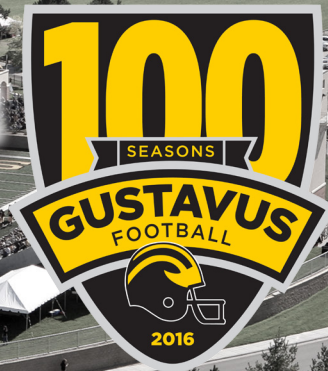

GAME NOTES

GUSTIES TAKE TO GRIDIRON FOR 100TH SEASON...The Gustavus football continues its 100th season today at Lloyd Hollingsworth Field for its home opener. Over the previous 99 years, the Gusties have compiled a record of 486-346-21, including a record of 226-127-8 in St. Peter. With 22 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) championships, Gustavus has claimed the second-most league titles in the 96-year history of the conference. Only Saint John's (32) has claimed more MIAC championships.

FOLLOW THE GUSTIES ON KNUJ... KNUJ AM 860 out of New Ulm, Minnesota once again broadcasts all 10 Gustavus regular season football games. The voice of the Golden Gusties Tom Wheeler handles the play-by-play duties for the 11th consecutive season. Wheeler is once again joined by 1984 Gustavus graduate and former Gustie football player Ken Ericson on the live call of this year's games. Fans can listen to the KNUJ broadcasts on the Internet through the Gustavus Athletics website. Gustavus provides a high definition video stream of all home games for viewing on your computer, tablet, or smart phone through GameCentral by Stretch Internet. CALLING ALL CAPTAINS... Of over 5,000 student-athletes who have played football for Gustavus in the 100-year history of the program, only 198 have earned the privilege to serve as team captain. Peter Haugen's captains this season include seniors Zach Martinez, Jake Schmitz, Joe Theiler, and Tyler Jakes.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP... In what has become a trend of Head Coach Peter Haguen's tenure, the 2016 Gustavus football roster once again features a great deal of senior leadership. This year's senior class features three defensive lineman, four defensive backs, three offensive lineman, three wide receivers, three linebackers, and one running back.

GUSTIE FOOTBALL AROUND THE GLOBE... The 2016 Gustavus football team features a total of 104 players from eight different states and, for the fifth straight year, a second country outside the United States. Of those 104 players, 84 claim Minnesota as their native state. Two players call Kansas home, two from Illinois, two from Hawaii, four from Texas, three from New Mexico, and one player each from Tennessee and Florida represent the Stars and Stripes. Mexico once again makes its presence felt on this year's roster as it is the homeland of five Gusties, four from Cancun and one from Guadalajara.

THE SERIES... Saturday's game is the 75th meeting between the Gustavus and Augsburg football programs. The Gusties lead the all-time series with a record of 56-18. Last season the Gusties defeated the Auggies in a Homecoming shootout, 59-42, marking the most combined points scored in the history of Gustavus football. The Gusties have defeated the Auggies in the last two meetings, scoring over 50 points both times, while Augsburg last beat the Black and Gold in 2013 in Minneapolis.

MEET THE HEAD COACHES... Gustavus Head Coach Peter Haugen is in his eighth season at the helm of the Gustavus football program. Haugen has a combined record of 34-38 after two games into season eight. A graduate of Bethel University, Haugen was the head coach at Washburn High School in Minneapolis prior to coming to Gustavus.

Augsburg Head Coach Frank Haege is in his 12th season leading the Auggies on the gridiron. Haege has a combined record of 47-65 after beginning his Augsburg coaching career 2-18. A 1992 graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Stout, Haege was an assistant coach for the Auggies for three seasons before becoming the head coach in 2005.



NOTES

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF TAKEAWAYS...

The Gusties escaped with a narrow three-point victory last Saturday against UW-River Falls, thanks in large part to turnovers. Gustavus took advantage of a blocked punt and an interception, turning both into touchdowns. The blocked punt return for a touchdown was the first by Gustavus since George Buchner did so against Carleton last season, while the interception return for a touchdown was the first since Nick Frandsen's return against Augsburg last season. Last Saturday against UW-River Falls, the Gusties were outgained 454-270 in total yards of offense, marking the first time Gustavus has won a game after being outgained by more than 180 yards since Nov. 19, 2009 when Concordia outgained the Gusties 398-138. Gustavus won that game 20-19 after Greg Lane returned a kickoff 86 yards for a score with 39 seconds remaining in the game. That was also the last time Gustavus has returned a kickoff for a touchdown.

