The Gustavus Adolphus College men's hockey team heads into "true" non-conference action this weekend with a pair of games against members of the Wisconsin Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. The Gusties will begin the weekend on Friday, Nov. 7 with a 7:05 p.m. game against the Pointers of UW-Stevens Point. On Saturday, Nov. 8, Gustavus will face off against the Blue Devils of UW-Stout at 7:05 p.m.

Gustavus carries a 1-1-0 overall record after last weekend's season-opening MIAC Showcase held Oct. 31 through Nov. 2 at the Schwan Super Rink in Blaine, Minnesota. UW-Stevens Point is 1-0-0 after beginning its season with an 11-0 victory over Finlandia last Saturday in Stevens Point, Wisconsin. UW-Stout heads into the weekend seeking its first victory after suffering a 6-2 loss to Lake Forest on Saturday in Lake Forest, Illinois. The Blue Devils will take on Hamline University on Friday, Nov. 7 at 7:00 p.m. before heading to St. Peter to finish their weekend against the Gusties.

GUSTAVUS EMBARKS ON 73RD SEASON OF MEN'S HOCKEY

The Gustavus men's hockey team is in its 73rd season of existence. One of the storied programs in collegiate hockey, Gustavus has compiled an all-time record of 850-619-68 overall and 563-424-42 in the MIAC. The Gusties have won 14 MIAC Championships and earned a place in the NCAA Division III Tournament six times, which includes a runner-up finish in 2009.

Gustavus first recognized a men's hockey team in 1937 when then Director of Physical Education George Myrum became interested in the sport and raised the funds to sponsor a team. The Gusties fell to Carleton in their first ever intercollegiate game in 1936. It would take until 1939, the first year Gustavus played on natural ice in the on-campus fieldhouse, for Gustavus to record the first victory in the program's history.

GUSTAVUS COACHING STAFF

Head Coach Brett Petersen is in his 15th season at the helm of the Gustavus men's hockey program. Petersen has compiled a 199-149-32 overall record in his 14 seasons at Gustavus. His 198 wins at Gustavus ranks second behind legendary coach Don Roberts. He has been named MIAC Coach of the Year twice in his tenure, once in 2001-02 and again in 2009-10.

Within MIAC play, Gustavus holds a record 124-79-21 during the Petersen era. The Gusties have earned a trip to the MIAC Playoffs 13 straight seasons and have advanced to the MIAC Playoff Championship a total of six times under Petersen. Since the turn of the century, Gustavus has qualified for the NCAA Division III Tournament three times in 2009, 2010, and 2012. The Gusties advanced all the way to the NCAA Championship in 2009 where they fell to Neumann 4-1 at Herb Brooks Arena in Lake Placid, N.Y.

Petersen, a Roseville, Minn. native, received his Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from the University of Denver in 1992 and his Master of Science degree in athletic administration in 2000 from St. Cloud State.

Former men's hockey standout David Martinson is in his third season as the assistant men's hockey coach at Gustavus. A 2010 graduate and one of the most decorated hockey players to don a three crowned sweater, Martinson is a native of St. Louis Park, Minn. After being named the MIAC Player of the Year and earning All-America honors twice during his playing career, Martinson continued his education at the Bowling Green State University where he served as a graduate assistant for the men's hockey team. In the fall of 2012, David received his masters of education in sport administration.

UW-STEVENS POINT COACHING STAFF

In three seasons at UW-Stevens Point, Chris Brooks has led the Pointers to a 52-28-7 (.634) overall record. Prior to his time at Rio Grande Valley, the Stratford, Ontario, native spent nine years at Western Michigan University, six as an assistant coach and his last three as the associate head coach. Brooks received a bachelor's degree in communication in 1996 and a master's degree in communication with an emphasis in coaching in 2007.

Chris Brooks is assisted by Greg Haney (SUNY-Cortland '12).

UW-STOUT COACHING STAFF

Terry Watkins is in his 19th year as the UW-Stout men's varsity hockey coach. Over his previous 18 seasons at the head of the program, Watkins compiled an overall record of 215-252-28. Watkins, a native of St. Paul, Minn. and 1972 graduate of UW-Stout, has spent the last 40-plus years in Menomonie where he coached the Blue Devil hockey club for eight years before returning the Blue Devils to the varsity level.

