GAME NOTES

GUSTIES TAKE TO GRIDIRON FOR 100TH SEASON... The Gustavus football continues its 100th season today at Lloyd Hollingsworth Field for its home opener. Over the previous 99 years, the Gusties have compiled a record of 486-346-21, including a record of 226-127-8 in St. Peter. With 22 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) championships, Gustavus has claimed the secondmost league titles in the 96-year history of the conference. Only Saint John's (32) has claimed more MIAC championships.

FOLLOW THE GUSTIES ON KNUJ...

KNUJ AM 860 out of New Ulm, Minnesota once again broadcasts all 10 Gustavus regular season football games. The voice of the Golden Gusties Tom Wheeler handles the play-by-play duties for the 11th consecutive season. Wheeler is once again joined by 1984 Gustavus graduate and former Gustie football player Ken Ericson on the live call of this year's games. Fans can listen to the KNUJ broadcasts on the Internet through the Gustavus Athletics website. Gustavus provides a high definition video stream of all home games for viewing on your computer, tablet, or smart phone through GameCentral by Stretch Internet. CALLING ALL CAPTAINS... Of over 5,000 student-athletes who have played football for Gustavus in the 100-year history of the program, only 198 have earned the privilege to serve as team captain. Peter Haugen's captains this season include seniors Zach Martinez, Jake Schmitz, Joe Theiler, and Tyler Jakes.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP... In what has become a trend of Head Coach Peter Haguen's tenure, the 2016 Gustavus football roster once again features a great deal of senior leadership. This year's senior class features three defensive lineman, four defensive backs, three offensive lineman, three wide receivers, three linebackers, and one running back.

GUSTIE FOOTBALL AROUND

THE GLOBE... The 2016 Gustavus football team features a total of 104 players from eight different states and, for the fifth straight year, a second country outside the United States. Of those 104 players, 84 claim Minnesota as their native state. Two players call Kansas home, two from Illinois, two from Hawaii, four from Texas, three from New Mexico, and one player each from Tennessee and Florida represent the Stars and Stripes. Mexico once again makes its presence felt on this year's roster as it is the homeland of five Gusties, four from Cancun and one from Guadalajara.

MEET THE HEAD COACHES...

Gustavus Head Coach Peter Haugen is in his eighth season at the helm of the Gustavus football program. Haugen has a combined record of 35-40 after five games into season eight. A graduate of Bethel University, Haugen was the head coach at Washburn High School in Minneapolis prior to coming to Gustavus.

Bethel Head Coach Steve Johnson is in his 28th year at the helm of the Royal football program. Johnson has a combined record of 199-91-1. A 1979 graduate of Bethel, Johnson has previous coaching experience at St. Cloud State University. St. Cloud Cathedral High School, the University of Minnesota and Montana State University.

THE SERIES... Saturday's game is the 39th meeting between the Gustavus and Bethel football programs. The Royals hold the advantage in the all-time series with a record of 21-17. The Gusties are seeking their first win over the Royals since 2008 as they have last the last seven meetings. Last season, Bethel topped Gustavus 33-24 in Arden Hills. Holding a 24-20 lead late in the fourth quarter, the Gusties were not able to maintain the advantage as they allowed a pair of touchdowns in the final four

minutes. Gustavus couldn't contain the Royals ground attack as it allowed 413 rushing yards and five scores, highlighted by 230 yards from Marshall Klitzke. The Gusties recorded 396 yards of total offense, compared to 523 by the Royals.

TRYING TO RIGHT THE SHIP...

During Peter Haugen's coaching tenure at Gustavus his teams are 17-20 following a loss. The Gusties went 1-2 after losing their first game of the 2015 season to finish 7-3. The last Gustie victory following a loss was a last-minute 41-34 win against Concordia on Nov. 7 last season.

NEEDING TO FINISH... The Gusties are looking to finish games strong after having trouble up until this point in the season. Gustavus has been outscored 61-23 in the fourth quarter this year, which includes 20 unanswered points against Concordia in its last game on Oct. 1. The Gusties have done well in each of the other three quarters, outscoring opponents 24-16 in the first, 45-38 in the second, and 63-13 in the third.

KEY MATCHUP... Bethel's offense vs. Gustavus's defense is an intriguing matchup to keep an eye on Saturday. The Royals boast the MIAC's top offensive attack, averaging 476.2 yards per game, while the Gustie defense ranks fourth in the league, allowing 356.8 yards per game. The Royals have a balanced offense, averaging 190.3 rushing yards and 285.8 passing yards per game. Conversely, the Gusties allow 145.4 rushing yards and 210.6 passing yards per game.

