### SETTING THE SCENE

The Gustavus Adolphus College women's basketball team takes on No. 12 University of St. Thomas on Wednesday, Feb. 3 at Gus Young Court, with tipoff set for 7 p.m. The Gusties enter the game with a 14-5 overall record and 9-3 mark in the conference, while the Tommies are 16-3 overall and 10-2 in MIAC.

### LAST TIME OUT

The Gusties most recently earned an 86-49 victory over Macalester College on Saturday in St. Peter, Minn. Gustavus took control early, as it ran to a 12-0 advantage just 4:03 into the contest. The Gusties continued to build their lead and jumped ahead 26-10 going into the first intermission, with seven different team members scoring in the first 10 minutes. The Black and Gold took its first 20 point lead 3:34 into the second quarter and eventually went into halftime up 24 at 46-22. The Gusties came out of the break with just as much fire as they did in the first half, and momentum stuck with the home team throughout the second. Less than five minutes into the third quarter, Gustavus took its first 30 point lead at 55-24 and brought that advantage to 40 with 5:24 remaining in the contest. When the final horn sounded, the Gusties were up 37 at 86-39 and had played every one of their 18 players on the roster.

St. Thomas is most recently coming off a 72-67 home win over St. Catherine University on Saturday in St. Paul, Minn. The Tommies shot 52 percent in the second half (13-of-25) and used a 48-28 rebounding advantage to help offset 18 turnovers. St. Catherine took a 65-60 lead with 3:11 remaining in the contest on LaShay Holt's three-point basket. However, St. Thomas' Lauren Fischer hit a trey and post Kaitlin Langer put in two inside baskets to put the Tommies ahead for good at 67-65. Paige Gernes (3-of-4) and Langer (2-of-2) helped ice the game at the foul line in the final 25 seconds, and St. Thomas' defense stopped the Wildcats on five of their last six possessions to seal the victory.

### THE SERIES

Wednesday's contest marks the 78th meeting between the Gusties and Tommies in women's basketball. St. Thomas holds a 54-23 record against Gustavus in the overall series, including a 67-45 victory over the Gusties earlier this season on Jan. 6, 2015 in St. Paul, Minn. In that game, Gustavus led 29-25 at the half, but St. Thomas outscored the Gusties 42-16 in the second to take the 22-point win.

### SCOUTING THE TOMMIES

St. Thomas enters Wednesday's contest ranked No. 12 in the nation by d3hoops.com and is 16-3 overall and 10-2 in the MIAC, putting them in a tie for first place in the conference standings. The Tommies are led by junior center Kaitlin Langer, who leads the team with 16.2 points and 8.4 rebounds per game. Senior guard Katie Stone is right up there with Langer, averaging 11.4 points per contest.

The Gusties and Tommies enter Wednesday's game after experiencing a fair amount of success since their last meeting on Jan. 6. Both teams are 6-1 during that stretch, with the Tommies' lone loss being an 80-60 defeat to Bethel on Jan. 9, while the Gusties suffered a 70-61 overtime loss to Saint Benedict on Jan. 20.

### RESTING UP

Gustie Coach Laurie Kelly is aware of the toll the long winter season can take on student-athletes and has used the team's recent success as an opportunity to utilize the team's depth and keep all players well-rested. The Gusties are the only team in the MIAC to not have a player in the top-25 in minutes played. Mikayla Miller leads the Gusties in minutes per game at 26.9 and is ranked 32nd in the league in minutes per contest.

### OFFENSIVE POWERHOUSES

Wednesday's matchup features two of the top offensive teams in the conference in Gustavus and St. Thomas. The Tommies hold the slight edge in almost every major shooting category in the MIAC, including being ranked first in field goal percentage, three-point percentage, and free-throw percentage. However, Gustavus is the slight leader in rebounds and steals per game, and is tied with St. Thomas in assists per game at 13.7.

### NEW THIS SEASON

In an effort to increase the flow of the game, NCAA women's basketball games will no longer be played in halves, but will consist of four, 10-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime intermission. Any overtime period will be five minutes in length with a one-minute intermission before each. Intermissions between the first and second and third and fourth periods will be 75 seconds.

### A STRONG TRADITION

The Gustavus women's basketball team has compiled an all-time record of 661-447 making for a win .596 percentage. The Gusties have won two MIAC titles, made five NCAA Tournament appearances, and have qualified for the conference playoffs each year since the initiation of the six-team MIAC Tournament in the 2000-01 season.

### OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

The 2015-16 Gustavus women's basketball team is captained by senior forward Lindsey Johnson (Edina, Minn.) and junior guard Hannah Howard (St. Paul, Minn.).

### HOME GROWN TALENT

Of the 18 players on this season's roster, 17 are natives of Minnesota. The lone player from outside the Land of 10,000 Lakes is first-year transfer Olivia Graskewicz, who hails from Hudson, Wis., but played her high school ball in Minnesota at Hill Murray.

### SCORERS RETURN, ROOKIES INITIATED

Gustavus returns 86.4 percent of its scoring from players that started at least one game last season. The Gusties also welcome seven first-years to this season's roster.

Laurie Kelly begins her fourth season as head coach of the Gustavus Adolphus College women's basketball team in 2015-16. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a degree in speech communications, came to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she directed the Division I Lumberjacks for nine seasons.

A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after a record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early '90s. In nine years at Northern Arizona, she compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while also directing the team to its first-ever Big Sky Conference tournament title and NCAA tournament bid in the 2005-06 season. During Kelly's tenure, the Lumberjacks advanced to the Big Sky tournament six times with two appearances in the championship game (2006, 2007), and her teams registered two of the three 20-win seasons in the program's history.

In addition to quality on the floor, her squads have also been strong in the classroom, with four players earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors including one Academic All-American. Following the 2012-13 season, the Gustavus women's basketball team achieved a significant milestone when the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) announced its Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll following the year. Making their 15th appearance on the NCAA Division III honor roll, the Gusties were recognized as the team with the top cumulative grade point average in the country at a 3.60 - a first in the program's history. In addition, the Lumberjacks were recognized in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Academic Honor Roll six times, with two Top Ten national rankings.

Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In their first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the Bearcats to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly began her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-1 Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times, and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Kelly is the ninth head coach in the history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. The Gusties have compiled an all-time record of 661-447 (.596), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly serves as the coordinator of the Wellbeing for Employees (WE). The Wellbeing for Employees program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan (13) and Madison (10).
