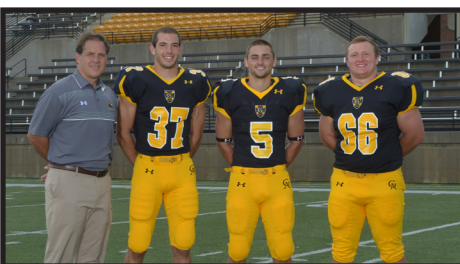

GAME NOTES

GUSTIES TAKE TO GRIDIRON FOR 98TH SEASON...The Gustavus football team began its 98th season at Lloyd Hollingsworth Field on Saturday, Sept. 6. Over the previous 97 years, the Gusties have compiled a record of 479-341-21, including a record of 222-125-8 in St. Peter. With 22 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) championships, Gustavus has claimed the second-most league titles in the 94-year history of the conference. Only Saint John's (31) has claimed more MIAC championships.

FOLLOW THE GUSTIES ON KNUJ...KNUJ AM 860 out of New Ulm, Minnesota, will once again broadcast all ten Gustavus regular season football games. The voice of the Golden Gusties Tom Wheeler will handle the play-by-play duties for the ninth consecutive season. Wheeler will once again be joined by 1984 Gustavus graduate and former Gustie football player Ken Ericson on the live call of this year's games. Fans can listen to the KNUJ broadcasts on the Internet through the Gustavus Athletics website. New this season, Gustavus will provide a high definition video stream of all home games for viewing on your computer, tablet, or smart phone through GameCentral by Stretch Internet. Calling All Captains... Of over 5,000 student-athletes who have played football for Gustavus in the 98-year history of the program, only 191 have earned the privilege to serve as team captain. Peter Haugen's captains this season include seniors Jake Forcier, Michael Hintze, and Zach Vine.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP... In what has become a trend of Head Coach Peter Haugen's tenure, the 2014 Gustavus football roster once again features a great deal of senior leadership. With 21 seniors on this year's squad, the Gustavus roster features the fifth-most seniors on any Gustie football team since the turn of the century. The 2003 (28), 2002 (26), 2011 (23), and 2013 (22) teams are the only four

squads during that span to have more or as many seniors wearing Black and Gold. This year's senior class features five defensive backs, six defensive linemen, three kickers, two wide receivers, two linebackers, one offensive lineman, and one tight end.

GUSTIE FOOTBALL AROUND THE GLOBE... The 2014 Gustavus football team features a total of 111 players from ten different states and, for the third straight year, a second country outside the United States. Of those 111 players, 91 claim Minnesota as their native state. Four players call Illinois home, three hail from Kansas, and one player each from California, Colorado, Florida, Hawaii, Iowa, South Dakota, Wisconsin, and Texas represents the Stars and Stripes. Mexico once again makes its presence felt on this year's roster as it is the homeland of five Gusties, all of whom hail from Cancun.

NOTES

MEET THE HEAD COACHES... Gustavus Head Coach Peter Haugen is in his sixth season at the helm of the Gustavus football program. Haugen has a combined record of 25-32 during his tenure at the College. A graduate of Bethel University, Haugen was the head coach at Washburn High School in Minneapolis prior to coming to Gustavus.

Head coach Terry Horan is in his 14th season at the helm of the Cobbers. In his first 13 seasons Horan has amassed 96 wins as he stands on the precipice of becoming only the third coach in program history to win 100 games. A 1989 graduate of Concordia, Horan began his coaching career in 1991 as an assistant coach at Breckenridge High School.

THE SERIES... Saturday's game will be the 83rd meeting between Gustavus and Concordia on the gridiron. Although the Gusties hold the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 44-36-2, the Cobbers have claimed victory the last three games of the series.

In last season's matchup in the season-finale on Nov. 16 in Moorhead, Concordia came away with an exciting 38-31 victory. In what was a shootout from the start, the two teams went back-and-forth for much of the afternoon. With the score tied at 31-31 halfway through the fourth quarter, Cobber quarterback Griffin Neal connected with Jon Baune from 36 yards out on what turned out to be the game-winning touchdown. Gustavus running back Jeffrey Dubose '14 scored three rushing touchdowns and ran for 198 yards, while Mitch Hendricks went 19-for-30 for 258 yards with one touchdown through the air. Cobber QB Griffin Neal stole the show with two rushing touchdowns and one passing. Through the air, Neal was 13-for-19 for 305 yards with three passes over 50 yards.

MATT BOYCE RACES INTO RECORD BOOKS... Junior wide receiver Matt Boyce propelled himself into the Gustavus record books thanks to his performance last Saturday against Bethel. With 11 catches for 93 yards to go along with two touchdown grabs, Boyce broke the school record for touchdown receptions in a season. Now with 15 on the year, Matt surpasses Ryan Hoag's '03 previous record of 14 set during the 2001 season.

Matt Boyce enters the weekend ranked amongst the top players in the country in every receiving category. He leads NCAA Division III in touchdown receptions (15),

ranks seventh in receiving yards (988), eighth in receptions per game (8.4), and 10th in receiving yards per game (123.5).

The junior has recorded six multiple-touchdown games and has gone over 100 yards receiving five times. With 988 yards, which ranks second all-time, Boyce is poised to become just the second receiver in the history of the program to reach the 1000-yard receiving plateau in a season. Chad Arlt '09 was the first and only receiver to accomplish such a feat when he totaled 1,294 yards in 2007.

MITCH HENDRICKS BREAKS, CLOSES IN ON SINGLE SEASON MARKS... With 25 completions and two touchdown passes against the Royals, quarterback Mitch Hendricks broke the single-season record for completions and has tied the single-season mark for touchdown passes. With 225 completions on the year, Hendricks topped Jordan Stolp's '08 record of 220 set in 2007. Hendricks currently has 31 touchdown passes, which matches the school-record held by both Bob Southworth in 1998 and Joe Thorvig in 2001.

Mitch Hendricks now ranks second in the nation in passing touchdowns (31), third in passing yards (2,809) and passing yards per game (351.1), fourth in completions per game (28.1), and 14th in passing efficiency (173.4). He is responsible for 198 of the team's points (3rd/NCAA) for an average of 24.8 points per game (2nd/NCAA).

The Bemidji product needs just seven yards to break Jordan Stolp's record for passing yards in a season (2,815 in 2007) and is on pace to be the first Gustavus quarterback to pass for 200 or more yards in all 10 games of the regular season. His current completion percentage of 70.8, which ranks third in the country, is already Gustavus's best mark - besting Sean Smith's 66.5-percent clip in 2002.

TEAM PASSING RECORDS SET TO FALL... Thanks to the prowess of its passing attack this season, Gustavus is on the verge of breaking the program's single-season record for passing yards. With a total of 2,870 yards, the Gusties need to pass for just 31 yards on Saturday to break the 2009 team's current record of 2,900 yards. The Gusties need three more passing touchdowns to break the 2001 team's all-time mark of 33.

