THE SERIES: Saturday's game marks the 65th all-time meeting between Gustavus and St. Olaf on the gridiron with the Gusties leading the series 39-25. Gustavus has won the past five meetings with the last loss coming in the 2012 season. Last season the Gusties defeated the Oles 41-13 at Hollingsworth Field. The rushing game guided the Gusties to victory as they ran 41 times for 224 yards and three touchdowns, led by a 200-yard performance from Karim Ortiz.

LAST TIME OUT: The Gustavus football team nearly knocked off No. 7 St. Thomas on a rainy Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field, but a fourth quarter comeback propelled the visitors to a 14-13 nail-biting win. The Gusties held St. Thomas scoreless through three quarters, which hasn't been done since its 2011 NCAA semifinal loss to UW-Whitewater. The Gusties outgained the Tommies 355-279 in total yards of offense, but three interceptions kept the home squad from putting more points on the board.

Veldman completed 27-of-48 passes for 382 yards, two touchdowns, and three interceptions. Beulke was the top target with 11 catches for 89 yards and a touchdown. Brice Panning (Jr., Hamburg, Minn.) caught six passes for 158 yards.

Jake Boykin (Jr., Las Cruses, N.M.) and Avery Bachman (Jr., Saint Peter, Minn.) led the defense with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively.

GAME NOTES

SCOUTING THE GUSTIES

Gustavus is hoping to end the 2018 season on a high note after nearly knocking off No. 7 St. Thomas on Senior Day last week. A fourth quarter comeback propelled the Tommies to a 14-13 nail-biting win. The Gusties held St. Thomas scoreless through three quarters, which hasn't been done since its 2011 NCAA semifinal loss to UW-Whitewater. The Gusties outgained the Tommies 355-279 in total yards of offense, but three interceptions kept the home squad from putting more points on the board.

With one game left to play this season, the Gusties average 28.2 points and 348.1 yards of total offense per game – both fourth best in the MIAC. They've moved the chains on 55-of-121 third down attempts, leading the MIAC with a 45 percent third down conversion rate. On the defensive side of the ball, Gustavus has caused 18 fumbles and totaled 733 tackles – most in the MIAC.

The return game continues to be a strength with the Black and Gold averaging 12.8 yards per punt return and 20.8 yards per kick return – second and third in the league, respectively. Gustavus has proven itself to be disciplined as the least penalized team in the MIAC with an average of just 4.6 penalities per game.

First-year David Peal (Worcester, Mass.) leads the rushing attack with 92 carries for 388 yards and eight touchdowns (3rd/MIAC). Michael Veldman (Sr., Becker, Minn.) has completed 58.5 percent of his passes for 2248 yards (1st/MIAC), 16 touchdowns, and nine interceptions. Brice Panning (Jr., Hamburg, Minn.) continues to be the top target, averaging 92.2 receiving yards per game (2nd/MIAC) and 19.8 yards per catch (2nd/MIAC). Inside linebackers Matt Berkner (Sr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.) and Jake Boykin (Jr., Las Cruces, N.M.) lead the defense with 72 and 54 tackles, respectively. Berkner's 8.0 tackles per game rank fifth in the MIAC.

SCOUTING THE OLES

After starting the season 5-0 and cracking the top-25 polls, St. Olaf has since lost its last four games, most recently losing 21-10 to Concordia. The Oles led 10-7 early in third quarter before the Cobbers answered with a 95-yard kickoff return touchdown to take the lead for good.

St. Olaf averages 23.8 points and 318.4 total yards of offense per game. The Oles like to make downfield passes, averaging 14.1 yards per completions, which ranks second in the MIAC. They convert on 32 percent of third downs and keep penalties to a minimum with 71 total on the season.

Ri. Johnson III leads the rushing attack with 537 yards on 118 carries and five touchdowns. Khayleb Willis is second with 509 yards on 122 carries and six touchdowns. Johnson III has completed 48.8 percent of his passes for 1485 yards, 18 touchdowns, and eight interceptions. Gabe Alada leads the receiving corps with 30 catches for 638 yards and eight touchdowns. Luke Dahl and Shiloh Goodwin are the top defenders with 68 and 63 tackles, respectively.

ANOTHER MIAC WEEKLY HONOR

Brice Panning hauled in six catches for a career-high 158 yards as Gustavus nearly knocked off No. 7-ranked St.

