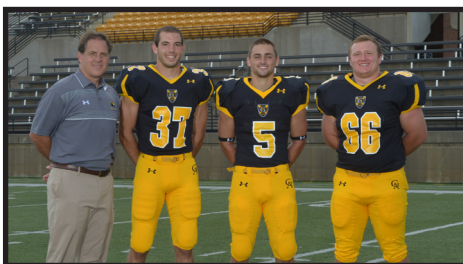
GUSTIES TAKE TO GRIDIRON FOR 98TH SEASON...

The Gustavus football team began its 98th season today at Lloyd Hollingsworth Field on Saturday, Sept. 6. Over the previous 97 years, the Gusties have compiled a record of 475-339-21, including a record of 219-123-8 in St. Peter. With 22 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) championships, Gustavus has claimed the second-most league titles in the 94-year history of the conference. Only Saint John's (31) has claimed more MIAC championships.

FOLLOW THE GUSTIES ON KNUJ...KNUJ

AM 860 out of New Ulm, Minnesota, will once again broadcast all ten Gustavus regular season football games. The voice of the Golden Gusties Tom Wheeler will handle the play-by-play duties for the ninth consecutive season. Wheeler will once again be joined by 1984 Gustavus graduate and former Gustie football player Ken Ericson on the live call of this year's games. Fans can listen to the KNUJ broadcasts on the Internet through the Gustavus Athletics website. New this season, Gustavus will provide a high definition video stream of all home games for viewing on your computer, tablet, or smart phone through GameCentral by Stretch Internet. Calling All Captains... Of over 5,000 student-athletes who have played football for Gustavus in the 98-year history of the program, only 191 have earned the privilege to serve as team captain. Peter Haugen's captains this season include seniors Jake Forcier, Michael Hintze, and Zach Vine.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP... In what has become a trend of Head Coach Peter Haugen's tenure, the 2014 Gustavus football roster once again features a great deal of senior leadership. With 21 seniors on this year's squad, the Gustavus roster features the fifth-most seniors on any Gustie football team since the turn of the century. The 2003 (28), 2002 (26), 2011 (23), and 2013 (22) teams are the only four squads during that span to have more or as many seniors wearing Black and Gold. This year's senior class features five defensive backs, six defensive lineman, three kickers, two wide receivers, two linebackers, one offensive lineman, and one tight end.

GUSTIE FOOTBALL AROUND THE GLOBE...

The 2014 Gustavus football team features a total of 111 players from ten different states and, for the third straight year, a second country outside the United States. Of those 111 players, 91 claim Minnesota as their native state. Four players call Illinois home, three hail from Kansas, and one player each from California, Colorado, Florida, Hawaii, Iowa, South Dakota, Wisconsin, and Texas represents the Stars and Stripes. Mexico once again makes its presence felt on this year's roster as it is the homeland of five Gusties, all of whom hail from Cancun.

NOTES

THE SERIES... Saturday's game will be the 82nd meeting between Gustavus and Hamline on the gridiron. The Gusties hold the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 58-23. Gustavus has been in control of the series as of late, heading into today's contest riding an eight-game winning-streak over the Pipers. In last year's meeting between the two teams on Oct. 5 in St. Paul, the Gustie offense exploded for 489 total yards en route to a 52-7 victory. Running back Jeffrey Dubose '14 scored five touchdowns and gained 200 yards on 16 carries, while Gustavus's defense forced two turnovers, allowed just 263 total yards, and recovered a fumble for a touchdown.

MEET THE HEAD COACHES... Head Coach Peter Haugen is at the beginning of his sixth season at the helm of the Gustavus football program. Haugen has a combined record of 21-31 in his first five-plus seasons. A graduate of Bethel University, Haugen was the head coach at Washburn High School in Minneapolis prior to coming to Gustavus.

Hamline head coach Chad Rogosheske is in his second season at the head of the Piper football team. A 1997 graduate of Hamline University, Rogosheske made his way back to his alma mater after spending two seasons as the offensive line coach at Bucknell University. In his first season as head coach he led the Pipers to an overall record of 2-8 and an MIAC mark of 1-7.