Thanks in large part to offense's proficiencies through the air, Gustavus is also knocking on the door of breaking the

MIAC Offensive Player-of-the-Week

John Gould, St. Thomas
Mendota Heights, Minn. / St. Thomas Academy



St. Thomas quarterback John Gould (Mendota Heights, Minn./St. Thomas Academy) certainly made the most of his first start of the 2014 season. The Tommie junior contributed five total touchdowns - including the game-winner late in the fourth quarter - while leading St. Thomas to 509 yards of total offense in Saturday's thrilling 35-32 upset of then-No. 18-ranked Concordia.

MIAC Defensive Player-of-the-Week

The Hamline football team reached its highest win total in five years Saturday thanks to a last-second, 23-17 victory over St. Olaf. The Piper defense turned in a strong performance, led by sophomore Johnny Nguyen (Mounds View, Minn./Irondale). The linebacker set a new career best in tackles and routinely made plays behind the line of scrimmage to help Hamline get the win.

MIAC Special Teams Player-of-the-Week

The Bethel football team survived a tough test Saturday, coming from behind in the second half to beat Gustavus 30-23. Junior Philip Peterson (Richfield, Minn.) played a huge role in the win, as the Royals' punter kept tilting the field position against the explosive Gustie offense.

school-record for total yards in a season. The current Gusties have totaled 3,928 yards of offense, needing 486 yards over the last two games of the regular season to break the all-time record of 4,413 yards set in 1979. Only six teams in Gustavus football history have ever totaled more than 4,000 yards in a season. The last to do so was the 2001 squad when it amassed 4,174 yards.

PICK MAN... With a pair of interceptions last weekend against Bethel, senior cornerback Michael Hintze now leads the MIAC in picks with four. Hintze picked off quarterback Erik Peterson early in the second quarter and then again early in the fourth quarter.

He is the second Gustavus defensive back this season to intercept two passes in a game. Free safety Jake Forcier was the first to do so against Augsburg on Sept. 27.

Gustavus currently ranks second in the conference in interceptions with 11. Saint John's leads the way with 12.

MORE THAN HALFWAY HOME... Oct. 4's win over Carleton marked the halfway point of Gustavus's 2014 campaign. Although the Gusties have struggled after the halfway point of the season during Peter Haguen's tenure, they put together a strong finish at 3-2 in 2013. In 1998, the program's last 5-0 start, Gustavus went 3-2 over the backstretch to place second in the league standings at 8-2 overall and 7-2 in the MIAC.

STOP THE RUN... Although Gustavus ranks first in the MIAC against the pass - allowing an average of 165.9 yards per game and eight touchdowns - it is against the run that has Gustavus had the most trouble as of late. After allowing seven rushing touchdowns and an average of 118.8 yards per game on the ground through their first six games, the Gusties have allowed a combined six rushing touchdowns and an average of 273.5 yards on the ground over their last two outings against Saint John's and Bethel.

A turnaround in its ground defense will be needed more than ever on Saturday as the Gusties travel to the home site of the league's top rushing team in Concordia.

The Cobbers head into Saturday ranked first in the MIAC and 19th in the nation in rushing offense, averaging 248.9 yards per game. Fullback Alex McLean and quarterback Griffin Neal rank third in the MIAC in rushing touchdowns with eight. McLean is the team's leading rusher with 533 yards (8th/MIAC) for an average 59.2 yards per game (10th/MIAC) and 6.5 yards per carry (2nd/MIAC). Amongst backs with 80 or more carries, McLean is one of just two who has not turned over a fumble. Overall, Gustavus ranks fifth in the MIAC in rushing defense, allowing 157.5 yards per game.

ON THE ROAD WE GO... With its 2014 home schedule now in the rear-view mirror, Gustavus hits the road for its final two games of the 2014 regular season. In their three previous games away from St. Peter, Gustavus went 3-0 and scored an average of 44.7 points per game. The Gusties are averaging 124 yards rushing and 390.3 yards passing for an average of 514.3 yards per game. Defensively, the Gusties are allowing 23 points per game and giving up an average of 399.7 total yards (273.3 pass, 126 rush) on the road.

BY THE NUMBERS

3 - Where outside linebacker Zack Martinez's 65 total tackles rank in the MIAC. Martinez turned in a career-high 12 tackles including eight solo against Bethel last weekend. The junior also ranks fourth in the MIAC in tackles for loss with 7.5.

49.5 - Gustavus's third down conversion percentage, which ranks second in the MIAC and 20th in the nation. The Cobbers rank third in the league and 20th in the country with a 48.6-percent conversion rate on third down.

36.1 - Gustavus's net average per punt his season. The Gusties rank 10th in country in net punting and are ranked 13th in punt return defense, allowing an average of 2.63 yards per return. Thomas Schleusener has punted 24 times for a total of 951 yards. He is averaging 39.6 yards per punt, which ranks first in the MIAC. Last week against Bethel, he boomed a season-best 53-yard punt and downed two inside the 20-yard-line.

Peter Haugen, a native of Minneapolis and a 1991 graduate of Bethel University, is in his sixth year as head football coach at Gustavus Adolphus College.

The Gustavus football team capped the most successful season during head Coach Peter Haugen's tenure with an overall record of 6-4 and an MIAC mark of 4-4. Gustavus picked up signature wins over St. Olaf 45-19 on Homecoming in late-September and Saint John's in a double-overtime thriller 23-20 in early-November. Of Gustavus's four losses in 2013, three were by eight or fewer points. In the MIAC's post-season honors, first team all-conference recipients included senior running back Jeffrey Dubose (St. Paul, Minn.), senior center David Gschneidner (Edina, Minn.), and senior guard Lyle Opdahl (Norwood Young America, Minn.) on offense, and senior defensive tackle Donte Green (Minneapolis, Minn.), senior linebacker Joe Haas (Mission, Kan.), and junior cornerback Zach Dilger (South St. Paul, Minn.) on defense.

In five-plus seasons at the head of the Gustavus Adolphus football program, Haugen has compiled an overall record of 25-33 and an MIAC record of 18-27.

Haugen, who was the head football coach at Washburn High School for 15 years prior to coming to Gustavus, compiled an overall record of 111-44 during that span, while winning 11 league championships and posting a league record of 76-8. He directed the Millers to the Class AAAA quarterfinals in 2007 finishing with a mark of 9-3. In his last season as the Millers head coach, Haugen's squad posted a mark of 8-2. While building the program at Washburn, Haugen increased player participation from 35 players in 1994 to 110 players. He also implemented academic monitoring and meal programs for student athletes as well as creating and directing the highly successful Washburn Athletic Leadership Academy. He served as the chair of the Minneapolis Football Conference this past year and he is an active clinician working at many local and regional clinics including the NIKE Coach of the Year clinic. Haugen was also a member of the Metro coaching staff for the Minnesota All-Star game in 1998. He started his coaching career at his alma mater serving as the offensive line coach during the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

A three-sport standout at Bethel, Haugen was a starting tight end on the football team, a starting goaltender on the hockey team, and a starting catcher on the baseball team in the late '80s and early 90s. In his senior year, he earned All-Conference honors in football, and was selected Most Valuable Player of the hockey team.

Haugen became the 17th head coach in the 98-year history of Gustavus football. The Golden Gusties have a long and storied football tradition that includes 22 MIAC titles. The program ranks in the top-50 all-time in Division III (out of 235 institutions) with a .580 winning percentage.

