SETTING THE SCENE

After earning its first playoff win since 2012 on Tuesday evening, the Gustavus Adolphus College women's basketball continues its postseason run with an MIAC Playoff Semifinal matchup against Saint Mary's University on Thursday evening in Winona, Minn. The game will be the second in three days for the Gusties after their quarterfinal win against the College of Saint Benedict on Tuesday. Meanwhile, Saint Mary's has been off from competition since Saturday, as it earned a first-round bye thanks to its No. 2 seed in the conference playoffs.

MIAC PLAYOFF HISTORY

Since the initiation of the six-team MIAC Tournament in the 2000-01 season, the Gusties have qualified for the conference playoffs every year. Gustavus is making its 16th consecutive appearance in the MIAC Playoffs this season, holding a record of 9-15 all-time during that span. No team in the MIAC has earned a trip to the league playoffs in every year except for the Gusties. Gustavus has had its share of struggles on the road in the conference playoffs, heading into Thursday's game with an 0-13 record away from Gus Young Court.

LAST TIME OUT

Playing in its first home playoff game since the 2011-12 season, Gusatvus put on a show for its home crowd, earning the largest margin of victory in program history by taking control from the start and eventually finishing with a 25-point, 65-40 victory Saint Benedict on Tuesday in St. Peter. The Gusties ran to a 24-8 lead after the first quarter and never looked back. Overall, Gustavus shot 47.5 percent from the floor and held Saint Benedict to 28.5 percent shooting. The Gusties were outrebounded (39-32) for just the sixth time this season, but made up for it with 19 steals and by forcing 26 Blazer turnovers, which led to 36 points off turnovers and 14 fastbreak points.

THE SERIES

Thursday's game will be the 75th meeting between Gustavus and Saint Mary's in women's basketball. The Gusties hold the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 51-23, but Saint Mary's earned a, 82-74 victory in the two teams' lone regular season contest on Dec. 2, 2015

The Gusties and Cardinals have met twice in the MIAC Playoffs leading up to Thursday night's game, with Saint Mary's winning both and ending the Gusties' season in each as well. In the first game back on Feb. 19, 2013, Gustavus jumped out to a 45-39 halftime lead, but the Cardinals came storming back in the second half, outscoring Gustavus 40-24 on their way to the 76-69 win.

In the second game on Feb. 24, 2015, the Cardinals jumped out to a 48-30 halftime lead and didn't look back from there, shooting over 60 percent from the field in both the first and second halves to take the 90-58 win.

SCOUTING THE CARDINALS

The Cardinals finished second in the regular season MIAC standings with a record of 14-4, same as Gustavus, but earned the tiebreaker because of their regular season win over the Gusties. Saint Mary's is most recently coming off an 89-65 loss to No. 8 University of St. Thomas this past Saturday, but before that had won five of its last six games.

First-year forward Brandi Blattner leads the team and averages a double-double with 16.6 and 10.4 rebounds per contest during the regular season. Blattner did miss five games due to an appendectomy late in the season, but made her return to competition against the Tommies on Saturday and made her impact felt, by leading the team in scoring with 15 points and seven rebounds. Senior guard Micaela Meredith is next, averaging 14.2 points and 4.6 rebounds per game. Bridget Pethke serves as the team's distributor, averaging 5.8 assists per contest.

OFFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS?

There is an age-old saying that state, "defense wins championships." However, in this year's MIAC Playoff field, it would seem efficient offense is a common theme among the remaining squads in St. Thomas, Saint Mary's, Concordia, and Gustavus. The Tommies, Cardinals, and Gusties hold down three of the top-four spots in the conference in points per game average and St. Thomas, Concordia, and Gustavus hold down three of the top four spots in field goal percentage.

ON THE ROAD

While playing away from home might serve as a discomfort for many teams, that does not seem to be the case for Gustavus so far this season. In games played away from Gus Young Court, the Gusties are 9-2 compared to an 11-2 home record. However, one of those two road losses did come at SMU Gym back on Dec. 2.

NEW THIS SEASON

In an effort to increase the flow of the game, NCAA women's basketball games will no longer be played in halves, but will consist of four, 10-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime intermission. Any overtime period will be five minutes in length with a one-minute intermission before each. Intermissions between the first and second and third and fourth periods will be 75 seconds.

A STRONG TRADITION

The Gustavus women's basketball team has compiled an all-time record of 667-448 making for a win .597 percentage. The Gusties have won two MIAC titles, made five NCAA Tournament appearances, and have qualified for the conference playoffs each year since the initiation of the six-team MIAC Tournament in the 2000-01 season.

Laurie Kelly begins her fourth season as head coach of the Gustavus Adolphus College women's basketball team in 2015-16. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a degree in speech communications, came to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she directed the Division I Lumberjacks for nine seasons.

A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after a record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early '90s. In nine years at Northern Arizona, she compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while also directing the team to its first-ever Big Sky Conference tournament title and NCAA tournament bid in the 2005-06 season. During Kelly's tenure, the Lumberjacks advanced to the Big Sky tournament six times with two appearances in the championship game (2006, 2007), and her teams registered two of the three 20-win seasons in the program's history.



In addition to quality on the floor, her squads have also been strong in the classroom, with four players earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors including one Academic All-American. Following the 2012-13 season, the Gustavus women's basketball team achieved a significant milestone when the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) announced its Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll following the year. Making their 15th appearance on the NCAA Division III honor roll, the Gusties were recognized as the team with the top cumulative grade point average in the country at a 3.60 - a first in the program's history. In addition, the Lumberjacks were recognized in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Academic Honor Roll six times, with two Top Ten national rankings.

Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In their first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the Bearcats to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly began her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-1 Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times, and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Kelly is the ninth head coach in the history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. The Gusties have compiled an all-time record of 667-448 (.597), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly serves as the coordinator of the Wellbeing for Employees (WE). The Wellbeing for Employees program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan (13) and Madison (10).