HENDRICKS STAYS HOT... Junior quarterback Mitch Hendricks (Laporte, Minn.) enters the third week of the season one of the hottest players in the country. Accounting for 75-percent of Gustavus's total offense and 10 (one rushing, nine passing) of the team's 11 offensive touchdowns, Hendricks is enjoying one of the best starts to a season by a quarterback in Gustavus football history. After throwing five touchdown passes and adding another one on the ground against Crown, the junior followed up with four touchdown strikes and 356 yards after completing 32 of his 41 passes against Lake Forest. His 356-yard passing total ranks sixth in program history and is the second time in his career that he has eclipsed the 300-yard mark. Compared to the rest of the NCAA Division III quarterbacks across the country, Hendricks ranks third in third in completion percentage (79.7%),

fourth in passing touchdowns (9), fifth in passing efficiency (5), 11th in passing yards (637), and 16th in passing yards per game (318.5). The Bemidji product is responsible for 60 of the team's 86 points, a total that leads MIAC schools and ranks fourth in the country.

FAST START AND MIAC OPENERS... At 2-0 overall following non-conference play, the Gustavus football team is off to its best start since the 2008 season when the Gusties opened up with wins over Coe College (27-19) and Hamline (21-9). Over the past 20 seasons, Gustavus has begun the year 2-0 a total of six times—averaging 6.6 wins in those six seasons. Now in their 91st year as a charter member of the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Gustavus boasts an all-time conference record of 374-244-13, which includes a record of 51-34-5 in MIAC season openers. Gustavus's first MIAC contest was in 1920 when the Gusties fell at the hands of St. Olaf by a final score of 14-0. The last time Gustavus and Hamline began MIAC play against one another occurred in 2009 and resulted in a thrilling 30-24 victory in double-overtime for the Gusties.

MICHAEL HINTZE SETTLES INTO NEW ROLE... After spending his first two seasons as a member of the receiving corps and missing his junior year because of an injury, senior Michael Hintze (Brooklyn Park, Minn.) has settled into a new role at cornerback. Although Gustie fans can still expect to see No. 5 running routes in certain offense packages, Hintze joins a secondary that is both deep and experienced. So far, he has recorded four tackles (three solo), picked off one pass, and broken up one other. On Saturday at Lake Forest, not only did Hintze lay a downfield block that opened a lane on Xavier Fust's interception return, but he was also "Johnny on the spot" when Fust fumbled into the end zone. The fumble recovery touchdown was Hintze's first score since catching a 15-yard touchdown pass from Tim Stepka '13 on Nov. 3, 2012, against Carleton. Gustavus's starting secondary of Hintze and Nick Frandsen (Sr., North Oaks, Minn.) at corner, and Fust and Jake Forcier (Sr., Watkins, Minn.) at safety has combined for three interceptions, nine pass break-ups, and is currently the ranked 26th in the country in passing yards allowed per game at 125.

MIAC Co-Offensive Players-of-the-Week

The second week of the 2014 MIAC football season was filled with numerous outstanding offensive performances, with a pair of record-setting efforts by two juniors rising to the top. Augsburg QB Ayrton Scott (Minneapolis, Minn./Southwest) racked up 504 yards of total offense and seven total touchdowns while becoming the Auggies all-time leading rusher, and Saint John's RB Sam Sura set a new Johnnie school record with 281 yards on the ground to go along with two touchdowns.



MIAC Defensive Player-of-the-Week

The Tommie defense was led by a breakout performance by senior linebacker Cavan Metzler (Green Bay, Wis./Notre Dame Academy), who led the team in tackles and tackles-for-a-loss and scored a defensive touchdown in the convincing win.



MIAC Special Teams Player-of-the-Week

The Carleton football team scored its first victory of the season Saturday with a 40-14 win over Knox, and the leg of kicker Brandt Davis (La Verne, Calif./Bonita) was a big factor in the victory. The Knights sophomore sent all six of his attempts through the uprights and played a huge role in the field-position game with his kickoffs.



SCHLEUSENER PUTS THE SPECIAL IN SPECIAL TEAMS... Following a breakout season in his first year on the team in 2013, senior Thomas Schleusener (Rapid City, S.D.) has established himself as one of the top kicking specialists in the MIAC. In addition to his kicking duties, Schleusener is also the team's primary punter. This season, he has made his only field goal try from 29 yards out and is 11-for-12 in extra point tries with 11 straight after missing his first opportunity of the year. Against the Foresters, he punted four times for 159 yards and a 39.8-yard average with one downed inside the 20-yard line. Schleusener also averaged 60.3 yards on his seven kickoffs, giving Lake Forest an average starting field position of the 28-yard-line. The Rapid City native's 60.9-yard kickoff average leads the league, while his 42.7-yard punting average ranks second.