Terry Watkins is assisted by Greg Slupe (UW-Stout), Corbin Richartz (UW-Stout), Kelly Wendlandt (UW-Stevens Point), and Lance Wendlandt (UW-Stevens Point).

GAME NOTES

AROUND THE GLOBE

Gustavus's 2014-15 roster features 28 players from six different states and one player from Canada. Within the United States, Minnesota (22), Alaska (1), California (1), North Dakota (1), Oklahoma (1), and Vermont (1) are represented by 27 players. Outside the U.S., the Canadian province of British Columbia is home to Sam Smith.

PRIOR EXPERIENCE

All 28 players on Gustavus's roster previously played junior hockey before beginning their collegiate careers. Thirteen of this year's Gusties are alums of the North American Hockey League (NAHL), while four played in the Superior International Junior Hockey League (SIJHL). The Eastern Junior Hockey League (EJHL), North American Tier III Hockey League (NA3HL), and Western States Hockey League (WSHL) are each represented by two players. The United States Hockey League (USHL), British Columbia Hockey League (BCHL), Central Canada Hockey League (CCHL), American West Hockey League (AWH L), and Minnesota Junior Hockey League (MNJHL) were all home to one future Gustie.

CAPTAIN'S LOG: 2014-15

The 2014-15 Gustavus men's hockey team is led by senior captains Jack Walsh (Mahtomedi, Minn.) and Tyler Lapic (New Prague, Minn.). In the 72-year history of Gustavus men's hockey, Walsh and Lapic are the 87th and 88th student-athletes to earn the right of wearing a "C" on their Gustavus sweater. Jack Walsh is the program's first two-time captain since Ross Ring-Jarvi '12 served during the 2010-11 and 2011-12 seasons.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

Eight student-athletes embark on their fourth and final season on the Gustavus men's hockey team. Sam Smith (Vancouver, B.C.), Jack Walsh, Tyler Lapic, Schyler Adams (New Prague, Minn.), Nate Paulsen (La Habra, Calif.), Andy Pearson (Burnsville, Minn.), Cory Ellis (St. Paul, Minn.), and Blake Schammel (Red Wing, Minn.) make up this year's Golden Gustie seniors. All eight have been significant contributors to the program since coming to campus in the fall of 2011.

LETTERWINNERS AND FRESH FACES

Brett Petersen returned 15 letterwinners from last year's team that went 17-8-3 overall (9-5-2 MIAC) and advanced to the MIAC Playoff Championship. To go along with his 15 returning letterwinners, coach Petersen also welcomes 11 new players to the program. Nine of the fresh faces are freshman while the other two are transfers from schools in the WIAC. This year's freshman class includes Jared Docken (Northfield, Minn.), Drew Apsinwall (Maple Grove, Minn.), Tony Paulson (Maple Grove, Minn.), Sam Akins (Stowe, Vt.), Sam Majka (Wayzata, Minn.), Blake Barnes (Broken Arrow, Okla.), Ross Kovacs (Dickinson, N.D.), Joncarlo Westerlund (Baudette, Minn.), and Erik Johnson (Rice, Minn.). Gavin Tufte (So., Blaine, Minn.) is a transfer from UW-Stout, and Alec Austin (So., Fort Lauderdale, Fla.) is a transfer from UW-Superior.

THE LONG AND WINDING ROAD

To go along with the team's standard 16 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference contests, this season's long and winding schedule features non-conference games against teams belonging to the MIAC, WIAC, NCHA, and NESCAC. In addition to non-league games against conference foes Bethel and St. Olaf this weekend at the MIAC Showcase, Gustavus will face UW-Stevens Point (Nov. 7) and UW-Stout (Nov. 8) of the WIAC, Lawrence (Nov. 29), Marian (Nov. 30), Finlandia (Jan. 9), and St. Scholastica (Jan. 10) of the NCHA, and Williams (Jan. 2) of the NESCAC. The Gusties will play 13 of its games at home at Don Roberts Ice Rink including non-conference bouts against Lawrence and Marian in the MIAC/NCHA Thanksgiving Showdown Nov. 29 and Nov. 30.