Along with great teams, Gustavus has also been blessed with many outstanding individual players, which includes 29 players who have received All-America honors, 13 who have received CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, and five who have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Most recently in 2014, senior cornerback Torey Asao was named a CoSIDA Academic All-America honoree.

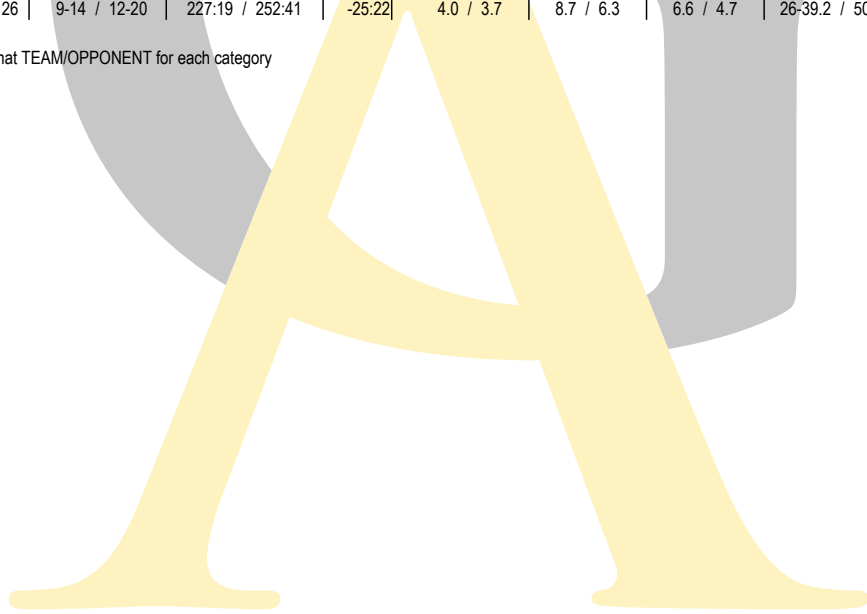

St. Peter, Minn. – The Gustavus Adolphus football team ran away with a 44-17 victory over Crown College in its 2014 season-opener on Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. The Gusties jumped out to a 30-7 halftime lead and never looked back as their aerial attack proved to be too much for the Crown secondary. Quarterback Mitch Hendricks (Jr., Laporte, Minn.) was efficient throughout the afternoon, going 23-for-28 for 260 yards with five touchdowns. His top target was Matt Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) who made nine catches for 146 yards and three touchdowns.

“The offense as a whole was clicking today,” said Hendricks. “The offensive line did a great job of keeping their defenders off me, the running backs ran the ball well after a bit of a slow start, and the receivers made plays. Matt made some big catches and Gabe and George were making guys miss all over the field. It’s a receiving corps that is young but explosive and that’s what we want to take advantage of. We executed what we needed to today and that was enough to put points on the board and pick up a win.”

After forcing Crown to punt on the opening possession of the game, Gustavus went to work on it’s first offensive drive of the season. Hendricks completed all five of his passes on a drive that totaled 60 yards on nine plays in 2:51. The series was capped off by a 12-yard touchdown pass from Hendricks to Harrison Feldkamp (Jr., Sibley, Iowa.) that put Gustavus on top 6-0. Mitch Hendricks threw for five touchdowns and 260 yards in efficient fashion.

Following another defensive stop, Hendricks continued to stay hot in the passing game. On third down and six from the Crown 28-yard-line, Hendricks connected with Matt Boyce for a 28-yard catch-and-run touchdown that put Gustavus on top 13-0 following the extra point with 4:44 remaining in the first quarter.

Crown got back into the game and generated some momentum at the end of the first quarter when DaiVon Poole (Fr., San Angelo, Texas) coughed up a fumble that was recovered by the Storm at the Gustavus 31-yard-line. Later at the 13:34 mark of the second quarter, Crown quarterback Brandon McCormick hit Ben Olson on a three-yard touchdown pass, cutting the lead to 13-7 after the extra point.

Gustavus responded to Crown’s score with a 26-yard field goal by Thomas Scheusener (Sr., Rapid City, S.D) on its next possession, extending its lead to 16-7 with 11:09 left in the half.

Taking advantage of a short field less than three minutes later, Hendricks once again went up top to Matt Boyce for the second of their three touchdowns together. This time, the junior quarterback hit Boyce from 37 yards out to bring the score to 23-7.

Gustavus’s defense – which took away Crown’s passing game all afternoon – was rewarded with an interception with less than two minutes left in the opening half. On third and nine from the Crown 40-yard-line, Nick Frandsen (Sr., North Oaks, Minn.) picked off McCormick at the Gustavus 20 and returned the pick 54 yards to the Crown 26.

Sticking to the trend, Hendricks hit Matt Boyce on an 18-yard touchdown two plays later. The pair’s third touchdown put the Gusties on top 30-7 after the extra point.

The Storm drove down to the Gustavus 20-yard-line on their next drive and capped the first half with a 37-yard field goal by Chad Anenson.

At halftime, Gustavus was on top 30-10 and Mitch Hendricks was clicking. He was 16-for-20 for 194 yards with four touchdowns. Matt Boyce had made seven of his nine catches for 120 yards with three touchdowns.

The Gusties opened up with the ball in the second half and put together an eight-play, 68-yard scoring drive that lasted just 2:32. Hendricks capped the drive with a 13-yard touchdown pass to Gabriel Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) that extended the lead to 37-10 after Scheusener’s extra point. Gabriel finished behind his twin brother with 66 yards on six catches.

After a bend-don’t-break defensive stand, Gustavus got the ball back at the 4:16 mark of the third. Running back Leeland Lauti (Fr., Ewa Beach, Hawaii) carried much of the load during the Gusties’ 11-play, 70-yard scoring drive. Of the 70 yards of field covered, Lauti ran for 60 yards of it and eventually capped the drive with an eight-yard touchdown at 14:14 of the fourth quarter. His score brought an end to Gustavus’s scoring for the afternoon and extended its lead to 44-10.

Overall, running back Luke Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Kan.) led the Gusties on the ground with 62 yards on 11 carries (5.6 ypc). Lauti finished with a net of 59 yards after nine rushes (6.6 ypc).

Crown brought the score to a final (44-17) with :34 seconds to go in the game when Matt Michaud plunged across the goal line from two yards out.

To go along with Gustavus’s stellar passing display, its pass defense was just as impressive. Crown quarterback Brandon McCormick finished with just 72 yards through the air after going 11-for-25 with one interception and one touchdown.

Crown rushed for 167 yards for a total of 239 yards in the game. To go along with 270 yards through the air, Gustavus tallied 119 yards on the ground for a total of 589. The Gusties were 5-for-5 in red-zone scoring and picked up 24 first downs compared to Crown’s 16.

Leading a balanced defense was linebacker Zack Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Kan.) who recorded a team-best eight tackles (four solo). Tyler Jakes (So., North Mankato, Minn.) finished behind him with seven (six solo).

Lake Forest, Ill. - The Gustavus Adolphus football team completed the non-conference portion of its regular season schedule with a 42-9 victory over Lake Forest College on Saturday afternoon at Farwell Field. With just a 14-9 cushion at halftime, Gustavus's offense found its rhythm and its defense went into lock-down mode over the course of the final 30 minutes. The Gusties scored 28 points and allowed just three first downs and a total of 58 yards in a second half dominated by the Black and Gold.