Thomas in a 14-13 loss over the weekend. Five of Panning's catches went for first downs, highlighted by three catches of 30-plus yards, including a career-long 58-yard reception. For his performance, Panning has been named MIAC Offensive Player of the Week. This is Panning's second MIAC weekly award as he was named Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 15. This is the fourth-straight week the Gusties have had an athlete MIAC Athlete of the Week after Panning (10/15) and Jacob Lamb (10/22) earned Special Teams Player of the Week, and Michael Veldman earned Offensive Player of the Week (10/29)

STOUT DEFENSE

After allowing more than 300 yards of total offense in the first four games of the season, the Gustie defense flipped the script by holding opponents to less than 200 total yards in the following three games. That marked the first time since the 1987 MIAC championship season that Gustavus held its opponents to less than 200 total yards in three-straight games. The recent defensive display also includes four straight games of allowing less than 100 yards rushing. It's the first time since 2006 the Gustavus defense has held opponents to less than 100 rushing yards in four consecutive games.

BEULKE RETURNS

After missing the first eight games of the season due to concussion protocol, Jamison Beulke returns to the Gustie backfield for Senior Day. In just five games last season, Beulke was a dual threat out of the backfield and as a receiver. He averaged 4.8 yards per carry, 264 rushing yards, and three touchdowns on the ground, and added 13.1 yards per reception with 354 receiving yards.

FOLLOW THE GUSTIES ON KNUJ

KNUJ AM 860 out of New Ulm, Minn. once again broadcasts all 10 Gustavus regular season games this year. The voice of the Golden Gusties, Tom Wheeler, handles the play-by-play duties for the 13th consecutive season. Wheeler is once again joined by 1984 Gustavus graduate and former Gustie football player Ken Ericson on the live call of this year's games.

Fans can listen to the KNUJ broadcasts on the Internet through the Gustavus Athletics website. Gustavus provides a high definition video stream of all home games for viewing on your computer, tablet, or smart phone through GameCentral by Stretch Internet. GameCentral is available at portal.stretchinternet.com/gac.

GUSTIES AROUND THE GLOBE

The 2018 Gustavus football team features a total of 100 players from 13 different states and, for the seventh-straight year, countries outside of the United States. Of those 100 players, 73 claim Minnesota as their native state. Five players call Florida home, four from California, three from Texas, two from Hawaii, two from New Mexico, two from lowa, and one player each from Massachusetts, Louisiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Colorado, and Alaska represent the Stars and Stripes. For the first time in Head Coach Peter Haugen's tenure, three countries outside the United States are represented in Mexico, Germany, and Ghana.

SEASON 102

The Gustavus football team continues its 102nd season Saturday at Hollingsworth Field. Over the previous 101 seasons, the Gusties have compiled an overall record of 496-356-21, including a record of 232-131-8 in Saint Peter. With 22 Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) championships, Gustavus has claimed the second-most league titles in the 99-year history of the conference. Only Saint John's (32) has claimed more MIAC championships.

Peter Haugen, a native of Minneapolis and a 1991 graduate of Bethel University, is in his 10th year as head football coach at Gustavus Adolphus College for the 2018 season.

Last season, the Gustavus football team posted a 5-5 overall record with a MIAC mark of 4-4. The Golden Gusties started the season winning three of their first four games and averaged 36 points per game during that time. The Gusties bookend the 2017 campaign with shutout performances, beating Westminster 38-0 to start the year and then topping Carleton 52-0 to end the season.

In the MIAC's 2017 postseason honors, defensive end/punter Casey Decker (Sr., Mapleton, Minn.) earned first team all-conference honors. Second team members included Brayton Finch (So., Mount Morris, III.), Kevin Krohn (Sr., Richfield, Minn.), Matt Berkner (Jr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.), and Brendan Boche (Sr., Lakeville, Minn.). In addition, Hunter Johnson (Sr., Cannon Falls, Minn.), Karim Ortiz (Sr., Cancun, Mexico), and Michael Veldman (Jr., Becker, Minn.) earned honorable mention honors.

In nine seasons at the head of the Gustavus Adolphus football program, Haugen has compiled an overall record of 42-48 and a MIAC record of 30-42.

