SETTING THE SCENE

The Gustavus Adolphus women's basketball team earned the No. 6 seed in the MIAC Plavoffs and will travel to St. Paul to take on the No. 3 seed Tommies of the University of St. Thomas on Tuesday, Feb. 25 at 7:30 p.m. Gustavus earned the sixth and final spot in the MIAC Playoffs on the last day of the regular season by defeating St. Catherine 82-52 on Saturday in St. Paul. St. Thomas locked in the third seed after capping the regular season with a 69-52 win over Saint Benedict on Saturday in St. Joseph. The Gusties enter the postseason at 14-11 overall after finishing their conference schedule with a record of 11-11. The Tommies are 21-4 overall and went 19-3 in league play.

TICKET INFORMATION

For Tuesday's quarterfinal women's basketball game, the rate is \$7 for adult and \$3 for any student (5 years old and vounger are free). There is no senior discount. MIAC passes will be honored. No other passes are to be accepted.

MIAC PLAYOFF HISTORY

Since the initiation of the six-team MIAC Tournament in the 2000-01 season, the Gustavus women's basketball team has qualified for the conference playoffs every year. The Gusties are making their 14th consecutive appearance in the MIAC Playoffs this season, holding a record of 8-13 all-time in the league's post-season tournament. Gustavus has had its share of struggles on the road in the playoffs, coming into Tuesday night's game with an 0-11 record in games away from Gus Young Court. Under the direction of Head Coach Laurie Kelly in what was her first season at the helm of the program in 2012-13, the Gusties suffered a 76-69 loss on the road to Saint Mary's in the MIAC Quarterfinals.

SERIES HISTORY

Tuesday night's game will be the 74th meeting between Gustavus and St. Thomas in women's basketball. The Tommies have the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 50-23. St. Thomas swept the regular season series against

the Gusties with a 79-52 win on Jan. 15 at Gus Young Court and a 90-56 victory on Feb. 19 at Schoenecker Arena.

The Gustavus and St. Thomas women's basketball teams have met a total of five times in the MIAC Playoffs. The Tommies have won the past four matchups and hold a record of 4-1 in those five games. The two teams most recently met on Feb. 25, 2012 in the MIAC Playoff Championship held at Schoenecker Arena. St. Thomas came out victorious in that game by the score of 66-54, earning the MIAC's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament. Gustavus's last postseason win against the Tommies came by way of a 79-71 victory in the quarterfinal round on Feb. 23, 2004.

SCOUTING THE TOMMIES

The St. Thomas women's basketball team heads into Tuesday's playoff game averaging 69 points per game (3rd/ MIAC). The Tommies are shooting 45.9-percent from the field and 36.3-percent from three-point range, both of which marks top the MIAC. Defensively, St. Thomas is just as good. The team allows 49 points per game (1st/MIAC) and limits opponents to just 32.2-percent shooting from the field (1st/MIAC) and 24.4-percent shooting from three-point range (1st/MIAC).

To go along with Maggie Weiers scoring presence on the blocks, Taylor Young and Katie Stone also average doublefigures. Young averaged 13.4 points per game and shot 45.2-percent from the field through the regular season, while Stone averaged 10.3 points and shot 41.6-percent. Stone is also the squad's top three-point threat, shooting 38.1-percent from behind the arc.

In order to be successful on Tuesday, the Gusties will need to find a way to slow down a St. Thomas team that shot the lights out against them in the regular season. The Tommies shot 54.9-percent in the first matchup on Jan. 15 and 60.3-percent in the most recent contest on Feb. 19.

NEWS AND NOTES

Battle On The Blocks – Tuesday's game will feature a battle on the blocks between two of the MIAC's top post players in Gustavus's Karina Schroeder and St. Thomas's Maggie Weiers. Schroeder is averaging 14.3 points per game (6th/ MIAC) and is shooting a league-best 53.4-percent from the field. Weiers is averaging 14 points per game (7th/MIAC) and is shooting 50-percent from the field (4th/MIAC). To go along with their top scoring averages and shooting percentages, Schroeder and Weiers are also two of the league's top rebounders. Weiers brings down an average of 9.1 boards per game, while Schroeder averages and even nine rebounds. Both players have also proven to be doubledouble machines this season with Schroeder recording nine and Weiers tallying eight.

