THE SERIES: Saturday's game marks the third all-time meeting between the Gustavus and Martin Luther football programs. The Gusties lead the series 2-0. The last meeting was Sept. 11, 1999 in New Ulm, Minn. as Gustavus won 38-14. The Knights opened the first quarter with a 7-0 lead but the Gusties responded with 31 unanswered points. Ryan Britz had three rushing touchdowns and 100 yards, while Travis Prunty added 24 carries for 106 yards. Gustavus accumulated 450 yards of total offense and held the Knights to 331 yards.

GUSTIES BEGIN 102nd SEASON: Gustavus embarks on its 102nd season Saturday as it travels to Martin Luther College for a non-conference matchup. Over the previous 101 seasons, the Gusties have compiled a record of 496-356-21, including 22 MIAC championships (second most in the league). Gustavus is four wins away from claiming its 500th all-time victory, and would join the company of 58 NCAA Division III football programs (out of 246 total) with at least 500 wins.

IN THE POLLS: Gustavus received 36 points in the MIAC Preseason Coaches Poll and is voted No. 5 in the nine-team league. Defending champion St. Thomas is No. 1, followed by No. 2 Saint John's, No. 3 Concordia, and No. 4 Bethel. Martin Luther received 28 points in the UMAC Preseason Coaches Poll and is voted No. 6 in the nine-team league. MacMurray is No. 1, followed by St. Scholastica at No. 2 and Northwestern at No. 3.

SAINT PETER, Minn. – After three weeks of preseason camp, the Gustavus football team is set to kick off its 2018 campaign Saturday in nearby New Ulm, Minn. against Martin Luther College. Last season's pedestrian 5-5 overall record and 4-4 mark in the MIAC for a fifth-place finish, which was hindered by injuries at key positions, are in the rear-view mirror and expectations are high within the Golden Gustie program.

"We are just trying to stay in the moment in getting prepared for the season," said Head Coach Peter Haugen, who is in his 10th season at the helm. "The winning and losing will take care of itself. We're not trying to build this around another 5-5 season. The expectations are high. What gives us the most confidence is what took place in the offseason. The level of commitment that our players showed and the level of leadership they demonstrated was great. It looked like a different team when they came back to practice in the spring, both mentally and physically."

Quarterbacks

Key losses: none

Players to watch: Michael Veldman (Sr., Becker, Minn.), Carter Kopet (Fy., Cleveland, Minn.), and Brett Hufendick (So., Edina, Minn.)

Notes:

• Despite missing four games due to injury last season, Veldman earned MIAC All-Conference honorable mention after leading the team to a 4-2 record. He completed 143-of-227 passes for 1,931 yards, 18 touchdowns, and five interceptions.

• Kopet set Minnesota State High School League records for completions (798), passing yards (11,214), and passing touchdowns (186) playing nine-man football at Cleveland. Head Coach Peter Haugen's comment: "Michael had a great spring and came ready to go this fall. Carter Kopet and Brett Hufendick are battling for the backup spot. I'm excited about the depth at quarterback."

Running Backs

Key loss: Karim Ortiz

Players to watch: Max Kahn (So., Medina, Minn.) and David Peal (Fy., Worcester, Mass.)

Notes:

• Ortiz is gone to graduation after leading the team with 577 yards and six touchdowns.

• Jamison Beulke (Sr., Montgomery, Minn.), a receiver, is the top returning rusher after posting 55 carries for 264 yards last year.

• Max Kahn starts the season as RB1 after tallying eight carries for 37 yards last year.

Coach's comment: "The backfield is still in flux, but our tight end, Brayton Finch (Jr., Mount Morris, Ill.), he will get some carries out of the backfield. Between Max Kahn, Rafael Soriano (Jr., Guadalajara, Mexico), Nate Schroeffer (So., Sleepy Eye, Minn.), and David Peal, there's really been a good competition."

Tight Ends/Fullbacks

Key losses: None

Players to watch: Brayton Finch and Hunter O'Bert (So., Eden Prairie, Minn.)

