# GAME NOTES

## GUSTIES TAKE TO GRIDIRON FOR 99TH SEASON...

The Gustavus football team continues its 99th season Saturday at Royal Stadium. Over the previous 98 seasons, the Gusties have compiled a record of 479-343-21, including a record of 222-126-8 in St. Peter. With 22 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) championships, Gustavus has claimed the second-most league titles in the 95-year history of the conference. Only Saint John's (32) has claimed more MIAC championships.

## FOLLOW THE GUSTIES ON KNUJ...KNUJ

AM 860 out of New Ulm, Minnesota once again broadcasts all 10 Gustavus regular season football games. The voice of the Golden Gusties Tom Wheeler handles the play-by-play duties for the 10th consecutive season. Wheeler is once again joined by 1984 Gustavus graduate and former Gustie football player Ken Ericson on the live call of this year's games. Fans can listen to the KNUJ broadcasts on the Internet through the Gustavus Athletics website. **Calling All Captains...** Of over 5,000 student-athletes who have played football for Gustavus in the 99-year history of the program, only 195 have earned the privilege to serve as team captain. Peter Haugen's captains this season include seniors Mitch Hendricks, Zach Martinez, Nick Frandsen and Marcus Kelly.



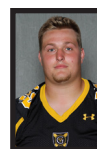

**SENIOR LEADERSHIP...** In what has become a trend of Head Coach Peter Hagen's tenure, the 2015 Gustavus football roster once again features a great deal of senior leadership. With 23 seniors on this year's squad, the Gustavus roster is tied for the third-most seniors on any Gustie football team since the turn of the century. The 2003 (28), 2002 (26), 2011 (23) and 2014 (23) teams are the only squads during that span to have more or as many seniors wearing Black and Gold. This year's senior class features four defensive lineman, four defensive backs, four offensive lineman, three tight ends, two wide receivers, two quarterbacks, two linebackers, one running back and one kicker.

## GUSTIE FOOTBALL AROUND THE

**GLOBE...** The 2015 Gustavus football team features a total of 104 players from nine different states and, for the fourth straight year, a second country outside the United States. Of those 104 players, 86 claim Minnesota as their native state. Three players call Kansas home, two hail from Iowa, two from Illinois, two from Hawaii, two from Texas, and one player from California, Colorado and Florida represent the Stars and Stripes. Mexico once again makes its presence felt on this year's roster as it is the homeland of four Gusties, all of whom hail from Cancun.

NOTES

**THE SERIES...** Saturday's game is the 84th meeting between the Gustavus and Concordia football programs. The Gusties hold the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 44-37-2. Last season, the Gusties lost to the Cobbers 35-26 on Nov. 8 in Moorhead, Minn. Gustavus took a 7-0 lead on its first drive of the game, but the Cobbers responded with 28 unanswered points to end the first half and never looked back. Gustavus outgained Concordia 464-391 in total yards of offense, but the Cobber defense tallied five interceptions.

**MEET THE HEAD COACHES...** Gustavus Head Coach Peter Haugen is in his seventh season at the helm of the Gustavus football program. Haugen has a combined record of 31-37 after eight games into season seven. A graduate of Bethel University, Haugen was the head coach at Washburn High School in Minneapolis prior to coming to Gustavus.

Concordia Head Coach Terry Horan is in his 15th season at the helm of the Cobber football program. Horan has a combined record of 105-49 after nine games into second 15. A 1989 graduate of Concordia, Horan began his coaching career in 1991 as an assistant at Breckenridge High School and took over as head coach of the program in 1993.

**HALL OF FAME WEEKEND...** Saturday's game is designated as Hall of Fame Day at Hollingsworth Field as the College's Athletics Department has selected nine individuals for induction into its Athletics Hall of Fame. The 2015 class of inductees include Tina Peterson Bross '96 (Soccer), Kyle Landon '99 (Golf), Lisa Broughten Monjeau '98 (Tennis), Kevin O'Laughlin '99 (Swimming), Katie Kortuem Olson '00 (Gymnastics), Erica Stone Scott '00 (Track and Field), Chris Swansson '99 (Football, Baseball), Dave Underdale '84 (Ice Hockey), and Alan Markman (Benefactor).

**FORMER FOOTBALL GREAT ENTERS THE HALL...** Former football star Chris Swansson '99, a native of Woodbury, Minn., is among the nine individuals to enter the Gustavus Athletics Hall of Fame today. Swansson starred as a wide receiver on the football team and an outfielder on the baseball team in the late '90s. On the gridiron, Swansson was a possession receiver who complete his career ranked second in career TD

receptions with 25 and second in career receptions with 159. On the diamond, Swansson played center field where he completed his career holding seven career records including stolen bases with 56, which still stand 16 years later.

**THIRD DOWN TO FIRST DOWN...** When the pressure is on to continue a drive on third down, the Gusties have come through in the clutch more times than any other team on any level of collegiate football (FBC, FCS, Division II, Division III). Gustavus has tallied 110 third down attempts this season and has converted 68 times for a .618 percentage, which ranks No. 1 in the nation. When the Gusties reach the red zone they have scored 40 out of 45 tries (19 rushing TDs, 19 pass TDs, 2 FG) for a .889 percentage, which ranks first in the MIAC and 12th in Division III.

**CONTRASTING STYLES OF PLAY...** Both teams enter this late season contest with hopes of a second or third place finish in league play and on paper it looks to be an even match-up. The strengths of each team however, are quite different as the Gusties enter with a high-powered offense that is averaging 459.7 yards and 45.5 points a game in league play compared to 384.4 yards and 29.0 points per game for Concordia's offense. While defensively, the Cobbers enter with a defense that is allowing 391.3 yards and 22.6 points per game, compared to Gustavus, which is allowing 427.3 yards and 34.2 points per game. It is a veteran Gustavus offense against a veteran Concordia defensive, and a young Gustavus defense against a young Cobber offense. Expect a back-and-forth battle that will likely be decided late in the game with the edge going to the team that can limit turnovers and convert a higher percentage of its red zone chances into touchdowns rather than field goals.

**TWO OF THE BEST IN THE NATION...** The quarterback-receiver duo of Mitch Hendricks and Matt Boyce is one of the best in the country. Boyce ranks third in NCAA Division III football in both touchdowns (14) and receiving yards per game (132.4). The Minnetonka High School product also ranks fourth in the nation with 1,059 receiving yards. Hendricks also has his name littered on the national rankings. The Bemidji High School product ranks fourth in the nation with 28 passing touchdowns, fifth in completion percentage (.696), six in points responsible for (192) and ninth in passing yards (2,518).