Haugen, who was the head football coach at Washburn High School for 15 years prior to coming to Gustavus, compiled an overall record of 111-44 during that span, while winning 11 league championships and posting a league record of 76–8. He directed the Millers to the Class AAAA quarterfinals in 2007 finishing with a mark of 9–3. In his last season as the Millers' head coach, Haugen's squad posted a mark of 8–2. While building the program at Washburn, Haugen increased player participation from 35 players in 1994 to 110 players in 2008. He also implemented academic monitoring and

meal programs for student-athletes as well as creating and directing the highly successful Washburn Athletic Leadership Academy. He has also served as the chair of the Minneapolis Football Conference and he is an active clinician working at many local and regional clinics including the NIKE Coach of the Year clinic. Haugen was also a member of the Metro coaching staff for the Minnesota All-Star game in 1998. He started his coaching career at his alma mater, serving as the offensive line coach during the 1992 and 1993 seasons.

A three-sport standout at Bethel, Haugen was a starting tight end on the football team, a starting goaltender on the hockey team, and a starting catcher on the baseball team in the late '80s and early '90s. In his senior year, he earned all-conference honors in football, and was selected Most Valuable Player of the hockey team.

Haugen became the 17th head coach in the 101-season history of Gustavus football in 2009. The Golden Gusties have a long and storied football tradition that includes 22 MIAC titles. The program ranks in the top-50 all-time in Division III (out of 246 institutions) with a 58.0 winning percentage (496–356–21). The Gusties will soon join an elite group of 57 NCAA Division III institutions whose football teams have won 500 games.

Along with great teams, Gustavus has also been blessed with many outstanding individual players, which includes 31 players who have received All-America honors, 16 who have received CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, and five who have received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships.

CHARLIE COSGROVE

CO-OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR, OFFENSIVE LINE

Charlie Cosgrove is in his 10th season on the Gustavus football coaching staff, serving as the team's co-offensive coordinator and offensive line coach for the seventh straight year. Prior to coming to Gustavus, Cosgrove served as a graduate assistant at St. Cloud State University for two years.

A 2005 graduate of St. Cloud State with a degree in mass communications, Cosgrove was a standout defensive end for the Huskie football squad, earning All-Conference honors three times and being named to the National Football Coaches Association All-America Team in 2005. He was also named the North Central Conference Defensive Lineman of the Year his senior season. In St. Cloud State football history, Cosgrove graduated ranked first in tackles for loss (47.5) and quarterback hurries (28), and second in sacks (23.5) and forced fumbles (7).

CARLIN SHOEMAKER

CO-OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR, QUARTERBACKS

Carlin Shoemaker returns for his seventh season on the Gustavus Adolphus football coaching staff as the co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

A 2003 graduate of Bethel High School in Spanaway, Washington, Shoemaker brings an extensive offensive background to the Gustavus coaching staff. Shoemaker completed his undergraduate studies in the spring of 2007, earning a degree in psychology from Kenyon College. While at Kenyon, Shoemaker went on to have one of the best receiving careers in the history of Lords football. A two-time captain in 2006 and 2007, Carlin made a total of 239 catches for 3,000 yards with 18 receiving touchdowns over his four-year career. His 239 receptions rank second all-time at Kenyon, while his total yards mark ranks third. To go along with his offensive production, he is also the program's top kick returner, recording 93 returns for 1,873 yards. A three-time All North Coast Athletic Conference (NCAC) performer in 2004, 2006, and 2007, Carlin concluded his career by being named the team's MVP his senior season.

Following his playing career at Kenyon, Shoemaker served as a graduate assistant coach at St. Cloud State University from 2008 to 2010. While on staff at St. Cloud State, he served as the wide receivers coach. Shoemaker made his way into the MIAC with Carleton College in 2010 where he served as the quarterbacks coach. After a year in Northfield and prior to taking the job at Gustavus, he took a position as the co-offensive coordinator at his alma mater, Kenyon, for the 2011 season.

Carlin currently resides in St. Peter with his wife, Courtney.

Lucas Kleinschrodt begins his third season on staff for the Gustavus Adolphus football team in 2018, and second season as the defensive coordinator.

A native of Alden, Minnesota, Kleinschrodt graduated from Alden-Conger High School in 2010. From there, Lucas attended Gustavus where he graduated in 2013 with an undergraduate degree in Health Fitness.

Kleinschrodt was a four-year letterwinner for the Gusties as a line-backer. He recorded 146 tackles in 38 career games at Gustavus, rank-

ing fifth on his team with a career-high 42 tackles his senior season in 2013. He finished his career with three interceptions, two fumble recoveries, four pass break-ups and four tackles for loss.