LEAGUE LEADERS... Halfway through the 2016 season, the Gusties have two offensive players who are among the best in the MIAC. Karim Ortiz (Jr., Cancun, Mexico) leads the league in rushing with 458 yards for an average of 91.6 yards per game, including four touchdowns. Wide receiver Hunter Johnson (Jr., Cannon Falls, Minn.) leads the league in all-purpose yards, averaging 147.6 per game. Through five games, Johnson has 26 catches for 371 yards and three touchdowns, along with 86 punt return yards and 287 kick return yards.

SCOUTING THE ROYALS...

The Bethel file: The Royals come into today's contest with a 2-4 record (2-2 MIAC) after a convincing 56-8 victory over Carleton last Saturday. Bethel was able to mount 533 yards of total offense that equated to eight touchdowns in their win over the Knights. The Royals defense held the Knights to 52 yards rushing, while intercepting Carleton QB Ethan Trujillo three times.

Sitting on a milestone: Head coach Steve Johnson is sitting on a milestone, as the 28-year staple is one victory shy of 200. Johnson, who has amassed a 199-92-1 record at BU, ranks No. 3 among active Division III head coaches in all-time wins. Currently, there are 11 active coaches among all divisions with 200+ wins and 76 coaches all-time to reach this plateau.

Getting down to Biz-ness: Bryce Marquardt continues to be the go-to target for Bethel QBs and as a result is No. 1 atop the MIAC for yards (660) and yards/game (132.0). Marquardt has recorded four 100-yard games this season and seven throughout his career. Already ranked No. 6 in BU's history for receiving yards, "Biz" needs to average 80.3 yards/game to break the record.

Around the block: Bethel's special teams unit is in elite company this year, as the Royals rank No. 1 nationwide in blocked punts with a total of three and No. 2 nationally in blocked kicks with a total of five. BU's Dawson Brown blocked his third punt of the season last week against Carleton, which puts him No. 2 among all Division III football players nationwide.

It takes two to tango: In hopes of exploiting the defense and capitalizing on individual strengths, Bethel has purposefully played two quarterbacks or more in every game this season. Getting time under center in every game is Trey Anderson, who is 15-of-25 (60.0%) for 210 yards and two touchdowns, while recent starter Jake Marsh is 40-65 (61.5%) for 641 yards and three TDs.

When was the last: Bethel's 0-3 start at home is an anomaly under Coach Johnson, as the Royals have never lost the first three home

MIAC Offensive Player-of-the-Week Alex Fenske, Saint Thomas Marshall, Minn.

Marshall, Minn.
Senior QB Alex Fenske led a three-play,
56-yard scoring drive in the game's 25
seconds for a dramatic 23-20 win over
Concordia. Fenske's winning drive had
completions of 20 and 21 yards to Co-Winner Nick
Waldvogel, the latter with two seconds left on a
timing route to the corner near the pylon. Fenske
completed 22-of-31 passes with no interceptions
for 373 yards and two TDs, and has thrown just
one interception in 132 passes in No. 4 UST's 6-0
start. He led UST to 460 total yards and 10-of-20


conversions on third- and fourth downs.

Hank Van Liew had a game-high seven solo tackles and finished with 11 total tackles in the Cobbers' near-upset over No. 4-ranked St. Thomas. Van Liew, helped to limit UST to only 87 rushing yards, the first time they have been held under 100 rushing yards since the

neid under 100 rushing yards since the 2012 NCAA title game, and the first time in MIAC play since prior to 2010. Van Liew's biggest tackle of the game came on crucial third-and-goal stop, when he stopped the Tommie running back at the one-foot line. Van Liew is currently in the Top 10 in the MIAC in total tackles, solo tackles, assisted tackles and tackles per game.

MIAC Special Teams Player-of-the-Week
Dusty Krueger
Lake Elmo, Minn.

Saint John's Dusty Krueger found the end zone twice in Saturday's 49-0 win at Augsburg, including a huge play on special teams early in the game. Krueger burst through the left side of the line, blocked an Auggie punt, and then won



games during his 28-year tenure. Additionally, the best BU can finish at home is 2-3, which marks just the third time since 1989 that Bethel will have a losing record at home. Since Coach J started at BU, the Royals have gone 103-35-1 (.745) at home.