Gustavus heads into Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference play with an overall record of 2-0. The Foresters suffer their first loss at Farwell Field since 2011 and are now 1-1.

"It's a big win and I'm proud of the guys and their effort against an unfamiliar opponent," said Head Coach Peter Haugen. "We improved as the game went on and I'm pleased with the steps we made."

On the opening possession of the afternoon, Lake Forest put together a six-play, 68-yard drive that was capped off by an Anthony Prestly touchdown run from six yards out. Following a failed extra point attempt, the Foresters found themselves on top 6-0 by the 12:21 mark.

"Lake Forest came out strong at the beginning and we started to get things going as the game progressed," Haugen said about the start of the game. "I'm extremely proud of our defense for holding its own as our offense slowly found rhythm. With the exception of their first drive, the defense did an outstanding job and was flying around the field. We got a tremendous effort by our defensive front and linebackers shutting down the run throughout the game."

Gustavus's offense struggled to get into a groove for much of the opening portion of the game. It wasn't until after being forced to punt three straight times and turning over the ball on downs on the next drive that Gustavus was able to generate some offense. With possession of the ball halfway through the second quarter, quarterback Mitch Hendricks (Jr., Laporte, Minn.) completed three straight passes that covered 60 yards and led to the squad's first touchdown of the day. The third of his consecutive completions was a 36-yard touchdown pass to Gabriel Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.). With Thomas Schleusener's (Sr., Rapid City, S.D.) extra point, the first of his six, Gustavus had its first lead of the afternoon up 7-6 with 8:59 left in the opening half.

The Gustie offense got the ball back quickly thanks to an interception by cornerback Michael Hintze (Sr., Brooklyn Park, Minn.) on the first play of the Lake Forest's next possession.

Following Hintze's pick, it once again took Hendricks just three pass completions to get the ball into the end zone. This time he covered 45 yards and capped the drive 11-yard touchdown strike to Hunter Johnson (Fr., Cannon Falls, Minn.) at the 7:59 mark of the quarter. The touchdown was Johnson's first of his career as he finished the game with two catches for 17 yards.

Lake Forest brought the second quarter's scoring to a close with a 42-yard field goal by Jon Gurchak that cut the lead to 14-9 with :06 seconds on the clock.

At halftime, Gustavus had totaled 172 yards of total offense compared to Lake Forest's 155 yards.

It didn't take long for the Gustie offense come alive in the second half. On their first possession of the third quarter, the Gusties marched 78 yards for a touchdown that gave them a 21-9 advantage and took only 2:44. Hendricks completed 7-of-8 passes on a drive that ended with a 25-yard touchdown reception by Matt Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.).

From that point on, Gustavus scored on its next two offensive possessions. Hendricks found Gabriel Boyce from 11-yards out to give the Gusties a 28-9 advantage at 6:26 of the third quarter, and Luke Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Kan.) then put the finishes touches on a 12-play, 98-yard drive with a three-yard touchdown run at 12:47 of the fourth quarter.

Gabriel Boyce paced all receivers with nine catches for 105 yards to go along with his two touchdowns. Matt Boyce finished next in line with 74 yards on six catches with one touchdown grab.

Luke Martinez led the way on the ground with 56 yards on 11 carries for an average of 5.1 yards per rush. He

also made his presence felt in the passing game with six catches for 48 yards.

After Martinez's touchdown run, Gustavus's defense got into the scoring mix with a touchdown of its own halfway through the fourth quarter. Strong safety Xavier Fust (Sr., Columbia Heights, Minn.) picked off Prestly at the Gustavus 21-yard-line and returned it 78 yards to the Lake Forest one-yard-line. It was at the one that Fust was stripped of the ball by Mike Rantis. Fortunately for Gustavus, Michael Hintze was on the scene and was able to recover the fumble in the end zone for a touchdown, which gave Gustavus a 42-9 lead with 9:23 remaining. Hintze's touchdown signified the end of the afternoon's scoring.

Mitch Hendricks completed a pass to ten different receivers throughout the day and finished 32-for-41 for a career-high 356 yards with four touchdowns. His 356-yard passing total ranks sixth in Gustavus history and is the second time in his career that he has eclipsed the 300-yard mark.

"Mitch is playing so well and commanding this offense with such great confidence and authority," commented Haugen about his junior quarterback. "He has a supporting cast around him that is playing at the top of its game. From his receivers getting open to his young offensive line providing solid protection, it was complete team effort. He threw to ten different guys today - when you have that many targets you believe in, it makes your job a lot easier." Gabriel Boyce led Gustavus's receiving corps with a pair of touchdowns to go with 105 yards on nine catches.

As a team, Gustavus finished with 108 yards rushing and 385 yards passing for a total 493 yards. The Gusties picked up 29 first downs compared to Lake Forest's 10, went 3-for-3 in the red zone with three touchdowns, and won the time of possession battle 31:23-to-28:37.

The Foresters were limited to a total of 213 yards (34 rush, 179 pass). It is the lowest rushing total allowed by a Gustavus defense since 2012 when the Gusties gave up 27 yards to Simpson in the season-opener. Defensive coordinator Corey Shea's unit also allowed the fewest amount of total yards since 2011 when it gave up 141 yards to Carleton's offense.

Leading the defense was Zach Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Kan.) who posted nine tackles (four solo) and one tackle for loss. Nick Frandsen (Sr., North Oaks, Minn.) finished next in line with seven tackles (6 solo), and Zach Burrington (Sr., Plymouth, Minn.) recorded six (four solo).

"It's still a learning process but this is another step in the right direction," Haugen concluded. "We are encouraged by the effort today and are looking forward to getting into conference play next weekend. Our league is one of the most challenging in the country, so we're going to have to stay true to the process and get back to work on Monday."

St. Peter, Minn. - The Gustavus Adolphus football team's early-season air raid led by junior quarterback Mitch Hendricks (Jr., Laporte, Minn.) continued terrorize opposing secondaries in a 48-19 victory over Hamline University on Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. Hendricks threw four touchdown passes for the second straight weekend and completed 31-of-43 passes on his way to setting a new school-record for passing yards in a game with 443. With a victory in their opening Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference game of the year, the Gusties improve to 3-0 for the first time since 2007. Hamline suffers its first loss and is now 2-1 overall and 0-1 in the MIAC.

Not since Dean Kraus '89 lit up Bethel for 403 yards in 1985 has a Gustavus quarterback broke the 400-yard passing mark in a game. With 281 yards and five touchdowns in week one, and 356 yards and four touchdowns last weekend, Hendricks solidified himself as one of the hottest quarterbacks in the country with today's record-breaking performance. He finished the day just two completions shy of Gustavus's single-game record, and now has reached the 1000-yards passing mark with a total of 1,080 on the year. Hendricks has yet to throw an interception and now has 13 total touchdown passes.

Gustavus's big first half began almost immediately. After the defense forced on three-and-out on Hamline's opening possession, the offense took over and scored the opening touchdown of the game on a drive that took just 3:37. On the possession, Hendricks connected with Gabriel Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) on a 40-yard skinny post that gave Gustavus 1st-and-goal on Hamline one-yard-line. Two plays later, David Cliett (So., Maplewood, Minn.) plunged over the goal line for the first touchdown of his collegiate career. After the extra point by Thomas Schleusener (Sr., Rapid City, S.D.), Gustavus was on top 7-0 with 9:20 on the clock.