It took some time for the Gustavus football team to find its footing Saturday in the season opener at Martin Luther College, but after trailing by two at halftime the Gusties made the necessary adjustments to outscore the Knights 14-0 in the final 30 minutes and came out on top 32-20.

"The adjustment in the second half really had to take place within our hearts," Head Coach Peter Haugen said. "We were really jacked up at the beginning of the game and I thought we were going to come out strong, and we did in the first minute of the game, but it may have gotten us a little complacent. You have to give Martin Luther credit. They gave us some more man coverage than we anticipated, but we made a couple adjustments there and settled down in the second half."

Martin Luther established its rushing game with 223 yards on the ground, but the Gustie defense limited the Knights to 84 yards through the air. Conversely, the Gusties had more success in the passing game with 248 yards compared to 106 yards on the ground for a total of 354 yards.

On the first play from scrimmage, the Gustie defense forced and recovered a fumble, which turned into six points four plays later on a three-yard rushing touchdown by Brayton Finch (Jr., Mount Morris, Ill.). But the majority of the first half belonged to the home team as it responded with three touchdowns over its next six drives. A 70-yard scoring drive gave MLC a 7-6 lead with 11:47 left in the first quarter. The Knights increased their lead to 13-6 on their next possession with a 10-play, 65-yard drive.

Early in the second quarter, Gustavus brought the score within one after a seven-play 67-yard drive, capped by a Michael Veldman (Sr., Becker, Minn.) to Hunter O'Bert (So., Eden Prairie, Minn.) two-yard touchdown pass. But the Knights answered right back by recovering a muffed punt and driving 23 yards in six plays to increase their lead to 20-12 with 2:27 left in the half.

The Gusties were able to put together a nine-play, 66-yard scoring drive on their last possession of the half as Veldman connected with Finch on a four-yard strike to make the score 20-18 at halftime.

After trading three-and-outs to start the third quarter, Gustavus got the ball back at the Martin Luther 20 ensuing a six-yard punt. On the next play, Veldman once again found Finch, this time down the left side for a 20-yard touchdown. The scoring play gave the Black and Gold a lead they would not relinquish.

After the Finch touchdown, the Knights had four more possessions, but each ended with Gustavus getting the ball back. Late in the third quarter, Veldman capped a six-play, 82-yard drive by lowering his shoulder for a six-yard touchdown run, making the score 32-20 which

would stand for the remainder of the game.

Martin Luther had 48 offensive plays in the second half, but the Gustie defense did not allow a score in the final 30 minutes. The Knights saw some success on third down, converting 11-of-23 chances along with 3-of-7 fourth downs. Gustavus was 5-for-10 on third down.

Veldman finished the day completing 20-of-35 passes for 248 yards and three touchdowns along with running one across the goal stripe. Brice Panning (Jr., Hamburg, Minn.) was his top target with seven catches for 143 yards and a long of 43. Finch had a productive day both on the ground and in the aerial attack with 13 carries for 57 yards and a touchdown along with four receptions for 43 yards and two scores. Matt Berkner (Sr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.) led the defense with 11 tackles.

"We need to do a better job of taking care of the ball. That's key," Haugen said. "And we need to be better at the tackle point. We had a few opportunities to get them into fourth down and we just need to wrap up there."

Despite holding a 17-0 lead though 43 minutes of play Saturday, the Gustavus football team suffered a deflating 24-23 overtime loss to UW-Stout in the home opener. The Blue Devils scored the game-tying touchdown with eight seconds remaining in regulation, scored a touchdown on their first overtime possession, and blocked the would-be game-tying extra point to complete the improbable comeback.

UW-Stout outgained the Gusties 351-308 with 182 rushing yards. Gustavus totaled 210 yards through the air and 98 on the ground.

The first quarter proved to be a defensive battle with both Gustavus drives ending on punts, while two UW-Stout drives ended on missed field goals of 47 and 45 yards.

It wasn't until the Gusties' fifth possession that they found the endzone on a 14-yard touchdown pass from Michael Veldman (Sr., Becker, Minn.) to Brayton Finch (Jr., Mount Morris, III.) with 6:10 remaining in the first half. The Gusties took a 10-0 lead on their next drive as Sawyer Johnson's (Jr., Mounds View, Minn.) 32-yard field goal went through the uprights.

Gustavus's defense held UW-Stout scoreless on all six of its first half drives, which included 30 plays.