#### MIAC Offensive Player-of-the-Week

**Jordan Roberts, St. Thomas  
Sheridan, Wyo. / Sheridan**

The St. Thomas football team continued its remarkable season Saturday with a 38-14 win over then No. 14/17-ranked Concordia to remain unbeaten. Junior running back Jordan Roberts (Sheridan, Wyo.) was a workhorse to lead the Tommie offense in the win, as he racked up 254 total yards on 34 touches, and scored a pair of touchdowns to help UST surge ahead and pull away.



#### MIAC Defensive Player-of-the-Week

Woodbury, Minn. / Woodbury**

The St. Thomas defense rose to the occasion Saturday, limiting a talented Concordia offense en route to a 38-14 road win for the Tommies in the nationally-ranked showdown of first- and second-place teams in the MIAC. Junior defensive lineman Ryan Winter (Woodbury, Minn.) continued to make his presence felt, as he recorded double-digit tackles, including three sacks and four total tackles behind the line of scrimmage.



#### MIAC Special Teams Player-of-the-Week

**Jake Swanberg, Hamline  
Le Sueur, Minn. / Le Sueur-Henderson**

The Hamline football team was the definition of clutch Saturday with a remarkable 31-30 win over St. Olaf in the game's final minute. However, the biggest play of the game may have been on special teams, as Piper senior Jack Swanberg (Le Sueur, Minn./Le Sueur-Henderson) blocked an Ole extra point in the fourth quarter that proved to be the difference in Hamline's one-point win.



**DON'T BLINK...** Although the Gustie offense ranks seventh in the MIAC in time of possession (28:54), its not because of three-and-outs, turnovers or inaccuracy, but rather because of its ability to strike in a hurry. Gustavus ranks second in the league in both points per game (47.3) and total yards per game (494.4), while the Gustie air raid is best in the league with an average of 329.0 yards per game. After 101 offensive possessions this season, the Gusties are averaging 1:58 per drive.

**SCOUTING THE COBBERS...** The Concordia football team had a tough task last week in facing No. 6-ranked St. Thomas and came out on the short end of a 38-14 final score. The Cobbers allowed 28 points in the second quarter and gave up 304 rushing yards—two marks that proved to be the difference in the outcome of the game. The loss snapped Concordia's five-game win streak and dropped their record to 7-2 overall and 5-2 in the MIAC.

The Tommies outgained the Cobbers 552-179 in yards of total offense. St. Thomas also ran 82 plays for an average of 6.7 yards per play compared to Concordia's 55 plays for 3.3 yards a pop. The Tommies also won the time of possession battle at 33:56.

Concordia got the scoring going at the 11:19 mark in the first period on a four-yard touchdown run by Brandon Zylstra (Sr., Spicer, Minn.) to cap a seven-play, 77-yard drive, and the Cobbers led 7-0 after the first quarter of play. St. Thomas responded with four touchdowns in the second quarter to take a comfortable 28-7 lead at halftime. Concordia scored a touchdown on the final play of the third quarter to make it a two-possession game, but the Tommies responded with two more touchdowns in the fourth quarter to secure the victory.

Michael Herzog (So., Detroit Lakes, Minn.) went 8-for-16 passing with 109 yards, one touchdown and an interception for the Cobber offense. Jason Montonye (So., Graceville, Minn.) led the ground game with five carries for 57 yards. Jon Baune (Sr., Fargo, N.D.) was the top target through the air with four catches for 88 yards and a score. Erik Bye (Sr., Moorhead, Minn.) led the defense with 15 total tackles.

After nine games this season, Chad Johnson (So., Glyndon, Minn.) is the team's leading rusher with 89 carries for 488 yards and nine touchdowns. Herzog has seen the bulk of the snaps as the play-caller as he has accumulated 1,022 passing yards and

eight touchdowns with a .549 completion percentage. Zylstra is the top receiver with 33 catches for 577 yards and four touchdowns. On the defensive side, Bye is the team's leader with 77 total tackles, including three sacks, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

**SCOUTING THE GUSTIES...** The Gustavus football team is anxious to get back to the friendly confines of Lloyd Hollingsworth Field this week after a couple of tough losses on the road, including last week's 33-24 setback at Bethel. The Gusties got off to a great start last Saturday in Arden Hills and led 24-20 heading into the fourth quarter, but the hard charging Royals scored 13 straight points to claim the come-from-behind victory.

Hendricks finished the day going 20-for-39 with 285 yards, two touchdowns and an interception. Hendricks also led the team in rushing with 58 yards on 12 carries, including a touchdown. Matt Boyce was the top target through the air with seven catches for 118 yards and two scores. Kysten Zierke (So., Blue Earth, Minn.) led the defense with 12 tackles and ranks sixth in the MIAC with 60 total tackles this season.

After eight games this season, Hendricks has amassed 2,518 passing yards with 28 touchdowns and a .696 completion percentage, all of which rank first in the MIAC. Karim Ortiz (So., Cancun, Mexico) is the team's leading rusher with 87 carries for 409 yards and five touchdowns. Matt Boyce is the leading receiver with 61 catches for 1,059 yards and 14 touchdowns.

Peter Haugen, a native of Minneapolis and a 1991 graduate of Bethel University, is in his seventh year as head football coach at Gustavus Adolphus College.

Last season, the Gustavus football team matched its 2013 campaign with an overall record of 6-4 and a MIAC mark of 4-4. The Golden Gusties started the season on a tear, winning their first six games, which was the best start to a season since the 1987 team went 10-0 and claimed the MIAC title. Last season's hot start was highlighted by conference wins over Hamline, Augsburg, Carleton and St. Olaf. Offense was the name of the game as the Gusties averaged 47.5 points per game during that four-game stretch. Of the four losses, three were by 10 points or less.

In the MIAC's post-season honors, first team all-conference recipients included senior kicker Thomas Scheusener (Rapid City, S.D.), junior quarterback Mitch Hendricks (Bemidji, Minn.), junior wide receiver Matt Boyce (Excelsior, Minn.), junior wide receiver Gabriel Boyce (Excelsior, Minn.) and junior offensive lineman Marcus Kelly (Woodbury, Minn.). Matt Boyce, Gabriel Boyce and Mitch Hendricks were later named to the D3football.com All-West Region Team, while Matt Boyce was selected to the D3football.com All-America Team.

In six seasons at the head of the Gustavus Adolphus football program, Haugen has compiled an overall record of 25-35 and a MIAC record of 18-30.