With fourth-and-inches deep in Gustavus territory later in the quarter, the defense once again came up with a big stand on a quarterback sneak to force the Pipers to turn the ball back over on downs. Six plays and 61 yards later, the Gusties were into the end zone for the second time. Matt Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) got over the top of the Piper defensive backs on a play-action stutter-and-go for a 35-yard touchdown. Schleusener converted the extra point to give the Gusties a 14-0 lead :10 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

On Hamline's opening drive of the second quarter, safety Jake Forcier (Sr., Watkins, Minn.) picked off quarterback Tim Bona at the Piper 30-yard-line and returned in nine yards to the Hamline 21.

Following Forcier's interception, his first of the season, and a personal foul on Hamline, Gustavus was set up with 1st-and-10 on the 11-yard-line. On the first offensive play, running back Luke Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Kan.) took a handoff on a draw, spun away from a tackle, and dove into the end zone for the score. Schleusener's converted extra point gave Gustavus a 21-0 lead with 14:35 left in the second quarter.

Hamline was able to stop the bleeding and cut the lead to 21-7 at the 9:51 mark of the second quarter when Austin Duncan scored on a 12-yard run. Duncan finished the game with 99 yards on 20 carries with another touchdown, which came with :25 left to go in the third quarter.

After Duncan's score, the Gusties responded two drives later with a 15-yard touchdown connection between Hendricks and Matt Boyce. Hendricks put a back shoulder throw in a place where only his intended target could get it, and Boyce did the rest - catching the pass outside his body and touching one foot down in-bounds for the touchdown. With Schleusener's extra point, Gustavus led 28-7 with 4:57 left to go in the half.

Hamline cut the lead to 28-13 with 1:06 left in the half on a Tim Bona touchdown pass to Hoyfal Adam from 18 yards out. Bona finished the game 20-for-36 for 222 yards with one touchdown and an interception. He was sacked twice - once by Travis Pepper (Sr., Overland Park, Kan.) and again by Barret Panning (Sr., Ham Lake, Minn.).

With the ball back in the possession of Gustavus and 1:00 remaining in the opening half, Hendricks went to work. He orchestrated a three-play, 69-yard drive that was capped off with a 15-yard touchdown pass

to running back DaiVon Poole (San Angelo, Texas). Pool caught a drop-off screen out of the backfield and had nothing but daylight in front of him as he ran in for the score. Schleusener missed the extra point, as Gustavus went into the locker room with a 34-13 halftime advantage.

After trading possessions to start the third quarter, the Gustie offense got back into rhythm with a 15-play, 89-yard scoring drive. A 23-yard pass to Gabriel Boyce set up a three-yard touchdown run for running back Leeland Lauti (Fr., Ewa Beach, Hawaii) with 2:52 left in the frame. The touchdown was also Lauti's first of his college career. Schleusener tacked on the extra point to give Gustavus its largest lead at 41-13. Travis Pepper celebrates his first sack of the season.

Hendricks made the most of his last offensive series of the day early in the fourth quarter. On 2nd-and-6 from the Hamline 49-yard line, the junior from Laporte, Minnesota broke Gustavus's single-game passing mark on a 40-yard completion to Matt Boyce who once again got open on a seam route. In a fitting end to the drive, Hendricks completed a one-yard, play-action pass to Jake Douglas (Jr., Montevideo, Minn.) for the touchdown. Schleusener added the extra point to bring the score to a final at 48-19 with 12:55 left to play.

By the end of the day, the Gusties racked up 603 total yards of offense (451 passing, 152 rushing). It is the first time that a Gustavus offense has totaled more than 600 yards since a 650-yard performance against Concordia on Oct. 24, 1998.

Hendricks connected with seven different receivers throughout the course of the afternoon. His top targets included Matt and Gabriel Boyce who combined for 18 catches and 299 yards. Matt made two touchdown grabs and finished with 156 yards on a eight receptions, while Gabriel tallied 143 yards on 10 receptions. George Buchner (So., Excelsior, Minn.) was next in line with five catches for 66 yards.

Gustavus's ground game was headed up by Luke Martinez and DaiVon Poole. Martinez ran for 76 yards on nine carries with his one touchdown, while Pool collected 56 yards on 12 carries.

Defensively, Gustavus allowed 338 total yards (222 passing, 116 rushing). Matt Keller (Sr., Eagan, Minn.) led the way with nine tackles (5 solo), while Zack Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Minn.) finished with eight (5 solo). The Gustie defense registered nine tackles for loss and broke up a total of seven passes.

St. Peter, Minn. - Prior to kickoff between the Gustavus and Augsburg football teams on Saturday, Sept. 27, only two quarterbacks in the history of Gustavus football had eclipsed 400 yards passing in a single game. With 405 yards against Bethel in 1985, Dean Kraus was the sole member of the club for nearly 30 years. Although there still exists just two names on the exclusive list, one of those names now appears twice. By 3:51 p.m. this afternoon, junior Mitch Hendricks (Laporte, Minn.) accounted for 504 passing yards - shattering his own school-record, which he set last weekend with 443 yards against Hamline.

Before this season, only three quarterbacks had ever thrown for five touchdowns in a single game. Jordan Stolp '08 threw five in 2005 against Augsburg, and Jordan Becker '10 threw five in 2009 against Pacific Lutheran. In 1998 against Hamline, the other of those quarterbacks, Bob Southworth '99, threw for a school-record six touchdowns. In the 2014 season-opener against Crown, Mitch Hendricks joined the above predecessors with five touchdown strikes. By 3:51 p.m. today, Hendricks left them all behind with a school-record seven touchdown passes to four different receivers.

Through the opening three weeks of the season, the Hendricks-led Gustie air raid has been billed dynamic, surgical, and most often, efficient. It was just that in more against the Auggies this afternoon. By the final tick of the game clock at 3:51 p.m., Hendricks had completed 33 of his 39 passes for a completion percentage of 84.6. To add his name to the program's record book one more time, Hendricks tied the record for completions in a single game - matching Dean Kraus and Jordan Stolp's marks set in 1985 against Bethel and 2007 against St. Thomas, respectively. Matt Boyce caught three TDs and a total of 12 passes for a career-best 178 yards.

Thanks in large part to the single best game ever had by a Gustavus quarterback, the Gusties came away with 55-31 victory over Augsburg College in what was their first MIAC road test of the season. Gustavus improves to 4-0 overall and 2-0 in the MIAC with the win, while Augsburg drops to 2-2 overall and 1-1 in the MIAC with the loss. The Gusties begin their campaign with four straight wins for the first time since 1998.

For a second-straight week, both Matt Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) and Gabriel Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) finished the game with more than 100 yards receiving. Matt caught 12 passes for 178 yards and made three touchdown grabs, while Gabriel caught 11 passes for 154 yards with two touchdown receptions. Matt's 178 yards rank fifth in Gustavus history.