Offensive state of mind: Bethel's offensive numbers continue to lead the league, as the Royals rank No. 1 across the MIAC in total yards (2,857), yards per game (476.2), passing yards (1,715), and completions (135). Additionally, BU ranks No. 1 in rushing TDs (21), first downs (150) and first downs per game (25.0). Bethel recorded its third 530+ performance of the year last week.

Line of protection: Bethel's offensive line has been sensational—statistically speaking—in 2016. The Royals are ranked No. 3 among all Division III teams (244) in sacks allowed with an average of 0.3 per game and No. 15 nationally in tackles for loss allowed with an average of 3.83. Moreover, Bethel's moving company ranks No. 1 among all MIAC opponents in both categories.

Career performance: Sophomore running back Gunnar Bloom had a career day last Saturday, as the Otsego, Minn., native carried the ball 17 times for 112 yards and four touchdowns. Bloom, who was averaging 5.05 yards per carry going into the game, finished the day averaging 6.6 yards per carry. Blom's longest run resulted in a 27-yard touchdown.

SCOUTING THE GUSTIES... Playing from behind the entire game, the Gustavus football team kept the score close through three quarters on Oct. 1 at Hollingsworth Field, but Concordia widened the gap in the fourth quarter with three unanswered touchdowns to secure a 46-21 victory on Gustavus's Homecoming. The Gustie defense faced a completely different style of offense from the opponent than it saw the previous week when Hamline amassed nearly 500 yards through the air. Against the Cobbers, it was the ground game of Concordia that carried the load, totaling 400 rushing yards. The Cobbers ran the ball 57 times compared to just nine passing attempts for 18 yards. Chad Johnson paced the Cobber rushing attack with 21 carries for 190 yards and four touchdowns. Christian Haffner (Fy., Lebanon, Tenn.) completed 19-of-29 passes for 234 yards and

three touchdowns, including an interception. Jamison Beulke (So., Montgomery, Minn.) had the most catches with four for 33 yards and a touchdown, while Josh Kirk (Fy., Garvin, Minn.) added three receptions for 96 yards and a score. Karim Ortiz (Jr., Cancun, Mexico) led the ground game with 18 carries for 45 yards. Leeland Lauti (Jr., Ewa Beach, Hawaii) paced the defense with 11 tackles.

Head Coach Peter Haugen and the Gusties will look to right the ship Saturday against the No. 1 offense in the league. Haugen is also looking for his first victory against his alma mater. Early season injuries forced to Gusties to dig deep into their depth chart and coming off the bye week, the extra time to work on their craft has the Gustie optimistic about Saturday's matchup. Haffner will start his third game of the season after beginning the year as the No. 3 quarterback on the depth chart. Running back Luke Martinez is back in the fold after recovering from an injury that occurred in Week 2. Martinez is hoping he can pick up where he left off, having rushed 21 times for 129 yards and three touchdowns in the season opening win at Westminster.

The Gustie defense faces a tough task in Bethel's No. 1 offense in the MIAC. The Gusties are hoping to slow down the Royals after allowing 400 rushing yards in their last game and nearly 500 passing yards in the game prior. Despite those number, Gustavus's defense ranks No. 4 in the league, allowing 356.8 yards per game. The Gusties allow an average of 25.6 points per game and have six interceptions, three fumble recoveries, and seven sacks.

Peter Haugen, a native of Minneapolis and a 1991 graduate of Bethel University, enters his eighth year as head football coach at Gustavus Adolphus College for the 2016 season.

Last season, Haugen earned MIAC Co-Coach-of-the-Year honors after directing the Gustavus football team to a 7-3 overall record and a third place finish in the MIAC at 5-3. Haugen shared the honor with St. Thomas coach Glen Caruso and became the first Gustavus coach to earn the award since 1987 when Dennis Raarup was named Coach-of-the-Year after going undefeated in the MIAC. The seven wins in 2015 were the most by Gustavus since 2001 and the third place finish in the league was the best since 2002. After posting a combined record of 13-27 in his first four seasons at Gustavus, Haugen has since turned the program around by going 19-11 in the past three seasons for a combined coaching record of 32-38 and 23-33 in the MIAC.

In the MIAC's 2015 post-season honors, first team all-conference recipients included quarterback Mitch Hendricks (Sr., Bemidji, Minn.), receivers Matthew Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) and Gabriel Boyce (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.), offensive lineman Scott Newby (Sr., Lakeville, Minn.), and defensive back Nick Frandsen (Sr., North Oaks, Minn.). Matthew Boyce and Mitch Hendricks were later named to the D3football.com All-West Region Team, while Matthew Boyce was selected to the D3football.com All-America Team for the second consecutive season.