The home team gained a 17-0 advantage on its first drive of the second half as David Peal (Fy., Worcester, Mass.) capped an eight-play, 45-yard series with a five-yard touchdown run. The bend-but-don't break Gustie defense finally gave up a field goal with 1:54 left in the third quarter.

On their first drive of the fourth quarter, the Blue Devils found the endzone for the first time on a 15-yard pass to make the score 17-10. Each team ended their next drives on punts before the Gusties drove 58 yards in nine plays and were threatening to score, but the momentum quickly turned as the visitors intercepted a pass at their own 32-yard line. The Blue Devils proceeded to go 64 yards in 17 plays, capped by a four-yard touchdown pass with eight seconds on the clock, forcing overtime.

UW-Stout started overtime with a touchdown after five plays. The Gusties immediately answered with a 25-yard touchdown strike from Veldman to Ellis Hirman (Sr., Zumbrota, Minn.), but the extra point was blocked to end the game.

Veldman completed 20-of-41 passes for 210 yards, two touchdowns, and two interceptions. Finch was the top target with six catches for 51 yards and a touchdown. The junior tight end also rushed a team-high 16 times for 75 yards. Josh Kirk (Jr., Garvin, Minn.) posted 128 all-purpose yards, highlighted by 111 kick return yards. Matt Berkner (Sr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.) led the defense for the second straight game, totaling 12 tackles.

In the first home night game since 1988, the Gustavus football team dropped a 45-13 decision to No. 9 Saint John's on Saturday night at Saint Peter High School's Floyd B. Johnson Memorial Field. The Gusties drop to 1-2 overall and 0-1 in the MIAC, while the Johnnies move to 2-0 overall and 1-0 in the league. The game was moved back to 7 p.m. from 1 p.m. due to afternoon heat and humidity levels that would have warranted significant delays.

A 15-yard throw-back pass from Michael Veldman (Sr., Becker, Minn.) to Brayton Finch (Jr., Mount Morris, III.) midway through the second quarter brought the Gustie deficit to 17-13, but the Johnnies were able to add another touchdown with 2:24 remaining in the half and held the home team scoreless the rest of the way. A 92-yard blocked field goal return for a touchdown put the game out of reach early in the fourth.

"In the fourth quarter, we need to kick a field goal and that gets us within two scores, but it gets blocked and goes back the other way. There are some holes in our kicking game right now," Head Coach Peter Haugen said. "Our kick coverage was spectacular tonight. Kickoff return was okay and we punted okay, but the PAT and field goals have been inconsistent so we'll have to figure that out."

Tonight's result may not have been favorable for Gustavus, but it was more than a game. It was an event that brought together the Gustavus and Saint Peter communities. Gusties and "townies," the affectionate name for the locals, enjoyed an atmosphere that may never happen again. It was the first night game Gustavus has hosted since Sept. 10, 1988 when it beat UW-Superior 45-14 under the lights of old Hollingsworth Field.

Gustavus and Saint Peter High School also rekindled a field-sharing use that dates back 89 years. Gustavus had the first lighted football field in Minnesota (and perhaps the Midwest) and played the first night game in 1929. That same year, Saint Peter High School used the field and gained the honor of playing the first night high school game in Minnesota.

Under Saturday night's lights, the Gusties scored their first touchdown of the day on their second drive as Veldman found Josh Kirk (Jr., Garvin, Minn.) on a five-yard pass, capping a nine-play, 75-yard drive highlighted by a 50-yard Brice Panning (Jr., Hamburg, Minn.) reception.

The Johnnies carried a 24-13 lead into halftime and outscored the home team 21-0 in the second half. Saint John's outgained the Black and Gold 409-313. Gustavus did well on third down, converting on 10-of-18 opportunities.

Veldman completed 19-of-34 passes for 255 yards, two touchdowns, and an interception. Kirk hauled in a game-high eight receptions for 63 yards and a score, while Panning made four catches for 140 yards. David Peal (Fy., Worcester, Mass.) led a pedestrian rushing attack with six carries for 20 yards. For the third consecutive game, Matt Berkner (Sr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.) led the defense with 10 tackles.

"I'm proud of the way our guys competed all day long," Haugen said. "No question that we've improved from week one. We just need to eliminate mistakes."

For the fourth-straight game, Matt Berkner (Sr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.) led the team with 11 tackles.

