SETTING THE SCENE

The Gustavus Adolphus College women's basketball team takes on MIAC foe St. Olaf College on Wednesday, Feb. 10 at Gus Young Court, with tipoff set for 7 p.m. The Gusties enter the game with a 15-6 overall record and 10-4 mark in the conference, while the Oles come into the game at 12-9 overall and 7-7 in the MIAC.

LAST TIME OUT

The Gusties most recently earned a 75-72 overtime victory over Concordia College on Saturday in Moorhead. In a game that saw Gustavus down double digits in both the second and third quarters, the Gusties fought back in the fourth and cut the Cobber lead to 45-44 less than a minute in. From that point, it was Mikayla Miller time, as the second-year guard scored 11 of Gustavus's 19 points to close the half, including three from long range. The Gusties took their first lead of the game at 63-61 with 51 seconds to play on one of those Miller treys, but an Olivia Johnson jumper with 27 seconds remaining tied the game at 63-63, sending the game to overtime. In the extra period, Gustavus jumped out to an 8-1 run, taking a 71-64 lead with just 2:35 remaining. But the Cobbers would not go quietly, scoring six straight points to bring the Gustie lead to just one with 27 seconds left on the clock. However, key free-throw shooting down the stretch helped Gustavus come out on top and secure the 75-72 win.

St. Olaf is most recently coming off a 62-48 win over cross-town rival Carleton. The Knights jumped out to a 7-2 lead early in the first quarter, but the Oles roared back and took a 10-9 lead with 3:32 to play in the first frame. From that point, St. Olaf never trailed again, and never led by less than 10 in the fourth quarter. Lauren Gutierrez had a team-high 14 points and Betsey Daly 13. First-year post Makenna Ash added 11 points and Woo Bandel seven points, five assists, and four steals.

THE SERIES

Saturday's contest marks the 73rd meeting between the Gusties and Oles in women's basketball. Gustavus holds a 48-24 record against St. Olaf in the overall series, including a series sweep in the 2014-15 season. In the first game between the two teams, Gustavus earned a narrow 64-62 win over the Oles on Jan. 3, 2015 in St. Peter, and a 66-58 win on Feb. 7 in St. Peter.

SCOUTING THE OLES

St. Olaf enters Wednesday's contest at 12-9 overall and 7-7 in the MIAC, putting them in a tie for seventh place in the conference standings, and two games out of the playoff picture behind Bethel and Saint Benedict.

The Oles are led by junior forward Betsy Daly, who leads the team with 12.6 points and 8.6 rebounds per game. First-year post Makenna Ash is right up there with Daly, averaging 9.7 points, 6.7 rebounds per contest, and is third in the MIAC in field goal percentage at 53.8. Just six Oles have played in all 21 of the teams' games and they all average 19.9 minutes per game or more.

St. Olaf has had an up-and-down season to this point, as it won six of its first seven games, but has now lost four of its last six.

OFFENSE VS. DEFENSE

Wednesday's game features a clash between the best statistical defense in the MIAC in St. Olaf, against the third best offense in Gustavus. The Oles only allow an average of 54.9 points per game, while the Gusties average 69.1 points per game, nearly a 15 point difference.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING

The Gusties' 75-72 overtime win over Concordia on Saturday marked the team's first matchup all season where the game wasn't decided by five points or more. In games decided by three or less, Gustavus is now 1-0. In games decided by single figures, the team is 5-3, and games decided by double figures, the Black and Gold are 8-2.

NEW THIS SEASON

In an effort to increase the flow of the game, NCAA women's basketball games will no longer be played in halves, but will consist of four, 10-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime intermission. Any overtime period will be five minutes in length with a one-minute intermission before each. Intermissions between the first and second and third and fourth periods will be 75 seconds.

A STRONG TRADITION

The Gustavus women's basketball team has compiled an all-time record of 661-448 making for a .596 percentage. The Gusties have won two MIAC titles, made five NCAA Tournament appearances, and have qualified for the conference playoffs each year since the initiation of the six-team MIAC Tournament in the 2000-01 season.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

The 2015-16 Gustavus women's basketball team is captained by senior forward Lindsey Johnson (Edina, Minn.) and junior guard Hannah Howard (St. Paul, Minn.).

HOME GROWN TALENT

Of the 18 players on this season's roster, 17 are natives of Minnesota. The lone player from outside the Land of 10,000 Lakes is first-year transfer Olivia Graskewicz, who hails from Hudson, Wis., but played her high school ball in Minnesota at Hill Murray.

SCORERS RETURN, ROOKIES INITIATED

Gustavus returns 86.4 percent of its scoring from players that started at least one game last season. The Gusties also welcome seven first-years to this season's roster.

Laurie Kelly begins her fourth season as head coach of the Gustavus Adolphus College women's basketball team in 2015-16. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a degree in speech communications, came to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she directed the Division I Lumberjacks for nine seasons.

A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after a record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early '90s. In nine years at Northern Arizona, she compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while also directing the team to its first-ever Big Sky Conference tournament title and NCAA tournament bid in the 2005-06 season. During Kelly's tenure, the Lumberjacks advanced to the Big Sky tournament six times with two appearances in the championship game (2006, 2007), and her teams registered two of the three 20-win seasons in the program's history.

In addition to quality on the floor, her squads have also been strong in the classroom, with four players earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors including one Academic All-American. Following the 2012-13 season, the Gustavus women's basketball team achieved a significant milestone when the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) announced its Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll following the year. Making their 15th appearance on the NCAA Division III honor roll, the Gusties were recognized as the team with the top cumulative grade point average in the country at a 3.60 – a first in the program's history. In addition, the Lumberjacks were recognized in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Academic Honor Roll six times, with two Top Ten national rankings.

Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In their first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the Bearcats to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly began her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-1 Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times, and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Kelly is the ninth head coach in the history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. The Gusties have compiled an all-time record of 662-448 (.596), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly serves as the coordinator of the Wellbeing for Employees (WE). The Wellbeing for Employees program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan (13) and Madison (10).