Haugen, who was the head football coach at Washburn High School for 15 years prior to coming to Gustavus, compiled an overall record of 111-44 during that span, while winning 11 league championships and posting a league record of 76-8. He directed the Millers to the Class AAAA quarterfinals in 2007 finishing with a mark of 9-3. In his last season as the Millers' head coach, Haugen's squad posted a mark of 8-2. While building the program at Washburn, Haugen increased player participation from 35 players in 1994 to 110 players in 2008. He also implemented academic monitoring and meal programs for student-athletes as well as creating and directing the highly successful Washburn Athletic Leadership Academy. He has also served as the chair of the Minneapolis Football Conference and he is an active clinician working at many local and regional clinics including the NIKE Coach of the Year clinic. Haugen was also a member of the Metro coaching staff for the Minnesota All-Star game in 1998. He started his coaching career at his alma mater, serving as the offensive line coach during the 1992 and 1993 seasons. A three-sport standout at Bethel, Haugen was a starting tight end on the football team, a starting goaltender on the hockey team, and a starting catcher on the baseball team in the late '80s and early '90s. In his senior year, he earned allconference honors in football, and was selected Most Valuable Player of the hockey team.

Haugen became the 17th head coach in the 100-season history of Gustavus football in 2009. The Golden Gusties have a long and storied football tradition that includes 22 MIAC titles. The program ranks in the top-50 all-time in Division III (out of 235 institutions) with a 58.2 winning percentage (486–346–21). The Gusties will soon join an elite group of 53 NCAA Division III institutions whose football teams have won 500 games.

Along with great teams, Gustavus has also been blessed with many outstanding individual players, which includes 25 players who have received All-America honors, 13 who have received CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, and five who have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships.

WESTMINSTER 6 GUSTAVUS 35

Fulton, Mo. (350) Priest Field 75°, Sunny

FULTON, Mo. – The Gustavus football team started its 100th season on the right foot, defeating Westminster College 35-6 on Saturday afternoon. The Gusties scored touchdowns on their first two possessions and never looked back. Gustavus accumulated 479 yards of offense on 275 passing and 204 rushing. Luke Martinez (Sr., Lenexa, Kan.) had a breakout game after missing all last season due to injury as he scored three touchdowns with 129 yards on 21 carries. In his first start under center, Michael Veldman (So., Becker, Minn.) was extremely efficient, completing 21-of-25 passes for 266 yards and a touchdown. Veldman also added a six-yard rushing touchdown. Jordan Kahlow (So., Le Sueur, Minn.) led the defense with six tackles.

Westminster started with the ball and was held to just two yards on its first possession, forcing a punt. The Gusties started the ensuing drive at the Westminster 45 and quickly went to work. Martinez capped a six-play drive with a punch-in from one yard out, which was set up by a 17-yard pass from Veldman to Michael Hensch (So., North Branch, Minn.), and after the Brendan Boche (Jr., Lakeville, Minn.) extra point, Gustavus led 7-0 just over four minutes into the game.

The Gustie defense forced a three-and-out for the second straight time, giving the offense the ball back at its own 42 after the punt. Gustavus methodically moved the ball down the field and found the endzone after nine plays, including three passing plays of 10 yards or more. Veldman capped the drive with a six-yard keeper and the Gusties led 14-0 at the 4:24 mark in the first quarter.

Westminster moved the chains for the first time on the following drive, but was forced to punt after four plays. Gustavus's first play on the following drive was a nine-yard completion to George Buchner (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.), but the Westminster defense forced a fumble and got the ball back at midfield. The home team was looking to take advantage of the turnover and drove the ball down to the two-yard line, but Sergio De Pablos Velez (Sr., Cancun, Mexico) had other plans as he intercepted a pass and returned it to the Gustie 38-yard line.

The Black and Gold capitalized on the turnover as they drove the ball 62 yards in 11 plays, capped by a 13-yard touchdown pass to Hunter Johnson (Jr., Cannon Falls, Minn.) and Gustavus led 21-0 five minutes into the second quarter. The next two possessions for both teams ended in punts and the score remained 21-0 at halftime.