NEXT MAN UP...

After completing 21-of-25 passes for 266 yards and a touchdown in the season opener, Michael Veldman (So., Becker, Minn.) continued his efficiency last Saturday against UW-River Falls by completing 6-of-9 passes for 84 yards, including a 41-yard touchdown, but was sidelined due to injury early in the game. Sam Archer (So., Zimmerman, Minn.) was the next man up and guided the offense the rest of the game. Archer completed 10-of-18 passes for 101 yards in relief. Running back Luke Martinez (Sr., Lenexa, Kan.) was also injured early in game, giving Karim Ortiz (Jr., Cancun, Mexico) the bulk of the rushing duties for the rest of the contest. Ortiz finished with 51 yards on 10 carries.

CLOSE CALL...

Last week's 24-21 victory over UW-River Falls marked the 10th game in Head Coach Peter Haugen's eight seasons at Gustavus that was decided by three or fewer points. Haugen and the Gusties are now 4-6 in games decided by three or fewer points. The last victory for the Gusties in a game decided by three points was a 23-20 overtime win against Saint John's in 2013.

MIAC OPENER...

Gustavus enters the conference opener undefeated for the fifth consecutive season. The Gusties have gone on to win the first game of MIAC competition the past two seasons, but lost the league opener in 2013 and 2012, both to Augsburg. The Auggies defeated the Gusties 19-16 in 2013 in Minneapolis, and 26-24 in 2012 in St. Peter. Gustavus has an all-time record of 53-34-5 in MIAC openers. Gustavus, Hamline, Saint John's, and St. Thomas are the four remaining undefeated teams in the MIAC after two games.

PLAYING WITH A PURPOSE...

Two games into the season, Hunter Johnson (Jr., Cannon Falls, Minn.) is proving to be a threat all over the field. Johnson ranks sixth in the MIAC in all-purpose yards, averaging 124.0 yards per game. He has accumulated 144 receiving yards, 32 punt return yards, 70 kick return yards, and two rushing yards for a total of 248 yards. Johnson also averages 13.1 yards per reception, 10.7 yards per punt return, and 17.5 yards per kick return.

SCOUTING THE AUGGIES...

After getting shut out in its season opener, the Augsburg football team's offensive struggles continued last Saturday in a 24-14 loss at Concordia University-Wisconsin. Isiah Malone (Jr., Brooklyn Center, Minn.) and Raymond Guyton Jr. (So., Stockton, Calif.) scored touchdowns for the Auggies.

Concordia took advantage of a turnover to score its first touchdown of the game at the 10:32 mark of the first quarter. The Auggies fumbled the ball deep in their own territory, which was recovered by the Falcons for a 20-yard return. Augsburg converted three first downs on its next drive, but stalled and punted the ball away. Concordia then drove 90 yards in 11 plays to take a 14-0 advantage after the first quarter of play.

Augsburg made a goal line stand early in the second quarter, but the offense couldn't take advantage of the momentum boost and failed on a fourth down attempt. The Falcons capitalized on the turnover and increased their lead 21-0 on a 27-yard touchdown pass. The Auggies broke the shutout late in the half as Malone intercepted a pass and returned it 39 yards for the score. At halftime, the Auggies trailed 21-7.

MIAC Offensive Player-of-the-Week

Jorgen Salvesson, St. Olaf
Wayzata, Minn./Breck

Justice Spriggs helped Head Coach St. Olaf (1-1) dropped a 46-40 double-overtime decision to Luther Saturday in the Oles' home opener, wide receiver Jorgen Salvesson turned in an unforgettable and clutch performance. The junior had 13 catches for 133 yards and three touchdowns, with his final two touchdowns coming in the biggest possible spots. Salvesson hauled in a six-yard touchdown with just nine seconds left, and St. Olaf got the two-point try as well to force overtime, and he added a four-yard touchdown catch in the first overtime period to send it to a second extra session. Salvesson ranks in the top four in the MIAC in catches (17), receiving yards (180) and receiving TDs (four) thus far in 2016.



