Setting The Scene: The Gustavus Adolphus men's basketball team will take on Saint Mary's University on Saturday, Jan. 10 in a 3 p.m. game in Winona. After dropping its second straight MIAC game to Augsburg this past Wednesday, the Gusties will look to bounce back on the road against the Cardinals. Gustavus will head into the contest at 3-2 in the MIAC and 7-3 overall, while Saint Mary's currently owns a 1-5 mark in the MIAC and a 2-7 overall record.

Quick Rewind: The Gusties last played on Wednesday and suffered their straight MIAC defeat in a 66-57 loss to Augsburg College in St. Peter. The game's first six minutes featured both team's trading threepoint shots. Augsburg guard Brandon Little got the visitors off to a fast start by sinking a three-pointer on the Auggies' first possession of the game, but Gustavus guard Isaac Tapp (Sr., Stewartville, Minn.) countered with a three-pointer of his own at the 17:06 mark in the first half to tie the game at 5-5. The Auggies' Collin Olmscheid, a 6'7, 200 pound freshman center, sank another three ball at 14:40, before Gustie guard Chris Narum (Jr., Eagan, Minn.) was able to tie the game again, this time

at 8-8, on his first of two three-pointers on the night. However, another three-pointer from Little at 13:24 would put Augsburg up by three again, and the Auggies would not relinquish their lead from that point forward.

The Gusties would not go quietly though, and, similar to what they did in their previous game against St. Olaf, went on a large run midway through the second half. A Martin Feddersen (Sr. Winona, Minn.) layup at 7:38 would spark a 10-0 run for Gustavus over the next 2:47 that would bring the home team to within two (52-50). However, a foul by Sergio Najera (Jr., New Prague, Minn.) would allow Olmscheid to make a pair of free-throws and steal some momentum from the surging Gusties and on the next Gustie possession, Olmscheid would continue to make his prescence felt as he snared a steal from Feddersen and converted on a layup to bring the Augsburg lead back to six (56-50) with 3:12 remaining. The Auggies were able to maintain control from that point on and brought their lead back to 11 at one point before eventually winning by a final score of 66-57.

Saint Mary's played Wednesday as well and fell to St. Olaf college 81-50 in Winona. Saint Mary's scored two of the game's first four field goals-3-pointers by Wylie Ferron and Ronnie Ortiz-as the Cardinals held an early 6-5 advantage. From there, however, the Oles took control, taking the lead for good, 7-6, and racing to a 44-27 advantage at the break. The Cardinals, who shot 31 percent from the field in the first half—hitting 8-of-26 field-goal attempts whittled away at the Oles' halftime cushion, cutting the deficit to nine, 53-44, with 12 minutes remaining in regulation. Unfortunately, over those final 12 minutes, St. Olaf outscored the Cardinals 28-6 to seal the conference win—St. Olaf's fifth in six MIAC contests.

Series Snapshot: Saturday's contest marks the 168th meeting between Gustavus and Saint Mary's in men's basketball. The Gusties hold the advantage in the all-time sries with a record of 118-49 and have won each of the last eight contests, including a 79-59 win in the two teams' last contest in St. Peter on Feb. 15, 2014.

About The Cardinals: Augsburg will enter Wednesday's contest as one of the league's youngest teams. The Cardinals entire roster has no seniors and their starting lineup has only one junior. Saint Mary's youth could be a key reason for the team's early struggles this season. The Cardinals' only wins this season came on Dec. 3, 2014, a 70-67 win against Hamline and on Jan. 5, an 81-64 victory over Crown College.

The Cardinals are led by junior forward Will Swiggum and sophomores Ronnie Ortiz and Wylie Ferron. Swiggum is second on the team in points, averaging 10.4 per game and leads the team in rebounds with 5.7 per game. Ortiz is the team's leading scorer, averaging 11.8 points per game and also is the team's primary distributor, averaging three assists per contest. Ferron also averages double digits in points, with 10.1 per game and has pulled down 4.7 rebounds per game to this point. dished out an average of 5.2 assists per contest.

Last Time They Met: The last time these two teams met was on Feb. 15, 2014 in St. Peter, with Gustavus handing Saint Mary's a 89-59 defeat. The Gusties opened up a 15-point lead (23-8) midway through the first half

and would never look back Gustavus led by as many as 27 points (70-43) before settling for the 20-point win.

Welcome Aboard: To ring in 2015, Gustavus welcomed two new players to its roster in freshmen Jason Faul and Schuyler Thompson. Faul is a 6'3 forward from Prior Lake, Minnesota, while Thompson, also a quarterback on the Gustavus football team, is a native of Millville, Minnesota.

First For Everything: Wednesday's loss marked the second straight loss for Gustavus and began the Gusties' first losing streak so far this season. Before losing to St. Olaf on Jan. 3, Gustavus hadn't lost since Nov. 16, 2014 when they were defeated by Buena Vista University 76-73 in its second game of the season.

