the Gustie defense with seven tackles (4 solo), while Kellan Euerle added six tackles (3 solo) and an interception.