ABOUT LAST WEEKEND

The Gustavus men's hockey team came out of the opening weekend of the 2014-15 season with a record of 1-1-0 after a 4-2 loss to Bethel on Friday night and a 6-3 win over St. Olaf on Sunday afternoon.

Bethel scored three unanswered goals in the first 12 minutes of the game before Gustavus could answer with a Blake Schammel power play goal at 19:15 of the first period. The Gusties cut the lead to 3-2 at 6:38 of the third period, but Bethel responded with a game-clinching goal at 15:04. Gustavus goaltender Erik Johnson suffered the loss after allowing four goals and making 27 saves. The Gusties outshot the Royals 34-31, and went 1-for-3 on the power play and killed all five penalties.

On Sunday against St. Olaf, Gustavus scored three consecutive goals in the

second period to grab a 3-1 lead. After St. Olaf answered with a pair of shorthanded goals that tied the game at 2-2 later in the second, Gustavus exploded for three goals in the third en route to its first victory of the season. Johnson stopped 25-of-28 shots to earn the win, while neither team could capitalize on the man-advantage. St. Olaf outshout the Gusties 28-25.

Gustavus head men's hockey coach Brett Petersen is just one win away from earning his 200th career victory as a head coach at the NCAA Division III rank. With an overall record of 199-149-32, Petersen looks to become the sixth coach in the history of the MIAC to reach 200 career wins. He would join a select club made up of Don Roberts (Gustavus, 515-278-25), Terry Krypek (St. Thomas, 418-197-46), Don Olson (Saint Mary's, 377-399-41), Ed Saugestad (Augsburg, 351-275-18), and John Harrington (Saint John's, 241-142-31). Petersen would be the 47 coach in Division III history to amass 200 career victories

AGAINST THE WIAC

Since the 2000-01 season, the Gustavus men's hockey team is 23-26-4 against University of Wisconsin NCAA Division III schools of the WIAC. In what are always critical games in the regional rankings at the end of the season, Gustavus will square off against members of the WIAC Men's Hockey Conference - which is now in its second year of existence - two times this season. The Gusties went 1-1-1 against the WIAC with an 8-4 loss to UW-Stevens Point, a 3-1 win over UW-Stout, and a 2-2 tie against UW-River Falls last season. All three of those games were played on the road.

TRENDS FROM LAST WEEKEND

Seven different players were responsible for Gustavus's eight total goals scored at the MIAC Showcase last weekend. Rookie defenseman Jake Bushey was responsible for two of those goals, scoring twice in Sunday's win over the Oles. Also hitting the back of the net was Conor Deal, Andy Pearson, Blake Schammel, Gavin Tufte, Colin Hernon, and Cameron Jackson.

Of Gustavus's 19 total points, nine were recorded by freshman with Jake Bushey leading the way with three points (2G, 1A). Conor Deal ranks second on the team with two points (1G, 1A), as Bushey and Deal sit first and third, respectively, in the MIAC in rookie scoring. Bushey is also the league's top scoring defenseman alongside Saint John's Wally Cossette.

Gustavus scored three goals in the second period and four goals in the third last weekend. Defensively, the Gusties allowed four in the first, two in the second, and one in the third.

The penalty killing unit was a bright spot of the MIAC Showcase as the Gusties negated all six of their opponents' power plays. Gustavus went 5-for-5 on the kill against Bethel and then followed up with a 1-for-1 afternoon against St. Olaf.

SCOUTING THE POINTERS

After skating away with an 11-0 victory over Finlandia in its season-opener on Nov. 1 in Stevens Point, the UW-Stevens Point men's hockey team heads into the weekend ranked No. 2 in both the USCHO.com and D3hockey.com Division III Men's Polls.

In a game that saw the Pointers get 11 goals from nine different players, Nick D'Avollo and Joe Kallsz led the way with two goals each. Kallsz recorded a three point game with an added assist, while Andrew Kolb (1G, 2A) and Kevin Gibson (3A) also recorded three points. Goaltender Brandon Jaeger earned the shutout win after making 11 saves.

SCOUTING THE BLUE DEVILS

The UW-Stout men's hockey team heads into the second weekend of the year hungry for a victory after suffering a 6-2 loss to Lake Forest College in its season-opener on Nov. 1 in Lake Forest, Ilinois.

