SETTING THE SCENE

The Gustavus Adolphus College women's basketball team takes on MIAC foe Concordia College on Saturday, Feb. 6 at Memorial Auditorium, with tipoff set for 3 p.m. The Gusties enter the game with a 14-6 overall record and 9-4 mark in the conference, while the Cobbers are also 14-6 overall but hold a one game lead over the Gusties in the conference standings with an MIAC mark of 10-3.

LAST TIME OUT

The Gusties most recently suffered a 75-67 defeat to the University of St. Thomas this past Wednesday in St. Peter. The No. 11 Tommies held the lead for the entirety of the game, but the Gusties fought hard to bring their 12-point deficit to one in the final quarter. However, a 14-7 Tommie run in the final 3:25 along with key free-throw shooting widened their advantage to 13 points with 16 seconds to play, and the Gusties eventually suffered the eight-point defeat. After being down 10 at halftime, the Gusties made a comeback in the third quarter, going on a 6-0 run from the 8:18 to 6:53 mark, which narrowed their deficit to three (45-42). Gustavus continued to build on that momentum and cut the Tommie lead to two at the 7:16 mark and went into the final quarter trailing St. Thomas by just four (55-51). Gustavus started the fourth quarter strong as well, with three free-throws from Kelsey Carpenter bringing the score to 57-56 at the 8:17 mark and continued to trail the Tommies by just one until the 4:31 mark. However, a 14-7 Tommie run in the final 3:25 gave St. Thomas the eight-point win.

Concordia is most recently coming off a 61-41 road win over Carleton College on Wednesday in Northfield. The Cobbers trailed Carleton 16-15 after the first quarter, but Concordia scored 10 of the first 11 points of the second period and ended the quarter on a 13-0 run. The two streaks combined to cover all but 1:18 of the 10-minute period and the win is the sixth straight for Concordia, the longest winning streak since 2013-14 when the Cobbers finished second in the final league standings with a 19-3 mark.

THE SERIES

Saturday's contest marks the 75th meeting between the Gusties and Cobbers in women's basketball. Concordia holds a 20-54 record against Gustavus in the overall series, including a series split in the 2014-15 season. In the first game between the two teams, Gustavus earned a 64-57 win over the Cobbers on Jan. 14, 2015 in St. Peter, while Concordia took the second game 72-59 victory on Feb. 11 in Moorhead.

SCOUTING THE COBBERS

Concordia enters Saturday's contest at 14-6 overall and 10-3 in the MIAC, putting them in third place in the conference standings, one game ahead of Gustavus. The Cobbers are led by junior forward Jenna Januschka, who leads the team with 15.2 points and is second with 7.9 rebounds per game. Junior guard Greta Walsh is right up there with Januschka, averaging 13.3 points per contest, while senior forward Olivia Johnson is the third Cobber averaging double digit scoring with 11.3 points per game and leads the team in rebounds with 8.4 per contest.

Concordia enters the game with significant momentum, as it currently is on a six-game win streak dating back to Jan. 13, a 61-55 loss to Saint Mary's in Winona

AN EVEN SCALE

On paper, it appears that Saturday's game could be an evenly-matched one. While Gustavus ranks higher in points per game (68.8-62.9), Concordia has held opponents to a lower point total (56.3-62.2). The teams are within 2.3 percent of each other in field goal percentage, three-point percentage, and free-throw percentage, and are also just 0.1 rebounds, 0.9 steals, and 1.1 turnovers apart in per game averages this season.

NEW THIS SEASON

In an effort to increase the flow of the game, NCAA women's basketball games will no longer be played in halves, but will consist of four, 10-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime intermission. Any overtime period will be five minutes in length with a one-minute intermission before each. Intermissions between the first and second and third and fourth periods will be 75 seconds.

A STRONG TRADITION

The Gustavus women's basketball team has compiled an all-time record of 661-448 making for a win .596 percentage. The Gusties have won two MIAC titles, made five NCAA Tournament appearances, and have qualified for the conference playoffs each year since the initiation of the six-team MIAC Tournament in the 2000-01 season.