Haugen, who was the head football coach at Washburn High School for 15 years prior to coming to Gustavus, compiled an overall record of 111-44 during that span, while winning 11 league championships and posting a league record of 76-8. He directed the Millers to the Class AAAA quarterfinals in 2007 finishing with a mark of 9-3. In his last season as the Millers' head coach, Haugen's squad posted a mark of 8-2. While building the program at Washburn, Haugen increased player participation from 35 players in 1994 to 110 players in 2008. He also implemented academic monitoring and meal programs for student-athletes as well as creating and directing the highly successful Washburn Athletic Leadership Academy. He has also served as the chair of the Minneapolis Football Conference and he is an active clinician working at many local and regional clinics including the NIKE Coach of the Year clinic. Haugen was also a member of the Metro coaching staff for the Minnesota All-Star game in 1998. He started his coaching career at his alma mater, serving as the offensive line coach during the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

A three-sport standout at Bethel, Haugen was a starting tight end on the football team, a starting goaltender on the hockey team, and a starting catcher on the baseball team in the late '80s and early '90s. In his senior year, he earned all-conference honors in football, and was selected Most Valuable Player of the hockey team.

Haugen became the 17th head coach in the 98-year history of Gustavus football. The Golden Gusties have a long and storied football tradition that includes 22 MIAC titles. The program ranks in the top-50 all-time in Division III (out of 235 institutions) with a 58.0 winning percentage (479-343-21). The Gusties will soon join an elite group of 40 NCAA Division III institutions whose football teams have won 500 games.

Along with great teams, Gustavus has also been blessed with many outstanding individual players, which includes 30 players who have received All-America honors, 13 who have received CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, and five who have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships. Most recently, wide receiver Matt Boyce '16 was named to the D3football.com All-America Team.

# 2015 GAME RECAPS



## GAME 1 - SEPT. 5

**ST. BONIFACIUS, Minn.** – The Gustavus Adolphus football team started the 2015 season Saturday on a positive note with a convincing 56-13 victory at Crown College in non-conference action.

The Gusties accumulated 683 yards of total offense, breaking the program record for most total yards of offense in a game, which previously stood at 650 yards in a 49-17 victory over Concordia in 1998.

“Solid first game for our team,” Head Coach Peter Haugen said. “Great energy early. We need to clean up penalties and learn from our mistakes.”

Most of the yards Saturday came in the first half as Gustavus jumped out to a 28-0 lead after the first quarter and entered the locker room at halftime with a comfortable 49-6 advantage.

Leeland Lauti (So., Ewa, Hawaii) got the game going with an 11-yard touchdown run at the 8:42 mark in the first quarter. The touchdown run capped an 11-play, 91-yard drive.

The Gustie defense forced a three-and-out on the next possession, which was highlighted by a sack by Tyler Jakes (Jr., North Mankato, Minn.) for a 10-yard loss. The Black and Gold then started at its own 32 and drove the field in five plays, ending with a four-yard touchdown from Mitch Hendricks (Sr., Bemidji, Minn.) to Gabe Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) to take a 14-0 lead after the Brendan Boche (So., Lakeville, Minn.) extra point.

Another three-and-out by the Gustie defense put the ball back into the offense’s hands at its own 28. After a false start put the Gusties back five yards, Hendricks then fired a strike to Matt Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) for a 77-yard touchdown with 4:58 left in the first quarter.

Crown got its first first down on the ensuing possession, but on the seventh play of the drive, the Storm were forced to punt. Gustavus started at its own 34 and after five plays and a first down, Hendricks connected with George Buchner (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.) for a 52-yard touchdown to take a 27-0 lead. The Boche extra point made it 28-0.

On the ensuing kickoff, Sergio De Pablos Velez (Jr., Cancun, Mexico) forced a fumble that was recovered by Nathan Hajder (So., Rogers, Minn.) at the Crown 30. The offense gained two first downs on its next two plays and the whistle blew to end the first quarter with the Gusties leading 28-0 and the ball on the Crown four-yard line.

DaiVon Poole (So., San Angelo, Texas) then started the second quarter with a four-yard touchdown to make it 35-0 after the Boche extra point.

Crown finally got on the scoreboard after a 10-play, 75-yard drive, ending with a two-yard touchdown pass. The extra point failed and the score read 35-6 Gustavus with 9:49 left in the second quarter.

The Gusties started the next drive at their own 18 and drove the field in 10 plays, finishing with a 20-yard touchdown pass from Hendricks to Matt Boyce. Another Boche extra point made it 42-6 Gustavus.

Another three-and-out by the Gustie defense gave the ball back to the offense at its own 34. On the fourth play of the drive, Hendricks was intercepted, but the Crown offense was unable to capitalize and its drive faltered after five plays. The Storm’s punt was downed at the Gustavus two-yard line with 3:12 left in the half.

Starting in the shadow of its own goal post, the Gustie offense used two big passing plays to drive the field for a touchdown in nine plays. The first big-yardage play was a 27-yard Hendricks-to-Matt Boyce connection on a third and 10 from the two-yard line. And the next was a 46-yard touchdown pass once again from Hendricks to Matt Boyce. The Boche extra point gave the Gusties a 49-6 advantage with 1:03 left in the half, and that score stood at half time.

After a frenzy of offense in the first two quarters, neither team was able to reach the end zone in the third. Crown fumbled the ball on its first drive of the quarter, which was recovered by Jakes at the Crown 45. The Gusties got down to the 11-yard line, but Boche missed a 28-yard field goal wide left.

Crown’s ensuing drive went 14 plays and 58 yards, but ended on another fumble on a fourth down attempt.

Gustavus followed with a three-and-out on the next possession and the Storm started their next drive at their own 35. After three plays and a first down, the whistle blew and the third quarter ended with the Gusties leading 49-6.

Crown continued its drive in the fourth quarter and found the end zone after seven plays, finishing on a four-yard rushing touchdown.

Gustavus couldn’t get much going on its next drive and went three-and-out.

The Storm responded with a 10-play drive, but Josh Curtis (Fy., Houston, Texas) recorded his first collegiate interception and gave the Gusties the ball at their own 35.

With Sam Lundberg (Sr., Ellendale, Minn.) in at quarterback in place of Hendricks, Lundberg directed a 13-play, 65-yard drive that ended on a one-yard quarterback keeper for a touchdown with 2:06 remaining in the game. The Boche extra point made it 56-13 and the score stood for a final.

Gustavus compiled 263 yards rushing and 420 passing for its record-setting 683 yards of total offense. The offense tallied 73 plays and average 9.4 yards per play.

Hendricks completed 25-of-32 passes for 385 yards and four touchdowns. He also had two interceptions.

Gabe Boyce was Hendricks’ favorite target, hauling in nine receptions for 71 yards and a touchdown.

Matt Boyce led the receiving corps with 217 yards on eight catches and two touchdowns. Boyce’s 217 yards receiving is third most in a single game in program history.

Lauti led the ground attack, rushing 10 times for 101 yards and a touchdown.