The Foresters scored four unanswered goals in the opening 31 minutes of the game to jump out to a 4-0 advantage. UW-Stout cut the lead to three goals twice down 4-1 and then later 5-2, yet could not close the gap any further. Riley Colvard and Shayne McLaughlin were the goal-scorers, while Spencer Viele suffered the loss in goal after allowing four and making 27 saves. Chase Hollander relieved Viele and allowed two goals with 17 saves in 29:04 minutes.

Brett Petersen is entering his 15th season as the head coach of the Gustavus Adolphus men's hockey team.

The 2013-14 Gustavus men's hockey team posted its best finish in the conference standings since the 2009-10 season and made it back to the MIAC Playoff Championship for the third straight year after what was the team's seventh consecutive winning season. Gustavus finished second in the MIAC with 38 points after going 12-3-1 within conference play. After defeating Saint John's 3-2 in the MIAC Playoff Semifinals at Don Roberts Ice Rink, the Gusties saw their season end with a 2-1 loss to St. Thomas in front of a capacity crowd at the St. Thomas Ice Arena in the MIAC Playoff Championship. Head Coach Brett Petersen's club finished the year 16-7-4 overall, reaching the 15-win mark for the sixth straight season.



Gustavus had a strong showing in the MIAC's postseason awards last season with three players taking home all-conference honors. Gusties featured on the 20-player All-Conference Team included senior forward Corey Leivermann (North Mankato, Minn.), sophomore goaltender John McLean (Eagan, Minn.), and senior forward Adam Smyth (Burnsville, Minn.). Smyth earned all-conference marks for the second straight year, while Leivermann and McLean were both first time recipients. Corey Leivermann shared the MIAC scoring title after scoring 19 points off a league-leading 12 goals and seven assists inside conference play.

In his 15-plus seasons behind the Gustavus bench, Petersen has compiled a 199-148-32 overall record. His 199 wins at Gustavus ranks second behind legendary coach Don Roberts. He has been named MIAC Coach of the Year twice, once in 2001-02 after helping the Gusties make the jump from ninth place the year before to a second place finish in the conference, and again in 2009-10 after leading the Gusties to their first MIAC Title since 1993. While at Gustavus, Petersen has worked with 18 All-Conference players, three MIAC Player of the Year recipients, eight AHCA All-Americans and one National Player of the Year (David Martinson, 2010).

Within MIAC play, Gustavus holds a record 124-79-21 during the Petersen era. The Gusties have earned a trip to the MIAC Playoffs 13 straight seasons and have advanced to the MIAC Playoff Championship a total of six times under Petersen. Since the turn of the century, Gustavus has qualified for the NCAA Division III Tournament three times in 2009, 2010, and 2012. The Gusties advanced all the way to the NCAA Championship in 2009 where they fell to Neumann 4-1 at Herb Brooks Arena in Lake Placid, N.Y.

Petersen, a Roseville, Minnesota native, started his coaching career with the St. Paul Vulcans of the United States Hockey League (USHL) from 1992-1994. He was named assistant coach at St. Cloud State University of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) in the spring of 1994. During his six years at St. Cloud State, he coordinated the recruiting process for head coach Craig Dahl, while also being closely involved with practice planning, player development and bench coaching.

In the classroom, Petersen received his Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from the University of Denver in 1992 and his Master of Science degree in athletic administration in 2000 from St. Cloud State. He was a four-year letter winner in hockey while at Denver and was named to the WCHA All-Academic team for three years. Petersen served as the team's assistant captain during his junior and senior seasons.

Petersen had the opportunity to represent USA Hockey on several difference occasions during his playing career including the U.S. Olympic Festival in Oklahoma City in 1990 and the World University Games in Sapporo, Japan in 1991. He was drafted by the Calgary Flames of the National Hockey League (NHL), but did not play professional hockey.

Along with this coaching duties at Gustavus, Petersen's responsibilities include managing Lund Arena, the College's multi-purpose facility that houses the ice sheet from October through March for team practices and games. The facility is then used for physical education classes, concerts and conventions the rest of the year.

Brett lives in St. Peter with his wife, Linda, and their daughters, Katherine and Natalie.