HISTORY LESSON: Ninety years ago this week, the 1924 Gustavus football team began practicing on what was Hallander Field with one of its largest, most veteran rosters. Although the Gusties finished their 1924 campaign just 2-5-1 overall and 2-3-1 in the MIAC, that season marked a significant turning point and a dawning of a new era in Gustavus football. With athletics on the rise at the College, the Board of Trustees approved the addition of a full-time assistant coach to assist then head coach D.C. Mitchell. The choice was then made to hire George Myrum—a decision that would have a profound impact on Gustavus and its athletics program for decades to come. A native of Worthington and graduate of the University of Minnesota, Myrum accepted the position as Mitchell's assistant along with head coaching duties for the baseball team. After two seasons on staff, Myrum took over the reigns of the program and led the Black and Gold during one of its most successful eras. He won six MIAC championships and put together an overall record of 63-20-6 from 1926 to 1938. Tragically, coach Myrum was killed on November 12, 1938, when the bus carrying the team home from the season's final game at St. Norbert's College in DePere, Wisc., crashed into a stalled truck. An early pioneer in collegiate athletics, he planned and supervised the construction of the first Gustavus football stadium, which opened in 1929 and was used until 2006.

IN THE RED ZONE... Through two games, when the Gustavus football team enters the red zone, it scores. The Gusties are 8-for-8 in red zone scoring with seven of those

scores being touchdowns. No team in the MIAC has more red zone touchdowns. Hamline is 9-for-13 in red zone scoring with six of those seven scores being touchdowns.

BY THE NUMBERS...

7 - The number of combined touchdown receptions twins Matt and Gabriel Boyce have recorded this season. Matt has caught four touchdowns (6th/NCAA), while Gabriel has caught three (11th/NCAA). They have each caught 15 passes with Matt racking up 225 yards and Gabe totaling 175.

34 - The amount of rushing yards Gustavus allowed Lake Forest last weekend. To go along with the 179 yards Gustavus gave up through the air, the Foresters managed just 213 yards of total offense - the Gusties' best defensive performance since holding Carleton to seven points and just 141 yards on Nov. 12, 2011.

19 - Where Gustavus's scoring average of 43.0 points per game ranks in the nation. The Gusties currently boast the 13th ranked passing offense (338.0 ypg) and are averaging 444.5 total yards per game. Gustavus has given up an average of 13 points and rank 22nd in total defense, allowing an average of 111.5 yards rushing and 125 yards passing for a total of 236.5 yards per game.

32 - The percentage of Hamline's total plays running back Austin Duncan has carried the ball in. Duncan has totaled 390 yards on 51 carries for an average of 7.6 yards per rush. His total rushing yards and per-game average (195.0) currently rank second in the nation.

60 - Gustavus's league-leading third down conversion percentage. The Gusties are 12-for-20 on third down this season. Defensively, opponents are a combined 14-for-35 for a conversion rate of 41-percent.

17 - The team-best number of tackles Zack Martinez has registered thus far. Martinez is currently the fifth-ranked tackler in the MIAC.

Peter Haugen, a native of Minneapolis and a 1991 graduate of Bethel University, is in his sixth year as head football coach at Gustavus Adolphus College.

The Gustavus football team capped the most successful season during head Coach Peter Haugen's tenure with an overall record of 6-4 and an MIAC mark of 4-4. Gustavus picked up signature wins over St. Olaf 45-19 on Homecoming in late-September and Saint John's in a double-overtime thriller 23-20 in early-November. Of Gustavus's four losses in 2013, three were by eight or fewer points. In the MIAC's post-season honors, first team all-conference recipients included senior running back Jeffrey Dubose (St. Paul, Minn.), senior center David Gschneidner (Edina, Minn.), and senior guard Lyle Opdahl (Norwood Young America, Minn.) on offense, and senior defensive tackle Donte Green (Minneapolis, Minn.), senior linebacker Joe Haas (Mission, Kan.), and junior cornerback Zach Dilger (South St. Paul, Minn.) on defense.