MIAC Defensive Player-of-the-Week

Mitchell Maday, Hamline

Hamline (2-0) defeated nonconference rival Macalester 21-7 Saturday to retain the Paint Bucket rivalry trophy behind a huge defensive effort from sophomore Mitchell Maday. The Piper defensive lineman had seven tackles (five solo) with 4.5 tackles-for-a-loss, 4.5 sacks and two forced fumbles. His 4.5 sacks are the most by a single player in Division III this season and lead the MIAC, and his second forced fumble stopped the Scots' final drive and preserved the win. His tackles behind the line of scrimmage resulted in a loss of 30 total yards for Macalester. The win helped the Pipers start 2-0 under first-year Head Coach Chip Taylor.



MIAC Special Teams Player-of-the-Week

Dawson Brown, Bethel
Becker, Minn./Becker

Bethel (0-2) came up just short in a thrilling 40-34 overtime loss to Carthage, but a spectacular individual effort from Dawson Brown kept the Royals in the game. The sophomore blocked a punt early in the second quarter to set Bethel up on the nine-yard line, and two plays later the team scored a touchdown to pull ahead 21-12. Brown's impact went well beyond special teams as he also had a 55-yard interception return for a touchdown just before halftime, and he racked up 15 tackles (six solo) and 3.5 tackles-for-a-loss to stuff the stat sheet in two of the game's three phases.



After a scoreless third quarter, Concordia increased its lead to 17 points with a 20-yard field goal with 5:46 remaining in the game. The Auggies scored their second touchdown of the game on a one-yard rush by Guyton Jr. with 3:53 on the clock, but it was too little, too late.

Concordia outgained Augsburg by a 384-215 margin of total offense. Guyton Jr. was limited to 8-of-36 passing for 164 yards. Nick Heenie (So., Victoria, Minn.) was the top receiving target with four catches for 89 yards. The Auggie ground game was held to 51 yards. Khoa Ngyuen (Sr., Rochester, Minn.) led the defense with 14 total tackles, including three tackles for loss and one sack. Lorenzo Hernandez (So., New Ulm, Minn.) also reached double figure tackles with 10, including a tackle for loss and a pass breakup. William Johnson (Sr., St. Anthony Village, Minn.) had an interception, forced fumble, and a tackle for loss among his six tackles. Punter Glenn Meyers (Jr., Blaine, Minn.) saw a lot of time on the field, punting the ball nine times for 361 yards and a 40.1-yard average.

SCOUTING THE GUSTIES...

All three phases of the game – offense, defense, and special teams – contributed to last Saturday's 24-21 home opener victory over the University of Wisconsin-River Falls. A long touchdown pass, 27-yard field goal, blocked punt return, and a 75-yard "pick-six" comprised Gustavus's scoring for the day, resulting in the close win and improving to 2-0 overall.

In the first drive of the day, Michael Veldman (So., Becker, Minn.) fired a strike to George Buchner (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) streaking down the left hash marks for an over-the-shoulder 41-yard touchdown. The Falcons responded on the following possession to tie the game and the score remained 7-7 after the first quarter. Gustavus's first drive of the second quarter ended with a 27-yard field goal by Brendan Boche (Jr., Lakeville, Minn.), his first of the season. The Gusties increased their lead to 17-7 on the ensuing UW-River Falls drive as Matt Berkner (So., Sleepy, Eye, Minn.) blocked a punt at the three-yard line, which was recovered by Kevin Krohn (Jr., Richfield, Minn.) for the touchdown. The Gusties then took the wind out of the Falcons' sails on the next drive. On a third-and-11 deep into Gustie territory, Casey Decker (Jr., Mapleton,

Minn.) tipped a pass on the left edge, came down with the deflection, and returned it 75 yards for the score. The Gusties led 24-7 at halftime.