Gusties Take To Hardwood For 106th Season: The 2014-15 season represents the 106th season of men's basketball at Gustavus. Founded in 1904, the men's basketball program has mounted an overall record of 1395-965, and a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) mark of 923-560. Since the inception of the MIAC, the Gusties have amassed at least a share of 17 conference titles, the second most in league history. The program has made 22 MIAC Playoff appearances, and has also participated in the NCAA Tournament 13 times, most recently in the 2011-12 season.

Follow The Gusties On KNUJ and KCHK: KNUJ AM 860 of New Ulm, Minnesota and KCHK 95.5 FM of New Prague, Minnesota will broadcast all twenty-five Gustavus regular season men's basketball games, with the voice of the Golden Gusties, Tom Wheeler, handling play-by-play duties for the ninth consecutive season. Fans can listen to the broadcasts on KNUJ Radio AM 860, KCHK 95.5 or Online through the Gustavus Athletics website. In addition, Gustavus will once again stream all home games for viewing on your computer and other portable internet devices through GameCentral by Stretch Internet. Captains Log: As is tradition, captains are selected each year to serve as leaders of their team. This year, two players were given the honor of serving as captain, as the Gusties named seniors Martin Feddersen and Isaac Tapp to the position for the second season in a row.

Future Looks Bright: With only two seniors on this season's roster, the Gusties seem primed to be an MIAC powerhouse beyond the 2014-15 season. This season's roster consists of two seniors, five juniors, five sophomores and just one freshman. Of those players, nine are returning letterwinners and consist of 69 percent of last season's scoring. Isaac Tapp and Brody Ziegler are the two leading scorers of those that return from last season. The duo averaged 11.7 and 10.9 points per game, respectively.

Home Grown: The 2014-15 Gustavus men's basketball roster features 13 players and all but two are natives of Minnesota. The two players who hail from outside the Land of 10,000 Lakes are junior Gary Cooper from Detroit, Michigan and Jake Weber from Dubuque, Iowa. They are two of just 10 players to come through the Gustavus men's basketball program who reside outside the

Meet The Gustavus Coaching Staff: Head coach Mark Hanson begins his 25th season at the helm of the Gustavus men's basketball program. During his tenure, Hanson has directed the team to seven MIAC championships, 21 MIAC Playoff appearances, and 11 NCAA Division III National Tournament appearances, including reaching the Final Four for the first time in school history and placing second in the nation during the 2002-03 season. With 459 career wins, Hanson is the all-time winningest coach in Gustavus men's basketball history.

Head Coach Mark Hanson

Mark Hanson is entering his 25th season as the head coach of the Gustavus Adolphus men's basketball program. During that time, Hanson has directed the team to 11 NCAA Division III National Tournament appearances, including reaching the Final Four for the first time in school history and placing second in the nation during the 2002-03 season.

After narrowly missing the postseason a year ago, the Gustavus men's basketball team bounced back this season with a fourth place finish in the conference standings after going 13-7 in league play. Thanks to a free throw by senior Jordan Dick (Wabasha, Minn.) with just :02 seconds remaining in the game, the Gusties were able to defeat No. 4-seeded Saint John's 65-64 on the road in the MIAC Playoff Quarterfinals. Gustavus' tournament run came to an end in the semifinal round when it fell to No. 2-seeded St. Olaf 66-53 in Northfield. The 2013-14 Gusties finished the season with a 17-10 overall record.

In the 2010-11 season, Hanson earned his 400th career victory with an 89-78 win over Saint Mary's on Gus Young Court. He became the 65th coach in NCAA Division III history, and 31st active coach, to reach the 400-win milestone. Research indicated that Hanson was the 14th fastest coach to reach 400 victories in Division III history, as becomes just the sixth coach from the MIAC to reach the 400-win plateau.

Hanson, who has compiled a 459-209 overall record at Gustavus, including a 347-138 record in the MIAC, has won seven MIAC Championships, and has been named MIAC Coach of the Year eight times. He has helped guide Gustavus to the MIAC Playoffs 20 times, reaching the finals 14 years and winning the MIAC Playoff Championship on seven occasions. His teams have reached the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament six times and the Elite Eight three times. Hanson has coached 29 players who have garnered 49 All-Conference honors, four MIAC Players of the Year, eight players who have received 13 all-region honors, and three All-Americans. In addition, Hanson has coached one Jostens' Award Finalist (Trevor Wittwer, 2008), which recognizes the top Division III men's basketball player in the nation based on academics, athletics, and community involvement.

Hanson is a 1983 Gustavus graduate and the basketball program's all-time leading scorer with 1,774 points. He was a two-time NAIA All-America and GTE Academic All-America selection, a three-time Gustie MVP and a four-time All-MIAC selection.

A long-time outdoor enthusiast, Hanson earned his master's degree in experiential education at Mankato State University and teaches outdoor education classes in the health and exercise science department. He is also the outdoor program director at the college.

Hanson, a native of Dodge Center, Minnesota, lives in St. Peter with his two children. Hans and Annika.