In five-plus seasons at the head of the Gustavus Adolphus football program, Haugen has compiled an overall record of 21-31 and an MIAC record of 14-26.

Haugen, who was the head football coach at Washburn High School for 15 years prior to coming to Gustavus, compiled an overall record of 111-44 during that span, while winning 11 league championships and posting a league record of 76-8. He directed the Millers to the Class AAAA quarterfinals in 2007 finishing with a mark of 9-3. In his last season as the Millers head coach, Haugen's squad posted a mark of 8-2. While building the program at Washburn, Haugen increased player participation from 35 players in 1994 to 110 players. He also implemented academic monitoring and meal programs for student athletes as well as creating and directing the highly successful Washburn Athletic Leadership Academy. He served as the chair of the Minneapolis Football Conference this past year and he is an active clinician working at many local and regional clinics including the NIKE Coach of the Year clinic. Haugen was also a member of the Metro coaching staff for the Minnesota All-Star game in 1998. He started his coaching career at his alma mater serving as the offensive line coach during the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

A three-sport standout at Bethel, Haugen was a starting tight end on the football team, a starting goaltender on the hockey team, and a starting catcher on the baseball team in the late '80s and early 90s. In his senior year, he earned All-Conference honors in football, and was selected Most Valuable Player of the hockey team.

Haugen became the 17th head coach in the 95-year history of Gustavus football. The Golden Gusties have a long and storied football tradition that includes 22 MIAC titles. The program ranks in the top-50 all-time in Division III (out of 235 institutions) with a .580 winning percentage.

Along with great teams, Gustavus has also been blessed with many outstanding individual players, which includes 29 players who have received All-America honors, 13 who have received CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, and five who have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Most recently in 2014, senior cornerback Torey Asao was named a CoSIDA Academic All-America honoree.

St. Peter, Minn. – The Gustavus Adolphus football team ran away with a 44-17 victory over Crown College in its 2014 season-opener on Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. The Gusties jumped out to a 30-7 halftime lead and never looked back as their aerial attack proved to be too much for the Crown secondary. Quarterback Mitch Hendricks (Jr., Laporte, Minn.) was efficient throughout the afternoon, going 23-for-28 for 260 yards with five touchdowns. His top target was Matt Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) who made nine catches for 146 yards and three touchdowns.

“The offense as a whole was clicking today,” said Hendricks. “The offensive line did a great job of keeping their defenders off me, the running backs ran the ball well after a bit of a slow start, and the receivers made plays. Matt made some big catches and Gabe and George were making guys miss all over the field. It’s a receiving corps that is young but explosive and that’s what we want to take advantage of. We executed what we needed to today and that was enough to put points on the board and pick up a win.”

After forcing Crown to punt on the opening possession of the game, Gustavus went to work on its first offensive drive of the season. Hendricks completed all five of his passes on a drive that totaled 60 yards on nine plays in 2:51. The series was capped off by a 12-yard touchdown pass from Hendricks to Harrison Feldkamp (Jr., Sibley, Iowa.) that put Gustavus on top 6-0. Mitch Hendricks threw for five touchdowns and 260 yards in efficient fashion.

Following another defensive stop, Hendricks continued to stay hot in the passing game. On third down and six from the Crown 28-yard-line, Hendricks connected with Matt Boyce for a 28-yard catch-and-run touchdown that put Gustavus on top 13-0 following the extra point with 4:44 remaining in the first quarter.

Crown got back into the game and generated some momentum at the end of the first quarter when DaiVon Poole (Fr., San Angelo, Texas) coughed up a fumble that was recovered by the Storm at the Gustavus 31-yard-line. Later at the 13:34 mark of the second quarter, Crown quarterback Brandon McCormick hit Ben Olson on a three-yard touchdown pass, cutting the lead to 13-7 after the extra point.

Gustavus responded to Crown’s score with a 26-yard field goal by Thomas Scheusener (Sr., Rapid City, S.D.) on its next possession, extending its lead to 16-7 with 11:09 left in the half.

Taking advantage of a short field less than three minutes later, Hendricks once again went up top to Matt Boyce for the second of their three touchdowns together. This time, the junior quarterback hit Boyce from 37 yards out to bring the score to 23-7.

Gustavus’s defense – which took away Crown’s passing game all afternoon – was rewarded with an interception with less than two minutes left in the opening half. On third and nine from the Crown 40-yard-line, Nick Frandsen (Sr., North Oaks, Minn.) picked off McCormick at the Gustavus 20 and returned the pick 54 yards to the Crown 26.