After a scoreless third quarter, UW-River Falls started its comeback effort. The Falcons capped an 11-play drive with a rushing touchdown to bring the score to 24-14. After holding the Gusties scoreless on their next two drives, the Falcons drove 64 yards in 11 plays, bringing to the deficit to three points. The Falcons defense forced another punt on the ensuing possession, getting the ball back at its own 14-yard line with four minutes remaining in the game. The visitors drove into Gustie territory, but the home defense came up big with a fourth down stop and Gustavus was able to take a knee and run out the clock.

Jordan Sorensen (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) led the Black and Gold defense with a career-high nine tackles, including a pass breakup. Tyler Jakes (Sr., North Mankato, Minn.) manned the middle, making eight stops, including 1.5 tackles for loss, and a breakup. Veldman completed 6-of-9 passes for 81 yards and a touchdown before leaving the game with an injury. Sam Archer (So., Zimmerman, Minn.) quarterbacked the rest of the game, going 10-for-18 with 101 yards, including 15 carries for six yards. Karim Ortiz (Jr., Cancun, Mexico) was the leading Gustie rusher with 10 carries for 51 yards.

Turnovers proved to be the turning points in the game as the Falcons outgained the Gusties 454-270 in total yards. UW-River Falls also converted 24 first downs, compared to 16 by Gustavus.

Peter Haugen, a native of Minneapolis and a 1991 graduate of Bethel University, enters his eighth year as head football coach at Gustavus Adolphus College for the 2016 season.

Last season, Haugen earned MIAC Co-Coach-of-the-Year honors after directing the Gustavus football team to a 7-3 overall record and a third place finish in the MIAC at 5-3. Haugen shared the honor with St. Thomas coach Glen Caruso and became the first Gustavus coach to earn the award since 1987 when Dennis Raarup was named Coach-of-the-Year after going undefeated in the MIAC. The seven wins in 2015 were the most by Gustavus since 2001 and the third place finish in the league was the best since 2002. After posting a combined record of 13-27 in his first four seasons at Gustavus, Haugen has since turned the program around by going 19-11 in the past three seasons for a combined coaching record of 32-38 and 23-33 in the MIAC.

In the MIAC's 2015 post-season honors, first team all-conference recipients included quarterback Mitch Hendricks (Sr., Bemidji, Minn.), receivers Matthew Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) and Gabriel Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.), offensive lineman Scott Newby (Sr., Lakeville, Minn.), and defensive back Nick Frandsen (Sr., North Oaks, Minn.). Matthew Boyce and Mitch Hendricks were later named to the D3football.com All-West Region Team, while Matthew Boyce was selected to the D3football.com All-America Team for the second consecutive season.

Haugen, who was the head football coach at Washburn High School for 15 years prior to coming to Gustavus, compiled an overall record of 111-44 during that span, while winning 11 league championships and posting a league record of 76-8. He directed the Millers to the Class AAAA quarterfinals in 2007 finishing with a mark of 9-3. In his last season as the Millers' head coach, Haugen's squad posted a mark of 8-2. While building the program at Washburn, Haugen increased player participation from 35 players in 1994 to 110 players in 2008. He also implemented academic monitoring and meal programs for student-athletes as well as creating and directing the highly successful Washburn Athletic Leadership Academy. He has also served as the chair of the Minneapolis Football Conference and he is an active clinician working at many local and regional clinics including the NIKE Coach of the Year clinic. Haugen was also a member of the Metro coaching staff for the Minnesota All-Star game in 1998. He started his coaching career at his alma mater, serving as the offensive line coach during the 1992 and 1993 seasons. A three-sport standout at Bethel, Haugen was a starting tight end on the football team, a starting goaltender on the hockey team, and a starting catcher on the baseball team in the late '80s and early '90s. In his senior year, he earned all-conference honors in football, and was selected Most Valuable Player of the hockey team.

Haugen became the 17th head coach in the 100-season history of Gustavus football in 2009. The Golden Gusties have a long and storied football tradition that includes 22 MIAC titles. The program ranks in the top-50 all-time in Division III (out of 235 institutions) with a 58.2 winning percentage (486-346-21). The Gusties will soon join an elite group of 53 NCAA Division III institutions whose football teams have won 500 games.

