SETTING THE SCENE

• The Gustavus Adolphus women's basketball team will cap its three-game road-stand with an MIAC contest against Carleton College this weekend. The Gusties will travel to Northfield, Minn. on Saturday, Feb. 8 to take on the Knights at 1:00 p.m. in the West Gym. With a win over Macalester on Wednesday night, Gustavus moved two wins ahead of Saint Benedict and retained its sixth place standing in the MIAC. The Gusties head into the weekend at 12-8 overall and 9-8 in the MIAC, while Carleton comes in ranked 10th in the league at 5-15 overall and 3-14 in the MIAC.

LAST TIME OUT

• Thanks to a strong push at the end of Wednesday night's game in St. Paul, the Gustavus women's basketball team was able to pick up its fourth straight victory by way of a 71-49 win over Macalester. Trailing by as many as 19 points in the second half, the Scots were able to cut the lead to 10 (57-47) with 7:41 left to play. From that point on, Gustavus buckled down on defense and didn't allow Macalester to score again until there were just :44 seconds remaining.

Gustavus went 24-for-53 (45.3%) from the field, 1-for-9 (11.1%) from three, and 22-for-29 (75.9%) at the charity stripe. Karina Schroeder led the scoring effort with 17 points and completed a double-double with 11 rebounds. Julia Dysthe finished next in line with 15 points, Britta Rinke scored 12, and Hanna Howard added 10 off the bench. The Gusties won the turnover battle 10-16 and controlled the glass 38-29.

SERIES HISTORY

• Saturday's game will be the 69th meeting between Gustavus and Carleton in women's basketball. The Gusties hold the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 46-22.

AT LAST THEY MET

• In the first meeting of the season between Gustavus and Carleton back on Jan. 11, the Gusties snapped a three-game skid using their best offensive performance of the season. Gustavus defeated the Knights 89-81 on Alumnae Day at Gus Young Court, earning the team's first win of the 2014 calendar year.

Sophomores Karina Schroeder (7-14 FG) and Anna Lundquist (6-8 FG) were the difference on the blocks, scoring 20 and 15 points, respectively, for their best combined outing of the season. Schroeder recorded her fourth double-double after bringing down a game-high 12 rebounds (7 defensive). To go along with the combined 35 points from Schroeder and Lundquist, Julia Dysthe led all scorers with 21 points on 7-of-16 shooting.

The Black and Gold finished the game over the 45-percent mark from the floor for the first time in January, going 35-for-75 (46.7%) from the field, 3-for-12 (25%) from three-point range, and 16-for-25 (64%) at the free throw line. The key stat in the game, however, was Gustavus's rebounding advantage. Coach Laurie Kelly's squad ended up with a 47-to-26 edge on the glass, which included a 22-to-4 advantage on the offensive glass.

SCOUTING THE KNIGHTS

• The Carleton women's basketball team heads into the weekend looking to snap a three-game slide. The Knights most recently fell to MIAC-leader Saint Mary's on Wednesday night in Northfield. Carleton trailed by just six at halftime, but Saint Mary's limited the Knights to just 27.8-percent shooting and 20 points in the second half. Michele Arima led Carleton in scoring with 19 points after going 6-for-10 from the field, 3-for-5 from three-point range, and 4-for-6 at the line.

Because Carleton's leading scorer Skylar Tsutsui has been out with an injury the past four games, Jenny Ramey has increased her scoring output. Over the past five games, Ramey is averaging 13.8 points and is shooting 31.5-percent from the field. The Knights will also look to Emma Purfeerst to slow down Karina Schroeder on the blocks. Purfeerst is averaging 10.6 points, six rebounds, and is shooting 50-percent from the floor over the last five games.

Although they are shooting a league-low 27.7-percent from beyond the arc, the Knights rely heavily on the three-pointer. Carleton leads the league in both three-point attempts (25.8) and three-point makes (7.2) per game. Within conference play, the Knights are averaging 60.5 points per game and are shooting 35.9-percent from the field

BY THE NUMBERS

9.5 - Karina Schroeder's third-ranked rebounding average within conference play. In Wednesday night's win over Macalester, Schroeder recorded her first double-double in five games with 17 points and 11 rebounds. In Gustavus's three games during February, Schroder is averaging 12.3 points and 8.3 rebounds.

77.6 - Carleton's scoring average in the team's five wins this season. In losses, Carleton averages just 59.4 points per game.

4 - The number of times this season that a Gustavus bench player has scored in double-figures. Hannah Howard scored 10 points in Wednesday's win, becoming the first Gustie player off the bench to reach double-digits since Anna Lundquist scored 10 against St. Thomas on Jan. 15.

10 - The number of turnovers Gustavus recorded in its last time out. It was the Black and Gold's second-lowest turnover total of the season. The Gusties turned the ball over a season-low eight times in their 70-38 win over Northwestern on Nov. 30.

Laurie Kelly will begin her second season as the head coach of the Gustavus women's basketball team in 2013-14. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a major in speech communications, comes to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she directed the Division I Lumberjacks for nine seasons.

Under Kelly's direction, the 2012-13 Gusties went 14-8 in the MIAC, finishing sixth in the conference standings. In the team's 13th appearance in the MIAC Playoffs, Gustavus was eliminated in the first round by Saint Mary's 76-69. The Gusties finished 15-11 overall, reaching the 15-win mark for the eighth consecutive season. Senior Abby Rothenbuehler (North Mankato, Minn.) and first-year Karina Schroeder (Lake Crystal, Minn.) were featured in the MIAC's Post-Season Awards. Rothenbuehler earned a spot on the All-Conference Team, while Schroeder was placed on the All-Rookie Team. Rothenbuehler scored a career-best 327 points to lead Gustavus with a 12.6 points per game scoring average. She shot 48.3-percent from the field and brought down a total of 213 rebounds (8.2 rpg). Rothenbuehler finishes her career the program's all-time leader in blocked shots with 121.



A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after a record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early `90s. In the past nine years at Northern Arizona, she has compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while also directing the team to its first-ever Big Sky Conference tournament title and NCAA tournament bid in the 2005-06 season. During Kelly's tenure, the Lumberjacks advanced to the Big Sky tournament six times with two appearances in the championship game (2006, 2007), and her teams have registered two of the three 20-win seasons in the program's history.

In addition to quality on the floor, her squads have also been strong in the classroom, with four players earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors including one Academic All-American. The Lumberjacks were recognized in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Academic Honor Roll six times, with two Top Ten national rankings. Following the 2012-13 season, the Gustavus women's basketball team achieved a significant milestone when the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) announced its Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll following the year. Making their 15th appearance on the NCAA Division III honor roll, the Gusties were recognized as the team with the top cumulative grade point average in country at a 3.600 – a first in the program's history.

Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In that first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the team to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly started her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-1 Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January of 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Laurie Kelly is the ninth head coach in the 44-year history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. Heading into the 2013-14 season, the Gusties have compiled an all-time record of 618-422 (.594), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly will serve as the coordinator of the Gustavus Health Promotion program (GHP). The Gustavus Health Promotion program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan and Madison.