Notes:

• Finch returns as the starter after leading tight ends last season in catches (28) and yards (412), which garnered MIAC All-Confer-

ence Second Team honors.

• Michael Hensch (Sr., North Branch, Minn.), an All-American thrower on the track & field team, returns to the football squad after taking last season off. As a sophomore, Hensch had seven catches for 61 yards.

Coach's comment: "Brayton Finch will lead this group. He's very talented as a receiver and has become really good in the blocking game. He's a guy that we are going to use in a lot of different places. Michael Hensch and Zachary Jakes (Fy., North Mankato, Minn.) will be the primary fullbacks when we are in a two-tight end set."

Receivers

Key loss: Hunter Johnson

Players to watch: Brice Panning (Jr., Hamburg, Minn.), Josh Kirk (Jr., Garvin, Minn.), and Jamison Beulke

Notes:

• Kirk led the receiving corps last year with 38 catches for 636 yards and six touchdowns.

• Panning hauled in the most touchdowns with seven, while catching 27 passes for 397 yards.

• Buelke averaged a team-high 70.8 receiving yards per game in five appearances at receiver last year.

Coach's comment: "We have some really talented guys and that group is led by Brice Panning and Josh Kirk. They both have had a really great camp. We have a lot of depth there as well. Jamison Beulke is a huge part of that group with experience in the slot and in the backfield. The group behind them is Ellis Hirman (Sr., Zumbrota, Minn.), Charlie Wachtler (So., White Bear Lake, Minn.), and Todd Johnson (So., Minneapolis, Minn.). We have a lot of guys with talent and who know the system well."

Offensive Line

Key losses: Zach LaFavor, Ethan Stordahl, and Matt VanSomeren

Players to watch: Tommy Jech (Sr., Chatfield, Minn.) and Blake Sikes (Jr., Valrico, Fla.)

Notes:

• Jech, a team captain this year, leads the group as the starting center for the second consecutive season.

• Sikes returns to his left guard position after starting all 10 games last year.

Coach's comment: "Surrounding Jech at center, Logan Holley (So., Fort Worth, Texas) and Blake Sikes will be our guards with Gunnar Johnson (So., St. Cloud, Minn.) and Tommy Bigaoutte (So., North Mankato, Minn.) at tackle. There are also some young guys that we are excited about in terms of our freshman class."

Defensive Line

Key losses: Chris Nelson and Kevin Krohn

Players to watch: Sam Jones (So., Jacksonville, Fla.), Zeke Erickson (Jr., Clarks Grove, Minn.), Tanner Sparrow (Sr., Edina, Minn.)

Notes:

• The group lost its top tackler in Krohn to graduation (42 tackles).

• Erickson is the defensive line's most experience player having started all 10 games last year with 17 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss.

Coach's comment: "The depth on the defensive line is strong. We have about seven guys who we feel will be big contributors on the

line."

Linebackers

Key loss: Casey Decker

Players to watch: Matt Berkner (Sr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.) and Jake Boykin (Jr., Las Cruces, N.M.)

Notes:

• Gustavus's lone MIAC First Team All-Conference selection last season in Decker is lost to graduation. Decker led the team with five sacks and 10 tackles for loss.

• Berkner and Boykin led the team in tackles last season with 69 and 64, respectively. Berkner also led the team with two interceptions. Both Berkner and Boykin are starting middle linebackers for the second-straight season.

Coach's comment: "Outside of Berkner and Boykin will be Avery Bachman (Jr., St. Peter, Minn.) and Ben Rengel (Sr., Sartell, Minn.). Our linebackers are solid and there is some experience there."

Defensive Backs

Key losses: Nathan Hajder and Drew Fredericksen

Players to watch: Dutch Claybaugh (Sr., Kaneohe, Hawaii), Brady Miller (Sr., Delano, Minn.), and Jordan Kahlow (Sr., Le Sueur, Minn.)

Notes:

• Hajder and Fredericksen led the secondary in tackles last season with 43 and 37, respectively.