Along with great teams, Gustavus has also been blessed with many outstanding individual players, which includes 25 players who have received All-America honors, 13 who have received CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, and five who have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships.

FULTON, Mo. – The Gustavus football team started its 100th season on the right foot, defeating Westminster College 35-6 on Saturday afternoon. The Gusties scored touchdowns on their first two possessions and never looked back. Gustavus accumulated 479 yards of offense on 275 passing and 204 rushing. Luke Martinez (Sr., Lenexa, Kan.) had a breakout game after missing all last season due to injury as he scored three touchdowns with 129 yards on 21 carries. In his first start under center, Michael Veldman (So., Becker, Minn.) was extremely efficient, completing 21-of-25 passes for 266 yards and a touchdown. Veldman also added a six-yard rushing touchdown. Jordan Kahlow (So., Le Sueur, Minn.) led the defense with six tackles.

Westminster started with the ball and was held to just two yards on its first possession, forcing a punt. The Gusties started the ensuing drive at the Westminster 45 and quickly went to work. Martinez capped a six-play drive with a punch-in from one yard out, which was set up by a 17-yard pass from Veldman to Michael Hensch (So., North Branch, Minn.), and after the Brendan Boche (Jr., Lakeville, Minn.) extra point, Gustavus led 7-0 just over four minutes into the game.

The Gustie defense forced a three-and-out for the second straight time, giving the offense the ball back at its own 42 after the punt. Gustavus methodically moved the ball down the field and found the endzone after nine plays, including three passing plays of 10 yards or more. Veldman capped the drive with a six-yard keeper and the Gusties led 14-0 at the 4:24 mark in the first quarter.

Westminster moved the chains for the first time on the following drive, but was forced to punt after four plays. Gustavus's first play on the following drive was a nine-yard completion to George Buchner (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.), but the Westminster defense forced a fumble and got the ball back at midfield. The home team was looking to take advantage of the turnover and drove the ball down to the two-yard line, but Sergio De Pablos Velez (Sr., Cancun, Mexico) had other plans as he intercepted a pass and returned it to the Gustie 38-yard line.

The Black and Gold capitalized on the turnover as they drove the ball 62 yards in 11 plays, capped by a 13-yard touchdown pass to Hunter Johnson (Jr., Cannon Falls, Minn.) and Gustavus led 21-0 five minutes into the second quarter. The next two possessions for both teams ended in punts and the score remained 21-0 at halftime.

Gustavus started with the ball in the second half and went back to work with a nine-play scoring drive, ending with an 11-yard rushing touchdown by Martinez. The drive featured the ground game as Martinez found an opening for a 28-yard gain and Karim Ortiz (Jr., Cancun, Mexico) rushed the ball four straight times for 19 yards, which set up the Martinez touchdown.

The Gustie defense once again shut down Westminster on the following possession, giving the ball back to the offense at its own 12-yard line, setting up the longest drive of the day. The longest play of the drive was a 32-yard pass from Veldman to Johnson and the possession ended with a one-yard run from Martinez, his third score of the day, for a 35-0 advantage.

"It looked like he was his old self," Head Coach Peter Haugen said of Martinez. "He's a physical runner at the point of attack and he got better as the game went along. He's a physical, punishing runner and did a nice job today."

Westminster ended the shutout early in the fourth quarter with a 10-play, 74-yard drive, but it was too little, too late. Veldman stayed in the game until the fourth quarter and was then replaced by Sam Archer (So., Zimmerman, Minn.).

"He was efficient and made good decisions with the ball," Haugen said of Veldman. "That's the big thing. He passed well in terms of his accuracy and our receivers went out and made some big plays behind him."

Johnson was the favorite target of the day, hauling in a career-high eight catches for 115 yards and a score. Jackson Feddema (Fy., Cleveland, Minn.) made eight receptions for 37 yards.

