### SETTING THE SCENE

The Gustavus Adolphus women's basketball team will play host to St. Catherine University in a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference showdown on Saturday, Dec. 6 at 1:00 p.m. on Gus Young Court. Gustavus heads into the weekend at 4-2 overall and 0-1 in the MIAC after suffering a 76-43 loss to the University of St. Thomas in its conference-opener on Wednesday night in St. Paul. St. Catherine rolls into St. Peter at 5-1 overall and 1-0 in the MIAC after defeating Bethel 66-62 in its first game of conference play at home on Wednesday.

Live video and live stats for Friday night's games will be provided by Gustavus. New this season, Gustavus will provide a high definition video stream of all home games for viewing on your computer, tablet, or smart phone through GameCentral by Stretch Internet. Tom Wheeler of KNUJ AM 860 will be at Gus Young Court for the live call of Saturday's game.

### LAST TIME OUT

The Gustavus women's basketball was thrown into fire in its conference-opener against No. 8 St. Thomas on Wednesday evening at Schoenecker Arena. With an 11-point advantage at halftime, the Tommies outscored the Gusties 37-16 in the second half on the way to a 76-43 win.

Gustavus made just four field goals in the second half and finished the game 35-percent (14-40) from the floor. Mikayla Miller led the team in scoring with 14 points after going 4-for-14 from the field. St. Thomas shot over 50-percent from the field in both halves to finish 52.9-percent (27-51) in the game and scored 32 points off Gustavus's 24 giveaways.

### SERIES HISTORY

Saturday's game will be the 52nd meeting between Gustavus and St. Catherine in women's basketball. Gustavus holds the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 47-4. In last year's regular season series, Gustavus came away with a sweep thanks to a 77-67 win on Jan. 20 in St. Peter and an 82-52 win on Feb. 22 in St. Paul. The Wildcats' last win in the series came on Jan. 5, 2008 in a 63-59 victory on their home court.

### SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

With its lone loss coming at the hands of UW-Stout on Nov. 20 in St. Paul, St. Catherine finished its early-season non-conference schedule with a record of 4-1. The Royals then kicked off conference play with a 66-62 win over Bethel University on Wednesday night on their home court. Trailing by three points with 1:04 left in the game, St. Catherine put the clamps down defensively and finished the game on a 7-0 scoring-run en route to its first MIAC victory of the season.

LaShay Holt led the Wildcats with a double-double, scoring 18 points on 8-of-19 shooting and bringing down 13 rebounds. Holt is currently the team's second-ranked scorer with a 12.5 points per game average. She is shooting 32.1-percent from the field and is also averaging 9.5 rebounds. Gabby Zeher began the year with 16 and 14 point scoring efforts, but has not suited up the last four games. Shauna Horsch has picked up the scoring as of late, averaging 12 points and shooting 52.9-percent from the field over the last two games.

As a team, St. Kate's is scoring an average of 69.8 points per game (4th/MIAC) and is shooting 36.7-percent (9th/MIAC) from the field. The Gusties will need to be disciplined on the boards as they go up against the top rebounding team in the league. The Wildcats are averaging 15.7 offensive boards and 30.7 defensive boards for an MIAC-leading rebounding average of 46.3

### NEWS AND NOTES

**Winter Gustieland** - The Gustavus Athletics Department is set to host the first Winter Gustieland Weekend on Friday and Saturday at Lund Center. Winter Gustieland will begin on Friday at the men's hockey game and continue into Saturday. To kick Saturday's events off, students dressed in ugly Christmas sweaters at the women's basketball game will receive free hot chocolate and candy canes. In what are the marquee contests of the weekend, students are encouraged to channel their inner elf by taking part in a present wrapping challenge at halftime of both the women's and men's basketball games. The winners of the gift-wrapping contests will also receive gift cards to the Gustavus Bookmark.

**Miller Named November Student-Athlete Of The Month** - First-year guard Mikayla Miller was selected as the Gustavus Adolphus College November Female Student-Athlete-of-the-Month, as selected by the Gustavus Sports Information Department, earlier this week. Miller led Gustavus's offense in all five of team's November games, helping the Gusties begin their 2014-15 campaign with a record of 4-1. Overall in November, the Goodhue product scored more than 20 points three times and averaged 21.4 points per game (2nd/MIAC). She shot 42.5-percent from the field, 34.5-percent from three-point range, and 85.2-percent at the line.

**Rebounding, Second Half Scoring** - In Wednesday's loss to St. Thomas, Gustavus struggled in two areas that had been strengths in their previous five games - rebounding and second half scoring. For the first time this season, the Gusties lost the battle on the glass 31-24. Gustavus was also limited to just 16 points in the second half - 23 points under its season average leading up to the game. The Gusties went just 4-for-13 from the field and committed 15 turnovers in the final 20 minutes.

Laurie Kelly is in her third season as the head coach of the Gustavus women's basketball team. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a degree in speech communications, came to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she directed the Division I Lumberjacks for nine seasons.

Thanks to a late surge during which the 2013-14 Gustavus women's basketball team won seven of eight games from late-January to mid-February, the Gusties were able finish sixth in the conference standings with a record of 11-11 and earn a trip to the MIAC Playoffs for an MIAC-best 14th consecutive season. Gustavus finished the year with a record of 14-12 overall after falling on the road to No. 3-seeded St. Thomas 66-51 in the quarterfinals of the MIAC Playoffs.

Senior guard Julia Dysthe (White Bear Lake, Minn.) and sophomore post Karina Schroeder (Lake Crystal, Minn.) were both honored as members of the All-Conference Team following the season. Dysthe, a first time all-conference performer, scored a career-high 382 points (13.7 ppg) and shot 42.1-percent from the field. Schroeder, a member of the MIAC All-Rookie Team last season, established herself as one of the top post players in the league after averaging 14.2 points per game, shooting 53.3-percent from the field, and bringing down an average of 8.9 rebounds per game. She led the team in all three categories and finished with the second-best field goal shooting percentage in the league at 51.6-percent against league opponents.

A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early '90s. In the past nine years at Northern Arizona, she has compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while also directing the team to its first-ever Big Sky Conference tournament title and NCAA tournament bid in the 2005-06 season. During Kelly's tenure, the Lumberjacks advanced to the Big Sky tournament six times with two appearances in the championship game (2006, 2007), and her teams have registered two of the three 20-win seasons in the program's history.

In addition to quality on the floor, her squads have also been strong in the classroom, with four players earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors including one Academic All-American. The Lumberjacks were recognized in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Academic Honor Roll six times, with two Top Ten national rankings.

Following the 2012-13 season, the Gustavus women's basketball team achieved a significant milestone when the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) announced its Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll following the year. Making their 15th appearance on the NCAA Division III honor roll, the Gusties were recognized as the team with the top cumulative grade point average in country at a 3.600 – a first in the program's history.

Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In that first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the team to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly started her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-1 Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January of 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Laurie Kelly is the ninth head coach in the history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. Heading into the 2014-15 season, the Gusties have compiled an all-time record of 632-434 (.593), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly serves as the coordinator of the Gustavus Health Promotion program (GHP). The Gustavus Health Promotion program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan and Madison .

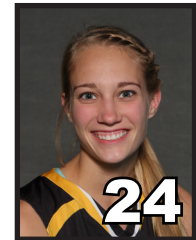

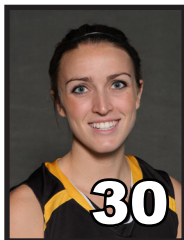

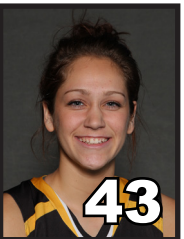