Jakes, Kysten Zierke (So., Blue Earth, Minn.) and Anders Raarup (Eagan, Minn.) paced the defensive front with six tackles each.

Gustavus starts the season 1-0 overall and returns to St. Peter Saturday for its home opener against Lake Forest College. Kickoff is slated for 1 p.m.

## GAME 2 - SEPT. 12

**ST. PETER, Minn.** – After starting Saturday’s game against Lake Forest with a fumble and a punt on its first two offensive possessions, the Gustavus football team regrouped and ended its next five drives with touchdowns en route to a 49-0 shutout over the Foresters at Hollingsworth Field.

The win was a complete team effort as the offense amassed 530 total yards, while the defense held Lake Forest to 288 yards with two interceptions.

After a slow start, the Gustie offense cracked the scoreboard with 52 seconds remaining in the first quarter. Mitch Hendricks (Sr., Laporte, Minn.) found a hole through the middle of the Foresters defense and ran seven yards for a touchdown. The touchdown run capped a 12-play, 80-yard drive that lasted 4:12.

Lake Forest went three-and-out on the ensuing possession and the Gusties started their next drive at the Foresters 45-yard line five seconds into the second quarter. Gustavus then put together a nine-play drive and ended it on a seven-yard strike from Hendricks to Gabe Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) for a touchdown.

Lake Forest responded with an impressive 17-play, 83-yard drive, but it didn’t end in favor of the visitors. On a fourth-and-one try from the Gustavus three-yard line, Kyle Krzmarzick (Sr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.) stuffed a rushing attempt for no gain, giving the Gusties the ball.

Starting the following drive with its heels in its own end zone, the Gustie offense rolled off a number of big gains throughout the possession and ended the nine-play, 97-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown run by Leeland Lauti (So., Ewa, Hawaii). The drive included five first downs, one of which featured a 26-yard run down the home sideline by Lauti.

On the ensuing kickoff, Michael Heitzman (Fy., Spicer, Minn.) forced a fumble, which was recovered by the Black and Gold at the Lake Forest 31. After a penalty to start the drive, Hendricks found Matt Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) for an acrobatic catch in the end zone, giving Gustavus its fourth touchdown of the half. The Brendan Boche (So., Lakeville, Minn.) extra point made it 28-0, which stood as the score at halftime.

Gustavus started the third quarter with the ball at its own 40 after a 28-yard return by George Buchner (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.). Two quick 10-plus-yard passes from Hendricks to Gabe Boyce got the Gusties into Forester territory and they continued to drive down the field. Six plays later, Hendricks connected with Matt Boyce for a five-yard touchdown pass and with the Boche extra point the Gusties led 35-0 three minutes into the second half.

After the Gustavus defensive unit recorded a three-and-out, the offense gave the ball right back to Lake Forest on an interception. But three plays into the ensuing Lake Forest drive, the Gustie defense came up big again, returning the favor with an interception by Tyler Jakes (Jr., North Mankato, Minn.). The interception was Jakes’ first career pick as he returned the pass 11 yards to the Lake Forest 43.

The offense made good use of the turnover as it drove the field in four plays, ending on a 16-yard pass from Hendricks to Matt Boyce.

On the ensuing Forester drive, Levi Gibbs (Sr., LaPorte, Colo.) came away with an interception – his first career – on a tipped pass, giving the Gusties the ball back at the Lake Forest 44.

Once again, the Gustie offense turned the interception into points as Hendricks connected with Buchner for a 23-yard touchdown pass with 1:45 left in the third. Another Boche extra point made it 49-0 in favor of the home squad.

Neither team was able to find the end zone in the fourth quarter and the Gusties finished their non-conference schedule with another convincing win.

Hendricks had another impressive day as the play-caller. The Laporte, Minn. native went 28-for-35 with five touchdowns and two interceptions. He also added a rushing touchdown.

Matt Boyce was Hendricks’ favorite target, hauling in 10 receptions for 136 yards and three touchdowns. Gabe Boyce added nine catches for 93 yards and a score.

Lauti led the rushing game with 17 carries for 109 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively, Jakes posted 10 tackles and an interception. Nick Frandsen (Sr., North Oaks, Minn.) added eight stops, including two pass breakups and 1.5 tackles for loss.

Gustavus improves to 2-0 overall and begins its Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference schedule next Saturday at Hamline University. Kickoff is slated for 7 p.m.

“It’s going to be a great challenge for us, no question about it,” Head Coach Peter Haugen said. “The MIAC is now the number one league in the country so we know there are going to be tougher days ahead. We just need to get back to work Monday and start preparing.”

ST. PAUL, Minn. - The Gustavus football team held off a late comeback Saturday night at Hamline University...

"We made enough plays to win and that's important," Head Coach Peter Haugen said. "Finding ways to win is important..."

The Gusties scored touchdowns on their first four drives of the game and looked every bit in control with a 28-7 lead midway through the second quarter.

Gustavus controlled the third quarter with a pair of touchdowns to take a comfortable 42-21 advantage, but once again, the Pipers responded with a pair of touchdowns late in the fourth quarter...

Gustavus started with the ball at its own 28 to begin the game and marched down the field in nine plays, capped by a five-yard touchdown run by DaiVon Poole...

Hamline converted one first down on the ensuing drive, but the Gustie defense forced a punt where the Pipers pinned the ball down at the four-yard line.

No stranger to starting drives in the shadow of its own goal post, the Gustie offense put together a 12-play, 96-yard drive to go ahead 14-0. Gustavus got into Hamline territory on its first three plays.

Hamline scored its first points of the game on the ensuing drive. Starting at their own 25, the Pipers ended a four-play drive on a 32-yard touchdown pass.

Starting their next drive at their own 26, the Gusties made their way down to the Hamline 26 and then scored on a touchdown pass from Hendricks to Matt Boyce with 34 seconds left in the first quarter.

The Gustavus defense forced a three-and-out on the next Hamline possession, highlighted by a sack by Isaac Kotila (Jr., Buffalo, Minn.) for a 15-yard loss.

Gustavus received the punt at its own 43 and Gabe Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) returned it 12 yards, giving the offense prime field position in Hamline territory.

The Gustie defense forced another punt on the following drive, but Hendricks was picked off as the Pipers returned the interception down to the Gustavus one-yard line.

The Hamline defense fed off the momentum swing and forced a three-and-out on the following Gustie possession. After the punt, the Pipers started at their own 40 and drove the field in 11 plays...

The Gusties got the ball down to the Hamline 33 and with seconds remaining in the first half, but a 50-yard field goal attempt by Brendan Boche (So., Lakeville, Minn.) was blocked...

