#### SETTING THE SCENE

• The Gustavus Adolphus women's basketball team will gear up for an MIAC test against 12th-ranked University of St. Thomas on Wednesday, Jan. 15 at 7:30 p.m. on Gus Young Court. Gustavus comes into the matchup ranked eighth in the league at 6-5 overall and 3-5 in the MIAC, while conference-leader St. Thomas enters the game at 10-2 overall and 8-1 in the MIAC.

#### LAST TIME OUT

• The Gustie women's basketball team got back on the winning track with an 89-81 victory over Carleton College last Saturday afternoon in St. Peter. The Gusties turned in their best scoring performance of the season and finished with four players in double figures.

Sophomores Karina Schroeder (7-14) and Anna Lundquist (6-8) were the difference on the blocks, scoring 20 and 15 points, respectively, for their best combined outing. Schroeder recorded her fourth double-double of the season after bringing down a game-high 12 rebounds (7 defensive). To go along with the combined 35 points from Schroeder and Lundquist, Julia Dysthe led all scorers with 21 points on 7-of-16 shooting. Britta Rinke rounded out Gustavus's top scorers, going 7-of-12 for 14 points.

The Black and Gold finished the game over the 45-percent mark from the floor for the first time this January, going 35-for-75 (46.7%) from the field, 3-for-12 (25%) from three-point range, and 16-for-25 (64%) at the free throw line. The key stat in the game, however, was Gustavus's rebounding advantage. Coach Laurie Kelly's squad ended up with a 47-to-26 edge on the glass, which included a 22-to-4 advantage on the offensive glass.

#### **SERIES HISTORY**

• Wednesday's game will be the 72nd meeting between Gustavus and St. Thomas in women's basketball. The Tommies hold the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 48-23. St. Thomas swept the Gusties in last year's regular season series with a 65-43 win on Jan. 9 in St. Peter and a 68-54 win on Feb. 6 in St. Paul. Gustavus's last win in the series came by way of a 66-56 victory on Feb. 17, 2010.

#### **SCOUTING THE TOMMIES**

• After suffering its first MIAC loss of the season 56-54 to Saint Mary's on Saturday, Jan. 11 in Winona, the St. Thomas women's basketball team bounced back with a 69-52 win over Bethel on Monday, Jan. 13 at Schoenecker Arena.

In the win against Bethel, St. Thomas jumped out to a 34-20 halftime lead and didn't look back. The Tommies shot 52-percent from the field in the second half and 46.3-percent in the game. Taylor Young went 9-for-11 from the field, knocked down her only three-point try, and went 4-of-4 at the line for a game-high 23 points. Maggie Weiers went 6-for-9 from the field and posted a double-double with 14 points and 13 rebounds (9 defensive).

So far this season, St. Thomas has benefited from a balanced scoring attack that features two players averaging double-figures and another three players scoring close to 10 points per game. Center Maggie Weiers is the top-ranked shooter in the league with a 52.1-percent field goal percentage. She is averaging 14.1 points per game and is bringing down an average of 10.5 rebounds. Taylor Young sits behind Weiers in scoring with a 13.6 ppg average and a 45.5-percent shooting percentage from the floor. Rounding out St. Thomas's offensive threat is Katie Stone at 9.8 ppg, Kelly Brandenberg at 9.5 ppg, and Anna Smith at 9.3 ppg.

The Tommies are scoring an average of 70.1 ppg (5th/MIAC) and are firing at a league-high 45.5-percent clip from the field. St. Thomas also boasts the conference's top defense, allowing an average of 50.7 points and limiting opponents to a league-best 32.2-percent shooting from the field.

#### **NEWS AND NOTES**

**SCORING SURGE -** The Gustie cagers went on a scoring-surge on Saturday, turning in a season-best 89 points in their eight point win over Carleton. Gustavus finished with its best field goal shooting performance of January at 46.7-percent - a drastic improvement compared to the club's 36.1-percent shooting average through the first three games of the month. Saturday's point total is the highest by a Gustavus team since Jan. 17, 2011 when the Gusties defeated Augsburg 91-70 in Minneapolis. The Gusties scored over 80 points twice last season in an 86-66 win over Saint Mary's (Jan. 2) and an 87-57 victory over Hamline (Jan. 5) both on Gus Young Court.

**BLASCHKO DELIVERS -** Gustavus senior guard Rachelle Blaschko turned in her best overall performance of the season on Saturday against the Knights. Blaschko registered her second-highest point total of the year with eight points on 3-of-9 shooting, but more importantly, dished out a careerbest 11 assists. The Henderson, Minn. product is the first Gustie to finish with double-digit assists since the 2009-10 season when Brianna Radtke did so twice. Radtke shelled out 13 dimes on Dec. 2 against Carleton and 10 dimes on Feb. 1 against Augsburg. With a total of 43 assists (2nd/MIAC) on the year, Rachelle Blaschko is currently ranked second in the MIAC in assists per game at 3.9. Bridget Pethke of Saint Mary's leads the league with 56 assists for an average of 5.1 per game.

Laurie Kelly will begin her second season as the head coach of the Gustavus women's basketball team in 2013-14. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a major in speech communications, comes to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she directed the Division I Lumberjacks for nine seasons.

Under Kelly's direction, the 2012-13 Gusties went 14-8 in the MIAC, finishing sixth in the conference standings. In the team's 13th appearance in the MIAC Playoffs, Gustavus was eliminated in the first round by Saint Mary's 76-69. The Gusties finished 15-11 overall, reaching the 15-win mark for the eighth consecutive season. Senior Abby Rothenbuehler (North Mankato, Minn.) and first-year Karina Schroeder (Lake Crystal, Minn.) were featured in the MIAC's Post-Season Awards. Rothenbuehler earned a spot on the All-Conference Team, while Schroeder was placed on the All-Rookie Team. Rothenbuehler scored a career-best 327 points to lead Gustavus with a 12.6 points per game scoring average. She shot 48.3-percent from the field and brought down a total of 213 rebounds (8.2 rpg). Rothenbuehler finishes her career the program's all-time leader in blocked shots with 121.



A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after a record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early `90s. In the past nine years at Northern Arizona, she has compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while also directing the team to its first-ever Big Sky Conference tournament title and NCAA tournament bid in the 2005-06 season. During Kelly's tenure, the Lumberjacks advanced to the Big Sky tournament six times with two appearances in the championship game (2006, 2007), and her teams have registered two of the three 20-win seasons in the program's history.

In addition to quality on the floor, her squads have also been strong in the classroom, with four players earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors including one Academic All-American. The Lumberjacks were recognized in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Academic Honor Roll six times, with two Top Ten national rankings. Following the 2012-13 season, the Gustavus women's basketball team achieved a significant milestone when the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) announced its Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll following the year. Making their 15th appearance on the NCAA Division III honor roll, the Gusties were recognized as the team with the top cumulative grade point average in country at a 3.600 – a first in the program's history.

Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In that first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the team to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly started her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-I Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January of 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Laurie Kelly is the ninth head coach in the 44-year history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. Heading into the 2013-14 season, the Gusties have compiled an all-time record of 618-422 (.594), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly will serve as the coordinator of the Gustavus Health Promotion program (GHP). The Gustavus Health Promotion program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan and Madison.