Sticking to the trend, Hendricks hit Matt Boyce on an 18-yard touchdown two plays later. The pair’s third touchdown put the Gusties on top 30-7 after the extra point.

The Storm drove down to the Gustavus 20-yard-line on their next drive and capped the first half with a 37-yard field goal by Chad Anenson.

At halftime, Gustavus was on top 30-10 and Mitch Hendricks was clicking. He was 16-for-20 for 194 yards with four touchdowns. Matt Boyce had made seven of his nine catches for 120 yards with three touchdowns.

The Gusties opened up with the ball in the second half and put together an eight-play, 68-yard scoring drive that lasted just 2:32. Hendricks capped the drive with a 13-yard touchdown pass to Gabriel Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) that extended the lead to 37-10 after Scheusener’s extra point. Gabriel finished behind his twin brother with 66 yards on six catches.

After a bend-don’t-break defensive stand, Gustavus got the ball back at the 4:16 mark of the third. Running back Leeland Lauti (Fr., Ewa Beach, Hawaii) carried much of the load during the Gusties’ 11-play, 70-yard scoring drive. Of the 70 yards of field covered, Lauti ran for 60 yards of it and eventually capped the drive with an eight-yard touchdown at 14:14 of the fourth quarter. His score brought an end to Gustavus’s scoring for the afternoon and extended its lead to 44-10.

Overall, running back Luke Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Kan.) led the Gusties on the ground with 62 yards on 11 carries (5.6 ypc). Lauti finished with a net of 59 yards after nine rushes (6.6 ypc).

Crown brought the score to a final (44-17) with :34 seconds to go in the game when Matt Michaud plunged across the goal line from two yards out.

To go along with Gustavus’s stellar passing display, its pass defense was just as impressive. Crown quarterback Brandon McCormick finished with just 72 yards through the air after going 11-for-25 with one interception and one touchdown.

Crown rushed for 167 yards for a total of 239 yards in the game. To go along with 270 yards through the air, Gustavus tallied 119 yards on the ground for a total of 389. The Gusties were 5-for-5 in red-zone scoring and picked up 24 first downs compared to Crown’s 16.

Leading a balanced defense was linebacker Zack Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Kan.) who recorded a team-best eight tackles (four solo). Tyler Jakes (So., North Mankato, Minn.) finished behind him with seven (six solo).

Lake Forest, Ill. - The Gustavus Adolphus football team completed the non-conference portion of its regular season schedule with a 42-9 victory over Lake Forest College on Saturday afternoon at Farwell Field. With just a 14-9 cushion at halftime, Gustavus's offense found its rhythm and its defense went into lock-down mode over the course of the final 30 minutes. The Gusties scored 28 points and allowed just three first downs and a total of 58 yards in a second half dominated by the Black and Gold.

Gustavus heads into Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference play with an overall record of 2-0. The Foresters suffer their first loss at Farwell Field since 2011 and are now 1-1.

"It's a big win and I'm proud of the guys and their effort against an unfamiliar opponent," said Head Coach Peter Haugen. "We improved as the game went on and I'm pleased with the steps we made."

On the opening possession of the afternoon, Lake Forest put together a six-play, 68-yard drive that was capped off by a Anthoney Prestly touchdown run from six yards out. Following a failed extra point attempt, the Foresters found themselves on top 6-0 by the 12:21 mark.

"Lake Forest came out strong at the beginning and we started to get things going as the game progressed," Haugen said about the start of the game. "I'm extremely proud of our defense for holding its own as our offense slowly found rhythm. With the exception of their first drive, the defense did an outstanding job and was flying around the field. We got a tremendous effort by our defensive front and linebackers shutting down the run throughout the game."

Gustavus's offense struggled to get into a groove for much of the opening portion of the game. It wasn't until after being forced to punt three straight times and turning over the ball on downs on the next drive that Gustavus was able to generate some offense. With possession of the ball halfway through the second quarter, quarterback Mitch Hendricks (Jr., Laporte, Minn.) completed three straight passes that covered 60 yards and led to the squad's first touchdown of the day. The third of his consecutive completions was a 36-yard touchdown pass to Gabriel Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.). With Thomas Schleusener's (Sr., Rapid City, S.D.) extra point, the first of his six, Gustavus had its first lead of the afternoon up 7-6 with 8:59 left in the opening half.