OH CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

The 2015-16 Gustavus women's basketball team is captained by senior forward Lindsey Johnson (Edina, Minn.) and junior guard Hannah Howard (St. Paul, Minn.).

HOME GROWN TALENT

Of the 18 players on this season's roster, 17 are natives of Minnesota. The lone player from outside the Land of 10,000 Lakes is first-year transfer Olivia Graskewicz, who hails from Hudson, Wis., but played her high school ball in Minnesota at Hill Murray.

SCORERS RETURN, ROOKIES INITIATED

Gustavus returns 86.4 percent of its scoring from players that started at least one game last season. The Gusties also welcome seven first-years to this season's roster.

Laurie Kelly begins her fourth season as head coach of the Gustavus Adolphus College women's basketball team in 2015-16. Kelly, a 1993 graduate of the University of St. Thomas with a degree in speech communications, came to Gustavus from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, where she directed the Division I Lumberjacks for nine seasons.

A Rochester, Minnesota, native, Kelly made a quick ascent through the Division II and I coaching ranks after a record setting Division III playing career at the University of St. Thomas in the early '90s. In nine years at Northern Arizona, she compiled the most wins in the program's history (117), while also directing the team to its first-ever Big Sky Conference tournament title and NCAA tournament bid in the 2005-06 season. During Kelly's tenure, the Lumberjacks advanced to the Big Sky tournament six times with two appearances in the championship game (2006, 2007), and her teams registered two of the three 20-win seasons in the program's history.



In addition to quality on the floor, her squads have also been strong in the classroom, with four players earning CoSIDA Academic All-District honors including one Academic All-American. Following the 2012-13 season, the Gustavus women's basketball team achieved a significant milestone when the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) announced its Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll following the year. Making their 15th appearance on the NCAA Division III honor roll, the Gusties were recognized as the team with the top cumulative grade point average in the country at a 3.60 – a first in the program's history. In addition, the Lumberjacks were recognized in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Top 25 Academic Honor Roll six times, with two Top Ten national rankings.

Prior to her position at Northern Arizona, Kelly coached at Binghamton University in New York and built the Bearcats into one of the top Division II programs in the country before helping the institution transition to a Division I program in 2001-02. In their first year of Division I competition, Kelly directed the Bearcats to a 19-9 record and a second-place finish in the America East Conference. During her five years at Binghamton, Kelly compiled a record of 94-22, including a mark of 75-13 in the program's final three years at the Division II level, and her squads won New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) titles in 1999 and 2000 and Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) titles in 2000 and 2001. She was named ECAC Coach of the Year in 2000 and New York State Coach of the Year in 2002. Kelly began her collegiate coaching career as the graduate assistant coach at Minnesota State University, Mankato from 1996 to 1998. While she was at Minnesota State, Mankato she earned a master's degree in physical education with an emphasis in sports administration.

Before her success in the coaching ranks, Laurie Trow Kelly was a standout player at the University of St. Thomas from 1989 to 1993 and is recognized by many as one of the greatest players in NCAA Division III history. A gifted athlete, the 6-1 Kelly scored 2,607 points and pulled down 1,204 rebounds in four years, earning Kodak All-America honors three consecutive seasons. In her senior season (1992-93), Kelly was voted National Player of the Year by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association after averaging more than 26 points per game. She set 22 conference and 24 school records, was conference MVP three times, and was also named Midwest Sports Channel NCAA Division III Women's Athlete of the Year. In January 2006, Kelly was one of five players selected to the NCAA Division III 25th Anniversary Team.

Kelly is the ninth head coach in the history of the Gustavus women's basketball program. The Gusties have compiled an alltime record of 661-448 (.596), winning two Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships and making five NCAA tournament appearances.

In addition to her coaching duties, Kelly serves as the coordinator of the Wellbeing for Employees (WE). The Wellbeing for Employees program offers employees at Gustavus a variety of educational opportunities, assessment tools, and physical activity experiences so that they can achieve and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

Kelly lives in St. Peter with and her husband, Matt, and their two daughters, Morgan (13) and Madison (10).