A strong defensive performance with a lopsided time of possession resulted in the Gustavus football team defeating Concordia 27-14 Saturday afternoon on its Homecoming. The Gusties controlled possession for more than 41 minutes and held the MIAC's top rushing attack to a pedestrian 20 yards on 23 carries (their fewest rushing yards since 2000). The Gusties snap a threegame losing streak to improve to 2-3 overall and 1-2 in the MIAC, while the Cobbers drop to 3-3 overall and 2-2 in the league.

"We've struggled in time of possession this season, but today we had the ball for 41 minutes and that was the difference in the game," Head Coach Peter Haugen said. "It was an incredible job by our defense. To hold a team like Concordia to 20 yards is really quite something. The execution of our offense on third down was special in some key areas. I'm really proud of our guys. We've had to fight through some adversity and come together as a group."

The first half was all Gustavus as it scored four touchdowns in the first 30 minutes, while holding the Cobbers scoreless. The momentum slightly turned in Concordia's favor in the second half as it scored a pair of touchdowns to bring the score within two possessions, but the Gusties made an interception on their own seven-yard line with 2:38 remaining in the game to thwart the visitor's comeback attempt.

Michael Veldman (Sr., Becker, Minn.) finished the game with a rushing touch-down and two passing scores. His first came on a one-yard run, capping a 13-play, 59-yard drive late in the first quarter. Veldman's first passing touch-down was a two-yard connection to Brayton Finch (Jr., Mount Morris, Ill.) with 4:17 remaining in the first half. The next was an 11-yard strike to Todd Johnson Jr. (So., Minneapolis, Minn.) with 21 seconds left in the half. David Peal (Fy., Worcester, Mass.) scored the other Gustie touchdown on an 11-yard rush, sprinting through the Cobber defense – as well as an official – 1:12 into the second quarter.


Gustavus outgained Concordia 387-194 in total offensive yards with 267 through the air and 120 on the ground. The Gusties also collected 25 first downs and held the Cobbers to 11.

Veldman completed 25-of-33 attempts for 267 yards, two touchdowns, and two interceptions. Peal led the rushing attack with 79 yards and a touchdown on 27 carries. Brice Panning (Jr., Hamburg, Minn.) hauled in a game-high six receptions for 73 yards. For the fifth-straight game, Matt Berkner (Sr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.) led the defense with seven tackles, including one for a loss.

Two blocked punts, one recovered for a touchdown, and a punt return touchdown highlighted the Gustavus football team's 42-14 win at Hamline on Saturday afternoon. The Gusties also had three rushing touchdowns and surpassed 400 yards of total offense for the first time this season to move to .500 at 3-3 overall and 2-2 in the MIAC.

"Proud of our guys, it's the kind of effort we needed today," Head Coach Peter Haugen said. "We didn't give up much on defense, made some big plays, and had some turnovers, so that was fun to see."

Jordan Kahlow (Sr., Le Sueur, Minn.) started the scoring for the Gusties as he recovered a blocked punt in the endzone after Hamline's first possession. Two plays into the Pipers' next drive, Jake Boykin (Jr., Las Cruces, N.M.) forced and recovered a fumble at the home 25-yard line. Rafael Soriano-Campos (Jr., Guadalajara, Mexico) ensued with four straight carries, finishing with a two-yard touchdown.

Gustavus took a 21-0 lead early in the second quarter as Brice Panning (Jr., Hamburg, Minn.) received a punt at the Gustie 42 and returned it 58 yards for the score. The punt return touchdown is the first by Gustavus since Ethan Armstrong did so in 2006 against Macalester.

Hamline ended the shutout midway through the second quarter after a nine-play, 76-yard drive, but the Gusties made it 28-7 just before halftime as Michael Veldman (Sr., Becker, Minn.) found Josh Kirk (Jr., Garvin, Minn.) for a 37-yard connection.

On the first Hamline drive of the second half, Gustavus forced a three-and-out and blocked the punt for the second time in the game. Four plays later, Soriano-Campos found the endzone for the second time.

Gustavus's last score came midway through the third quarter as David Peal (Fy., Worcester, Mass.) capped a four-play, 60-yard drive with a two-yard touchdown run. Peal started the drive with a 48-yard scamper, his longest of the season. Hamline scored a touchdown early in the fourth quarter, but that would be it as the Gusties held on for the convincing win.

"We need to be better in some short yardage situations," Haugen said. "We probably could have put a real stamp on the game early and we didn't do that. But thankfully we hung in there and kept playing."