Hamline started the second half with the ball, but Nick Frandsen (Sr., North Oaks, Minn.) put the pigskin back in the hands of the Black and Gold with interception on the fourth play of the drive.

the Hamline 37.

The Gustie offense made good on the turnover as Karim Ortiz (So., Cancun, Mexico) rushed 28 yards for a touchdown on the third play of the drive...

Gustavus' defense forced another three-and-out, but the ensuing drive ended on Hendricks' second interception of the game. Once again, the Gustie defense stood its ground...

With the ball at the Hamline 30, Gustavus capped a six-play drive on a five-yard touchdown rush by Hendricks to take a 42-21 advantage after the Boche extra point.

To start the fourth quarter, both teams stalled on their first possessions. On their second possession of the final quarter, the Gusties were forced to punt, which was blocked and returned for a 25-yard touchdown.

Trailing 42-28 with 4:26 remaining in the game, the Pipers elected to onside kick and did so successfully. Hamline then drove 49 yards on seven plays, capped by a 12-yard touchdown pass...

After a timeout with 2:02 remaining in the game, Hendricks connected with Matt Boyce for the aforementioned first down strike to seal the victory.

The Gustavus offense had another big day, totaling 520 yards. Hendricks completed 31-of-44 passes for 307 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions.

Gabe Boyce was the top target with nine receptions for 70 yards. Matt Boyce compiled a team-high 118 yards on six catches and a touchdown.

The rushing game was led by Poole who had 15 carries for 107 yards and three touchdowns - a career best for yards and touchdowns in a game.

Defensively, Mason Kaliszewski (Jr., Maple Grove, Minn.) and Anders Raarup (So., Eagan, Minn.) led the way with seven stop apiece. Kaliszewski also added 2.5 tackles for a loss of 13 yards and a half sack.

Gustavus returns to Hollingsworth Field at 1 p.m., Sept. 26 for its Homecoming game against Augsburg College. Last season, the Gusties defeated the Auggies 55-31.

"We will do what we do every week in practice and clean it up," Haugen said about the team's preparation for Augsburg. "It's going to be a difficult challenge for us this week, but we'll be ready..."

**ST. PETER, Minn.** – There was no shortage of offense in Saturday’s Gustavus football Homecoming game against Augsburg, as the Gusties won the shootout 59-42. The 101 combined points between the two teams marks the most points scored in a single game in the 99-season history of Gustavus football. With the win, Gustavus improves to 4-0 overall and 2-0 in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

“We did a couple things defensively that were so important to get us that gap in the lead,” Head Coach Peter Haugen said. “And then offensively we continued to execute and make plays.”

A number of key turnovers propelled the Gusties to victory. Leading 14-7 nearing the end of the first quarter, the Gustavus defense came up big as Iker Ortiz (Jr., Cancun, Mexico) sacked Augsburg quarterback Ayrton Scott for a loss of eight yards. As Scott was taken down, he fumbled the ball and Isaac Kotila (Jr., Buffalo, Minn.) recovered it at the Gustavus 48-yard line. Five plays later, which was the first play of the second quarter, Mitch Hendricks (Sr., Laporte, Minn.) found Matt Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) for a 29-yard touchdown connection to give the Gusties a two-possession lead.

Augsburg responded with an eight-play, 68-yard drive to get down to the Gustavus one-yard line, but on third-and-goal, Adam Neubarth (Sr., Cologne, Minn.) recovered another Augsburg fumble to put the ball back in the hands of the offense. The Gusties were forced to punt on the following drive, though, and the Auggies hit pay dirt with a 46-yard touchdown pass to make it a 21-14 game.

Gustavus answered with a six-play, 70-yard drive, capped by a 30-yard touchdown run by Karim Ortiz (So., Cancun, Mexico).

Looking to get back to a one-possession game, the Auggies were driving into Gustavus territory, but Nick Frandsen (Sr., North Oaks, Minn.) had a different idea as he intercepted a pass at the Gustavus 31 and ran it back 69 yards for a touchdown and a 21-point lead.

On the ensuing drive, the Auggies threatened again with the ball in Gustavus territory, but the Gustie defense stopped the drive on a fourth down attempt and the score remained 35-14 at halftime.

The Black and Gold started the third quarter with the ball and wasted little time expanding its lead. On the sixth play of the drive, Hendricks found Matt Boyce for a four-yard touchdown, giving the Gusties a 42-14 lead after the Brendan Boche (So., Lakeville, Minn.) extra point.

Augsburg quickly answered with a three-play, 81-yard drive, highlighted by a 54-yard touchdown pass.

Starting the following drive at its own 27, Gustavus put together a 12-play drive that included four first downs and finished on a six-yard touchdown pass from Hendricks to Hunter Johnson (So., Cannon Falls, Minn.). But once again, Augsburg would not lay down and responded with a quick four-play, 58-yard drive, scoring a touchdown on a 10-yard rush to make it a 49-27 game after the extra point attempt failed.

On their third possession of the third quarter, the Gusties finished their drive with yet another touchdown, this time on a four-yard quarterback keeper by Hendricks. The drive lasted eight plays and went 51 yards. After three quarters of play, Gustavus led 56-27.

Augsburg scored on the opening drive of the fourth quarter on a four-yard touchdown pass. Gustavus then started its drive at the Augsburg 48 and ran the ball nine times in an effort to run time off the clock. The drive stalled at the Augsburg 10 and Boche came in for a 26-yard field goal, which he booted through the uprights giving the Gusties a 59-35 advantage.

Augsburg scored a touchdown on the next possession, but the Gusties were able to run out the clock for the 17-point victory.

Gustavus finished the game by scoring eight touchdowns on a total of 12 drives, while Augsburg scored six touchdowns on 11 possessions. The Gusties compiled 517 yards of total offense on 72 plays and the Auggies put up 561 yards on 61 plays.

Karim Ortiz – Gustavus’ fourth-string running back – led all rushers with 28 carries for 178 yards and two touchdowns.

Hendricks led the passing game, completing 26-of-32 passes for 311 yards and four touchdowns. The Bemidji High School product also ran for a score and was sacked once, which was the first sack allowed by the Gusties all season.

Matt Boyce was the main target through the air as he hauled in eight catches for 106 yards and three touchdowns.

On the defensive side of the ball, Frandsen and Anders Raarup (So., Eagan, Minn.) led Gustavus with 10 tackles apiece. Frandsen added the 69-yard interception return and two pass breakups, while Raarup contributed 1.5 tackles for loss.

“We just believe in our players,” Haugen said. “Karim is our number four running back, but we are confident in him and he’s confident in the guys blocking in front of him. The offensive line did an awfully good job today. We’ve given up only one sack in four weeks, so we have to give them a lot of credit, too. It was a big day by our big-time players.”