Kahlow led the defense with six tackles, closely followed by Iker Ortiz (Sr., Cancun, Mexico) with four stops, including two tackles for loss. The Gustie defense limited Westminster's ground game to 74 yards and 226 total yards. Gustavus also dominated the time of possession 39:18-to-20:42.

"The defense was really active today," Haugen said. "I think it's a group that was really moving around. They kept Westminster off balance. Our goal going into the game was to stop their star running back and we were able to do that. It was fun to see a lot of kids get an opportunity to play and compete."

Gustavus returns to St. Peter next Saturday for its home opener against UW-River Falls. Kickoff is 1 p.m. at Hollingsworth Field.

"We're a young team and continuing to find our identity," Haugen said. "We just need to keep improving from week to week. Certainly today was a great start, but we're going to have to clean things up for sure."

ST. PETER, Minn. – All three phases of the game – offense, defense, and special teams – contributed to last Saturday’s 24-21 home opener victory over the University of Wisconsin-River Falls. A long touchdown pass, 27-yard field goal, blocked punt return, and a 75-yard “pick-six” comprised Gustavus’s scoring for the day, resulting in the close win and improving to 2-0 overall in front of an excited home crowd.

“It was a huge deal for our players,” said Head Coach Peter Haugen on the Gustavus crowd. “When we were out before the game even started the “Hill Crew” already had the stands and the student section packed. That’s a huge encouragement to our players and we’re so thankful for all of the support.”

In the first drive of the day, Michael Veldman (So., Becker, Minn.) fired a strike to George Buchner (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) streaking down the left hash marks for an over-the-shoulder 41-yard touchdown. The Falcons responded on the following possession to tie the game and the score remained 7-7 after the first quarter. Gustavus’s first drive of the second quarter ended with a 27-yard field goal by Brendan Boche (Jr., Lakeville, Minn.), his first of the season. The Gusties increased their lead to 17-7 on the ensuing UW-River Falls drive as Matt Berkner (So., Sleepy, Eye, Minn.) blocked a punt at the three-yard line, which was recovered by Kevin Krohn (Jr., Richfield, Minn.) for the touchdown. The Gusties then took the wind out of the Falcons’ sails on the next drive. On a third-and-11 deep into Gustie territory, Casey Decker (Jr., Mapleton, Minn.) tipped a pass on the left edge, came down with the deflection, and returned it 75 yards for the score. The Gusties led 24-7 at halftime.

“We lost a couple key guys early, and guys had to step up. We excelled in a couple areas we needed to after those injuries took place,” said Haugen.

After a scoreless third quarter, UW-River Falls started its comeback effort. The Falcons capped an 11-play drive with a rushing touchdown to bring the score to 24-14. After holding the Gusties scoreless on their next two drives, the Falcons drove 64 yards in 11 plays, bringing to the deficit to three points. The Falcons defense forced another punt on the ensuing possession, getting the ball back at its own 14-yard line with four minutes remaining in the game. The visitors drove into Gustie territory, but the home defense came up big with a fourth down stop and Gustavus was able

to take a knee and run out the clock.

Jordan Sorensen (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) led the Black and Gold defense with a career-high nine tackles, including a pass breakup. Tyler Jakes (Sr., North Mankato, Minn.) manned the middle, making eight stops, including 1.5 tackles for loss, and a breakup. Veldman completed 6-of-9 passes for 81 yards and a touchdown before leaving the game with an injury. Sam Archer (So., Zimmerman, Minn.) quarterbacked the rest of the game, going 10-for-18 with 101 yards, including 15 carries for six yards. Karim Ortiz (Jr., Cancun, Mexico) was the leading Gustie rusher with 10 carries for 51 yards.

Turnovers proved to be the turning points in the game as the Falcons outgained the Gusties 454-270 in total yards. UW-River Falls also converted 24 first downs, compared to 16 by Gustavus.

“We kicked the ball well and had a really solid day with special teams with the turnover for a touchdown,” Haugen said. “Offense isn’t always going to score points, you have to find ways to make big plays outside of just one phase of the game. We did that today and as a result we won. I told the players, this is such a big win for our team. Certainly, we’re going to have to make some improvements but they’re more fun to make when you’re 2-0 rather than 1-1.”