Gustavus out-gained Hamline 407-196 in total yards with a season-high 200 on the ground. Peal led the ground game with eight carries for 75 yards and a score. Soriano-Campos had 11 carries for 60 yards and two touchdowns. Veldman completed 15-of-22 passes for 204 yards, a touchdown, and an interception. Brayton Fich (Jr., Mount Morris, III.) was the top target with five catches for 43 yards. Panning finished with a game-high 120 all-purpose yards. Boykin led the team in tackles for the first time this season with six, including the forced fumble and recovery.

Another strong defensive performance paired with a scoring outburst in the first half propelled the Gustavus football team to a 42-0 shutout victory over Augsburg on Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field. The convincing win marks the 500th all-time victory for the Gustavus football program, which is in its 102nd season. Gustavus is now one of 57 NCAA Division III institutions with at least 500 wins with an all-time record of 500-359-21.

For the third consecutive game the Gusties held their opponent to less than 100 yards rushing. Augsburg was limited to 59 yards on the ground and just 39 through the air. The 98 total yards are the fewest allowed by the Gusties since 2014. Conversely, Gustavus amassed 289 total yards with 108 on the ground and 181 through the air.

"It was a great win for the Gusties in some interesting conditions with the wind, but we were fortunate that we won the toss and took advantage of that," Head Coach Peter Haugen said. "We had good balance on offense and executed in key moments, but as crazy as it sounds, if [quarterback] Michael [Veldman] (Sr., Becker, Minn.) didn't have an open receiver, he threw it into the ground. Sometimes you just need to get to the next play so I felt we played smart.

"The defense is a really confident group right now. Coach Kleinschrodt and the staff have done a great job and the players have responded. They are playing very fast and disciplined football."

The Gusties scored what proved to be the game-winning touchdown on their first series of the game. Veldman connected with Josh Kirk (Jr., Garvin, Minn.) for 36 yards on the first play and Rafael Soriano-Campos (Jr., Guadalajara, Mexico) punched in a three-yard rush for the score three plays later.

On their second possession of the first quarter, the Gusties found the endzone again as Veldman found Ellis Hirman (Sr., Zumbrota, Minn.) for a touchdown, capping a 13-play, 72-yard drive. The Black and Gold took advantage of a bad snap on a punt, starting its next drive on the Augsburg 10-yard line. On the ensuing play, Veldman rushed to pay-dirt for a 21-0 lead early in the second quarter.

The home team gained a 28-0 advantage two possessions later. David Peal (Fy., Worcester, Mass.) scampered 14 yards for his first of two touchdowns on the afternoon. Another bad snap on an Augsburg punt attempt gave the Gusties the ball at the Augsburg six yard-line. Peal then crossed the goal line after two carries for a

35-0 lead, which stood at halftime.

The final score of the day came after an eight-play, 75-yard drive to open the second half. Brice Panning (Jr., Hamburg, Minn.) kept the drive alive with a 34-yard reception on third down. Brayton Finch (Jr., Mount Morris, III.) later recovered a fumble in the endzone for the score.

Veldman completed 13-of-19 passes for 181 yards and a touchdown. Kirk was the top target with four catches for 66 yards. Peal led the rushing attack with 10 carries for 34 yards and two touchdowns. Brady Miller (Sr., Delano, Minn.) totaled a team-high six tackles, including one for a loss. Jake Krull (Jr., Plymouth, Minn.) and Kaleb Scott (So., Gardena, Calif.) each had an interception.



The Gustavus football team Saturday afternoon scored early and often, cruising to a 62-28 victory over Carleton for its fourth consecutive victory, improving to 5-3 overall and 4-2 in the MIAC. The Knights fall to 3-6 overall and 2-5 in the league.

"The thing that impressed me most today was that we made some really big plays in key moments," Head Coach Peter Haugen said. "We had some big catches on third down with our guys going up for the ball."

The 62 points are the most by the Gusties since a 63-14 win over Carleton in 2015. During the past three games, Gustavus has averaged 30 points in the first half and that trend continued today with 34 first half points. The Gusties also entered today's matchup without any points in the fourth quarter and were able to end that slump against the Knights with 21 points in the final frame.

Gustavus outgained Carleton 581-348 with 443 yards of passing and 138 on the ground. Both the total offensive yards and passing yards are season highs for the Gusties. Michael Veldman's (Sr., Becker, Minn.) 417 passing yards mark the second most in his career as he completed 22-of-32 passes for three touchdowns. He also ran the ball for two scores.

