SETTING THE SCENE

The Gustavus Adolphus College women's basketball team goes for its fifth straight win at 3 p.m. on Saturday when its hosts Carleton College for Senior Day on Gus Young Court. The Gusties enter the contest with an 18-6 overall record and 13-4 mark in the conference, while the Knights come to town at 4-20 overall and 1-16 in the MIAC.

LAST TIME OUT

Gustavus is most recently coming off a narrow 52-51 victory over the College of Saint Benedict this past Wednesday in Saint Joseph. After scoring just 21 points in the entire first half, the Gusties exploded for 20 in the third quarter, going on a 20-7 run to erase a 26-21 Blazer halftime lead and take a 41-33 lead into the final 10 minutes. Saint Benedict battled back though, retaking its lead at 47-46 with 3:25 to play and tied the game at 51-51 with 2:06 to play. However, with 1:51 to play, the Blazers' Grace Wolhowe fouled Stephanie Klockmann (So., Brownton, Minn.) who made 1-of-2 free-throws to seal the win for the Black and Gold, clinching it the No. 3 seed in next week's MIAC Playoffs.

Carleton is coming off a 72-59 loss to Bethel University this past Wednesday in Northfield. Paced by seven early points from Kayla Frank, the Knights raced out to a 19-14 lead and shot 53 percent in the opening period. Bethel started the contest just 6-of-18 from the field, but bounced back by shooting 55 percent over the remainder of the game compared to 29 percent for Carleton over the same span.

The Royals led 32-27 at intermission, but Carleton closed to within 40-37 midway through the third quarter. A 10-0 run for Bethel opened up some breathing room for the visitors who maintained a double-digit lead for much the remaining game time.

2015-16 GUSTAVUS ADOLPHUS WOMEN'S BASKETBALL GAME NOTES

GUSTAVUS VS. CARLETON | FEBRUARY 20, 2016

THE SERIES

Saturday afernoon's contest marks the 72nd meeting between the Gusties and Knights in women's basketball. Gustavus has controlled the all-time series with a record of 49-22 against Carleton, including a 67-32 win over the Knights on Jan. 16 in Northfield.

In that game, Gustavus began the game on a 13-0 run and eventually concluded the first quarter with a 20-4 lead. Carleton managed to come back slightly in the second quarter, but Gustavus brought its lead to 29-10 midway through, went into halftime up 13 at 34-20, and eventually came away with the 35-point victory.

SCOUTING THE KNIGHTS

Carleton enters Saturday's contest at 4-20 overall and 1-16 in the MIAC, good for a tie for 11th in the conference. The Knights have struggled as of late, dropping their last 10 games. However, Carleton has spent a majority of its season without leading scorer and rebounder Anne Hamilton.

The Knights are led by senior guard Michele Arima, who leads the team with 10.9 points and 2.6 assists per contest.

SENIOR DAY

As is tradition on the hill, the final home game of the regular season is designated as Senior Day and a special tribute is made to the individuals who have dedicated themselves to the Gustavus women's basketball program. This year, the athletics department, head coach Laurie Kelly, parents, and fans salute the two student-athletes who have represented the women's basketball team with pride and class. Seniors honored today for their commitment include Lindsey Johnson of Edina, Minn. and Anna Lundquist of Rochester, Minn.

PLAYOFF OPPONENT

With their win over Saint Benedict this past Wednesday, the Gusties clinched the No. 3 seed in the upcoming MIAC Playoffs that begin this Tuesday, guaranteeing they will play the No. 6 seed which has yet to be determined. Augsburg and Saint Benedict are currently tied for that No. 6 spot, and play in today's regular season finale, meaning the winner between the Auggies and Blazers will be Gustavus's first round opponent.

NEW THIS SEASON

In an effort to increase the flow of the game, NCAA women's basketball games will no longer be played in halves, but will consist of four, 10-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime intermission. Any overtime period will be five minutes in length with a one-minute intermission before each. Intermissions between the first and second and third and fourth periods will be 75 seconds.

A STRONG TRADITION

The Gustavus women's basketball team has compiled an all-time record of 665-448 making for a win .596 percentage. The Gusties have won two MIAC titles, made five NCAA Tournament appearances, and have qualified for the conference playoffs each year since the initiation of the six-team MIAC Tournament in the 2000-01 season.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

The 2015-16 Gustavus women's basketball team is captained by senior forward Lindsey Johnson (Edina, Minn.) and junior guard Hannah Howard (St. Paul, Minn.).

HOME GROWN TALENT

Of the 18 players on this season's roster, 17 are natives of Minnesota. The lone player from outside the Land of 10,000 Lakes is first-year transfer Olivia Graskewicz, who hails from Hudson, Wis., but played her high school ball in Minnesota at Hill Murray.

Laurie Kelly begins her fourth season as head coach of the Gustavus Adolphus College women's basketball team in 2015-16. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a degree in speech communications, came to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she directed the Division I Lumberjacks for nine seasons.

A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after a record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early '90s. In nine years at Northern Arizona, she compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while also directing the team to its first-ever Big Sky Conference tournament title and NCAA tournament bid in the 2005-06 season. During Kelly's tenure, the Lumberjacks advanced to the Big Sky tournament six times with two appearances in the championship game (2006, 2007), and her teams registered two of the three 20-win seasons in the program's history.



In addition to quality on the floor, her squads have also been strong in the classroom, with four players earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors including one Academic All-American. Following the 2012-13 season, the Gustavus women's basketball team achieved a significant milestone when the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) announced its Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll following the year. Making their 15th appearance on the NCAA Division III honor roll, the Gusties were recognized as the team with the top cumulative grade point average in the country at a 3.60 – a first in the program's history. In addition, the Lumberjacks were recognized in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Academic Honor Roll six times, with two Top Ten national rankings.

Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In their first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the Bearcats to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly began her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-1 Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times, and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Kelly is the ninth head coach in the history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. The Gusties have compiled an alltime record of 665-448 (.597), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly serves as the coordinator of the Wellbeing for Employees (WE). The Wellbeing for Employees program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan (13) and Madison (10).
