SETTING THE SCENE

The Gustavus Adolphus College women's basketball team opens MIAC Playoff action on Tuesday, Feb. 23 with a matchup against the College of Saint Benedict at Gus Young Court, with tipoff set for 7 p.m. After going 14-4 in the MIAC during the regular season, Gustavus earned the No. 3 seed and the right to host its first playoff game since the 2011-12 season. Saint Benedict clinched the No. 6 seed after defeating Augsburg this past Saturday to finish 10-8 in the league.

TICKET INFORMATION

For Tuesday's quarterfinal women's basketball game, the rate is \$7 for adult and \$3 for any non-Gustavus student (5 years old and younger are free). All Gustavus students will receive free admission, courtesy of The Hill Crew and the women's basketball program. There is no senior discount. MIAC passes will be honored, however, no other passes are to be accepted.

MIAC PLAYOFF HISTORY

Since the initiation of the six-team MIAC Tournament in the 2000-01 season, the Gusties have qualified for the conference playoffs every year. Gustavus is making its 16th consecutive appearance in the MIAC Playoffs this season, holding a record of 8-15 all-time in that time. No team in the MIAC has earned a trip to the league playoffs in every year except for the Gusties. Gustavus's success in the playoffs has come at home, as the Black and Gold hold an 8-2 record in home playoff games during the course of that 16-year stretch.

GUSTAVUS VS. SAINT BENEDICT | MIAC PLAYOFF QUARTERFINALS | FEBRUARY 20, 2016

THE SERIES

Tuesday evening's contest marks the 71st meeting between the Gusties and Blazers in women's basketball. Saint Benedict holds a 47-23 record against Gustavus in the overall series, however, the teams split their 2015-16 regular season series.

In game one on Jan. 20, Saint Benedict earned a 70-61 overtime win over Gustavus. The lead went back and forth the entire game, but at the half Gustavus led 29-27. The second half involved much of the same, leading to a 55-55 score at the end of regulation. Saint Benedict pulled through in overtime though, going on a 15-6 run to earn the nine-point victory over the Gusties.

In the teams' second game on Feb. 17, the Gusties earned a narrow 52-51 win in Saint Joseph. After scoring just 21 points in the entire first half, the Gusties exploded for 20 in the third quarter, going on a 20-7 run to erase a 26-21 Blazer halftime lead and take a 41-33 lead into the final 10 minutes. Saint Benedict battled back though, retaking its lead at 47-46 with 3:25 to play and tied the game at 51-51 with 2:06 to play. However, with 1:51 to play, the Blazers' Grace Wolhowe fouled Stephanie Klockmann who made 1-of-2 free-throws to seal the win.

SCOUTING THE BLAZERS

After losing four straight prior to Saturday, Saint Benedict pulled together a win when it needed it most, earning a hard-fought, defensive battle over Augsburg 42-37 on Saturday in Saint Joseph to clinch the No. 6 seed.

The Blazers are led by sophomore post Niki Fokken who leads the team with a 10.1 point per game average and 7.1 rebounds. Alison Newton, who didn't play in last Wednesday's game against the Gusties, is next, averaging 8.7 points per game, and dishes out a team-high 2.5 assists.

ON THE GLASS

Entering Tuesday's contest, the Gusties have to feel confident in their ability to win the battle on the glass after controlling the boards in the season's previous two meetings with Saint Benedict. Gustavus outrebounded the Blazers 39-35 in the first matchup and 38-34 in the second. The Gusties boast the league's second-ranked rebounds per game average, hauling in 40.5 per contest. In games where the Gusties outrebound their opponents, the team is 15-5.

BY THE NUMBERS

4 - Where Mikayla Miller's league scoring average of 15.3 points per game ranked following the conclusion of MIAC play. The league's fourth-ranked scorer shot 44.9-percent from the field, averaged 5.2 rebounds, and ranked second in steals with 2.7 per game. Miller scored 16 and 12 points, respectively, in games against the Blazers this season.

55 - Number of points that Saint Benedict allows per game, good for first in the MIAC ranks following the regular season. The Blazers held the Gusties to 61 and 52 points in their previous matchups this season, well below Gustavus's average of 69.1 points per game.

NEW THIS SEASON

In an effort to increase the flow of the game, NCAA women's basketball games will no longer be played in halves, but will consist of four, 10-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime intermission. Any overtime period will be five minutes in length with a one-minute intermission before each. Intermissions between the first and second and third and fourth periods will be 75 seconds.

A STRONG TRADITION

The Gustavus women's basketball team has compiled an all-time record of 666-448 making for a win .597 percentage. The Gusties have won two MIAC titles, made five NCAA Tournament appearances, and have qualified for the conference playoffs each year since the initiation of the six-team MIAC Tournament in the 2000-01 season.

Laurie Kelly begins her fourth season as head coach of the Gustavus Adolphus College women's basketball team in 2015-16. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a degree in speech communications, came to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she directed the Division I Lumberjacks for nine seasons.

A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after a record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early '90s. In nine years at Northern Arizona, she compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while also directing the team to its first-ever Big Sky Conference tournament title and NCAA tournament bid in the 2005-06 season. During Kelly's tenure, the Lumberjacks advanced to the Big Sky tournament six times with two appearances in the championship game (2006, 2007), and her teams registered two of the three 20-win seasons in the program's history.



In addition to quality on the floor, her squads have also been strong in the classroom, with four players earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors including one Academic All-American. Following the 2012-13 season, the Gustavus women's basketball team achieved a significant milestone when the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) announced its Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll following the year. Making their 15th appearance on the NCAA Division III honor roll, the Gusties were recognized as the team with the top cumulative grade point average in the country at a 3.60 – a first in the program's history. In addition, the Lumberjacks were recognized in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Academic Honor Roll six times, with two Top Ten national rankings.

Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In their first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the Bearcats to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly began her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-1 Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times, and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Kelly is the ninth head coach in the history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. The Gusties have compiled an all-time record of 666-448 (.597), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly serves as the coordinator of the Wellbeing for Employees (WE). The Wellbeing for Employees program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan (13) and Madison (10).