Hendricks spread the ball around to seven different receivers over the course of the afternoon. Outside the five touchdowns the Boyce twins accounted for, Harrison Feldcamp (Jr., Sibley, Iowa) caught one and Drew Fredericksen (Fr., Forsyth, Ill.) caught the other. Fredericksen's touchdown was the first of his collegiate career.

Featured in Gustavus's ground game was rookie DaiVon Poole (San Angelo, Texas) who became the first Gustie running back this season to rack up more than 100 yards rushing in a game. Poole finished with 101 yards on 21 carries (4.8 ypc) to go along with a three-yard touchdown plunge for the first score of the game.

Gustavus totaled 597 yards of total offense and scored over 50 points for the first time this season and the first time since putting up 52 against Hamline in 2013.

Despite Gustavus's offensive explosion, Augsburg's offense followed suit for much of the afternoon. Led by quarterback Ayrton Scott, the Auggies totaled 546 yards (200 rush, 346 pass). Through the air, Scott was 27-for-41 for 346 yards and three touchdowns. He also carried the ball 20 times or 94 yards with one rushing touchdown. Scott's favorite target was Joey Sonnenfeld who caught two touchdown passes and made eight catches for 140 yards. Gabriel Boyce made 11 catches for 154 to go along with two touchdown grabs.

In the end, turnovers and big plays by the Gustavus defense made the difference. The Gusties sacked Scott a total of four times and picked him off thrice. Zach Tvedten (Sr., Elmore, Minn.) had a pair of sacks, while Jake Forcier (Jr., Watkins, Minn.) came up with two interceptions, and Anthony Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) recorded another. Anthony Boyce led the team with a game/season-high 11 tackles (5 solo). Zack Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Kan.) finished next in line with nine (2 solo), and Xavier Fust (Sr., Columbia Heights, Minn.) recorded eight (2 solo).

When the scoring began halfway through the opening quarter, it came masses. Gustavus got on the scoreboard first when DaiVon Pool ran in from three yards out to put the Gusties on top 7-0 following Thomas Schluessener's (Sr., Rapid City, S.D.) extra point.

Augsburg answered with a touchdown to tie the game at 7-7 on the next drive and the race was on. At the 1:47 mark of the first quarter, Mitch Hendricks found Matt Boyce on 20-yard strike for the first of their three touchdown connections. Schluessener added the extra point to put Gustavus up 14-7.

Following a defensive stop, Gustavus got the ball back and quickly went to the air. Hendricks found Matt Boyce on a 25-pass and then connected with Drew Fredericksen from 35 yards out for the score. Schluessener missed the extra point and Gustavus was up 20-7 with 12:25 left in the second quarter.

After an over eight-minute Augsburg drive stalled at the Gustavus 31-yard-line, the Gusties took over with :40 seconds

remaining in the half. Disaster stuck on the opening play of the ensuing drive when Hendricks threw his first interception of the season. Despite the sudden momentum swing, Gustavus's defense held strong and allowed the Auggies just a field goal, which cut the lead to 20-10 at the half.

It took Hendricks and the Gustavus offense little time to get back on track in the third quarter. The Gusties marched 61 yards in just over two minutes, capping the drive with a 17-yard touchdown pass to Gabriel Boyce. Schluessener's extra point pushed the score to 27-10.

The Gusties forced a punt on Augsburg's next possession and once again put together a touchdown-scoring drive. This time, Hendricks finished what was an 82-yard drive with a six-yard pass to Harrison Feldcamp. With the extra point by Schluessener, Gustavus led 34-10 with 4:45 left in the third. Anthony Boyce's interception set up Gustavus's victory-sealing score late in the fourth quarter.

Facing their largest deficit of the game, the Auggies got their offense back on track with a 75-yard scoring drive that took just :53 seconds. Ayrton Scott broke free and went 42 yards for the touchdown, cutting the lead to 34-17 with 3:52 left in the third.

Gustavus responded to Augsburg's quick strike with one of its own. Following a 12-yard pass to Gabriel, and a 15-yard run by Poole, Hendricks went deep to Matt Boyce for a 49-yard touchdown - the team's longest pass play of the season. After the extra point, the Gusties were back up 14 points at 41-17 with 2:57 to go in the third.

Despite a 41-17 deficit after three quarters, Augsburg would not go away quietly. Ayrton Scott connected with Scott Bossard on an 11-yard touchdown pass, and then hit Joey Sonnenfeld for 74 yards out. The two scores came three minutes apart from one another, as Gustavus found itself clinging to a 41-31 lead with 1:14 remaining in the game.

Refusing to succumb to the same fate of recent Gustavus teams against Augsburg, the offense responded with 14 unanswered points and the defense came up with back-to-back interceptions. Anthony Boyce came up with the first pick with just under eight minutes remaining, and Forcier picked off his second pass of the day with four minutes to go.

Hendricks first orchestrated a seven-play, 76-yard drive that came to a quick conclusion when Gabriel Boyce caught a 49-yard touchdown pass - matching his brother's team/season-long. The junior quarterback then capitalized on the Boyce interception with a touchdown-scoring drive that put the nail in the coffin. With a two-yard pass to Matt Boyce with 4:24 on the clock, the game's scoring came to an end. Schluessener tacked on an extra point to both scores to bring the score to a final at 55-31.

The Mitch Hendricks (Sr., Bemidji, Minn.) led air raid continued, while the defense turned in its best performance of the season. Through the air, Hendricks threw four touchdown passes and finished 24-for-28 for 383 yards. He also added 69 yards on the ground, which included a 61-yard touchdown run. His top targets were the Boyce twins, who combined for 18 catches and 273 yards. Matt (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) caught nine passes for 166 yards with two touchdowns, while Gabriel (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) caught nine passes for 107 yards. As a whole, Gustavus totaled 607 yards (204 rush, 397 pass).

Gustavus's defense was as relentless as its offense. The Gusties held Carleton to just 58 net yards of total offense, which included 30 yards on the ground and 28 yards through the air. The Black and Gold registered a season-best six sacks, tallied 15 tackles for loss, and allowed the Knights just seven first downs all afternoon.

Even before a large number of the more than 3,100 fans had settled into their seats, Gustavus was taking to the air. On the first play from scrimmage, Mitch Hendricks went up top to Matt Boyce and connected on 42-yard fly that gave the Gusties 1st-and-10 on the Carleton 20-yard line. Two plays later Hendricks found Jordan Sorensen (So., St. Peter, Minn.) in the back of the end zone from 15 yards out with 13:31 on the clock. Thomas Schleusener (Rapid City, S.D.) added the extra point to put the Gusties on top 7-0.

Gustavus's defense forced its first of six total three-and-outs on Carleton's next possession, and Hendricks went back to work through the air. He completed five straight passes, took a break by handing the ball off to Leeland Lauti (Fr., Ewa Beach, Hawaii), and then capped the drive with a 30-yard strike to Matt Boyce on a skinny post for the touchdown. With Schleusener's extra point, Gustavus led 14-0 with 8:41 left in the first.

After establishing the passing game, Hendricks showed off his ability in the running game. On 1st-and-10 from the his own 39-yard-line, Hendricks found a hole on a quarterback draw and scampered 61 yards into the end zone for what was the team's longest offensive play from scrimmage this season. Schleusener tackled on the extra point to complete the first quarter's scoring and give the Black and Gold a 21-0 advantage.