The Gustie offense got the ball back quickly thanks to an interception by cornerback Michael Hintze (Sr., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) on the first play of the Lake Forest's next possession.

Following Hintze's pick, it once again took Hendricks just three pass completions to get the ball into the end zone. This time he covered 45 yards and capped the drive 11-yard touchdown strike to Hunter Johnson (Fr., Cannon Falls, Minn.) at the 7:59 mark of the quarter. The touchdown was Johnson's first of his career as he finished the game with two catches for 17 yards.

Lake Forest brought the second quarter's scoring to a close with a 42-yard field goal by Jon Gurchak that cut the lead to 14-9 with :06 seconds on the clock.

At halftime, Gustavus had totaled 172 yards of total offense compared to Lake Forest's 155 yards.

It didn't take long for the Gustie offense come alive in the second half. On their first possession of the third quarter, the Gusties marched 78 yards for a touchdown that gave them a 21-9 advantage and took only 2:44. Hendricks completed 7-of-8 passes on a drive that ended with a 25-yard touchdown reception by Matt Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.).

From that point on, Gustavus scored on its next two offensive possessions. Hendricks found Gabriel Boyce from 11-yards out to give the Gusties a 28-9 advantage at 6:26 of the third quarter, and Luke Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Kan.) then put the finishes touches on a 12-play, 98-yard drive with a three-yard touchdown run at 12:47 of the fourth quarter.

Gabriel Boyce paced all receivers with nine catches for 105 yards to go along with his two touchdowns. Matt Boyce finished next in line with 74 yards on six catches with one touchdown grab.

Luke Martinez led the way on the ground with 56 yards on 11 carries for an average of 5.1 yards per rush. He

also made his presence felt in the passing game with six catches for 48 yards.

After Martinez's touchdown run, Gustavus's defense got into the scoring mix with a touchdown of its own halfway through the fourth quarter. Strong safety Xavier Fust (Sr., Columbia Heights, Minn.) picked off Prestly at the Gustavus 21-yard-line and returned it 78 yards to the Lake Forest one-yard-line. It was at the one that Fust was stripped of the ball by Mike Rantis. Fortunately for Gustavus, Michael Hintze was on the scene and was able to recover the fumble in the end zone for a touchdown, which gave Gustavus a 42-9 lead with 9:23 remaining. Hintze's touchdown signified the end of the afternoon's scoring.

Mitch Hendricks completed a pass to ten different receivers throughout the day and finished 32-for-41 for a career-high 356 yards with four touchdowns. His 356-yard passing total ranks sixth in Gustavus history and is the second time in his career that he has eclipsed the 300-yard mark.

"Mitch is playing so well and commanding this offense with such great confidence and authority," commented Haugen about his junior quarterback. "He has a supporting cast around him that is playing at the top of its game. From his receivers getting open to his young offensive line providing solid protection, it was complete team effort. He threw to ten different guys today - when you have that many targets you believe in, it makes your job a lot easier." Gabriel Boyce led Gustavus's receiving corps with a pair of touchdowns to go with 105 yards on nine catches.

As a team, Gustavus finished with 108 yards rushing and 385 yards passing for a total 493 yards. The Gusties picked up 29 first downs compared to Lake Forest's 10, went 3-for-3 in the red zone with three touchdowns, and won the time of possession battle 31:23-to-28:37.

The Foresters were limited to a total of 213 yards (34 rush, 179 pass). It is the lowest rushing total allowed by a Gustavus defense since 2012 when the Gusties gave up 27 yards to Simpson in the season-opener. Defensive coordinator Corey Shea's until also allowed the fewest amount of total yards since 2011 when it gave up 141 yards to Carleton's offense.

Leading the defense was Zach Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Kan.) who posted nine tackles (four solo) and one tackle for loss. Nick Frandsen (Sr., North Oaks, Minn.) finished next in line with seven tackles (6 solo), and Zach Burrington (Sr., Plymouth, Minn.) recorded six (four solo).

"It's still a learning process but this is another step in the right direction," Haugen concluded. "We are encouraged by the effort today and are looking forward to getting into conference play next weekend. Our league is one of the most challenging in the country, so we're going to have to stay true to the process and get back to work on Monday."