Gustavus started with the ball in the second half and went back to work with a nine-play scoring drive, ending with an 11-yard rushing touchdown by Martinez. The drive featured the ground game as Martinez found an opening for a 28-yard gain and Karim Ortiz (Jr., Cancun, Mexico) rushed the ball four straight times for 19 yards, which set up the Martinez touchdown.

The Gustie defense once against shut down Westminster on the following possession, giving the ball back to the offense at its own 12-yard line, setting up the longest drive of the day. The longest play of the drive was a 32-yard pass from Veldman to Johnson and the possession ended with a one-yard run from Martinez, his third score of the day, for a 35-0 advantage.

"It looked like he was his old self," Head Coach Peter Haugen said of Martinez. "He's a physical runner at the point of attack and he got better as the game went along. He's a physical, punishing runner and did a nice job today."

Westminster ended the shutout early in the fourth quarter with a 10-play, 74-yard drive, but it was too little, too late. Veldman stayed in the game until the fourth quarter and was then replaced by Sam Archer (So., Zimmerman, Minn.).

"He was efficient and made good decisions with the ball," Haugen said of Veldman. "That's the big thing. He passed well in terms of his accuracy and our receivers went out and made some big plays behind him."

Johnson was the favorite target of the day, hauling in a career-high eight catches for 115 yards and a score. Jackson Feddema (Fy., Cleveland, Minn.) made eight receptions for 37 yards.

Kahlow led the defense with six tackles, closely followed by Iker Ortiz (Sr., Cancun, Mexico) with four stops, including two tackles for loss. The Gustie defense limited Westminster's ground game to 74 yards and 226 total yards. Gustavus also dominated the time of possession 39:18-to-20:42.

"The defense was really active today," Haugen said. "I think it's a group that was really moving around. They kept Westminster off balance. Our goal going into the game was to stop their star running back and we were able to do that. It was fun to see a lot of kids get an opportunity to play and compete."

Gustavus returns to St. Peter next Saturday for its home opener against UW-River Falls. Kickoff is 1 p.m. at Hollingsworth Field.

"We're a young team and continuing to find our identity," Haugen said. "We just need to keep improving from week to week. Certainly today was a great start, but we're going to have to clean things up for sure."

UW-RIVER FALLS 21 GUSTAVUS 24

St. Peter, Minn. (1,301) Hollingsworth Field 70°, Sunny

ST. PETER, Minn. – All three phases of the game – offense, defense, and special teams – contributed to last Saturday's 24-21 home opener victory over the University of Wisconsin-River Falls. A long touchdown pass, 27-yard field goal, blocked punt return, and a 75-yard "pick-six" comprised Gustavus's scoring for the day, resulting in the close win and improving to 2-0 overall in front of an excited home crowd.

"It was a huge deal for our players," said Head Coach Peter Haugen on the Gustavus crowd. "When we were out before the game even started the "Hill Crew" already had the stands and the student section packed. That's a huge encouragement to our players and we're so thankful for all of the support."

In the first drive of the day, Michael Veldman (So., Becker, Minn.) fired a strike to George Buchner (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.) streaking down the left hash marks for an overthe-shoulder 41-yard touchdown. The Falcons responded on the following possession to tie the game and the score remained 7-7 after the first quarter. Gustavus's first drive of the second quarter ended with a 27-yard field goal by Brendan Boche (Jr., Lakeville, Minn.), his first of the season. The Gusties increased their lead to 17-7 on the ensuing UW-River Falls drive as Matt Berkner (So., Sleepy, Eye, Minn.) blocked a punt at the three-yard line, which was recovered by Kevin Krohn (Jr., Richfield, Minn.) for the touchdown. The Gusties then took the wind out of the Falcons' sails on the next drive. On a third-and-11 deep into Gustie territory, Casey Decker (Jr., Mapleton, Minn.) tipped a pass on the left edge, came down with the deflection, and returned it 75 yards for the score. The Gusties led 24-7 at halftime.

"We lost a couple key guys early, and guys had to step up. We excelled in a couple areas we needed to after those injuries took place," said Haugen.

After a scoreless third quarter, UW-River Falls started its comeback effort. The Falcons capped an 11-play drive with a rushing touchdown to bring the score to 24-14. After holding the Gusties scoreless on their next two drives, the Falcons drove 64 yards in 11 plays, bringing to the deficit to three points. The Falcons defense forced another punt on the ensuing possession, getting the ball back at its own 14-yard line with four minutes remaining in the game. The visitors drove into Gustie territory, but the home defense came up big with a fourth down stop and Gustavus was able

to take a knee and run out the clock.