Gustavus continues MIAC play at 1 p.m., Oct. 3 at Carleton College.

**NORTHFIELD, Minn.** – The Gustavus football team continued its offensive dominance Saturday as it defeated Carleton College 63-14 and Matt Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) cemented his name in the Gustavus record books by scoring two touchdowns – his 29th and 30th career scores – becoming the program’s all-time leader in receiving touchdowns.

“Matt has meant a lot to our football program in terms of his accomplishments on the field,” Head Coach Peter Haugen said. “He would be the first one to tell you that none of this would happen without his teammates. He’s been a tremendous leader and we are excited for him. Matt has worked really hard to get to this point and he brings so much more to the table with everything he does off the field as a great mentor to our younger players.”

Gustavus’ 63 points are the most scored in a single game since 1991. The Gusties scored touchdowns on nine of 11 possessions and tallied 445 yards of offense. The offense also continued to impress on its third down attempts, converting 9-of-12 on the day, improving its season average to .677 (2nd/NCAA).

Carleton started the game with possession and the Gustie defense held the Knights to a three-and-out. On the punt, Josh Curtis (Fy., Houston, Texas) got a hand on the ball for the block, which was returned 20 yards for a touchdown by George Buchner (Jr., Excelsior, Minn.). The blocked punt return for a touchdown was the first by the Gusties since 2011.

The Knights’ offense immediately went to work with its hurry-up offense and marched 75 yards in 11 plays, capped by a five-yard touchdown pass to tie the game.

“Carleton did a nice job of giving us a look we haven’t seen in four weeks,” Haugen said. “It took us a drive to adjust but I’m proud of our defense for making those changes.”

The Gustavus offense then started its first drive of the game and answered with a methodical 13-play, 65-yard drive. Matt Boyce finished the drive with a five-yard receiving touchdown, which tied the Gustavus all-time receiving touchdowns record of 29 held by Ryan Hoag (1999-2002).

On Carleton’s next possession it put together a nine-play drive, but an Adam Neubarth (Sr., Cologne, Minn.) sack for a loss of eight yards halted the drive on third down.

The Gusties took little time to increase their lead as Mitch Hendricks (Sr., Laporte, Minn.) connected with Gabe Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) for an 11-yard gain on first down and then found Matt Boyce for a 68-yard pass-and-catch touchdown to give the Black and Gold a two-possession advantage. The long receiving touchdown for Matt Boyce gave him sole possession of the Gustavus all-time receiving touchdowns record with 30.

After the first 15 minutes of play, the Gusties led 21-7.

Carleton responded with an eight-play drive, but was again stalled and forced to punt. Starting at their own 42-yard line, the Gusties put together a 12-play drive and finished it off with a four-yard touchdown pass to Gabe Boyce.

The Gustavus defense was stout once again, forcing the Knights to end their next drive after six plays. Carleton went for it on fourth down, but the pass went incomplete for the turnover on downs.

The Gusties started their next possession at the Carleton 45-yard line and found the end zone on the fifth play of the drive as DaiVon Poole (So., San Angelo, Texas) ran 26 yards for a touchdown with 1:09 remaining in the half.

With all three of their timeouts, the Knights were able to cut into the deficit by scoring on a 10-yard

touchdown pass on their eighth play of the drive. Gustavus then went into halftime with a 35-14 lead.

The Black and Gold started the third quarter with the ball at its own 30 yard-line. The ensuing drive featured four first downs and was capped by a nine-yard touchdown pass to Gabe Boyce.

Carleton started its next drive on its own 30-yard line and on the fourth play of the drive Neubarth recovered a fumble, giving the Gusties the ball back in Knight territory. It took only six plays for the Gusties to score as Karim Ortiz (So., Cancun, Mexico) found the end zone on a four-yard carry.

The Gustie defense forced a three-and-out on the following drive and on the Carleton punt, Gabe Boyce recorded a 57-yard return all the way down to the Knights’ 10-yard line. Poole answered the bell with two carries, scoring on the second for a five-yard touchdown.

For the second time in a row, the Gustavus defense forced a three-and-out and this time the Carleton punt was partially blocked by Buchner, limiting the kick to 20 yards down field. Leading by 42 points, the second team offense entered the game and took its first possession 45 yards in eight plays, ending on a two-yard touchdown run by Matt Berkner (Fy., Sleepy Eye, Minn.) – his first career score. After the Brendan Boche (So., Lakeville, Minn.) extra point, the Gusties led 63-14, which remained for a final score.

Ortiz and Poole led the ground game with 57 and 56 yards, respectively. Ortiz had 10 carries and touchdown, while Poole added eight carries and two scores.

Hendricks completed 20-of-29 passes for 270 yards and four touchdowns. Matt and Gabe Boyce tallied eight catches apiece to lead the receiving corps. Matt posted a game-high 161 yards and two touchdowns, while Gabe had 64 yards and two scores as well. Gabe also added two punt returns for 71 yards.

Anders Raarup (So., Eagan, Minn.) and Kysten Zierke (So., Blue Earth, Minn.) led the defense with seven tackles each. Raarup also contributed two tackles for a loss of 11 yards.

“I think the level of consistency we’ve shown is important,” Haugen said. “I’m happy to see that we are functioning well in all three phases.”

The Gusties continue MIAC play at 1 p.m., Oct. 10 as they host St. Olaf College (1-4 overall, 0-3 MIAC) who lost 54-0 at St. Thomas today.

## GAME 6 - OCT. 10

**ST. OLAF 34**  
**GUSTAVUS 58**

**ST. PETER, Minn.** – The No. 23-ranked Gustavus football team cruised to a 58-34 win over St. Olaf College on Saturday afternoon and in the process quarterback Mitch Hendricks (Sr., Laporte, Minn.) became the program's all-time leader in passing touchdowns. Hendricks threw five touchdowns on the day to increase his career total to 67, passing the previous record of 65 set by Jordan Stolp (2004-07).

"Mitch has meant so much to this program ever since he came here as a transfer," Head Coach Peter Haugen said. "He got acclimated and gained the trust of our players early on. He is an intense competitor, works really hard and has taken the role as a leader very seriously. We are excited for him and this accomplishment reflects well on the guys that work around him – from the scout team to the offense and the coaches, it's a great achievement."

Not to be overshadowed by Hendricks' career day, Jake Douglas (Sr., Montevideo, Minn.) had the best performance by a Gustavus tight end dating back more than 35 years. Douglas led the Gusties in receiving with 172 yards on nine catches and three touchdowns – proving to be the highest marks by a Gustie tight end in decades.

"It was a big day for the tight ends and especially Jake," Haugen said. "I think St. Olaf was keyed in on our receivers so that opened it up and we were able to get our tight ends loose."