On Gustavus's next offensive possession, Hendricks got his running backs involved in the passing game by finding DaiVon Poole (Fr., San Antonio, Texas) on a wheel route up the left sideline. Poole caught the pass and proceeded to outrun the defense 49 yards for the score. Schleusener's point after put the home team on top 28-0 with 13:37 left in the second quarter.

Although the offense was stopped on its next two possessions, Gustavus's defense got the ball back in the its hands with :38 seconds left in the half. All it took was :06 seconds for the Gusties to find the end zone, as Hendricks aired out a deep post to Boyce who tracked it down, secured the catch, and took it into the end zone for the touchdown. Schleusener's kick extended Gustavus's lead to 35-0, which it remained for the remaining minutes of the half.

By halftime, Hendricks was 17-or-20 for 275 yards with four passing touchdowns and one rushing. Gustavus allowed a net of just 46 yards despite Carleton controlling the clock for 18:17 of the half.

Although the Gusties drove nearly the entire length of the field in just under five minutes to start the second half, a Hendricks fumble inside the Carleton 10-yard-line gave the ball to the Knights with 10:15 on the clock.

Less than one minute after the fumble, the Gusties came up with a safety to push the lead to 37-0 with 9:17 left in the third. After his initial hole closed up, Carleton running back Chris Madden attempted to bounce the play outside where he was met by a triggering Nick Frandsen (Sr., North Oaks, Minn.) who came up and made the tackle in the end zone.

After Iker Ortiz Hidalgo (So., Cancun, Mexico) recovered a fumble that was stripped by Kyle Krzmarzick (Jr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.), Hendricks completed his final pass of the game to George Buchner (So., Excelsior, Minn.) for 29 yards to give Gustavus 1st-and-goal from the three-yard-line. DaiVon Poole plunged in from two yards for his second touchdown of the game. Poole finished the game with 46 yards on 17 carries and 46 yards on two catches. Schleusener missed the extra point and Gustavus led 43-0 with 3:45 to go in the third.

The game's final score came at the 2:34 mark of the fourth quarter when backup quarterback Sam Lundberg (Jr., Ellendale, Minn.) ran in from four yards out to cap a nine-play, 66-yard drive.

Leading Gustavus's stifling defensive effort in tackling was Jake Forcier (Sr., Watkins, Minn.) with seven (three solo). Barret Panning (Sr., Hamburg, Minn.) was unyielding at the line of scrimmage, finishing with two sacks and two tackles for loss.

Carleton quarterbacks Zach Creighton and Ethan Trujillo went a combined 4-for-8 for 14 yards through the air. Chris Madden led the Knights on the ground with 30 yards on 15 carries.

Northfield, Minn. - The Gustavus Adolphus football team was able to hold off St. Olaf College in a 37-29 victory on Saturday afternoon at Manitou Field. Gustavus improves to 6-0 overall and 4-0 in the MIAC, while St. Olaf drops to 0-6 overall and 0-4 in the MIAC. The Gusties are now 6-0 for the first time since 1987.

Clinging to a 37-29 lead with less than five minutes remaining in the game, Gustavus was able to shut down St. Olaf's potentially game-tying drive and seal the victory with an interception by Xavier Fust (Sr., Columbia Heights, Minn.) with less than one minute on the clock.

Although Gustavus led 37-22 by the 8:41 in the fourth quarter, the Oles refused to go down quietly. Penz completed an 11-yard touchdown pass to Joel Reinhardt at the 4:08 mark to bring the game within one score down 37-29. St. Olaf recovered an onside kick and then drove the ball to the Gustavus 17-yard-line before being stopped thanks to Fust's interception.

After St. Olaf took a 7-0 lead in the first quarter, Gustavus responded with a touchdown on its following offensive possession. Running back Leeland Lauti (Fr., Ewa Beach, Hawaii) ran in the first of his two touchdowns from two yards out to tie the game at 7-7 at the 1:41 mark.

Lauti added his second touchdown on a one-yard plunge at the 7:16 mark of the second quarter to give Gustavus its first lead up 14-7. The rookie tailback totaled a season-best 123 yards on 21 carries in the game.

The back-and-forth continued throughout the second quarter. St. Olaf tied the game at 14-14 with a JJ Strnad touchdown run with 4:26 left in the half, and Gustavus answered with a seven-yard touchdown pass from Mitch Hendricks (Jr., Bemidji, Minn.) to Gabriel Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) with 1:26 on the clock. Gustavus's extra point try was blocked and taken into the end zone, bringing the score to 20-14.

The Gusties forced a three-and-out and went to the air with under 1:30 to go in the half. Hendricks connected with Gabriel Boyce on a 25-yard strike to bring the score to 27-16 after Thomas Schleusener's (Sr., Rapid City, S.D.) extra point.

After forcing a punt on the first drive of the third quarter, Gustavus took over and put together an 11-play, 88-yard touchdown scoring drive. Once again, Hendricks went to Gabriel Boyce who brought in an 11-yard grab to give the Gusties their largest lead of the afternoon up 34-16 after Schleusener's kick.

St. Olaf cut the lead to 34-22 at the 2:23 mark of the third quarter, and Gustavus added a 21-yard field goal by Schleusener at the 8:41 mark to bring the score to 37-22.

Gabriel Boyce Gustavus's receiving corps with 125 yards on nine catches to go along with three touchdowns. George Buchner (So., Excelsior, Minn.) finished next in line with 75 yards on eight catches.

Mitch Hendricks was 26-for-37 for 282 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. He connected with seven different receivers and added 37 yards rushing on eight carries.

Gustavus tallied 171 yards rushing and 282 yards passing for a total of 453 yards. St. Olaf totaled 440 yards on 144 yards rushing and 296 yards passing.

St. Peter, Minn. - The Gustavus Adolphus football team suffered its first loss of the season to Saint John's University 29-19 on Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. Although Gustavus led 13-7 at halftime, Saint John's outscored the Gusties 22-6 over the final 30 minutes. Gustavus drops to 6-1 overall and 4-1 in the MIAC, while Saint John's improves to 5-1 overall and 4-1 in the MIAC.

Turnovers and red zone scoring turned out to be the difference. Gustavus committed four turnovers (3 interceptions, 1 fumble) and went 3-for-6 in the red zone, while Saint John's didn't commit a turnover and was a perfect 5-for-5 in the red zone.

With a 13-play, 75-yard touchdown-scoring drive on its opening possession of the game, the red-hot Gustie offense picked up right where it left off the first six weeks of the season. On 3rd-and-goal from the six-yard-line, Mitch Hendricks (Jr., Bemidji, Minn.) found Matt Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) on a slant for the pair's first of two touchdown connections. With Thomas Schleusener's (Sr., Rapid City, S.D.) extra point, Gustavus led 7-0 with 10:18 left in the first quarter.

After Gustavus's defense forced a three-and-out on Saint John's ensuing possession, the offense took control and put points on the board once again. After a 15-play, 56-yard drive stalled on Saint John's nine-yard-line, Schleusener burred a 26-yard field goal to give the Black and Gold a 10-0 lead with 1:56 left in the opening quarter.