• Claybaugh, Miller, Kahlow, and Matthew Montplaisir (Jr., Buffalo, Minn.) accounted for 123 tackles combined in 2017, led by Claybaugh's 35.

• The 2017 secondary made five interceptions.

Coach's comment: "Dutch Claybaugh has the most experience along with Brady Miller, Matthew Montplaisir, and Jordan Kahlow. Kaleb Scott (Fy., Gardena, Calif.) is an up-and-coming guy at corner who's had a great camp. Austin Fest (So., West Des Moines, Iowa) and Jake Krull (Jr., Plymouth, Minn.) are coming back from knee injuries at safety."

Specialists

Key losses: Brenden Boche and Casey Decker

Players to watch: Brayton Finch and Avery Bachman

Notes:

• The starting kicker and punter the past two seasons (Boche and Decker) are both lost to graduation. Boche owns seven school kicking records.

• Finch will serve as the starting punter and kickoff kicker to start the season.

• Bachman will return kicks and punts. He led the team in kick returns last year with 17 for 370 yards (21.8 average).

Coach's comment: "We still have a lot to learn in the kicking game. Brayton Finch is the punter with Bachman as a backup. Finch on kickoffs and extra points will be Sawyer Johnson (Jr., Mounds View, Minn.). We are a work in progress."

Peter Haugen, a native of Minneapolis and a 1991 graduate of Bethel University, is in his 10th year as head football coach at Gustavus Adolphus College for the 2018 season.

Last season, the Gustavus football team posted a 5-5 overall record with a MIAC mark of 4-4. The Golden Gusties started the season winning three of their first four games and averaged 36 points per game during that time. The Gusties bookend the 2017 campaign with shutout performances, beating Westminster 38-0 to start the year and then topping Carleton 52-0 to end the season.

In the MIAC's 2017 postseason honors, defensive end/punter Casey Decker (Sr., Mapleton, Minn.) earned first team all-conference honors. Second team members included Brayton Finch (So., Mount Morris, Ill.), Kevin Krohn (Sr., Richfield, Minn.), Matt Berkner (Jr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.), and Brendan Boche (Sr., Lakeville, Minn.). In addition, Hunter Johnson (Sr., Cannon Falls, Minn.), Karim Ortiz (Sr., Cancun, Mexico), and Michael Veldman (Jr., Becker, Minn.) earned honorable mention honors.

In nine seasons at the head of the Gustavus Adolphus football program, Haugen has compiled an overall record of 42-48 and a MIAC record of 30-42.

Haugen, who was the head football coach at Washburn High School for 15 years prior to coming to Gustavus, compiled an overall record of 111-44 during that span, while winning 11 league championships and posting a league record of 76-8. He directed the Millers to the Class AAAA quarterfinals in 2007 finishing with a mark of 9-3. In his last season as the Millers' head coach, Haugen's squad posted a mark of 8-2. While building the program at Washburn, Haugen increased player participation from 35 players in 1994 to 110 players in 2008. He also implemented academic monitoring and meal programs for student-athletes as well as creating and directing the highly successful Washburn Athlet-

ic Leadership Academy. He has also served as the chair of the Minneapolis Football Conference and he is an active clinician working at many local and regional clinics including the NIKE Coach of the Year clinic. Haugen was also a member of the Metro coaching staff for the Minnesota All-Star game in 1998. He started his coaching career at his alma mater, serving as the offensive line coach during the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

A three-sport standout at Bethel, Haugen was a starting tight end on the football team, a starting goaltender on the hockey team, and a starting catcher on the baseball team in the late '80s and early '90s. In his senior year, he earned all-conference honors in football, and was selected Most Valuable Player of the hockey team.

Haugen became the 17th head coach in the 101-season history of Gustavus football in 2009. The Golden Gusties have a long and storied football tradition that includes 22 MIAC titles. The program ranks in the top-50 all-time in Division III (out of 246 institutions) with a 58.0 winning percentage (496-356-21). The Gusties will soon join an elite group of 57 NCAA Division III institutions whose football teams have won 500 games.