Jordan Sorensen (Sr., St. Peter, Minn.) led the Black and Gold defense with a career-high nine tackles, including a pass breakup. Tyler Jakes (Sr., North Mankato, Minn.) manned the middle, making eight stops, including 1.5 tackles for loss, and a breakup. Veldman completed 6-of-9 passes for 81 yards and a touchdown before leaving the game with an injury. Sam Archer (So., Zimmerman, Minn.) quarterbacked the rest of the game, going 10-for-18 with 101 yards, including 15 carries for six yards. Karim Ortiz (Jr., Cancun, Mexico) was the leading Gustie rusher with 10 carries for 51 yards.

Turnovers proved to be the turning points in the game as the Falcons outgained the Gusties 454-270 in total yards. UW-River Falls also converted 24 first downs, compared to 16 by Gustavus.

"We kicked the ball well and had a really solid day with special teams with the turnover for a touchdown," Haugen said. "Offense isn't always going to score points, you have to find ways to make big plays outside of just one phase of the game. We did that today and as a result we won. I told the players, this is such a big win for our team. Certainly, we're going to have to make some improvements but they're more fun to make when you're 2-0 rather than 1-1."

AUGSBURG 13 GUSTAVUS 35

St. Peter, Minn. (1,255) Hollingsworth Field 65°, Overcast

ST. PETER, Minn. – Trailing 13-0 at halftime with only 79 total yards of offense, the Gustavus football team was in need of a spark. The momentum shifted in the home team's favor on the first drive of the second half with a touchdown, which was followed by four more drives finishing in the endzone, resulting in a 35-13 win over Augsburg on Saturday afternoon. The victory propels the Gusties to 3-0 overall and 1-0 in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, while the Auggies drop to 0-3 overall and 0-1 in the league.

Gustavus tallied 320 yards in the second half for a total of 399 yards. After accumulating 174 yards in the first half, the Auggies were limited to 20 yards in the second and only one first down.

"First off, you have to give Augsburg credit because they came ready to play," Head Coach Peter Haugen said. "They came out really strong and set the tone. They were more physical than we were in the first half. I think the biggest thing is that we played with a lot of heart in the second half. We started to get physical and played the way that we needed to play. It was a mindset that we need to be more physical and need to be sharper."

Midway through the second quarter, Haugen turned to his freshman quarterback Christian Haffner (Lebanon, Tenn.) to give the Auggie defense a different look. Haffner threw only two passes in the second quarter, along with two runs, but the first-year turned it on in the second half. The Liberty High School product finished with nine completions on 11 attempts for 112 yards and three touchdowns. Haffner is the first freshman quarterback to see significant time on the field since Jordan Stolp in 2004.

"He really did a nice job of staying composed and made a couple key throws and runs," Haugen said. "The guys rallied around him and that was good to see."

Haffner directed a six-play, 79-yard drive to start the second half, which ended on a 43-yard touchdown run by Karim Ortiz (Jr., Cancun, Mexico). After a three-and-out forced by the Gustie defense, Haffner and the offense went 63 yards in seven plays, capped by a 10-yard pass to Hunter Johnson (Jr., Cannon Falls, Minn.) to tie the game. After the Brendan Boche (Jr., Lakeville, Minn.) extra point, Gustavus had its first lead of the game, which it would not relinquish the rest of the game.

On the ensuing drive, the Auggies were faced with a fourth-and-13 from the Gustavus 30-yard line. Augsburg elected to go for it and the end result was a 64-yard interception by Brady Miller (So., Delano, Minn.), giving the Gusties the ball at the Auggie 20-yard line. Gustavus took advantage of the turnover, scoring five plays later on a six-yard touchdown pass from Haffner to Jamison Beulke (So., Montgomery, Minn.). The Gusties led 21-13 after the third quarter.

The Black and Gold scored on their first drive of the fourth quarter. The eight-play drive ended on a six-yard rushing score by Ortiz – his second of the game. Haffner tossed his third touchdown of the day with 4:45 left in the game as he found Johnson for a 30-yard strike – his longest completion of the game. The Gustie defense was stout in the fourth quarter, allowing only 18 yards to go along with a sack and forced fumble.

"We started to swarm the ball," Haugen said of the defense in the second half. "Our defense was in attack mode and we had their quarterback on his heels the entire second half and got so much pressure on him that it helped us on the back end to get a nice interception. We did a good job with our pressure and stopping the run all day long, that was really good."