With the win, the Gusties improve to 6-0 overall and 4-0 in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, while the Oles drop to 1-5 overall and 0-4 in the MIAC. The Gusties accumulated 575 total yards of offense and the Oles tallied 382 total yards.

For the first time this season, the Gusties played with a deficit as St. Olaf scored on its first possession of the game. The Oles drove 75 yards in 10 plays and finished the drive on a four-yard touchdown rush to take an early lead. Gustavus responded with its own scoring drive, going 65 yards in seven plays. DaiVon Poole (So., San Angelo, Texas) capped the drive with a four-yard touchdown run.

On the ensuing possession, the Gustie defense forced a three-and-out, giving the ball back to the Black and Gold at its own 41-yard line after the punt. The offense couldn't capitalize, though, as a fumble gave the ball back to the Oles at the their own 22-yard line. The Oles took advantage of the turnover and drove the field in seven plays, finishing with a 26-yard touchdown run to take a 14-7 lead after the extra point.

"At the beginning of the game it was something we haven't seen all year," Haugen said. "They had two running backs in the game and one of them was out for several weeks, and he was their premier running back from last year. He got a start again today after not being in the lineup now for a while, so they put their two top running backs in there and gave us some zone and option reads, and that gave us a tough time, but we managed through that and the defense tightened up."

Once again, Gustavus answered with a scoring drive, this time going 43 yards in eight plays. The Gusties started with good field position after a 24-yard return by Drew Fredericksen (So., Forsyth, Ill.) followed by a 15-yard unsportsmanlike penalty on the Oles. Karim Ortiz (So., Cancun, Mexico) scored the Gusties' second rushing touchdown on a one-yard carry to tie the game after the Brendan Boche (So., Lakeville, Minn.) extra point and the score read 14-14 after the first quarter.

The second quarter was all Gustavus as it scored 23 points and surrendered zero. The Gusties took their first lead of the game at the 10:48 mark of the second quarter. Hunter Johnson (So., Cannon Falls, Minn.) capped a nine-play, 66-yard drive with a four-yard touchdown catch.

The Gustavus defense then forced a three-and-out and the special teams came up with its play of the game. The snap of the punt got past the St. Olaf punter as he then had to dive on the ball in the end zone with the Gusties closing in. The special teams forced a safety to take a 23-14 advantage. Gustavus then started the following drive at midfield and found the end zone after five plays. A 32-yard strike from Hendricks to Matt Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) got the Gusties down to the St. Olaf 11-yard line, and two plays later, Hendricks connected with Douglas for an 11-yard touchdown.

St. Olaf registered a pair of first downs on its next possession, but the Gustie defense once again forced the Oles to punt. The Ole punt was pinned perfectly down at the one-yard line, giving the Gusties 99 yards of field to work with. The Gustie offense is no stranger to starting at its own one-yard line as it has done so three times already this season. And on this particular drive, the offense didn't disappoint as it recorded six first downs on a 14-play, 99-yard drive, capped by a seven-yard touchdown reception by Poole. After the extra point, Gustavus led 37-14 and took a 23-point lead into halftime.

The Gusties started with the ball in the second half and picked up right where they left off by driving 63 yards in nine plays. Poole recorded his third score of the game on a six-yard rush. The Gustavus defense then held its ground once again, forcing a St. Olaf punt after six plays. It didn't take long for the Gusties to increase their lead as on the third play of the drive, Hendricks found Douglas wide open down the seam for a 54-yard touchdown pass, which marked his 66th career passing touchdown to break the Gustavus all-time record.

After going nearly 27 minutes without registering any points, St. Olaf found its way back to the end zone after an eight-play, 61-yard drive, finished on a 13-yard touchdown pass. But as was the case after the previous two touchdowns by the Oles, the Gusties were able to answer with a touchdown drive of their own. On the ninth play of the drive, Hendricks found Douglas open in the front right corner for his fifth passing touchdown of the game. Hendricks now has two games this season with five passing touchdowns and four games of five scores in his career.

St. Olaf scored 14 unanswered points to close out the game, but it was too little, too late as the Gusties claimed the decisive 24-point victory.

Hendricks finished the game going 23-of-35 for 383 yards and five touchdowns. Poole led the ground game with 19 carries for 111 yards and two touchdowns. He also added four catches for 36 yards and a score. Ortiz reached double figure carries as well, as he ran 12 times or 33 yards and a touchdown. Kyle Krzmarzick (Sr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.) led the defense with 10 tackles, including one for a loss and a sack. The Gusties tallied four sacks on the day.

Gustavus has one more week before its bye and the upcoming competition is a formidable foe. The Gusties travel to Collegeville, Minn. next Saturday to take on Saint John's (4-1, 2-1 MIAC) who had a bye today.

"I think this wasn't our best week of practice to be honest with you," Haugen said. "So we'll have to be sharper this week and I know our guys will do that, but every week is important. We'll prepare the same way, but we'll need to be sharper in practice."

**COLLEGEVILLE, Minn.** – The No. 20-ranked Gustavus football team suffered its first loss of the season Saturday, falling 49-27 to No. 14/15-ranked Saint John's. The Gusties drop to 6-1 overall and 4-1 in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, while the Johnnies improve to 5-1 overall and 3-1 in the MIAC.

The Gustie offense was held to its lowest marks all season as it accumulated 309 total yards of offense (245 passing, 64 rushing), while the Johnnies amassed 489 total yards of offense (215 passing, 274 rushing). The SJU rushing attack proved to be the difference as it won the time of possession battle 34:03-to-25:57 and its All-American running back Sam Sura rushed 33 times for 201 yards and four touchdowns.

Gustavus held a 14-7 lead early in the second quarter, but the momentum shifted in Saint John's favor and the Johnnies were able to hold off the Gusties the rest of the way.

"They made a couple key third down conversions and we didn't," Head Coach Peter Haugen said. "That was the tough part right there. We had some opportunities but [Saint John's] was doing some good stuff and we just couldn't match them today."

The game started out as a defensive battle as the Gusties went three-and-out on their first drive, the Johnnies then punted on the fifth play of their first drive, followed by another three-and-out by the Gusties on their second possession.

The Gustie defense made a key play on the first play of the Johnnies' next drive as Iker Ortiz (Sr., Cancun, Mexico) recovered a fumble, giving the Gusties the ball at the SJU 35-yard line.

On the ensuing Gustavus possession, Mitch Hendricks (Sr., Laporte, Minn.) connected with Matt Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) for 16 yards and a crucial third-down conversion. Six plays later, Leeland Lauti (So., Ewa, Hawaii) finished off a tough one-yard run for the game's first touchdown with :39 seconds left in the first quarter.