Johnson Adds Scoring Threat - Sophomore post Lindsey Johnson has come on strong over the last month and increased her scoring average to 8.6 points per game - 2.4 points greater than her 6.2 ppg average on Jan. 22. Johnson is coming off her best outing of the season on Saturday at St. Kate's where she scored a season-best 22 points after going 7-for-10 from the field, 2-for-2 from three-point range, and 6-for-6 at the line. She is averaging 16.5 points and is 21-for-46 (45.7%) from the field and 6-for-8 (75%) from behind the arc over her last four games.

Dysthe Returns - After sitting out the Saint Mary's and St. Thomas games to rest a lower-body injury, senior guard Julia Dysthe returned to the court on Saturday against St. Catherine. Dysthe scored 17 points, her highest point-total in over a month, and dished out five assists in the win. She was an efficient 7-for-8 from the field and 3-for-4 from three-point range, which were her two best shooting marks of the season. The White Bear Lake native is averaging 13.7 points per game (8th/MIAC) and is shooting 43.7-percent from the field (14th/MIAC). Dysthe's free throw percentage of .841 also ranks third in the league.

On The Road - As the sixth seed in the conference tournament, the Gustavus women's basketball team will be on the road for the remainder of its season. The Gusties are 7-5 on the road and are averaging 65.9 points per game. Gustavus has shot better away from Gus Young Court with a .428 field goal percentage, yet averages more turnovers at 18.1 per game compared to 14.5 at home.

Laurie Kelly will begin her second season as the head coach of the Gustavus women's basketball team in 2013-14. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a major in speech communications, comes to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she directed the Division I Lumberjacks for nine seasons.

Under Kelly's direction, the 2012-13 Gusties went 14-8 in the MIAC, finishing sixth in the conference standings. In the team's 13th appearance in the MIAC Playoffs, Gustavus was eliminated in the first round by Saint Mary's 76-69. The Gusties finished 15-11 overall, reaching the 15-win mark for the eighth consecutive season. Senior Abby Rothenbuehler (North Mankato, Minn.) and first-year Karina Schroeder (Lake Crystal, Minn.) were featured in the MIAC's Post-Season Awards. Rothenbuehler earned a spot on the All-Conference Team, while Schroeder was placed on the All-Rookie Team. Rothenbuehler scored a career-best 327 points to lead Gustavus with a 12.6 points per game scoring average. She shot 48.3-percent from the field and brought down a total of 213 rebounds (8.2 rpg). Rothenbuehler finishes her career the program's all-time leader in blocked shots with 121.



A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after a record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early `90s. In the past nine years at Northern Arizona, she has compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while also directing the team to its first-ever Big Sky Conference tournament title and NCAA tournament bid in the 2005-06 season. During Kelly's tenure, the Lumberjacks advanced to the Big Sky tournament six times with two appearances in the championship game (2006, 2007), and her teams have registered two of the three 20-win seasons in the program's history.

In addition to quality on the floor, her squads have also been strong in the classroom, with four players earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors including one Academic All-American. The Lumberjacks were recognized in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Academic Honor Roll six times, with two Top Ten national rankings. Following the 2012-13 season, the Gustavus women's basketball team achieved a significant milestone when the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) announced its Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll following the year. Making their 15th appearance on the NCAA Division III honor roll, the Gusties were recognized as the team with the top cumulative grade point average in country at a 3.600 – a first in the program's history.

Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In that first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the team to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly started her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-1 Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January of 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Laurie Kelly is the ninth head coach in the 44-year history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. Heading into the 2013-14 season, the Gusties have compiled an all-time record of 618-422 (.594), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly will serve as the coordinator of the Gustavus Health Promotion program (GHP). The Gustavus Health Promotion program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan and Madison.