Ortiz had a career-day rushing the ball with 27 carries for 180 yards and two touchdowns. DaiVon Poole (Jr., San Angelo, Texas) added 60 yards on nine carries. Johnson led the receiving corps with seven catches for 97 yards and two touchdowns. Johnson also had 52 kick return yards and 28 punt return yards for 177 all-purpose yards. Leeland Lauti (Jr., Ewa Beach, Hawaii) led the defense with eight stops, including a tackle-for-loss.

Gustavus next travels to Hamline (2-0), who was idle this week, for a 1 p.m. game next Saturday.

"We're looking forward to getting back to work and we've got a lot of improvements to make," Haugen said. "That's a positive thing because we haven't played our best football yet at all. Hamline is off to a great start so it will be a tough test."

HAMLINE 42 GUSTAVUS 40

St. Paul, Minn. (1,515) Klas Field 62°, Cloudy

ST. PAUL, Minn. – The Gustavus and Hamline football teams battled to the bitter end Saturday afternoon at Klas Field, but a touchdown late in the fourth quarter by the host Pipers proved to be the difference in a 42-40 loss for the Gusties. The defeat snaps a 10-game winning streak against the Pipers and marked the first time since 1975 Gustavus lost a game after scoring at least 40 points. Gustavus moves to 3-1 overall and 1-1 in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, while the Pipers remain unbeaten at 3-0 overall and 1-0 in the league.

Hamline quarterback Justice Spriggs was the story of the game as he passed for 475 yards and six touchdowns, completing 29-of-41 attempts. The Gusties limited the Piper ground game to just 17 yards on 29 attempts, but the aerial attack proved to be too much.

Karim Ortiz (Jr., Cancun, Mexico) had another big game rushing the ball with a career-high 34 carries for 155 yards and two touchdowns. First-year quarterback Christian Haffner (Lebanon, Tenn.) completed 14-of-25 passes for 273 yards, two touchdowns, and an interception. Hunter Johnson (Jr., Cannon Falls, Minn.) was the favorite target, hauling in six receptions for 104 yards. Jordan Kahlow (So., Le Sueur, Minn.) led the defense with eight tackles, including a 46-yard interception return for a score.

"We had a few chances to win on offense but didn't get it done today," Head Coach Peter Haugen said. "Some of the mistakes early in the game hurt, but we rallied back in the second half, it just didn't come all the way around. It's a disappointing loss, but we're moving on."

Casey Decker (Jr., Mapleton, Minn.) provided a spark in the third play of the game as he intercepted a pass and returned it 18 yards to the Hamline 32-yard line. On the ensuing drive, Haffner completed a 13-yard pass to George Buchner (Sr., Excelsior, Minn.), but fumbled the ball which was recovered by Hamline at its own one-yard line. The Gusties got the ball back after forcing a punt and responded with a 12-play, 50-yard drive, resulting in a 39-yard field goal off the foot of Brendan Boche (Jr., Lakeville, Minn.). After the first quarter, Gustavus led 3-0.

On the first offensive series of the second quarter, Haffner turned the ball over at midfield with a fumble. The Pipers took advantage and scored seven plays later on a 16-yard pass. The extra point failed and Hamline led 6-3. The Gusties immediately answered with a seven-play, 75-yard drive, culminating with a 24-yard pass and catch from Haffner to Brayton Finch (Fy., Mount Morris, Ill.), giving Gustavus a 10-6 advantage after the Boche extra point.

On the second play of Hamline's ensuing drive, Kahlow jumped a route and returned the interception 46 yards for a touchdown. The Pipers wasted little time to answer as they scored after three plays – two of which went for 40 and 23 yards. Hamline forced a punt on the following drive and its offense once again found the endzone after a seven-play, 62-yard drive. Hamline led 21-17 at halftime.

Gustavus received the second half kick and put together a 12-play scoring drive. Ortiz punched in touchdown from one yard out, giving his squad the lead. The Gustie defense forced a punt after five plays and the offense responded with another scoring drive, this time 69 yards in 11 plays, ending with a four-yard score from Ortiz. Ortiz was the workhorse in the scoring drive with nine carries. Gustavus forced another Hamline punt and was in control of the game heading into the fourth quarter with a 31-21 lead.