For the first time this season, two Gustie receivers eclipsed 100 yards. Josh Kirk (Jr., Garvin, Minn.) hauled in seven passes for 150 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while Brice Panning (Jr., Hamburg, Minn.) caught seven passes for 139 yards and his first touchdown of the season.

David Peal (Fy., Worcester, Mass.) had 11 carries for 90 yards and three touchdowns. One of Peal's touchdowns, a 62-yarder, was the longest rush by the Gusties since Karim Ortiz ran for a 69-yard touchdown against St. Olaf last year.

"He's starting to show more confidence and is getting more acclimated to what we're doing and learning a ton of football this year. I'm just proud of his efforts." Haugen said of Peal.

Matt Berkner (Sr., Sleepy Eye, Minn.) led the defense with eight tackles and a sack. Brady Miller (Sr., Delano, Minn.) and Landon Rauen (Fy., Zumbrota, Minn.) each had an interception.

Carleton made it interesting late in the third quarter by scoring 14 unanswered points to make the score 41-28, but the Gusties were able to respond by outscoring the home team 21-0 in the fourth.

Late in the fourth quarter with the game in hand, the Gusties were able to play a number of second-string players. Backup quarterback Carter Kopet (Fy., Cleveland, Minn.) took advantage of the opportunity by connecting with Dalton Thelen (Fy., Cold Spring, Minn.) on a wheel route up the ride sideline for a 29-yard touchdown pass.

The Gustavus football team nearly knocked off No. 7 St. Thomas on a rainy Saturday afternoon at Hollingsworth Field, but a fourth quarter comeback propelled the visitors to a 14-13 nail-biting win. The Gusties held St. Thomas scoreless through three quarters, which hasn't been done since its 2011 NCAA semifinal loss to UW-Whitewater.

Gustavus drops to 5-4 overall and 4-3 in the MIAC, while the Tommies improve to 8-1 overall and 6-1 in the league.

The Gusties outgained the Tommies 355-279 in total yards of offense, but three interceptions kept the home squad from putting more points on the board.

"We were so good defensively today and really hung in there," Head Coach Peter Haugen said. "And offensively, there was no question what the game plan was... try to spread them out and throw the ball. We made some huge catches. The offensive line battled all day long with blitzes and pressure basically every play.

"I'm just so proud of our effort. I wanted to win for our seniors more than anything because they've given everything to this program. Just sick to our stomach that we weren't able to finish."

The Gustie defense forced a three-and-out on the first possession of the game and the offense continued to momentum with a five-play, 41-yard scoring drive all on the connection of quarterback Micheal Veldman (Sr., Becker, Minn.) to receiver Jamison Beulke (Sr., Montgomery, Minn.). Beulke, in his first game of the season, caught passes of 13, 10, and 18 yards on the drive, the last coming on a swing pass out of the backfield and spinning around a defender into the endzone.

Gustavus's defense continued to impress against the second-best scoring offense in the nation, stopping Tommie drives on five punts, one on downs, and another on an interception by Jordan Kahlow (Sr., Le Sueur, Minn.).

The Black and Gold took a 13-0 lead with 3:40 left in the first half after a seven-play, 80-yard drive, highlighted by four first down passes of at least 12 yards. Ellis Hirman (Sr., Zumbrota, Minn.) finished the drive with a diving catch in the endzone on an 18-yard strike from Veldman.

St. Thomas first threatened to score late in the third quarter with a fresh set of downs from the Gustie 10-yard line. The Gustie defense stepped up once again with two rushing stops and forced two incomplete passes for a turnover on downs.

The Tommies finally broke the shutout on their first drive of the fourth quarter after nine plays and 53 yards. The game-winning drive featured 17 plays, went 87 yards, and lasted

6:39, ending on a 25-yard fourth down touchdown pass with 2:28 remaining in the game.

On the ensuing possession, Gustavus was driving into Tommie territory, but an interception at the 28-yard line essentially ended the game as the visitors were able to run out the clock.

Veldman completed 27-of-48 passes for 382 yards, two touchdowns, and three interceptions. Beulke was the top target with 11 catches for 89 yards and a touchdown. Brice Panning (Jr., Hamburg, Minn.) caught six passes for 158 yards.

Jake Boykin (Jr., Las Cruses, N.M.) and Avery Bachman (Jr., Saint Peter, Minn.) led the defense with 11 and 10 tackles, respectively.