Along with great teams, Gustavus has also been blessed with many outstanding individual players, which includes 25 players who have received All-America honors, 13 who have received CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, and five who have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships.

Charlie Cosgrove

Co-Offensive Coordinator, Offensive Line

Charlie Cosgrove is in his 10th season on the Gustavus football coaching staff, serving as the team's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach for the seventh straight year. Prior to coming to Gustavus, Cosgrove served as a graduate assistant at St. Cloud State University for two years.

A 2005 graduate of St. Cloud State with a degree in mass communications, Cosgrove was a stand-out defensive end for the Huskie football squad, earning All-Conference honors three times and being named to the National Football Coaches Association All-America Team in 2005. He was also named the North Central Conference Defensive Lineman of the Year his senior season. In St. Cloud State football history, Cosgrove graduated ranked first in tackles for loss (47.5) and quarterback hurries (28), and second in sacks (23.5) and forced fumbles (7).

Carlin Shoemaker

Co-Offensive Coordinator, Quarterbacks

Carlin Shoemaker returns for his seventh season on the Gustavus Adolphus football coaching staff as the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

A 2003 graduate of Bethel High School in Spanaway, Washington, Shoemaker brings an extensive offensive background to the Gustavus coaching staff. Shoemaker completed his undergraduate studies in the spring of 2007, earning a degree in psychology from Kenyon College. While at Kenyon, Shoemaker went on to have one of the best receiving careers in the history of Lords football. A two-time captain in 2006 and 2007, Carlin made a total of 239 catches for 3,000 yards with 18 receiving touchdowns over his four-year career. His 239 receptions rank second all-time at Kenyon, while his total yards mark ranks third. To go along with his offensive production, he is also the program's top kick returner, recording 93 returns for 1,873 yards. A three-time All North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC) performer in 2004, 2006, and 2007, Carlin concluded his career by being named the team's MVP his senior season.

Following his playing career at Kenyon, Shoemaker served as a graduate assistant coach at St. Cloud State University from 2008 to 2010. While on staff at St. Cloud State, he served as the wide receivers coach. Shoemaker made his way into the MIAC with Carleton College in 2010 where he served as the quarterbacks coach. After a year in Northfield and prior to taking the job at Gustavus, he took a position as the co-offensive coordinator at his alma mater, Kenyon, for the 2011 season.

Carlin currently resides in St. Peter with his wife, Courtney.

Lucas Kleinschrodt

Defensive Coordinator, Defensive Backs

Lucas Kleinschrodt begins his third season on staff for the Gustavus Adolphus football team in 2018, and second season as the defensive coordinator.

A native of Alden, Minnesota, Kleinschrodt graduated from Alden-Conger High School in 2010. From there, Lucas attended Gustavus where he graduated in 2013 with an undergraduate degree in Health Fitness.

Kleinschrodt was a four-year letterwinner for the Gusties as a linebacker. He recorded 146 tackles in 38 career games at Gustavus, ranking fifth on his team with a career-high 42 tackles his senior

season in 2013. He finished his career with three interceptions, two fumble recoveries, four pass break-ups and four tackles for loss.

Kleinschrodt currently lives in St. Peter with his wife, Ali.

Christian White Kickers

Christian White is in his 10th year as a coach under head coach Peter Haugen. White, who has assisted the Gustavus football program off and on over the past decade, specifically works with the team's kickers and punters.

A native of Northfield, Minn., White was a four-year member of the Gustavus football team from 1997-2000. A First-Team All-Conference place-kicker in 1999, Christian majored in management and earned his degree in 2001 from Gustavus. Following his Gustavus career, White began flight school in Orlando, Fla. in June of 2001. He worked as a flight instructor in Atlanta for a year before taking jobs at Mesaba Airlines and Skyway Airlines of Milwaukee. Christian is currently a captain for Air Wisconsin Airlines Corporation, the largest independently held regional airline in the United States, a position he has held since November of 2005. White currently resides in Northfield, Minn.

Zach Vine Defensive Line