The home team wouldn't go down without a fight and proved that over the final 15 minutes of the game. Spriggs completed consecutive passes of 29 and 32 yards on the first possession of the quarter, with the latter resulting in a touchdown to come within three points. Gustavus was forced to punt after nine plays, giving the Pipers the ball back at their own 29-yard line. Hamline regained the lead at 35-31 after a 10-play, 71-yard drive that ended with a four-yard touchdown pass. The momentum then shifted immediately back in the Gusties' favor with the biggest play of the game. Haffner connected with Jamison Beulke for an 82-yard touchdown and Gustavus grabbed back the lead at 38-35 with 4:13 remaining in the game.

Hamline once again took advantage of the long ball on its next drive, which included connections of 33 and 28 yards. The 28-yard completion found the endzone and the Pipers took a 42-38 advantage with 1:35 on the clock. Haffner made a big play on the first play of the ensuing drive with a 34-yard completion to Johnson, but his next pass was picked off, giving the Pipers the ball at their own 12-yard line. The Gusties used all three timeouts on the next possession and ended up getting a safety with 35 seconds remaining the bring the score to 42-40, but the final drive of the game came up short and the Pipers walked away with the victory.

"We had four sacks today so it was good to get a little pressure on the quarterback," Haugen said. "We have to continue to do that. The kicking game was solid today so that was a really good sign. We bounced back there really well. And our young quarterback made some big plays in key spots, and that's an area where we are going to have to continue to grow. We are throwing some young guys into the fire and we'll keep growing and learning and try to get better next week."

Gustavus hosts Concordia at 1 p.m. next Saturday for its Homecoming game.

CONCORDIA 46 GUSTAVUS 21

St. Peter, Minn. (3,147) Hollingsworth Field 70°, Partly Cloudy

ST. PETER, Minn. – Playing from behind the entire game, the Gustavus football team kept the score close through three quarters Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field, but the Cobbers widened the gap in the fourth quarter with three unanswered touchdowns to secure a 46-21 victory on Gustavus's Homecoming. The loss drops the Gusties to 3-2 overall and 1-2 in the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, while the Cobbers improve to 3-1 overall and 2-0 in the league.

The Gustie defense faced a completely different style of offense from the opponent than it saw a week ago when Hamline amassed nearly 500 yards through the air. Today, it was the ground game of Concordia that carried the load, totaling 400 rushing yards. The Cobbers ran the ball 57 times compared to just nine passing attempts for 18 yards. Chad Johnson paced the Cobber rushing attack with 21 carries for 190 yards and four touchdowns.

On Concordia's second drive of the game it reached the endzone on an 11-play, 78-yard drive. The extra point failed and the Cobbers led 6-0 after the first quarter. The visitors increased their lead to 13-0 two minutes into the second quarter on Johnson's second score of the day. The two teams traded a pair of possessions, which included back-to-back turnovers midway through the quarter, setting up a 10-play, 65-yard scoring drive for the Gusties. Christian Haffner (Fy., Lebanon, Tenn.) connected with Josh Kirk (Fy., Garvin, Minn.) for a five-yard touchdown with 14 seconds remaining in the half and Concordia took a 13-7 advantage into the locker room.

The Cobbers extended their lead to 20-7 on their first drive of the second half, reaching the endzone after seven plays and 70 yards. The Gusties wasted little time to answer as Haffner found Kirk streaking down the right side for a 77-yard pass and catch, cutting the deficit to 20-14 with 7:40 in the third quarter. But just like that, the Cobbers struck back by returning the ensuing kickoff 60 yards, setting up a 16-yard rushing touchdown two plays later for a 26-14 lead.

Gustavus kept the Cobbers in check by forcing a fumble, which was recovered by Chris Nelson (Jr., New London, Minn.) at the Cobber 17-yard line. The Gusties took advantage of the turnover with a six-yard touchdown pass from Haffner to Jamison Beulke (So., Montgomery, Minn.) to bring the score to 26-21 with 1:50 left in the third quarter. But the fourth quarter was all Concordia as it scored touchdowns on all three of its drives, while shutting the Gusties out in the final 15 minutes.

Haffner completed 19-of-29 passes for 234 yards and three touchdowns, including an interception. Beulke had the most catches with four for 33 yards and a touchdown, while Kirk added three receptions for 96 yards and a score. Karim Ortiz (Jr., Cancun, Mexico) led the ground game with 18 carries for 45 yards. Leeland Lauti (Jr., Ewa Beach, Hawaii) paced the defense with 11 tackles.

Gustavus enters its bye week and then returns to the gridiron Oct. 15 at Bethel, who lost to 42-27 to Saint John's today.