Saint John's was able to snap Gustavus's momentum on its next drive with a touchdown of its own. On 2nd-and-goal from the one-yard-line, Johnnie running back Sam Sura went up-and-over the pile and into the end zone for the touchdown. With Alexi Johnson's extra point, Saint John's cut the gap to 10-7 with 11:39 left in the half.

Although it looked as if Gustavus was on its way to another touchdown with second-and-goal at the Johnnie five-yard-line, Saint John's came up with the first of its four turnovers when Trevor Warner picked off Mitch Hendricks in the end zone.

Despite the momentum swing, the Gustie offense bounced back and was able to add a field goal to their lead with :26 seconds remaining in the half. Capping the 12-play, 59-yard drive was Schleusener who split the uprights from 27-yards out to bring the score to 13-7, which it remained until the clock ran out.

By halftime, Gustavus had already racked up 315 total yards (251 pass, 64 rush) on 55 plays. Saint John's had just 107 yards (42 pass, 65 rush) on 25 plays. Hendricks was 22-for-37 for 251 yards with his top targets being Matt and Gabriel Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.). Matt had six catches (one of which being a 61-yard post) for 111 yards, while Gabriel had seven catches for 76 yards.

Saint John's came out of the locker room after halftime with one goal in mind - establish the run. The Johnnies did that. Going to work with the option and attacking the edge of Gustavus's defense was quarterback Nick Martin and running back Sam Sura. On the opening drive of the second half, the Johnnies put together a nine-play, 53-yard scoring-drive that was capped by an Alexi Johnson field goal at 10:59 to put the cut the Gustavus advantage to 13-10.

On the ensuing drive, Gustavus's Luke Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Kan.) fumbled at the his own 39-yard-line, and Saint John's Sean Tillman picked up the loose ball and brought it back to the 32.

After the fumble, the Johnnies went back to work on the ground. After marching 31 yards on six straight running plays, Sam Sura took an option pitch from Martin and strolled into the end zone untouched to give Saint John's its first lead of the afternoon. Johnson's extra point brought the score to 17-13 with 6:34 left in the third quarter.

Trailing by seven points (20-13) after a 29-yard field goal by Johnson at the 14:56 mark of the fourth quarter, Gustavus got back into rhythm and put together an eight-play, 76-yard touchdown-scoring drive. Hendricks connected with Matt Boyce up the seam on a 26-yard skinny post to bring the Gusties within

one point down 20-19 with 11:47 left to play in the game.

Perhaps the biggest play of the game occurred on the extra point following Boyce's touchdown. With a strong push up the middle, Schleusener's kick was blocked by Johnnie Sam Brynstad, picked up and then returned more than 80 yards to the house by Trevor Warner for two points. Instead of a 20-20 score, Gustavus now found itself trailing 22-19.

Saint John's built on the energy of the blocked extra point and put together a touchdown-scoring drive that went 75 yards on 10 plays and featured nothing but carries by the Johnnie backfield. Capping the drive was Martin who held on to the option sweep and walked untouched into the end zone. Johnson's extra point extended the gap to 29-19 with 7:15 on the clock.

Although Gustavus drove the ball with efficiency on its final two possessions of the game, Saint John's defense was able to put to rest any comeback hopes with a pair of deep-territory interceptions by cornerback Andrew Norri. Norri first picked off Hendricks on a tipped pass at the one-yard-line, then later snagged a ball intended for Matt Boyce in the back of the end zone. Norri also recorded two pass breakups and led the Johnnie defense in tackles with nine (9 solo) on the afternoon.

Hendricks finished 31-for-54 for 356 yards with two touchdowns and three interceptions. Matt Boyce had nine catches for 158 yards with two touchdowns, while Gabriel Boyce caught nine passes for 89 yards.

Through the air, Johnnie quarterback Nick Martin completed three of his nine passes. Josh Bungum had all three catches for 56 yards.

Of Saint John's 356 yards of total offense, 300 were on the ground. Leading the way was Sam Sura who carried 52 times for 205 yards with two touchdowns. Martin finished next in line with 55 yards on 16 carries.

The Gusties added 110 rushing yards to Hendrick's passing total to give them 466 total yards. Luke Martinez led the way on the ground with 83 yards on 14 carries and also caught seven passes for a 62 yards.

Although Saint John's was just 3-for-14 on third down, it converted on all four of its fourth down tries. The Johnnies won the time of possession battle 32:36-to-27:24, holding onto the ball for more than 20 minutes of the second half.

St. Peter, Minn. - The Gustavus Adolphus football team suffered a 30-23 loss to Bethel University on Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field.

In what was a game of two halves, Bethel won the second. Although the Gusties led 13-7 at halftime and then 16-14 after three quarters, Bethel scored 16 points in the fourth quarter to take a 30-23 lead.

After shutting down Gustavus's opening two drives of the game, Bethel was the first to put points on the scoreboard at the 3:37 mark of the first quarter.

Gustavus tied the game early in the second quarter when it put together a 13-play, 59-yard touchdown scoring drive.

On Bethel's ensuing offensive possession, cornerback Michael Hintze (Sr., Brookly Park, Minn.) picked off a pass and returned it 11 yards to the Gustavus 43-yard-line.

With a six point advantage at the start of the third quarter, Gustavus's defense forced a three-and-out and its offense scored on the next possession.

The field goal signified the beginning of what was a 23-point scoring-run by Bethel. With just over six minutes remaining in the third quarter, Bethel's Charles Johnson caught a slant, bounced off a would-be tackler, and then outran everyone to the end zone for a 58-yard touchdown reception.

The Royals scored at the 9:37 mark of the fourth quarter to give them their first lead since the opening quarter and go up to 22-16. Set up by a 49-yard catch by Bryce Marquardt and a 26-yard run by Marshall Klitzke, the Royals capped a six-play, 84-yard drive with a two-yard Klitzke touchdown.

Following a second straight fourth quarter punt by Gustavus, Bethel stuck in the dagger with 1:57 remaining in the game to extend its lead to 30-16 after a two point conversion.

the third and final running back to score a touchdown, going in from eight yards away. He paced Bethel's ground game with 87 yards on 13 carries (6.7 avg.).

Gustavus brought the afternoon's scoring to a close when Mitch Hendricks found Matt Boyce for the second time in the game. Boyce's touchdown, which came with just :24 seconds left on the clock, brought the score to a final at 30-23 after Schleusener's added kick.

Matt Boyce finished the day with 93 receiving yards on 11 catches to go along with his two touchdowns. With 15 on the season, Matt is now owner of the Gustavus football program's single-season touchdown receptions record.

Mitch Hendricks was 25-for-48 for 204 yards with two touchdowns through the air. Gabriel Boyce (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) also had a good day receiving by catching five passes for 81 yards.

In the end, Bethel's ground attack was the difference. Out of their 376 total yards, the Royals ran for 247. The Gusties threw for 204 yards and ran for 115 for a total of 319 in the game.

Field position also played a key factor in this afternoon's game. Gustavus punter Thomas Schleusener punted six times for 235 yards (39.2 avg.) with two downed inside the 20-yard-line.

Defensively, Gustavus forced two turnovers, which were both interceptions by Michael Hintze. Linebackers Zack Martinez (Jr., Lenexa, Minn.) and Tyler Jakes (So., North Mankato, Minn.) led all defensive players with 12 tackles each.