Saint John's then started at its own 29-yard line and capped a 10-play drive with a seven-yard touchdown run. The Gusties went seven plays on their next drive, but were stalled and forced to punt.

The Johnnies got one first down on the following possession, but were forced to punt on the second set of downs. On the punt, the snap went past the punter, which was recovered by Sergio De Pablo Velez (Sr., Cancun, Mexico) at the Johnnie 11-yard line and returned to the one-yard line. On the second play of the drive, Hendricks connected with Matt Boyce for a touchdown to take a 14-7 lead after the Brendan Boche (So., Lakeville, Minn.) extra point.

With 9:14 left in the second quarter, the Johnnies started their next drive and began to shift the momentum in their favor. SJU capped a nine-play drive with a 35-yard touchdown pass to tie the score 14-14. On the ensuing possession, the Gusties were forced to punt after a three-and-out, giving the ball back to the Johnnies at their own 32-yard line. On the seventh play of the drive, Saint John's took its first lead of the game on a two-yard touchdown rush.

George Buchner (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) gave the Gusties great field position with a 45-yard kickoff return down to the Gustavus 46, but the offense needed to work quickly with just :30 seconds left in the half. With :24 seconds left in the clock, Hendricks' pass was intercepted at the goal line and the Johnnies held a 21-14 advantage at halftime.

Saint John's started the third quarter with a pair of touchdowns on its first two drives of the half to take a comfortable 35-14 lead with 5:51 remaining in the quarter. The Gusties responded on their next drive with a seven-play drive, capped by a one-yard touchdown fade pass from Hendricks to Gabe Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) in the back left corner of the end zone. After three quarters, Saint John's led 35-21.

It didn't take long for the Johnnies to increase their lead as they scored on the first play of the fourth quarter on a 34-yard touchdown run. Gustavus drove the ball from its own 22-yard line all the way down to the SJU 13, but on the 14th play of the drive the Gusties were unable to convert on a fourth down attempt and turned the ball over on downs.

The Gustie defense then forced a three-and-out, but the punt was muffed and the Johnnies regained possession at the Gustavus 24-yard line. Two plays later, the Johnnies found the end zone on a 22-yard touchdown pass.

Gustavus would not go quietly, though, and answered with a nine-play, 65-yard drive capped by a 17-yard touchdown pass from Hendricks to Gabe Boyce. The extra point failed and the score read 49-27, which remained as the final.

Hendricks finished the day going 26-of-40 with 224 yards, three touchdowns and one interception. Matt Boyce was the top target, hauling in 11 catches for 121 yards and a touchdown. Tyler Jakes (Sr., North Mankato, Minn.) led the defense with a career-high 15 tackles (five solo).

"The message to the team was to stay positive. It's not an option," Haugen said. "It's a long season, but I know our guys will come back really well. It was a frustrating day for all of us, but the biggest message is to stay positive and just continue to work hard."

The Gusties head into their bye week and return to action Oct. 31 at Bethel University (4-2, 3-1 MIAC), who was idle today.

ARDEN HILLS, Minn. - Holding a 24-20 lead late in the fourth quarter Saturday, the Gustavus football team was not able to maintain the advantage as it allowed a pair of touchdowns in the final four minutes to lose 33-24 at Bethel University. The Gusties drop their second straight road test and now own a 6-2 overall record and 4-2 mark in the MIAC.

Gustavus couldn't contain the Royals ground attack as it allowed 413 rushing yards and five scores, highlighted by 230 yards from Marshall Klitzke. The Gusties recorded 396 yards of total offense, compared to 523 by the Royals.

The Gusties got off to a quick start by scoring on their first three offensive possessions. After allowing a 12-play, 77-yard touchdown drive, the Gusties answered with an eight-play, 59-yard drive - highlighted by a 45-yard pass and catch from Mitch Hendricks (Sr., Laporte, Minn.) to Gabe Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) - but were stalled at the Bethel eight-yard line. Brendan Boche (So., Lakeville, Minn.) then came in and connected for a 25-yard field goal.

Bethel put together a nine-play drive, but only made it 28 yards and turned the ball over on a fourth down attempt. Gustavus took over at its own 30 and on the first play of the possession, Hendricks found Matt Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) for a 70-yard touchdown strike to take a 10-7 lead after the extra point.

It didn't take long for the Royals to regain the lead as they scored on the following drive after just four plays. BU went 75 yards in 1:09, capped by a 28-yard rushing touchdown. Starting at its own 10-yard line, Gustavus pieced together its longest scoring drive of the day. The Gusties gained five first downs during a 14-play drive that lasted 5:52 and ended on a four-yard pass from Hendricks to Matt Boyce to take a 17-14 lead after the extra point.

The next two possessions for each offense ended on failed fourth down attempts. Bethel then had the ball in Gustavus territory, but Nick Frandsen (Sr., North Oaks, Minn.) intercepted a pass at the Gustie 41-yard line to end the second quarter. At halftime, the Gusties led 17-14.

Gustavus started with the ball in the third quarter, but was stalled after six plays as Hendricks pooched a quick quarterback punt down to the Bethel 17-yard line. The Royals followed with seven straight rushing plays to drive the field for a touchdown, taking a 20-17 lead. The Gusties responded, though, with a 13-play drive that included five first downs. Hendricks finished off the drive with a four-yard touchdown run and

after the extra point the Gusties led 24-20, which would be the score after three quarters of play.

Bethel's next drive ended on a failed fourth down attempt from the Gustavus 22-yard line, giving the Gusties the ball back with all the momentum. But five plays later, the momentum swung right back into the hands of the Royals as Hendricks was intercepted at the Bethel 40-yard line. The Royals then took advantage of the turnover by driving 60 yards in 15 plays (12 rushing), capped by a five-yard touchdown run. Bethel took a 26-24 lead with 3:41 left in the game and never let go of the advantage.

Gustavus was stopped after just four plays on its next drive, giving the Royals the ball at the Gustie 41-yard line. Four plays later, the Royals took a two-possession lead on a 32-yard rushing score with 1:55 on the clock. The Gusties made it near midfield on the ensuring possession, but on the seventh play of the drive they were stopped on a fourth down attempt to end the game.

Hendricks finished the day going 20-for-39 with 285 yards, two touchdowns and an interception. Hendricks also had the most rushing yards for the Gusties with 58 yards on 12 carries. Matt Boyce was the top target through the air with seven catches for 118 yards and two scores. Kysten Zierke (So., Blue Earth, Minn.) led the defense with a team-high 12 tackles.

Gustavus returns home next Saturday for a 1 p.m. matchup against Concordia College (7-2, 5-2 MIAC), who lost 38-14 to St. Thomas today.
